Aldridge Starts Liquor Petition for Iuka Only

After more than a year of trying to get enough signatures to put legalized beer and wine sales on a county-wide ballot, Charles Aldridge still lacks about 200 signatures, but he's starting a new one that will bring it to a vote in the city of Iuka, only.

Senate Bill 2497 was signed by Governor Phil Bryant in July and it allows for municipalities in counties that have voted down legalization efforts previously) to vote on legalizing liquor or beer

sales if they are greater than 5,000 in population, or are a county seat - which qualifies Iuka (population 2,932), since it is the county seat, and Tishomingo County last voted to remain under dry laws in the late 1960s.

A successful petition in Iuka will only need about 519 signatures of registered Iuka residents, who are registered to vote, reported Aldridge Monday.

The new legislation clears the path for cities like Corinth and Booneville, and an effort to legal-

ize liquor sales in Corinth is now underway.

Chances for an Iuka-only petition differ greatly from those for a county wide option, since the area and population of Iuka are so much smaller than the whole county. Petition circulators still face the problem of finding qualified, registered IUKA voters. So many of the people who work and shop in Iuka, and would be likely to sign, still actually live in the county.

Highpointers' Plaque Stolen from Woodall Mountain Monument

A plaque placed at Mississippi's highest point by a national organization was stolen over Labor Day weekend.

Back in October of 2010, the Highpointers, a national group who make a point of climbing the tallest peak in every state, and sometimes in other countries, had their national convention here in Tishomingo County at the home of Mississippi's highest peak, Woodall Mountain.

As their gift to the county, they installed a four-ton boulder bearing a metal plaque, describing the significance of Woodall Mountain - which was one of the only high points that had been used as a staging point for a Civil War battle.

According to the private landowners, who graciously leave the peak open for hiking and visitors near around, the plaque was there Thursday, August 30th, when they replaced the Highpointers log book that stays up on the mountain. Late Monday, the plaque had been taken from the rock.

Reports were not available from the county sheriff's department on the status of any investigation.

Thousands of people visited the Iuka area over Labor Day

weekend, when the 150th Anniversary of the Battle of Iuka was observed.

If anyone has any information about the plaque, they are asked to call the sheriff's department at 423-7000. Landowners say that there will be no questions asked, they just want this bit of history to be replaced to be enjoyed by others.

THE BATTLE OF IUKA.

Victory of Gen. Rosecrans over Gen. Price.

The Rebel Force Estimated at Eighteen Thousand.

Capture of Baggage, Arms and Prisoners.

Iuka, Miss., Saturday, Sept. 20.

To Maj. Gen. H. W. Halleck, General-in-Chief.

Gen. ROSECRANS, with STANLEY's and HAMILTON's Divisions and MINNIE's Cavalry, attacked PRICE south of this village about two hours before dark yesterday, and had a sharp fight until night closed in.

Gen. OSA was to the north, with an armed force of about 5,000 men, and had some skirmishing with the rebel pickets.

This morning the fight was renewed by Gen. ROSECRANS, who was nearer to the town, but it was found that the enemy had been evacuating during the night, going south. Gen. HANCOCK and STANLEY, with cavalry, are in full pursuit.

Talk will no doubt break up the enemy, and possibly force them to abandon most of their artillery.

The loss on either side, in killed and wounded, is from 300 to 500. The enemy's loss in arms, tents, &c., will be large. We have about 250 prisoners.

I have reliable intelligence that it was PRICE's intention to move over east of the Tennessee. In this he has been thwarted.

Among the enemy's loss are Gen. LITTLE, killed and Gen. WARREN wounded.

I cannot speak too highly of the energy and skill displayed by Gen. ROSECRANS in the attack, and of the obedience of the troops. Gen. OSA's command showed untiring zeal, but the direction taken by the enemy prevented them from taking the active part they desired. PRICE's force was about 16,000.

**Welding Training
Offered in Iuka**

The Northeast Mississippi Community College Workforce Development division is offering customized welding training at the mobile welding lab in Iuka MS on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:00 PM until 8:30 PM

The enrollment is open as space is available and training can be customized for the individual needs. The duration may be as short as one class or as long as needed.

Here is a brief description of some of the processes that are covered.

Shielded Metal Arc Welding (Stick Welding) which is often used in the construction trades but is also useful around the home/farm due to the relatively simple equipment and versatility. The process also offers a great deal of versatility due to the ability to rapidly change the types of metal that can be welded without complicated equipment changes. This process also requires a greater amount of skill than many of the commonly used wire fed processes. If you just want to come down and learn about the different electrodes that have been sitting around your barn or shop, come on down. If you want to learn how to put a 6010 root pass in a 6G pipe test, we can do that too.

Flux Cored Arc Welding is often used in the steel fabrication industries for components requiring a high quality weld deposit that is also highly productive. Though not as versatile as some processes, the high production rates and

ease of use in all positions makes this a valuable process for companies involved in heavy steel fabrication. In an industrial setting, the process generates a great deal of smoke and heat but can deposit a great deal of weld metal in a short period of time. Smaller 110V Flux cored arc welding machines are available for use around the house or farm and if you have one of these you are welcome to come down to get some help if you need it. If you have been thinking about getting a job welding using FCAW, you can come down and try it out to see if you would like to do it for hours at a time. Its Hot, Its Smoky, and it PAYS! Some people can handle it, some can't, but you won't know until you try. There is more to it than just being able to run a few beads on a table.

Training in other processes such as GTAW and GMAW is also available. In addition, there are additional training options available during the day.

With no further business the meeting adjourned at 3 p.m.

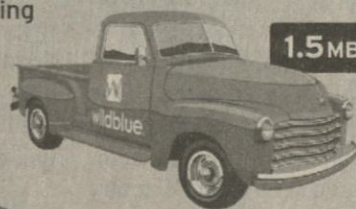

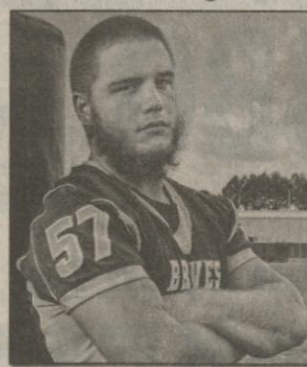

The 3rd Annual Tri-County Genealogy Fair will be held Saturday, October 6, 2012, at the historic Jacinto Courthouse from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Fair is sponsored by the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society, the Alcorn County Genealogical Society, and the Prentiss County Genealogical & Historical Society. Tishomingo County was established in 1836 and often referred to as the "State of Tishomingo" due to its large size. Jacinto was chosen as its county seat, but in 1870, Old Tishomingo County was divided into present-day Alcorn, Prentiss, and Tishomingo Counties. Each of the three "new" counties chose new county seats, and Jacinto and its courthouse was abandoned.

Registration will begin at 9:30 at the Jacinto Courthouse located on Highway 356 East in Jacinto, Miss. Seminars will include a session at 10 a.m. on Beginning Genealogy—Finding Folks by Mrs. Diane Garvin of Booneville. She has previously taught this course at the Itawamba County Community College. At 11 a.m., Dr. Robert Harris, Professor of History and Genealogy at the Wallace State Community College in Hanceville, Ala., will speak on Journey to the Bottom of the Barrel: What You Might Do When You Hit a Brick Wall. After a lunch period, Dr. Harris will resume at 12:30 p.m. and teach another class Blue & Gray, Black & White: Basics of Civil War Research. Mrs.

Angela Broyles, founder of Bluewater Publications, will teach a session at 1:30 p.m. on How to Get Published. She has also spearheaded Historical Truth, an initiative dedicated to collecting and preserving rare and unique stories through the collection of oral, written, and audiovisual histories of individuals. 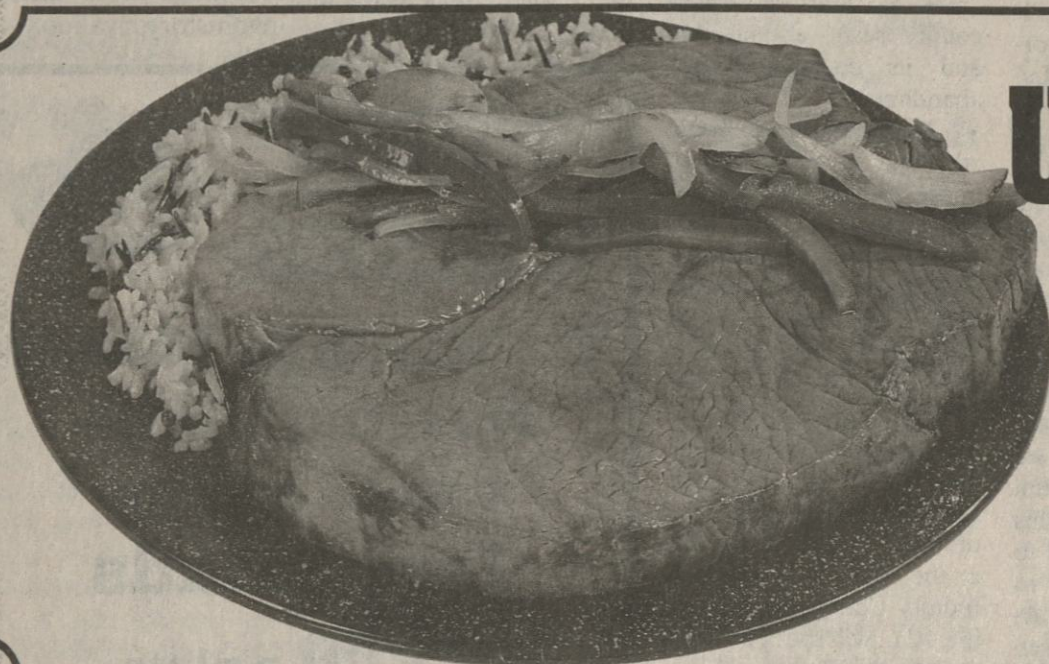

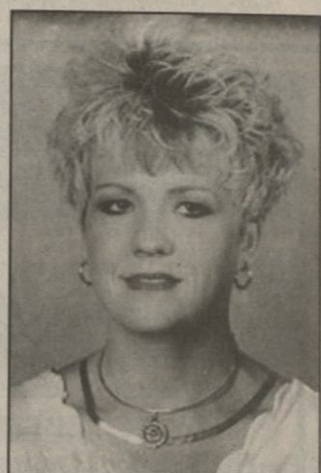

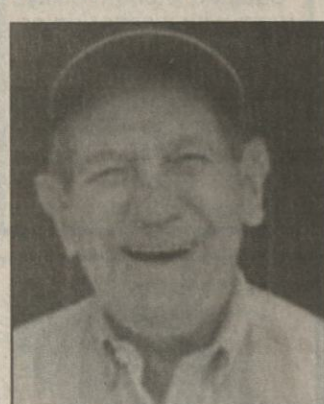
