Volleyball Makes Playoffs in Inaugural Season Win Over Ackerman Advances Lady Braves to 2nd Round of Playoffs

Tishomingo County's volleyball team defeated Ackerman in first round playoff action Tuesday night, and they head to Lewisburg Thursday night.
Tuesday, Ackerman won the first match 23-25, and the Lady Braves prevailed in the next three: 25-26-24 and 25-22. As indicated by the scores, the matches were very close - an impressive feat for the first year program of the County, against the Ackerman team, where they have had a volleyball program for more than a decade, according to reports.
TCHS beat Aberdeen and Ripley in Division tournament action Saturday to earn a place in the MHSAA Class 1 state play-

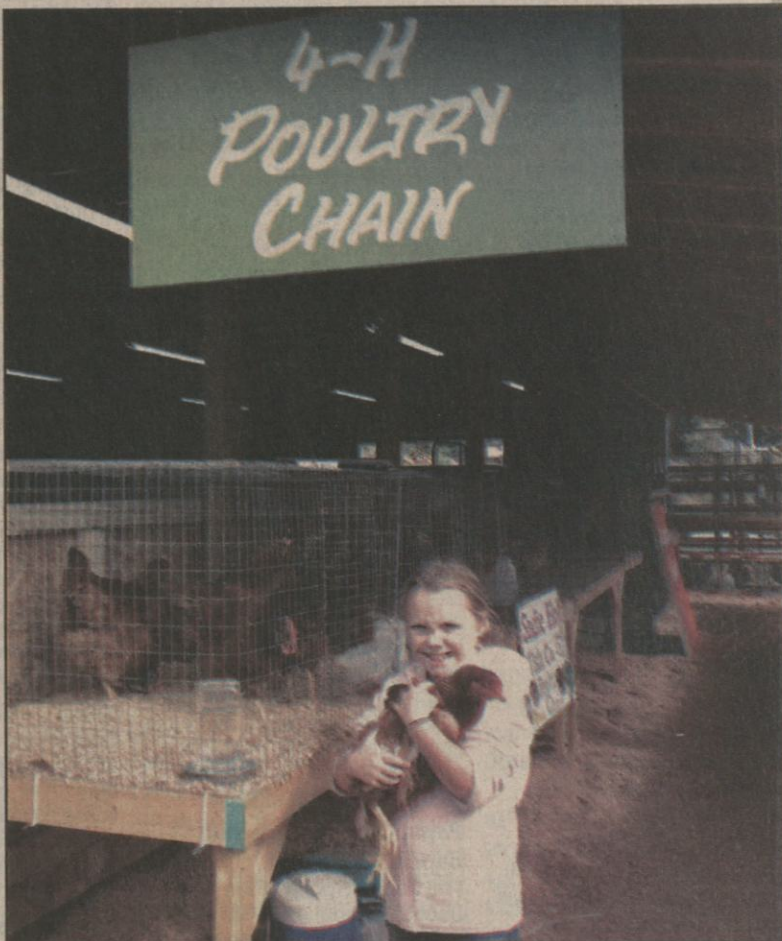
offs. Since volleyball is new for many of the schools in the area, the divisions are not the same as in other more established sports.
Though TC's record wasn't fabulous, the girls improved dramatically throughout the year. Many of the players saw their first live volleyball match in the Pontotoc tournament at the beginning of the season, and the second one they ever saw - they played in! Much to their surprise they did better than expected, with a win over H.W. Byers in that tournament.
"We didn't even know how to do pre-game warm up," laughed players recently. Ironically, it was the Ackerman team whom they first saw play a match against New

Albany, at that Pontotoc tournament. Afterward, Ackerman team members helped the TC girls learn the pre-game warm-up routine.
By Saturday's tournament, the Lady Braves were defeated by the best in the division, Corinth, by just a couple points in best two out of three matches. They have lost by just a few points to every team they played in recent weeks, and had some good wins, over Ripley, Aberdeen, Amory and New Albany. Coaches Kennedy and Hamilton, and all the girls, thank the school, parents, and many fans who have been supporting this fledgling sport at Tishomingo County.

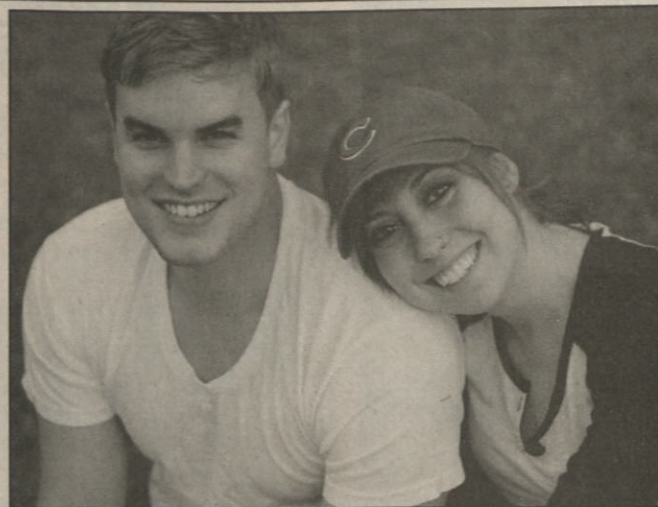

Residents may also obtain seasonal flu vaccinations from private providers and some retail pharmacies.

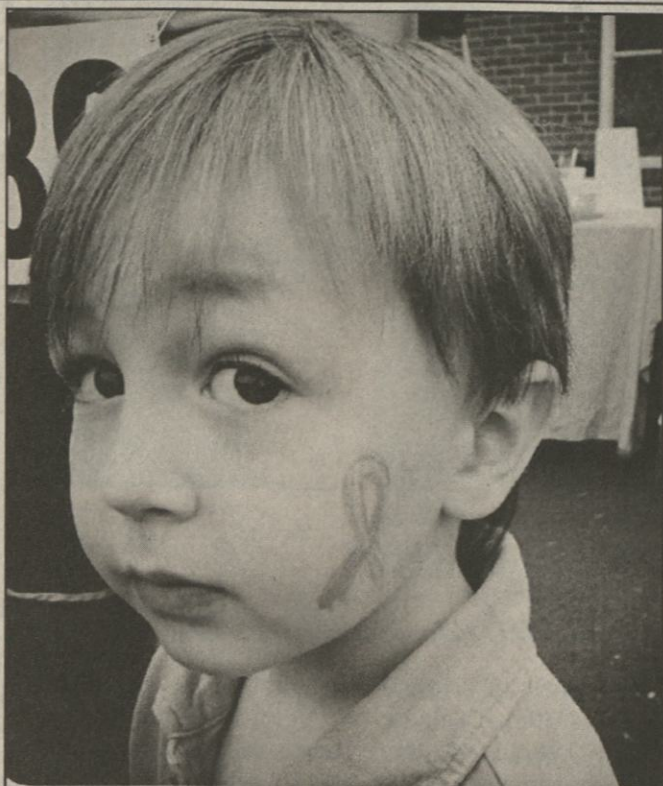

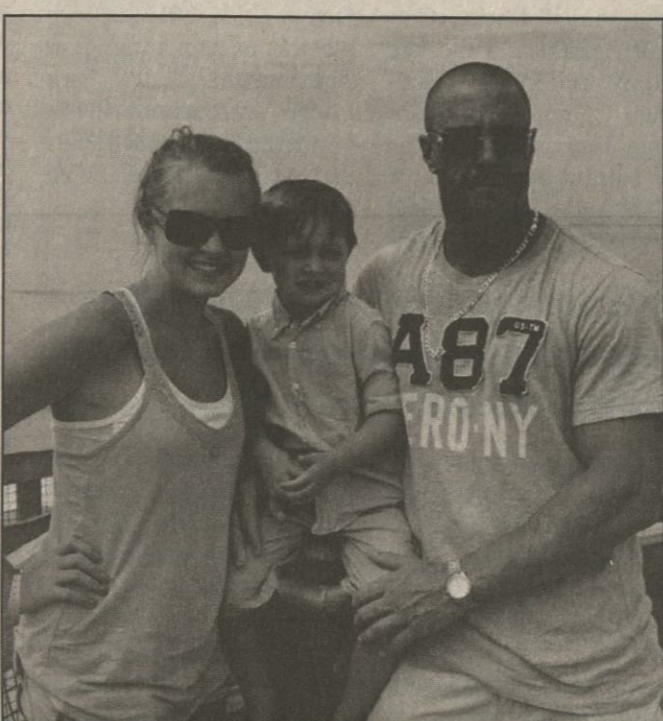

If you don't believe that this is the law all you have to do is call the Secretary of State's office in Jackson, TN. Their phone number is 1-(601)359-1350. If you have a store then you are allowed to sell it within 1500 feet of all these places. So this should let all you people that are worried about beer joints and dance halls being set up all over the cities in Tishomingo County, it will not be happening. This seems to be a big issue with a lot of people. This should put your mind at ease on this.

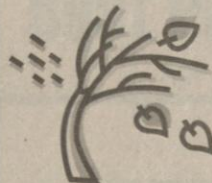

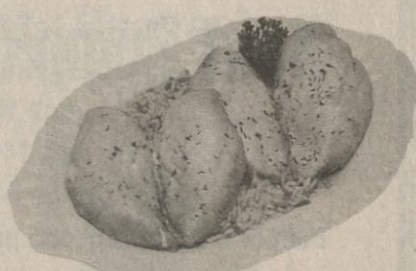

**When Faith Seems To Have Failed**

The church today has some ideas about faith that do not necessarily match what the Bible shows to be true faith. I am not discounting the true faith of anyone, but I am seeking to correct some mistaken ideas about what faith will produce. The name-it-claim-it philosophy that some are parroting around the countryside today is not necessarily a "match" for Bible faith. I am saying that God does not always take people out of hard circumstances, just because they have great faith. Hebrews 11:32-35a tells us of some great victories that came to people who had faith, but Hebrews 11:35b-40 shows another side of great faith: "...and others were tortured, not accepting deliverance; that they might obtain a better resurrection: And others had trial of cruel mockings and scourgings, yea, moreover of bonds and imprisonment: They were stoned, they were sawn asunder, were tempted, were slain with the sword: they wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins; being destitute, afflicted, tormented; (Of whom the world was not worthy:) they wandered in deserts, and in mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, received not the promise: God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made perfect."

The people in view in these verses had a hard time in life. Some are saying today that those who have faith are going to always enjoy great health; great wealth; popularity with the masses and happiness beyond measure, but that does not seem to fit the equation of our verses! Hebrews 11:35 tells of women who received their dead raised to life again, but there were only two such women in all of the Old Testament (I Kings 17:17-24; II Kings 4:18-37). Why were some tortured who had great faith? Why were some imprisoned; some stoned to death; some without enough food, clothing or proper shelter? The modern health-wealth preachers would say they did not have enough faith, but verse 39 will negate that philosophy, for God's Word says they all obtained a good report through faith. The mystery is in the fact that God does not give all of His children the same things, even when great faith is present in their lives. Christians in third world countries are more likely to suffer the difficulties that are mentioned above than Christians in America, but that does not make our faith greater, nor does it mean we are better Christians. Those who put down suffering Christians and belittle them by saying they do not have enough faith will sadly see their mistake at some point in the future!

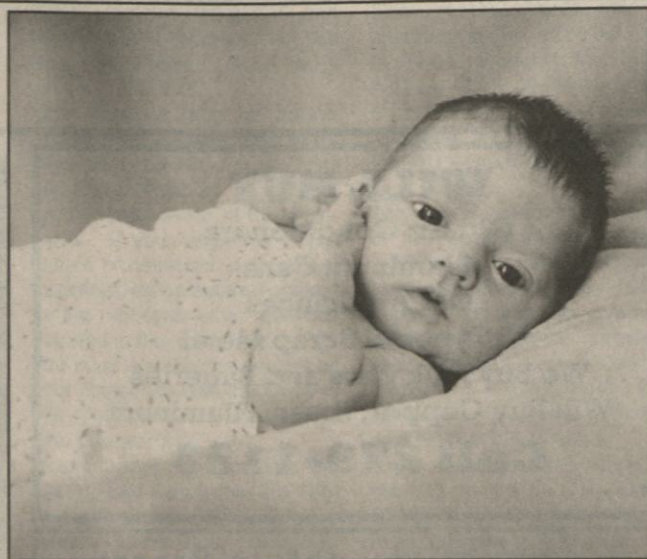

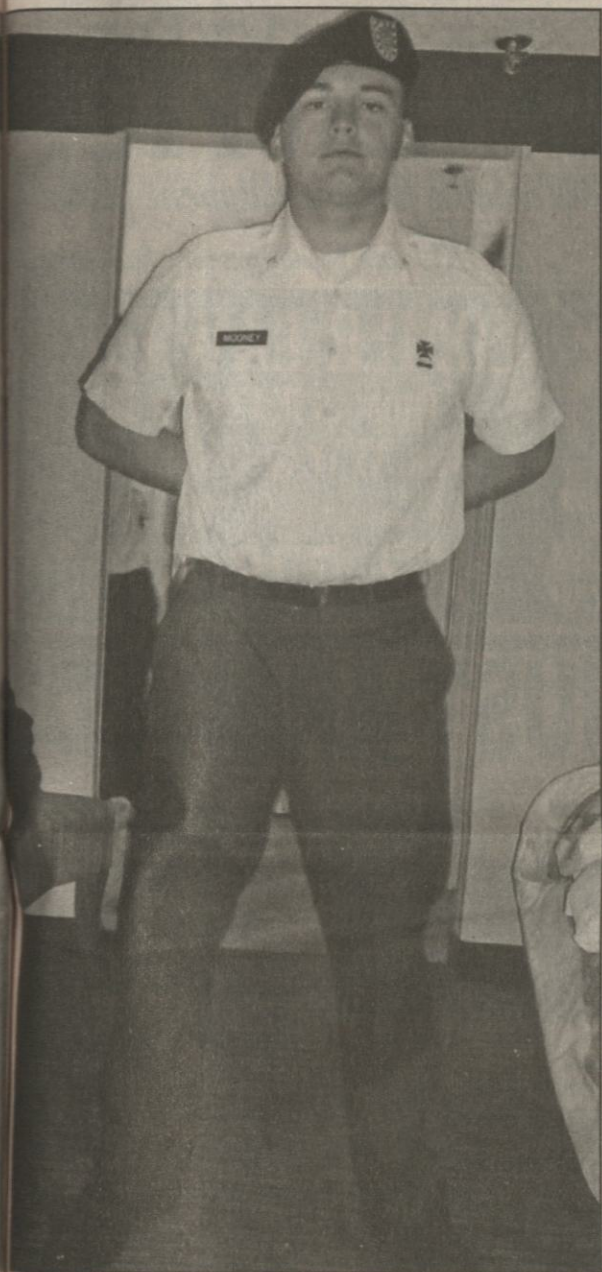

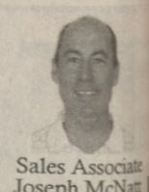
