Saturday Wreck Kills Glen Couple in luka

A collision Saturday at the intersection of Quitman and Highway 25 resulted in the death of a Glen couple, and hospitalized their grandson.

According to Tishomingo County Coronor Mack Wilemon, a 2000 Buick LeSabre driven by Harris Strickland was struck by a northbound pickup that did not stop at the intersection. The car came to rest about 100 feet away, in the right-of-way beside the Sonic, after being struck in the intersection. Harris and his wife Wanda were killed instantly in the collision.

The Stricklands were reportedly going to visit someone in a nursing home in Iuka, and were urning left onto Quitman, said Wilemon. They operated an antique booth at Sunflower Antiques and Flea Market in Iuka, and had extensive ties to the area.

The pickup truck, owned by Industrial Valve from Cleveland, Tennessee, apparently struck the car at full highway speed. The driver, Edward Sprague, of Soddy Daisy, Tennessee, was in route to the paper mill in Counce, said last of the Season:

The Strickland's 13-year-old grandson, Benjamin Marshall, who was in the backseat was airlifted from the scene and has been hospitalized since the wreck. Family friends say that he has lost a kidney, but official reports are not available.

Two Companies Hold Offical Openings at Yellow Creek Port

Two companies at Yellow Creek Port held ribbon cutting ceremonies Tuesday afternoon, with the Governor, and other state, county, and economic development officials in attendance.

Dennen Steel, headquartered in Grand Rapids, Michigan, has built a 50,000-square-foot building for its extensive metal stamping and fabrication operation. The project was made possible by a company investment of \$7.4 million, along with a \$2 million CAP loan from the county, and additional support from the Appalachian Regional Commission, TVA and the Mississippi Development Authority.

"Today is a great day for Dennen Steel as we celebrate the ribbon cutting of our new facility at Yellow Creek Port," said Andrew Dennen, chairman and CEO of Dennen Steel. "The support we have received from the Mississippi Development Authority, Tishomingo County, the Appalachian Regional Commission and the Tennessee Valley Authority played a significant role in our decision to locate Dennen Steel's southern operation here, and we look forward to many successful years in Tishomingo County."

Mississippi provided a big official welcome, from Governor Phil Bryant, who was accompanied to "one of his favorite parts of Mississippi" by several staff members and State Auditor Stacey Pickering.

"We welcome Dennen Steel as the newest member of Mississippi's business community," Gov. Bryant said. "The investment and jobs being created by Dennen Steel are further proof that 'Mississippi Works,' and the company's decision to locate here will positively impact the community and the state as a whole. I thank the company for its investment in our state, its confidence in our business climate and for creating these new job opportunities for the area's workers." Eventually, 50 workers will be employed at Dennen. The plant will run a variety of hightech metal forming machines that make pretty much anything made of metal - file cabinets, automobile parts, machine parts, appliance casings.
