Fairgrounds Ready for 60th Annual Tishomingo County Fair

The Tishomingo County Fairground Board has completed several improvements to the county fairgrounds in preparation for the 60th Annual Fair, this October 9th-13th.

There is a new 4-H concession stand located on the south side of the arena, so that fairgoers can more easily get snacks during the rodeos and other arena activities. Concession sales during the fair are a major fundraiser for local 4-H clubs each year, and they will have hot dogs and hamburgers, candy, chips, nachos and popcorn for sale.

There is also a new livestock barn at the north end of the building area. During fair week this barn will house various livestock exhibits such as beef, poultry, goats and rabbits.

Be sure to get those exhibits ready for all the hundreds of folks to see and enjoy during the fair, and make plans to attend October 9th through the 13th.

Schools Getting Tech Infrastructure Upgrade

During the September board meeting, the Tishomingo County School Board (TCSD) approved advertising to accept bids on an infrastructure upgrade for all schools in the county.

This will upgrade the infrastructure from a 100-megabyte backbone to a 10-gigabyte backbone providing faster and more reliable access to the network and the Internet. Wi-Fi will be expanded to cover all rooms on every campus. In addition, the district has just completed upgrading all teacher workstations to 21" Apple iMac Desktops and installing interactive white boards in all subject area tested classrooms. In preparing for the 21st century, TCSD has fully implemented the STEM and ICT programs, which consist of seven new state of the art labs. The District plans to complete the project infrastructure upgrade project by December of this year.

Collecting Unused Prescription Drugs

On September 29 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public another opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your medications for disposal to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 1208 Betty Dale Drive in Iuka, MS. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Last April, Americans turned in 552,161 pounds—276 tons—of prescription drugs at over 5,600 sites operated by the DEA and nearly 4,300 state and local law enforcement partners. In its four previous Take Back events, DEA and its partners took in over 1.5 million pounds—nearly 775 tons—of pills.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

Four days after the first event, Congress passed the Secure and Responsible Drug Disposal Act of 2010, which amends the Controlled Substances Act to allow an "ultimate user" of controlled substance medications to dispose of them by delivering them to entities authorized by the Attorney General to accept them. DEA is drafting regulations to implement the Act. Until new regulations are in place, local law enforcement agencies like the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the DEA will continue to hold prescription drug take-back events every few months.

Out-of-county judges will be selected to judge this contest. Boy winners and girl winners will be selected in each division. Judging will be based upon the child's attractiveness, poise, and personality. A winner and two alternates will be chosen from each category. Each winner and alternate will receive a trophy from the Tishomingo County Fair Association.

There will be no phone registrations. All registration will be done at the fairgrounds before the event starting at 12:00 p.m. The registration fee is \$10.00 payable at the gate the day of the event-cash only. 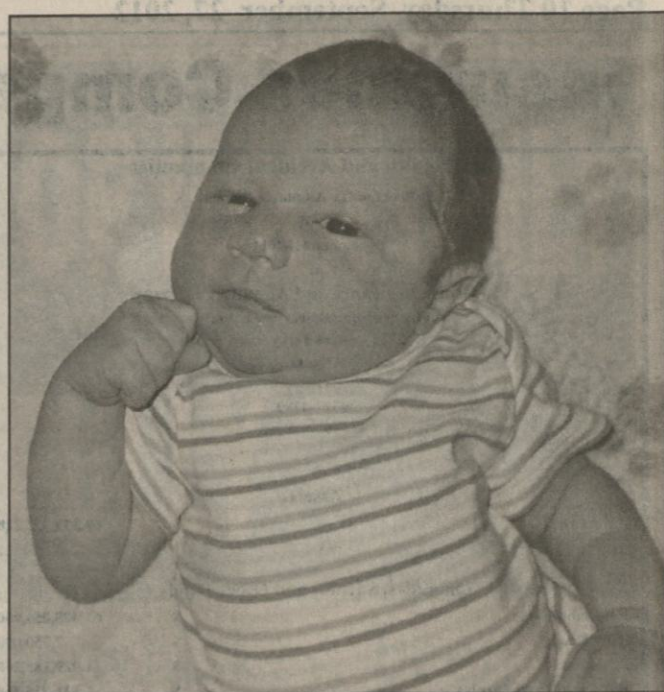

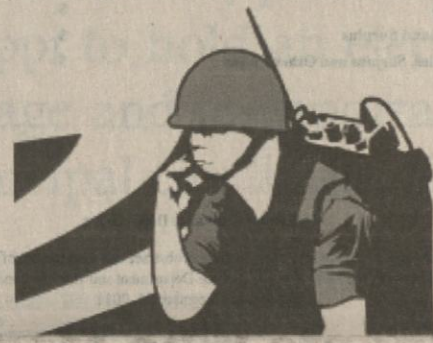

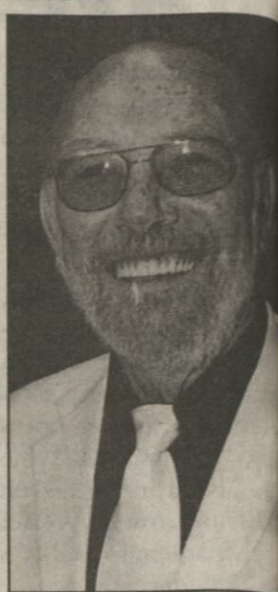

Should You Prepare For "Fiscal Cliff"?

As an investor, you can sometimes still feel you're at the mercy of forces beyond your control. This may be especially true today, when the Federal Reserve has warned of an approaching "fiscal cliff." What can you do in the face of such a dire prediction?

First of all, you need to understand what led to the Fed's remarks. Here's the story: Some \$1.2 trillion in spending cuts are scheduled to begin in 2013 while, simultaneously, the bush-era tax cuts - including the reduction in capital gains and dividend taxes - are set to expire. This combination of spending cuts and higher taxes could take some \$600 billion out of the economy, leading to a possible recession - and maybe something much worse, at least in the eyes of the Fed.

Still, there's no need for panic. Despite its political infighting, Congress is likely to reduce the "cliff" to a smaller bump, though it probably won't happen until after the election. But as an investor, you may need to be prepared for two significant events: market volatility, at least in the shorter, and higher taxes, probably for the foreseeable future.

To combat market volatility, you need to own a broadly diversified portfolio that can handle "bumps," "cliffs" and other rugged investment terrain. This means you'll need a mix of stocks, bonds and other securities that are suitable for your needs. (Keep in mind, though, that while diversification can reduce the impact of market volatility, it cannot guarantee profits or protect against losses.) You may also need to "rebalance" your portfolio to ensure that it's still aligned

with your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon, despite the impact of volatility.

Now, let's turn to taxes. Even if taxes on income, capital gains and dividends do rise, they will still, in all likelihood, be much lower than they've been at various points in the past. Nonetheless, you may want to consider a variety of steps, including the following:

- Take advantage of tax-deferred vehicles. Contribute as much as possible to your traditional IRA, your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan, and any education savings accounts you may have, such as a 529 plan.

- Consider converting your traditional IRA to a Roth IRA. A Roth IRA provides tax-free earnings, provided you don't start taking withdrawals until you're 59 1/2 and you've had your account for at least five years. (Be aware, though, that this conversion is taxable and may not be appropriate if you don't have money readily available to pay the taxes.)

- Consider municipal bonds. If you're in one of the upper tax brackets, you may benefit from investing in "munis," which pay interest that's free of federal taxes, and possibly state and local taxes as well.

- Not all these choices will be suitable for your situation, of course. Before taking action on these items, you may want to consult with your tax and financial advisors. But give these options some thought because they may prove helpful in keeping your financial goals from going "over a cliff." ABSENTEE BALLOTS FOR NOVEMBER 6, 2012 GENERAL ELECTION ARE NOW AVAILABLE

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2012. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, October 6, 2012, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturday, October 27, 2012, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and on Saturday, November 3, 2012, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;
2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;
3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or
4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.
5. All voters who are members of the Armed Services, Their Spouses, Dependents, and Overseas Citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered.

November 3, 2012, will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the November 6, 2012 General Election.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 5, 2012, in order to be eligible to be counted for the November 6, 2012 General Election.
