Schools Getting Tech Infrastructure Upgrade

During the September board meeting, the Tishomingo County School Board (TCSD) approved advertising to accept bids on an infrastructure upgrade for all schools in the county.

This will upgrade the infrastructure from a 100-megabyte backbone to a 10-gigabyte backbone providing faster and more reliable access to the network and the Internet. Wi-Fi will be expanded to cover all rooms on every campus. In addition, the district has just completed upgrading all teacher workstations to 21" Apple iMac Desktops and installing interactive white boards in all subject area tested classrooms. In preparing for the 21st century, TCSD has fully implemented the STEMS and ICT programs, which consist of seven new state of the art labs. The District plans to complete the project infrastructure upgrade project by December of this year.

Sheriff's Dept. Collecting Unused Prescription Drugs

On September 29 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public another opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your medications for disposal to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 1208 Betty Dale Drive in Iuka, MS. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked. Last April, Americans turned in 552,161 pounds-276 tonsof prescription drugs at over 5,600 sites operated by the DEA and nearly 4,300 state and local law enforcement partners. In its four previous Take Back events, DEA and its partners took in over 1.5 million pounds-nearly 775 tons-of pills. This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines-flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash-both pose potential safety and health hazards. Four days after the first event, Congress passed the Secure and Responsible Drug Disposal Act of 2010, which amends the Controlled Substances Act to allow an "ultimate user" of controlled substance medications to dispose of them by delivering them to entities authorized by the Attorney General to accept them. DEA is drafting regulations to implement the Act. Until new regulations are in place, local law enforcement agencies like the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the DEA will continue to hold prescription drug take-back events every few months. ABSENTEE BALLOTS FOR NOVEMBER 6, 2012 GENERAL ELECTION ARE NOW AVAILABLE

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2012. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, October 6, 2012, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturday, October 27, 2012, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and on Saturday, November 3, 2012, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five This race is a way for groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;

2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;

3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or

4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.

5. All voters who are members of the Armed Services, Their Spouses, Dependents, will go far in making sure and Overseas Citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA)

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered.

November 3, 2012, will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the November 6, 2012 General Election.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 5, 2012, in order to be eligible to be counted for the November 6, 2012 General Election.




