County Picks Up Suspected Robber of Iuka, Tupelo, Booneville Banks

In the late afternoon Monday, Tishomingo County deputies stopped a suspect in connection with two bank robberies in the last three days, and possibly the one in Iuka in late August.

About 4:20 p.m. Monday, a man walked into the Renasant Bank at 3690 No. Gloster, Tupelo, demanding money, and then fled on foot. Lee County issued a BOLO (be on the lookout) for a silver Toyota pickup with Alabama tags and Auburn stickers on it.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, in response to the BOLO, Tishomingo County Chief Deputy Mike Kemp stopped a truck matching that description on the Natchez Trace near the intersection with Highway 25, just south of Tishomingo after 5 p.m.

Brian Jones, 35, of Toney, Alabama (near Huntsville) was driving and when they approached the truck, it smelled like marijuana, and he reportedly admitted to having marijuana. There was no one else with him, said sheriff Whitlock.

In custody at the Tishomingo County Jail, he was charged with possession of

a misdemeanor amount of marijuana, and also for possession of a controlled substance, for some pills he had that authorities were still identifying Tuesday morning.

In an interview with Iuka City Police, who have jurisdiction for the Iuka's August 16th robbery of Renasant Bank, Jones admitted to robbing the Tupelo Renasant Bank Monday, Booneville's Renasant on

Friday, and Iuka's August 16th. He was also connected to another bank robbery in Tupelo about a month ago. He had cash with him that could

possibly be connected to the Monday robbery in Tupelo.

Iuka City Police will turn the case in to the Grand Jury, said Chief Randy Stringer.

Lady Braves Beat Belmont!

First Time in Seven Years for Heated Cross County Rivalry

It's no secret that the TCHS-Belmont rivalry burns in the hearts of all Tishomingo Countians, but Friday night, the Tishomingo County girl basketball team managed to turn the tables when they beat the storied Belmont girls basketball team 41-39 at Belmont.

It was a night celebrating the Belmont girls' basketball legend - the school was dedicating and renaming their gymnasium in honor of Malcolm Kuykendall, recently retired superintendent of Tishomingo County Schools, but famous in Mississippi high school basketball for multiple state titles, and even more appearances in the state title games. Most of those titles were earned when he coached Belmont girls, and the gym literally "already bears his name" on a dozen title banners hanging there, as noted by Tishomingo County School Board President Michael Puckett in his remarks at the dedication, at halftime of the girls' game.

Belmont's current team had already managed, in overtime, to beat TC on Monday in the TC gym, so it was doubly sweet for the Lady Braves to get their first victory in seven years on the Lady Cardinals.

Most recent years, the games have been neck-and-neck - Belmont worked for the wins they got, because TCHS just couldn't get past the mentality that they could beat the Lady Cardinals.

"They have a very respectable program each year, and a tough squad this season, but we came out with the right game plan, a chip on our shoulder, and determination to leave our best game on the court, and we did," said second year coach Lauren Whitson. "Every player who stepped on the court performed their job to the best of their ability and that's all I ask of them."

She praised the leadership of seniors Shimei Carter, Anna Claire Griffin and Haley Price on both ends of the floor. Juniors Megan Lomenick, Deldra McCoy, Annsley McRae and Audrey South contributed their best, and sophomores

Kalee Nash and Erika Carmack had strong performances, giving promise for the future of TC Lady Brave basketball.

TC plays at Corinth at 6 p.m. next Tuesday, November 27th. Later that week, on Thursday at the New Site Tournament they play the winner of Mantachie v Saltillo at 5:30, and then Friday at 6:30 in the finals.

The Braves lead the young Belmont team throughout the game, and only in the final minutes, amidst a rain of foul calls, and free throws, did the Cardinals pull ahead enough for a victory. Final score was 63-59.

Dr. Bob and Sylvia Ferguson Recognized as Delta State University's "Philanthropist of the Year" for 2012

CLEVELAND, Miss. -- Delta State University announces Dr. Bob and Sylvia Ferguson as the University's "Philanthropist of the Year" for 2012.

Bob and Sylvia Ferguson, natives of New Albany, co-founded the Tri State Educational Foundation in 1998 and have since provided more than six million dollars in scholarships and grant money to support the educational needs of students who are residents within a 50 mile radius of Iuka. Over one million dollars of the six million dollars has supported scholarships and academic programs at Delta State University.

Tri State Educational Foundation is partnering with Delta State University through the College of Education to give scholarships to teachers

in Tishomingo County, in order to attain their Master of Elementary Education degree. The financial support is also evident in the College of Arts and Sciences through scholarships and support of various programs such as the Delta Music Institute and the Delta Center of Culture and Learning. Scholarships provided by Tri State Educational Foundation are supporting the University's recently announced \$15 million Scholarship Initiative.

The Fergusons work daily overseeing day-to-day operations of the Tri State Educational Foundation with its board members: Nancy Brown (Iuka), Sara Ellington (Corinth), Judy Schaper (Saltillo) and Dana Degraw (Iuka).

Dr. Bob Ferguson is a 1962 graduate of Delta

State where he earned his B.S.E. in Art and Physical Education and was a member of the Statesmen football team. He earned the Master of Education Degree in 1966 from the University of Kansas and Educational Doctorate from the University of Southern Mississippi in 1979. His tenure in P-12 education began with coaching and progressing through the positions of principal and superintendent in Long Beach Schools, Tishomingo County Schools, and the Picayune School District. Dr. Ferguson's service extends to tenure as State President of the Southern Association for Colleges and Schools, and he has been a recipient of a Ford Foundation Fellowship.

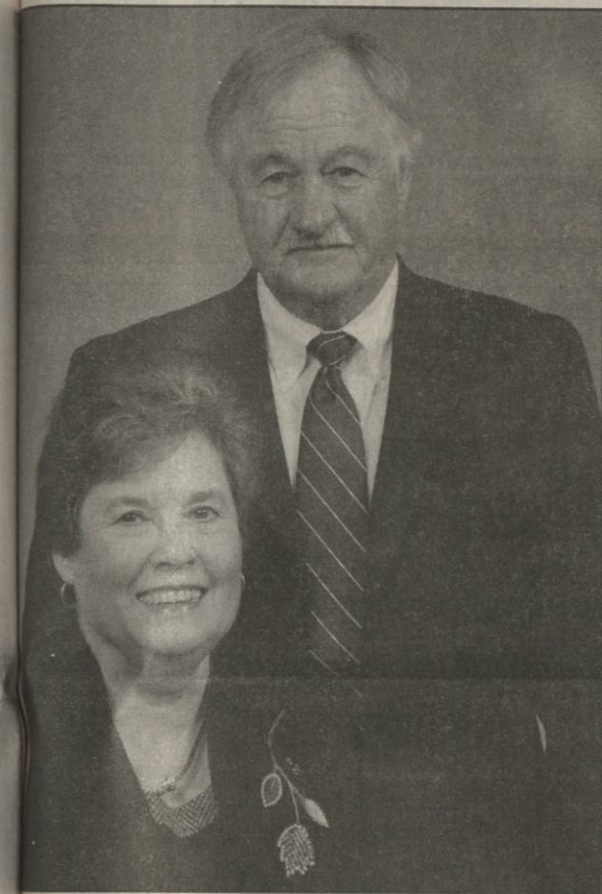

Quail Season Opens Thanksgiving Day

JACKSON - Mississippi's statewide bobwhite quail hunting season will open November 22, 2012 and continue through March 2, 2013. There is a daily bag limit of eight quail.

Several public lands around the state offer quail hunting opportunities, but hunters should be prepared to put in some time to find birds. "The 2012 quail hatch was good where habitat was suitable. Some of the best places to find quail during the hunting season are in or near thicker cover patches or edges associated with fields and upland forests with grassy ground cover," said Dave Godwin, MDWFP Small Game Program Coordinator.

Many hunters and landowners have observed the decline in quail populations throughout much of their range. The primary cause of this decline has been the gradual loss of suitable habitat due to changes in land use and

management. The declining use of prescribed fire as a land management tool and changes in agricultural practices are major factors that have affected quail habitat suitability. However, quail habitat quality on agricultural and upland forest lands can be improved with appropriate management practices.

MDWFP biologists are working to reverse the declining bobwhite population trend by improving habitat and providing technical guidance on public and private lands. "There have been a number of positive things happening for quail habitat in some localized areas, and we will continue to

work to build on what has been started. We need suitable habitat at larger scales to achieve sustainable quality hunting opportunities," said Rick Hamrick, MDWFP Small Game Biologist. "This often involves reaching out and providing guidance to multiple landowners within a local community to increase the scale of suitable habitat available to birds."

Leander Lycurgus Pickett, son of James Cochran Pickett and Martha Van House Pickett, was born February 27, 1859, in Burnsville, Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Although nine children were born in the household, only Leander and three siblings made it to adulthood. By the 1870 census, the Pickett family had left Mississippi and relocated to Hopkins County, Texas.

Leander's humble beginnings in Tishomingo County did not make him shortsighted in what he desired to accomplish in life. He became a minister, songwriter, and composer of music. Leander was a Methodist evangelist and conducted meetings in a number of states and at holiness campgrounds. He and his wife, Ludie, served in northeast Texas, Columbia, South Carolina, and possibly elsewhere, before settling in Wilmore, Kentucky. The two of them were prominent local players in the founding of Asbury College in Wilmore in 1890, and Leander served as the financial agent of the Board of Trustees for many years. Leander and

his wife also boarded young ministry students from Asbury. In 1905, a prayer meeting among the students at the Pickett home spilled out to the Asbury College campus in a revival that spread around the town of Wilmore. Perhaps the Picketts' greatest gift to the world was their son, Jarrell Washom Pickett, who attended Asbury College and became a missionary to India, rising as high as Bishop of the Methodist Church in India.

Leander wrote lyrics to many songs, including *Hallelujah! Jesus Saves Me*; *Wonderful Story of Love*; *It Is for Us All Today*; and *Some Mother's Child*. Some of Leander's works include:

Leander Pickett died May 9, 1928 in Middleborough, Bell County, Kentucky. He and his wife, Ludie, are both buried in Wilmore, Jessamine County, Ky.

NMHS Receives 2012 Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award

North Mississippi Health Services was named today as one of four U.S. organizations to receive the 2012 Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award, the nation's highest Presidential honor for performance excellence through innovation, improvement and visionary leadership.

In addition to NMHS in the health care category, the U.S. Commerce Secretary Rebecca Blank named three other recipients. They are Lockheed Martin Missiles and Fire Control, Grand Prairie, Texas (aerospace); MESA Products, Inc., Tulsa, Okla. (small business); and City of Irving, Texas (non-profit).

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the award and the Baldrige Performance Excellence Program (BPEP) that supports it. North Mississippi Health Services, NMHS' flagship hospital, won the Baldrige Award in 2006. NMHS and NMHS hold the distinction of being the only Baldrige recipients in Mississippi. NMHS shared the honor with Mesa, the small business recipient.

"The four organizations recognized today with the 2012 Baldrige Award are leaders in the truest sense of the word and role models that others in the health care, nonprofit and business sectors worldwide strive to emulate," said Commerce Secretary Blank. "They have set the bar high for innovative practices, dynamic management, financial performance, outstanding employee and customer interaction, and most of all, their unwavering commitment to excellence and results."

We are honored to receive the Baldrige Award which recognizes 'role model' performance and demonstrates a long-term commitment to focusing on the right things," said John T. Scott, NMHS president and executive officer. After submitting its ap-

plication in May, NMHS hosted a site visit by a team of Baldrige examiners in early October. The team visited multiple locations throughout the health care system and interviewed approximately 600 people. They made stops throughout north Mississippi in Tupelo, Pontotoc, Baldwyn, Iuka, Columbus, Eupora, West Point and Hamilton, Ala.

"We had a fantastic site visit," said Karen Koch, NMHS administrator of organizational performance. "The Baldrige examiners were able to understand how fully engaged and caring that our staff and physicians are with our patients and their family members."

To date, more than 1,500 U.S. organizations have applied for the Baldrige Award and there are Baldrige-based award programs in nearly all 50 states. Internationally, the program has served as a model for nearly 100 quality programs. A December 2011 study by Albert N. Link and John T. Scott measuring the Baldrige Program's value to U.S. organizations conservatively estimated a benefit-to-cost ratio of 820 to 1, while a 2011 report by Thomson Reuters found that health care organizations that have won or been in the final review process for a Baldrige Award outperform other hospitals in all but one metric the company uses to determine its "100 Top Hospitals" in the nation (and were six times more likely to be among the top 100).

Bobby Martin of Ripley, past chairman of the NMHS Board of Directors, said, "In addition to being a great honor, this is a great learning opportunity for NMHS. The Baldrige process points out where we are strong and helps identify areas where we can improve our health care organization."

The 2012 Baldrige Award recipients were selected from a field of 39 applicants. All of the applicants

were evaluated rigorously by an independent board of examiners in seven areas defined by the Baldrige Criteria for Performance Excellence: leadership; strategic planning; customer focus; measurement, analysis and knowledge management; workforce focus; operations focus; and results. The evaluation process for each of the recipients included about 1,000 hours of review and an on-site visit by a team of examiners to clarify questions and verify information in the applications.

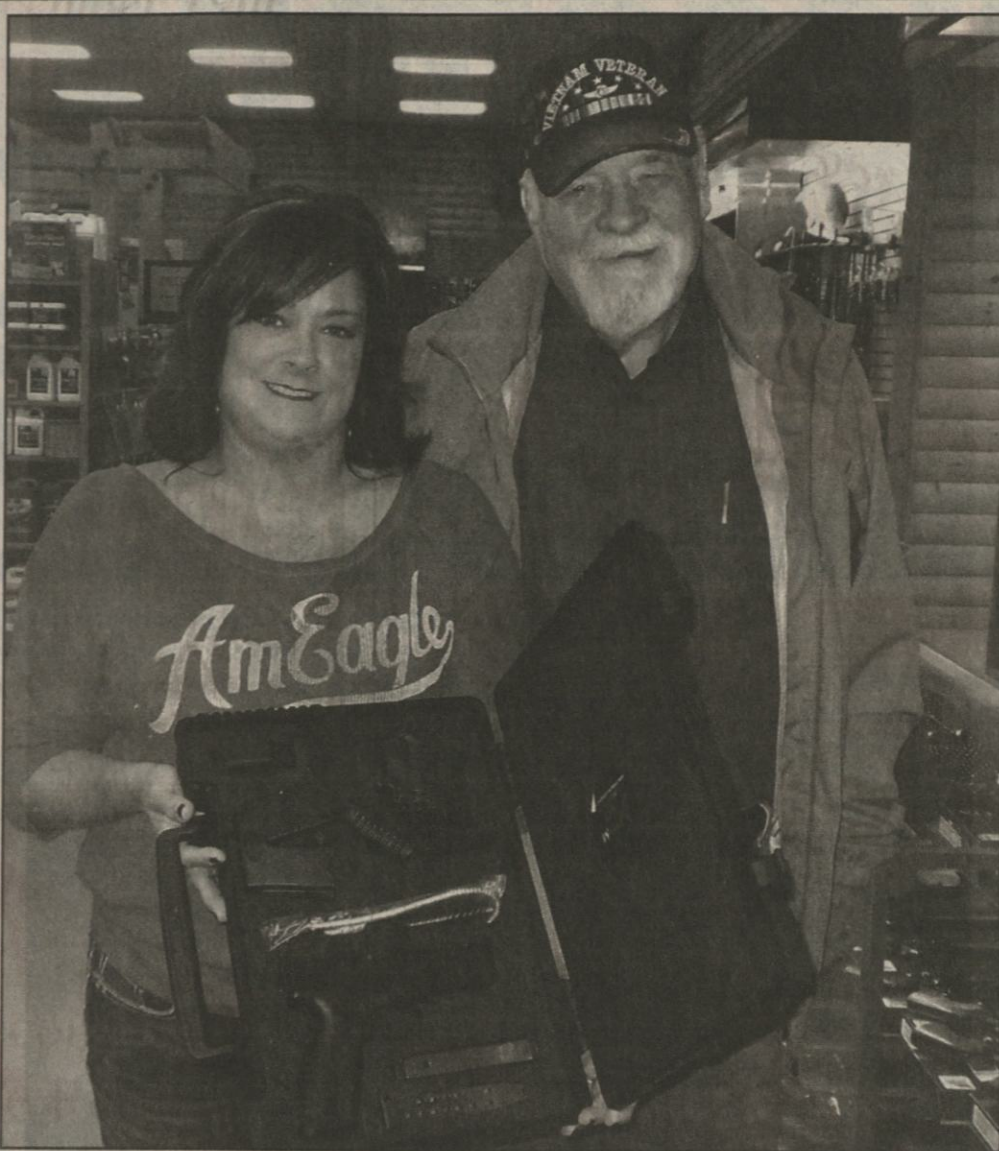
The 2012 Baldrige Award recipients are expected to be presented with their awards at an April 2013 ceremony in Baltimore, Md.

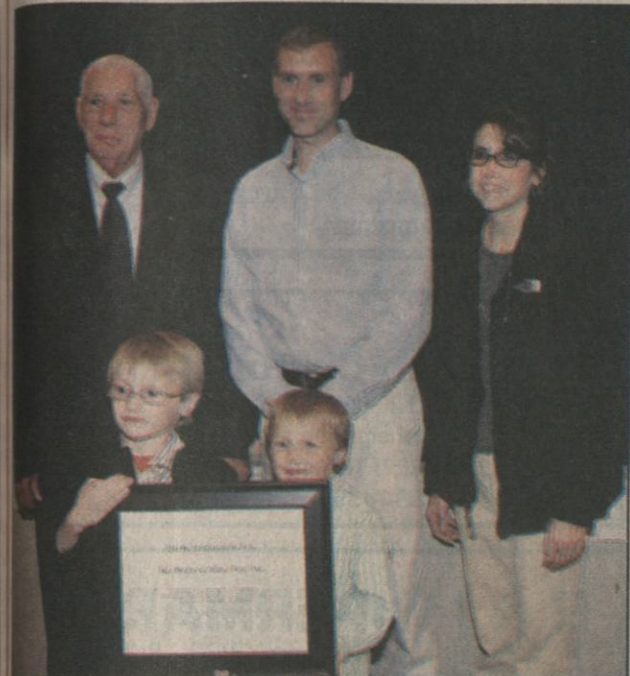

Annual Corinth Home and Garden Tour Nov. 30th

CORINTH, Miss. ... The annual Corinth Home and Garden Tour, normally held during the spring, will be a holiday event this year with home tours and other seasonal activities from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Friday, Nov. 30, and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Saturday, Dec. 1, in downtown Corinth.

The tour raises money to preserve the Verandah Curlee House, on Jackson Street. The house was built in 1857 for city co-founder Hamilton Mask and served as military headquarters during the Civil War. This year's tour - the fourth annual - features the home of Mr. and Mrs. Bailey Williams, 1302 Taylor St., which was built in 1885 on the Civil War site of Battery Powell. Also included in the ticket prices are performances of Christmas music in the historic Fillmore Street Chapel and demonstrations on creating Christmas centerpieces and gift wrapping on Friday and Saturday as well as a Teddy Bear tea for children at 11 a.m. Saturday that in-

cludes making an ornament and hearing a story read by Mr. and Mrs. Claus. In addition, tour organizers are hosting a sale of baked goods, wreaths, topiaries, forced bulbs and other holiday items in the Holiday Shoppe and the annual silent art auction, with works by local artists up for bid.

"Our tour raises money to renovate the Verandah Curlee House and at the same time showcases local talent through area musicians and artists in one of Corinth's finest historic homes," Marolt said. "We want visitors to come enjoy the seasonal flavor of Corinth."

The Strange Words And Strange Works Of God

I am using the word "strange" to show that many things that God says and does are strange to men, not that God is ever wrong about anything He does, for He is not! I listen to preachers and teachers very carefully, because I too am in that category, and I want to know what is being said by others in the same positions. I often hear the word "anointed" used in a way that is not exactly the same way the Bible uses it. Notice the wording of Isaiah 45:1: "Thus saith the LORD to His anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have holden, to subdue nations before him; and I will loose the loins of kings, to open before him the two leaved gates; and the gates shall not be shut." Who is Cyrus? He is the king of Persia who allowed Judah to return to their land after the Babylonian captivity. Actually, Isaiah wrote these words as prophesy, for Cyrus was not even born when Isaiah wrote. Nebuchadnezzar, the king of Babylon, would capture Judah, then seventy years later, after Persia had captured Babylon, Cyrus would release Judah from captivity.

If the word "anointed" should mean what some preachers think it means, then Cyrus was not only a saved man, but he was in great favor with God, but such is not the case, for Isaiah 45:4-5 says twice that Cyrus has not known God. So, the word "anointed" has to mean something different than some people suppose. It actually means that God had appointed Cyrus to do a job. He was not physically anointed with oil, but he was God's "anointed", in the sense that God had chosen him to be the king who would set Judah free. It may also seem strange that God would use an unsaved king to do His work, but He did in this case. Proverbs 21:1 says, The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD, as the rivers of water: He turneth it whithersoever He will." Do not worry, therefore, God is still doing what He has always intended to do. Isaiah 45:6 tells us why God chose Cyrus to release Judah: "That they may know from the rising of the sun, and from the west, that there is none beside Me. I am the LORD, and there is none else." God wants the entire earth to know that He is the only God. Then Isaiah 45:7 says, I form the light, and create darkness; I make peace, and create evil; I the LORD do all these things." "Evil", in our verse, does not mean "sin", rather, it means calamity, adversity, affliction etc. (Hebrew meanings). So, God is in charge of all that happens, even if He is not always pleased with it. The time will come when He will bring to a halt everything that is not within His will!

Be Alert: Avoiding Holiday Email Scams

The holiday season is upon us, and for many this means we increase our travel, shopping and charitable donations. Unfortunately, this also opens a door for scammers to take advantage of our additional online activity. Whether you are making flight reservations or purchasing the top gifts of the season, your email and personal accounts can become vulnerable. Before clicking on a deal that seems too good to be true, stop and think. Below is a list of holiday email scams to be alert for this season:

1. 'Tis the Season for Giving – Emails that come in during the holidays may ask you to support a cause with a monetary donation. We are all a little more generous during this time of year. Before clicking on any links or making your donation, do your research. If this is a legitimate charity, visit their website directly for detailed information. A credible charity will give you information describing its mission, how donations are distributed and proof that your contribution is tax deductible.

2. Heading Home for the Holidays – If you haven't purchased a flight home for the holidays, cautiously look at any email stating that an airline ticket has been purchased in your name. Call the airline immediately, and do not open the email. Hackers may attempt to place malicious software in a link of a fake airline ticket.

3. Thank You for the Card – E-cards are a popular and inexpensive way to deliver the season's greetings to family and friends. E-cards are also an easy way for hackers to install viruses and malware on your computer. Be careful when clicking on a link in an e-card as the hackers will often use logos from recognizable brands in order to appear legitimate. If you are concerned, delete the email immediately.

4. Oh Wow! A Package! – Emails that look like they are coming from familiar delivery services stating that a package can't be delivered tend to increase during the holiday season. The email typically asks the receiver to insure their order so it can be delivered properly. If the receiver enters a credit card, the scammer could be off shopping with your money. If you have made an online purchase and receive an email like this, contact the company you made the purchase from to inquire about delivery or track your purchase through the delivery website.

5. This Year's HOT Item – Beware of emails from websites claiming to have the "hot" gift of the season. If the deal seems too good to be true, it probably is. These fake websites will tempt you through an appealing email, directing you to their website, where upon ordering they gain access to your credit card and billing information. You probably won't get your gift, but instead, a very large bill. When shopping online, buy only from a reputable, known site.

6. A New Credit Card For Holiday Purchases – Of course, we can all use extra money during the holidays, and many credit card companies see the holidays as the perfect time of year to get new customers. Be cautious of emails from unfamiliar credit card providers. These cards can have high membership fees and interest rates, may only be used at specific stores or online, and can limit the products you are able to purchase. Don't accept these offers, but instead inquire for a card from a notable credit card company.

7. Local Holiday Events – False local news can be pushed to you via email, highlighting topics of interest like holiday events in your town. Beware when clicking on links as you may begin downloading viruses or malware. If you see a headline you are interested in, visit a trusted local news site rather than click on the link.

8. Holiday Spending – We all tend to shop until we drop during the holidays. So, we may not find it odd if we receive an email from the bank to verify account information. Instead, scammers are sending these emails asking customers to confirm their banking details and passwords. Unfortunately, the bank website is not the actual website. If the email seems suspicious, call your bank directly before sending any information.

If you think you have fallen victim to a scam, change the passwords or PINs on all your online accounts and place a fraud alert on your credit reports. Contact the bank, online merchant or charity directly to alert them of your concerns. As a best practice, routinely review your bank and credit card statements for any charges that you didn't initiate. Additionally, be sure your computer's antivirus software is up-to-date. This extra defense may help keep spam emails out of your inbox.

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE REGULATION OF THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF ANIMALS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, Section 21-19-9 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, hereby conveys upon municipalities within the State of Mississippi the direct authority to regulate the running of animals at large within the city limits of said municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi hereby find that it is necessary, in order to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi, to enact and ordinance governing the running at large of stray animals within the city limits of said Town; and

NOW THEREFORE, It is hereby ordained and adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi that the "Stray Animal Ordinance for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi" shall be as follows:

The owners of animals are required to do the following:

1. restrict the animal be it a dog, cat or other animal, from coming upon any public property as defined herein, in a humane way, whether it be by pen, chain, cable, leash, fencing, electronic fencing or otherwise; and
2. the animal must have proof of rabies vaccination and all other vaccinations required by any state, federal or local law; and
3. the animal must be tagged with the owner's name, address and telephone number on the tag.

Employees of the Town's Maintenance and Police departments are designated as "animal control officers" and will remove any and all animals that are found on public property including but not limited to the town parks, playing fields, parking lots, schools and other public property which are not confined to the owner's property and any diseased, abused or viscous animal found on public property as defined herein. The animal will be transported to a licensed veterinarian selected by the Town of Burnsville. The veterinarian will notify the owner of the animal if the animal is tagged and collared. Also, a notice of the animal's confinement, whether tagged or not, will be placed on the bulletin board inside the city hall. The owner will be responsible for all expenses incurred at the veterinarian's office including bathing, vaccinations and any other treatments necessary in the sole discretion of the veterinarian for the health and well being of the animal.

If the animal is not claimed and retrieved from the veterinarian within five days of capture, the veterinarian will be responsible for the euthanasia and disposal of the animal. In the alternative, the veterinarian may, after five days have elapsed and the animal has not been claimed, sell the animal and said funds shall be kept by the veterinarian to the extent that they satisfy the expenses incurred for the treatment and upkeep of the animal while in his care. All funds in excess of the amount of the expenses for the care and upkeep of the animal shall be paid over to the Town Clerk for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi within ten days of the receipt of the same.

Any animal control officer or police officer with probable cause to believe that a person has violated this ordinance may issue the person a citation charging the offender with a violation of the animal control ordinance and requiring the person to appear at the date and time certain before the municipal court of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi to answer to the charges.

Notwithstanding anything in this ordinance to the contrary, any animal(s) that are diseased, viscous, an immediate danger to public safety or not reasonably subject to capture or detainer, may, at the discretion of the animal control officer, be destroyed on sight.

The penalties for violation of the animal control ordinance are:

First Offense-Fine of \$25.00 to \$50.00 plus court costs.

Second Offense-Fine of \$50.00 to \$100.00 plus court costs.

Third or Subsequent Offense-Fine of \$100.00 to \$500.00 plus court costs and up to 10 days in jail.

In addition to these costs, the Court shall impose the costs of the expenses incurred at the veterinarian's office for the care, treatment and upkeep of the animal including euthanasia.

Legal service animals rendering service for legally handicapped persons, Canine units, and other service animals in the use of other government agencies are hereby exempted from this ordinance.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this ordinance in the

Tishomingo County News for the period of time as prescribed by law.

This ordinance was adopted on the 6 day of October, 2012 by a vote of 5 to 0 vote of the Board of Aldermen to take effect on the 1st day of January 2013.

vestment risk, you can also go to the other extreme by investing too conservatively.
