Tour of Yellow Creek Port Shows State, Regional Officials Tishomingo County's Shining Star of Industrial Development

The Yellow Creek Port Authority Board of Directors and staff sponsored a tour of the port and industrial areas for the region's legislative delegation, supervisors in the four-county region, and economic development partners on October 23.

About 50 people attended the event, taking a guided bus tour that showed them the progress made in recent years at the region's major steel coil multi-modal facility, the Port. Officials viewed operations of the port facility as well as

manufacturers such as Ergon, FerrouSouth, Roll Form Group, SkySteel, Dennen Steel, Contract Fabricators, Spry Marine, and Yellow Creek Coating Services.

FerrouSouth Executive Vice President Reed McGivney and Vice President for Manufacturing Frank Frostino conducted a brief walking tour and presentation at FerrouSouth.

FerrouSouth and Yellow Creek Port partnered to build one of the South's first steel processing facilities in 1998. The port au-

thority funded the buildings and leased them to FerrouSouth. FerrouSouth invested in equipment and machinery, including a recent \$3.6 million investment for a new stretcher-leveler called the Eliminator, the largest in the USA.

The partnership between Yellow Creek Port and FerrouSouth has been fruitful and has been an important factor in the location of several steel fabricators in Northeast Mississippi and the creation of a steel fabrication cluster near Yellow Creek Port.

Fifteen years ago, there were less than two-dozen jobs and now, including Monotech and Burnsville properties owned by the Port, 447 are employed.

After the visit to FerrouSouth, the bus tour traveled to Monotech/PSP industries and to the Northeast Mississippi Waterfront Industrial Park at Burnsville.

The tour group was advised of several ready-to-build-on sites within the approximately 800-acre industrial park south of Highway 72 in Burnsville.

The New River Homes building is a county-owned 88,000-sq. ft. industrial building that is available for lease or sale to industrial clients. Plant Process Support is located in a 50,000 sq. ft. industrial building leased from Yellow Creek Port. Plant Process Support recently expanded into another building. The port authority built a 20,000-sq. ft. speculative industrial building this year.

County Elects Two New School Board Members; Fails to Support New Tourism Funding

The status quo won the day on the national election scene – incumbent President Barack Obama, and Vice-President Joe Biden will serve four more years, and the Senate is still controlled by Democrats, and the House by Republicans.

Mississippi First District voters returned Alan Nunnelee to office for a second term, and Mississippi Senator Roger Wicker won his re-election bid for his first full six-year term. He was appointed by Governor Haley Barbour to take Trent Lott's seat, and then won a special election for the remainder of Lott's term in 2008.

Local Results

Locally, two new school board members were elected. James Perkins won 59.15 percent (866) of the Third District vote to win Tommy Dean's seat, who chose not to run again. Roger Pounders won 40.7 percent of the vote (596) in his first bid for public office. Widely-known veterinarian James Perkins was part of the Iuka School Board before consolidation, and is part of several local organizations.

In the Fourth District, Jeff Daniel, of Tishomingo, handily won the school board seat with 48.8 percent (789) of the votes. Also running for Charles South's old seat were Paul Thorn, of Dennis, with 33 percent, and Camille Whitehead, of Tishomingo, with 17.6 percent of the votes.

All the current election commissioners were unopposed in their elections, and will serve the next four years.

County Not with Country Behind Obama-Biden

Seventy-seven percent of Tishomingo County voters made their choice for the Mitt Romney-Paul Ryan ticket, and the state-wide total was similar, with Romney receiving 56 percent of Mississippi votes in unofficial

returns. The incumbent Obama team only received 20 percent of Tishomingo County's votes, and 43 percent of the state's, keeping Mississippi firmly in the "red state" category of supporting Republican presidential candidates.

Both Senator Wicker, and Representative Nunnelee won more than seventy percent of county votes, and were successfully re-elected.

TCDF Must Make Do With Current Funding

Tishomingo County voted against instituting a 1 percent restaurant tax in Tuesday's general election pushing development officials back to the drawing board to study how to continue to do more with less.

Fifty-five percent voted against adding on a few pennies to restaurant tabs, and only 44 percent for the funding that would help Tishomingo County catch up with surrounding counties in marketing and tourism promotion efforts.

Apparently some were still unfamiliar or undecided on the tax, despite promotion and support of the issue by county development officials – 489 didn't complete a vote on that question.

The vote leaves Tishomingo County with a pittance of tax support to promote tourism in the county – compared to all the other counties in Northeast Mississippi. Tishomingo County works with less than \$20,000 to do all the marketing and advertising of its most promising resource, tourism, while neighboring counties

Let us never forget those who gave so much so that we may live free

Local World War II Veteran Honored and Recognized

Life tends to throw some rather unpredictable pitches at us...yes, pardon the pun...but, we aren't always the ones giving the signs.

When a typical teenager takes it upon himself to recruit some associates to destroy the outside toilets in the men's bathroom at Burnsville School, punishment would be easily justified. Maybe...maybe not? They could 'take a whipping' or perhaps a few afternoons staying after school for some 'extracurricular duties.' What about an expulsion? All of the above would seem applicable. However, in the case of one local individual, there was a deeper form of punishment that would change his life forever, a draft notice with the United States Army. After all, at the time, there were billboards everywhere saying that "Uncle Sam Wants You!"

Yes, this story is about a North Mississippi resident who was told he couldn't play basketball as a result of his clandestine capers. The team was playing against Glen Dale in 1944, one of the best teams in the region. His teacher and principal, Mr. Jim Cummings, told him and his friends they wouldn't be playing that night due to their mischievous behavior.

James Clayton Marlar, my grandfather and also better known as J.C., was born September 23rd, 1927 to Tom and Carrie Curtis Marlar. He had one brother, Varnell, and they were as different as daylight and dark. At the age of 18, his life journey shifted into high gear with a trip to the other side of the world, an excursion that would change him forever. Before leaving for service, he received, as did all local Soldiers, a gold dollar from Mr. Claude Curtis. As many will recall, Mr. Curtis sold slug burgers in downtown Iuka.

My grandfather entered Active Duty with the United States Army on November 10th, 1945. He completed Basic Training at Fort McClellan, Alabama and finished his training for overseas duty at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. I still recall stories he told me about Fort McClellan. He said there was a mountain there he referred to as Bain's Gap. He said they ran up that mountain so much, "he could have done it with his eyes closed." I also vividly

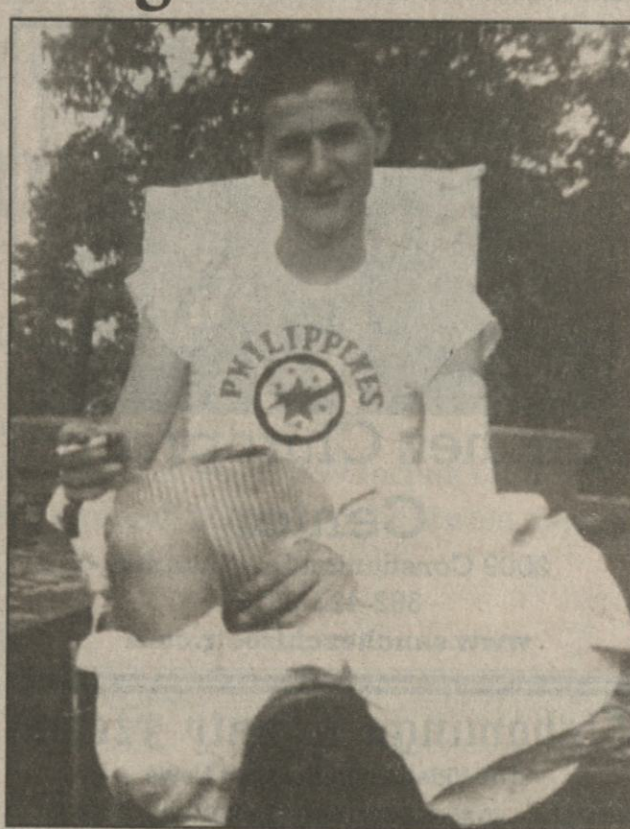

remember his stories about Camp Shelby. "That was the hottest place (during the day) and the coldest place (during the night) I've ever been in my entire life. And I've been to some places around the world. The mosquitoes were big enough to carry you away." He rode by train to Kearns, Utah for some additional training. Upon completing this required training, Private First Class Marlar left Utah bound for Okinawa.

His time in Okinawa was short (only a few weeks), but arduous. One day, an incident occurred that would stain his life. After a lengthy firefight with the Japanese, he and some buddies were riding back to base camp in a military tactical truck with some Japanese POWs (prisoners of war). Their vehicle hit a land mine and everyone was killed, except my grandfather. His legs were severed at the knee caps and his left arm was damaged by shrapnel. A couple days later, he woke up in an Army hospital in Manila. Tom and Carrie Marlar were notified by a Western Union telegram that their son had been severely wounded and would be coming home. There were no phone calls, no emails, no Facebook...only encouraging letters from the Base Chaplain that their son was ok.

After movement back to the States, he began rehabilitation at Percy Jones General Hospital near Battle Creek,

Michigan. He remained there for 18 months. His parents, brother, and an uncle and aunt, Wilburn and Lillian Curtis, hired a taxi driver, Tom Akers, to take them to Michigan to visit him. Stories and pictures show a young J.C. Marlar sitting in a wheelchair, smiling, his appendages taped from top to bottom, flirting with the nurses and having a good time, probably due to his macho nature. Nonetheless, he was making the most of what he could with his new life.

He was discharged from the Army on September 18th, 1947, five days from his twentieth birthday. For

his service, he received the World War II Victory Medal and the Army of Occupation Medal. The WWII Victory Medal commemorated military service during WWII and is awarded to any service member of the United States military who served on active duty between December 7th, 1941 and December 31st, 1946. The Army of Occupation Medal was for those who performed military service for at least thirty consecutive

days within a designated area of military operation. His daughter, Kathy Spears, is currently pursuing action to justify that he be awarded a Purple Heart for the injuries he sustained during his military service. My grandfather came home to Northeast Mississippi with a walking stick and a will that life wouldn't slow him down. He, naturally, felt like life had betrayed him. His life took him overseas as a confident, tall (he stood 6' 6"), good-looking 18-year-

old male. Now, he is back at home, hanging out with his friends and with limited mobility. He admits to 'living fast and having made some quick decisions' that were obviously attributed to combat stress, more known now as post-traumatic stress disorder. But as we all know, God always had a plan for his life. He was the father of two children, a daughter and a late son, Robby Warren Marlar. His daughter currently lives and takes care of him at his

home in North Crossroads.

Most people that read this article are going to recall several things that remind them of my grandfather. Most notably was his ability to make the best southern fried catfish in the area. He helped with a family-owned restaurant named Marlar's Fish & Steak House from 1977-1982. Every Friday and Saturday night, it was difficult to find a parking spot. Trust me, I know. I worked as a bus boy. Folks would drive as

far as 50 miles for either a charbroiled steak or my grandfather's famous, delicious catfish. His renowned recipe was a unique blend of spices that only he knew. I can still see him tossing the fish in a brown paper grocery bag and shaking it aggressively, to ensure the fish were literally saturated before deep frying. He did the same to his hushpuppies. After the customers paid, many would take a moment to thank him. They would walk through the swinging doors that led to the kitchen and personally shake his hand, even offering words of gratitude for a wonderful meal. He would smile and say "thank you" and continue to deep fry those fabulous-tasting fish.

The other detail was his ability to decorate his house at Christmas with tens of thousands of multi-colored lights. He decorated his property from 1977 to 1989, and each year the display expanded exponentially. Again, folks would drive from all around just

to see his lights. It was an 'opulent display that would earn him phone calls and visits from local news and radio stations. Even to the day, whenever I introduce myself to someone, I always ask if they know J.C. Marlar, "do you remember the guy that used to decorate his yard at Christmas?" That usually does it.

I'm very proud and grateful to my grandfather and his service to our great nation, as well as all Veterans of Foreign Wars. I guess that's one of the many reasons I decided to enlist my senior year of high school. And, after my 23 years of service, I'm even more proud. I can't imagine having to learn how to live again after suffering through such a tragic event. He returned from Okinawa a 100% DAV (Disabled American Veteran). Remember, if you love your freedom, take time to 'thank a Vet' and always pray that God continues to bless our United States of America.

A number of larger sites are available within the industrial park, some up to 300 acres or more.

The barge facility on Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway was built at a cost of \$2.6 million several years ago. The barge facility has a concrete pad ready for a large mobile crane. The port authority is working on the engineering, permit, and ROW acquisition for a rail spur to Highway 72. As funds become available, the rail spur will be extended to the barge facility.

For the Mississippi Supreme Court, the county backed the winner, Josiah Coleman, an Oxford attorney, and grandson of former Mississippi governor J. C. Coleman, for whom one of the county's state parks is named. He won 64 percent of the county vote, and voters across the supreme court District 3 had the same idea - he won with 58 percent, over Flip Phillips, who was perceived as supported by trial lawyers.

Time to Observe "Save for Retirement Week"

October 21 through 27 is National Save for Retirement Week, established by Congress to remind Americans of the importance of — you guessed it — saving for retirement. So why not mark the occasion by considering ways in which you can boost your own financial resources for those years in which you're officially a "retiree"?

If you're somewhat concerned about your financial prospects during retirement, you're not alone. Check out a few of the findings from the Employee Benefit Research Institute's 2012 Retirement Confidence Survey:

- Just 14% of workers are very confident they will have enough money to live comfortably in retirement.

- Sixty percent of workers report that the total value of their household's savings and investment, excluding the value of their primary home and any defined benefit plans, is less than \$25,000.

- More than half of workers report that they and/or their spouse have not tried to calculate how much money they will need to live comfortably in retirement.

In these challenging economic times, it can be challenging to pay your living expenses and still have money left over to save for retirement. But you can take some steps to help your cause. Here are a few to consider:

- Pay yourself first. Every time you get paid, move some money — even if it's only a small amount — from your checking or savings account into an investment. Make it easier on yourself by having your bank move the money automatically.

- Boost your 401(k) contributions. Whenever your salary goes up, increase your 401(k) contributions. Your money can grow on a tax-deferred basis, which means it can accumulate faster than if it were placed in an investment on which you paid taxes every year.

- Control your debts. It's never easy, but try to reduce your debts as much as possible. The less money you need to devote to debt payments, the more you can add to your investments.

- Build an emergency fund. Try to build an emergency fund containing six to 12 months' worth of living expenses, kept in a liquid account. This fund can help you avoid dipping into your retirement accounts to help pay for unexpected costs, such as a big doctor's bill, a new furnace or a costly car repairs.

- Create a retirement income strategy. It's important to project your living expenses during retirement. Then, once you have at least a good estimate, you can create a long-term strategy — involving your investments, retirement accounts, Social Security benefits and all other financial resources — to help you achieve the retirement income you will need. To calculate these figures and develop such a strategy, you may want to work with a financial advisor.

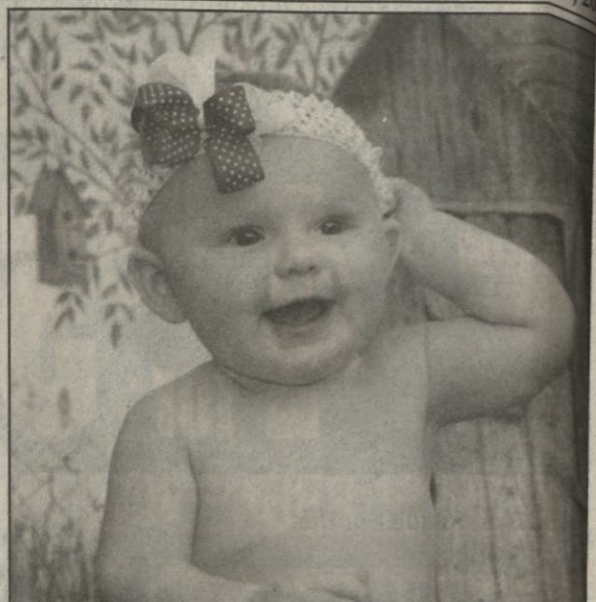

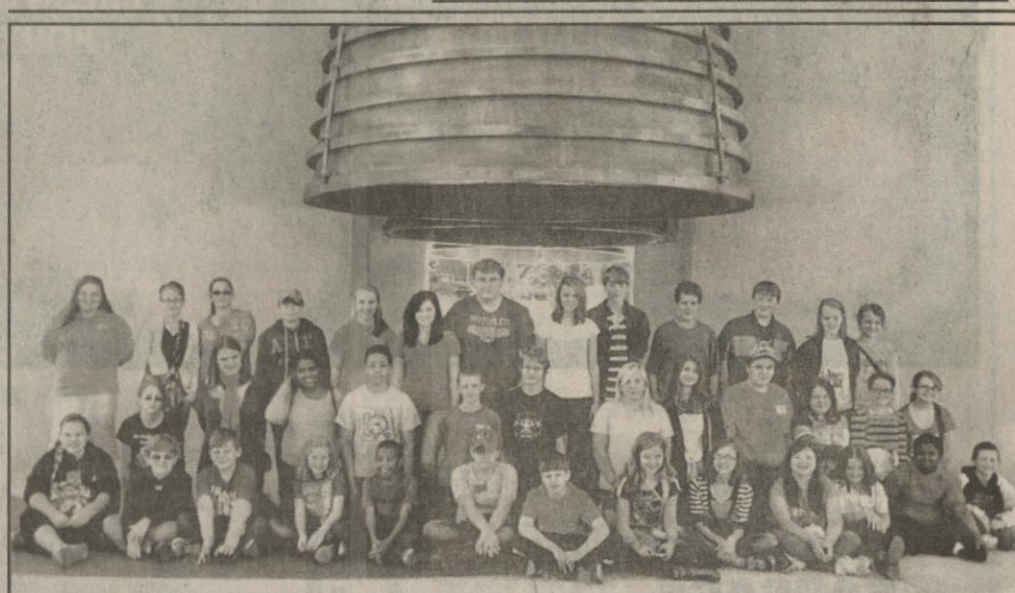

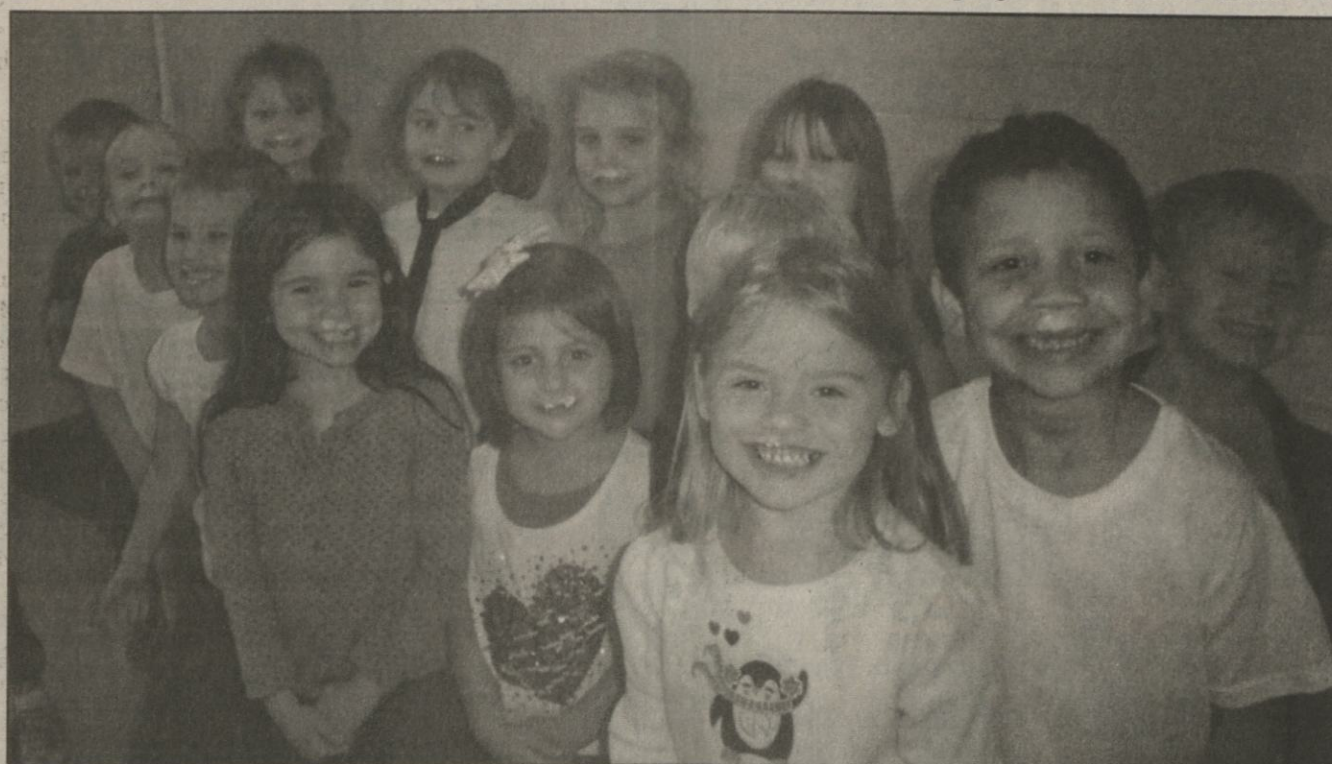
National School Lunch Week October 15th - 19th

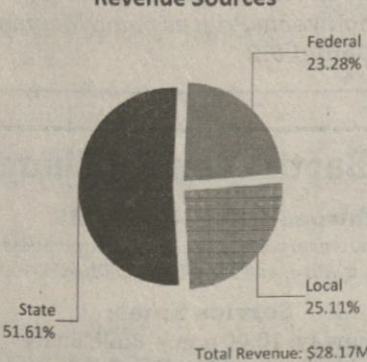

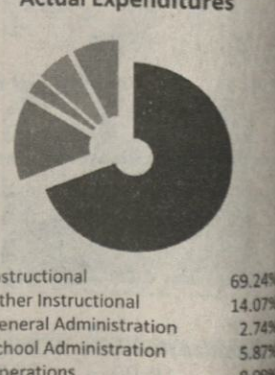
