Development Officials Urge Passage of Penny Tax for Progress

Development officials are urging county voters to approve a one-cent restaurant tax that will be on the November 6th ballot.

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation requested the county board of supervisors to put the measure on the ballot, and it will only pass if 60 percent of the voters approve the extra penny tax on food sold at restaurants in the county.

"We've been needing this for a long time," explained TCDF Board President Neil Davis at a recent industry ribbon-cutting event. "Compared to other counties, and even cities, we

are not only not doing what we should, we are falling behind."

Development professionals have, for many years, said that tourism is one of Tishomingo County's strongest prospects for industry, and we don't capitalize enough on strengths like two state parks, and hundreds of miles of lake-front property.

Despite efforts at advertising the county with a meager \$16,000 budget, many people still are heard to say, when visiting, "I never even knew this was here!"

Even one ad in a magazine like Southern Living

costs thousands, and neighboring states and counties spend thousands, and millions of dollars more enticing tourists to visit. In 2010, Oxford had \$1,925,141 in gross tourism tax revenues to spend; New Albany had \$548,278; and Tishomingo County had \$16,213.

The Mississippi Development Authority reports that tourists spent more than \$12 million in Tishomingo County in 2011, and that tourism accounts for 180 jobs in the county.

The spending and jobs are a tiny fraction of the potential, and they hope with the passage of the penny restaurant tax to increase

both, and bring additional jobs and spending.

Officials initially expected to get approximately \$80,000 annually from a one-percent restaurant tax on all restaurants in the county. But the legislature produced a bill that included only restaurants that can seat more than 25 people, and estimated figures are not available yet on expected income, should the tax pass, said TCDF representatives Wednesday.

The county currently only uses income from a 2 percent lodging tax to promote industry, attract development investors and promote tourism.

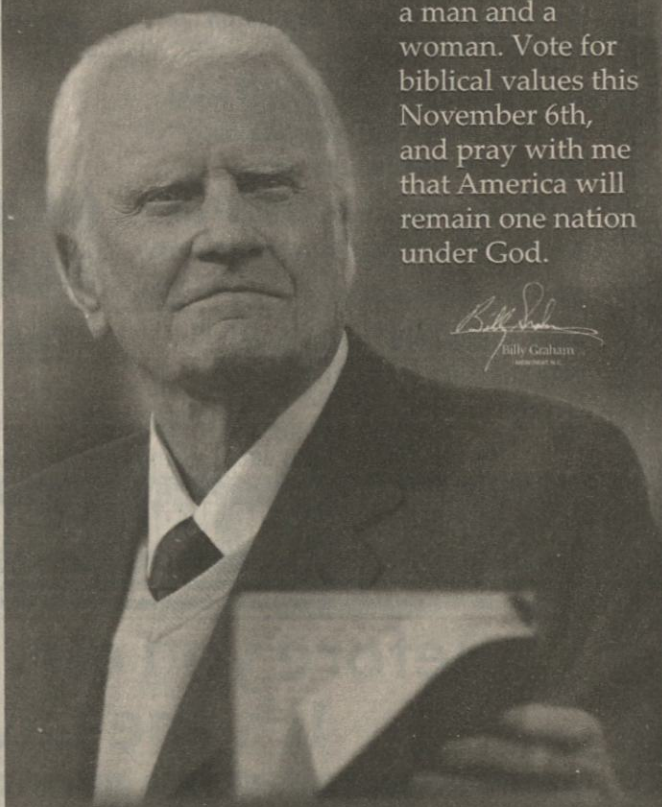

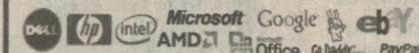

RESOLUTION OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO PLACE 1% TOURISM TAX ON NOVEMBER BALLOT

Be it resolved that the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors met on the 15th day of June, 2012 and at said meeting considered the request made by the Legislative Delegation representing Tishomingo County, Mississippi in the Mississippi Legislature and the Tishomingo County Economic Development Foundation's request to impose a 1% tax on the gross proceeds from the sales of beverages and prepared food at restaurants pursuant to House Bill No. 1551 with said tax proceeds being used for purpose of promoting tourism with Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Being considered, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors do hereby find and resolve as follows:

Be it resolved that the Tishomingo County Economic Development Foundation requested that the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors seek a Local and Private Bill in the 2012 Legislative session of the Mississippi Legislature authorizing the imposition of a 1% Tourism Tax to be levied upon the gross proceeds derived from prepared food and beverages sold in Tishomingo County, Mississippi with said Tax being used for the purposes of promoting tourism within Tishomingo County, Mississippi. The Board of Supervisors requested and received the same from the Legislative Delegation that represents Tishomingo County, Mississippi and House Bill No. 1551 was passed and signed into law by the Governor for the State of Mississippi authorizing the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to provide Notice of Intent to Levy said tourism tax and to provide for the same to be placed on the ballot to be decided by the voters of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

Be it resolved that the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors intends to levy a 1% tax upon every person, firm or corporation operating a restaurant in Tishomingo County, Mississippi on the gross proceeds from the sales of beverages and prepared food at restaurants beginning on December 1, 2012, if approved by the voters of Tishomingo County, Mississippi on the November 6, 2012 general election date.

Be it further resolved that the Circuit Clerk for Tishomingo County, Mississippi shall take all action necessary to place the referendum on the November 6, 2012, General Election Ballot to allow the voters of Tishomingo County, Mississippi to approve or deny the implementation of said tax as described in House Bill 1551 as signed into law by the Governor. 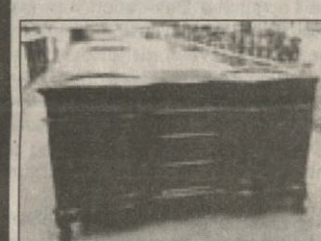

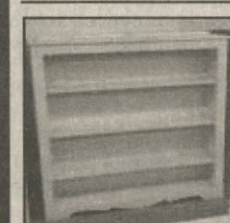

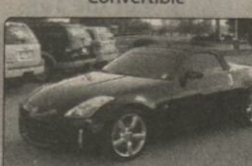
