## Iuka Man Died in Wreck Early Monday

An 18-year-old Iuka man died in an apparent single-vehicle wreck off Highway 25 about a mile south of Iuka in the early morning hours of Tuesday.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, David Edward Gist, a 2012 graduate of Tishomingo County High School, was discovered about 2:30 a.m. by a sheriff's deputy. He was in his pickup truck where it apparently left the road and struck the rock lining a drainage ditch on the side of the road.

Wilemon said no one reported seeing the wreck, and that Gist was currently traveling southbound.

## Persons Man Dies in Fire Overnight Tuesday

A camper trailer near Alabama state line apparently burned in the night sometime late Tuesday or Wednesday, killing a man, according to authorities.

A passerby saw the camper-trailer on County Road 165, that apparently caught up during the night, and reported it about 6:30 a.m. Wednesday. County Road 165 is off Rock Creek Road nearly to the Alabama state line.

Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon said that the 20-ft. camper was occupied by Thomas Gist, 65. His body will be sent to the state crime lab for positive identification as required by the new medical examiner, Wilemon.

The dwelling was burned up, and fire investigators were on the scene Wednesday at presstime, trying to determine the cause.

## Bank Robbery Suspect Turned over to Feds

The suspect in the August robbery of an Iuka bank, who was apprehended near Tishomingo last week, has been turned over to federal authorities for prosecution.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, federal authorities are scheduled to present Brian Gist to a grand jury in Aberdeen or Oxford in three weeks. He is being charged with robberies of Renasant banks in Iuka, Booneville, and two in Tupelo.

He is still in custody in the Tupelo jail, said Stringer.

Teresa Darwin has been named Grand Marshall for the Iuka Christmas parade this Friday night.

Teresa and her husband, Sammy, were married for 38 years, and raised four children here in Iuka. She has been speaking recently at events and area churches of how she and her two daughters, Nikki and Beth and their families, are working through the life-shattering events of last year - she lost her 17-year-old daughter Kinsley to a sudden illness last March, and then her beloved Sammy died suddenly in May of a heart attack. Their son Jay died years ago in a childhood hunting accident.

Sammy was the announcer for the Iuka Parade for many years, and, with Teresa at his side, volunteered in many community events like Heritage Day, Iuka's Got Talent, and with their church, Mt. Evergreen United Methodist.

Teresa is the daughter of current Iuka Mayor Jackie and Burnette Bry-

ant, and was an assistant at Iuka Elementary School for several years and a substitute in the county schools, as well as a stay at home mom to her girls. Now, she takes care of her youngest grandson, Alex, son of her daughter Nikki and Nathaniel Clark, and looks forward to frequent visits from daughter Beth, and her husband Ryan, and their son Mac.

But, Mrs. Dawson is so much more.

She is a...strong Christian, devoted wife, mother to Kim and Angie; grandmother to four; great-grandmother to 6, well, almost 7; distinguished member of the Order of the Eastern Star; 4-H advisor; and 40 1/2 year veteran of the teaching wars.

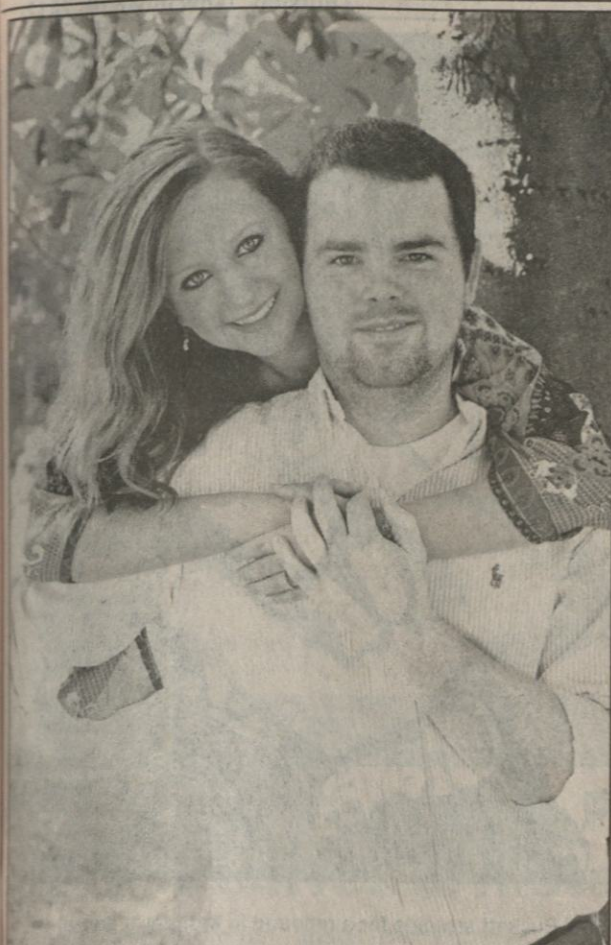

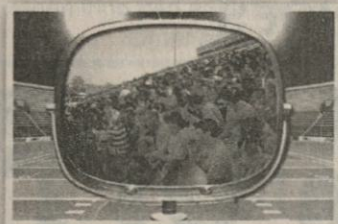

Barbara's Earthquake Cake was a winner at the Bake-Off contest held November 3 at First Presbyterian Christian Academy in Hinesville, GA. Barbara and her husband, the late Pat Cooper, owned a bar-b-que restaurant in Georgia for many years and Barbara is known for her outstanding cooking ability and no doubt, many of her skills were taught to her by her mother, Margaret King of Iuka. Barbara got the recipe for Earthquake Cake while attending a 1956 class reunion in Iuka from Pauline Johnson and wants to share it with our readers.

### Earthquake Cake or Dolop Cake

1 box of Duncan Hines German Chocolate Cake Mix  
1 cup of Chopped Pecans  
1 cup of Shredded Coconut  
1-8oz. pkg. of Cream Cheese (soften)  
1 stick of Oleo (soften)  
1-16 oz. box of Powdered Sugar

Mix together the pecans and coconut and place them in the bottom of a greased sheet cake pan.

Mix cake mix as directed on box and pour on top of the nut and coconut mixture in the pan.

Mix the cream cheese and the oleo together and add the box of powdered sugar and mix well. Take a quart zip lock bag and put the mixture in it and then cut the corner of the bag and squirt or swirl the mixture over the cake mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 50-55 minutes or until cake pulls from pan.

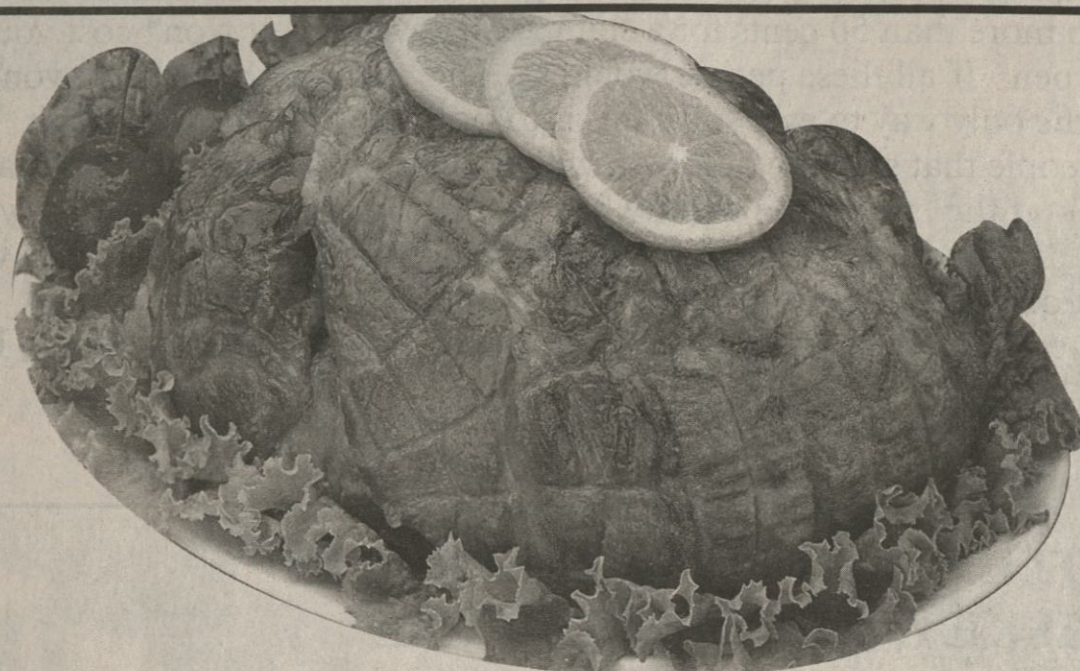

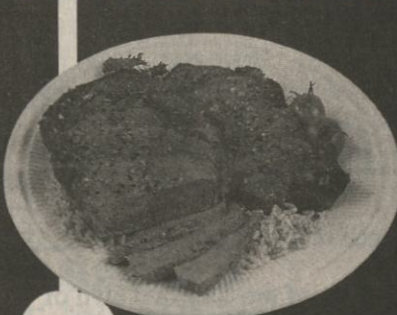

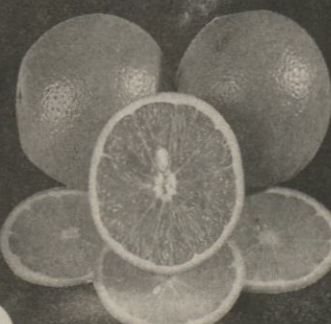

### Are You One Of God's Anointed?

Anointed is a word often misused by good preachers, who use such statements as: "God's anointing was really on the preacher today." Without meaning to sound critical, I wish we could use Bible words the same way the Bible uses them. In the Old Testament the word "anoint" was used for the anointing of objects in the tabernacle and temple; of kings; of priests and of prophets. In the New Testament it is used of the anointing of Jesus to preach to the poor etc. (See Luke 4:16-20, with verses 18-19 coming from Isaiah 61:1-2a.) The word "anointed" is also used of the anointing with oil, which was done by the apostles in Mark 6:13; it is also used in James 5:14 concerning anointing the sick with oil. I will not cover these occurrences of the word "anointed", since that is not my purpose here. I do want to say that all of the kings of Judah were considered to be God's anointed, even though some of them were very ungodly. So, the word "anointed" did not necessarily mean that God's blessing or power was on the one who had been anointed.

I really want to cover the word "anointing", or "anointed", as it is used in the gospels and the church epistles. We actually have four references in the New Testament concerning Christ as God's anointed:

Luke 4:18; Acts 4:27; Acts 10:38; Hebrews 1:9. We have thirteen references in the New Testament where "anoint", or some form of the word, is used to speak of a physical anointing with oil or perfumes etc. (as for Jesus burial). These references are: Mt. 6:17; Mark 6:13; 14:8; 16:1; Luke 7:38; 7:46 twice; John 9:6, 11; 11:2; 12:3; James 5:14; Rev. 3:18.

We have only three other places where the word "anoint" or "anointing" is used; they are II Corinthians

1:21: "Now He which stablisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us is God." Verse 22 says,

"Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts." I John 2:27 says, "But the anointing which ye have received of Him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in Him." I John 2:20 says, "But ye have an unction from the Holy One, and ye know all things." The word "unction" in this verse is the exact same Greek word as the word "anointing". The conclusion that we should draw is that every saved person has the anointing in him, because the word "anointed", or "anointing" is referring to the Holy Spirit in these references. He lives in every saved person, according to Romans 8:9 and Galatians 4:6. So, the more accurate thing to say about a person who is being used of God in a special way is not the word "anointing", rather

it is the term "filled with the Spirit" (see Ephesians 5:18). I am not mad at anyone who misuses the word "anointing"; I just think it would be less confusing if we all used words in the way the Bible uses them. The idea of anointing objects, etc. is an Old Testament idea and is never taught in any church epistle.

### ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE REGULATION OF THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF ANIMALS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, Section 21-19-9 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, hereby conveys upon municipalities within the State of Mississippi the direct authority to regulate the running of animals at large within the city limits of said municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi hereby find that it is necessary, in order to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi, to enact and ordinance governing the running at large of stray animals within the city limits of said Town; and

NOW THEREFORE, It is hereby ordained and adopted by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi that the "Stray Animal Ordinance for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi" shall be as follows:

The owners of animals are required to do the following:

1. restrict the animal be it a dog, cat or other animal, from coming upon any public property as defined herein, in a humane way, whether it be by pen, chain, cable, leash, fencing, electronic fencing or otherwise; and
2. the animal must have proof of rabies vaccination and all other vaccinations required by any state, federal or local law; and
3. the animal must be tagged with the owner's name, address and telephone number on the tag. Employees of the Town's Maintenance and Police departments are designated as "animal control officers" and will remove any and all animals that are found on public property including but not limited to the town parks, playing fields,

parking lots, schools and other public property which are not confined to the owner's property and any diseased, abused or vicious animal found on public property as defined herein. The animal will be transported to a licensed veterinarian selected by the Town of Burnsville. The veterinarian will notify the owner of the animal if the animal is tagged and collared. Also, a notice of the animal's confinement, whether tagged or not, will be placed on the bulletin board inside the city hall. The owner will be responsible for all expenses incurred at the veterinarian's office including bathing, vaccination and any other treatments necessary in the sole discretion of the veterinarian for the health and well being of the animal.

If the animal is not claimed and retrieved from the veterinarian within five days of capture, the veterinarian will be responsible for the euthanasia and disposal of the animal. In the alternative, the veterinarian may, after five days have elapsed and the animal has not been claimed, sell the animal and said funds shall be kept by the veterinarian to the extent that they satisfy the expenses incurred for the treatment and upkeep of the animal while in his care. All funds in excess of the amount of the expenses for the care and upkeep of the animal shall be paid over to the Town Clerk for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi within ten days of the receipt of the same. Any animal control officer or police officer with probable cause to believe that a person has violated this ordinance may issue the person a citation charging the offender with a violation of the animal control ordinance and requiring the person to appear at the date and time certain before the municipal court of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi to answer to the charges.

Notwithstanding anything in this ordinance to the contrary, any animal(s) that are diseased, vicious, an immediate danger to public safety or not reasonably subject to capture or detainer, may, at the discretion of the animal control office, be destroyed on sight.

The penalties for violation of the animal control ordinance are:

First Offense-Fine of \$25.00 to \$50.00 plus court costs.  
Second Offense-Fine of \$50.00 to \$100.00 plus court costs.  
Third or Subsequent Offense-Fine of \$100.00 to \$500.00 plus court costs and up to 10 days in jail. In addition to these costs, the Court shall impose the costs of the expenses incurred at the veterinarian's office for the care, treatment and upkeep up the animal including euthanasia.

Legal service animals rendering service for legally handicapped persons, Canine units, and other service animals in the use of other government agencies are hereby exempted from this ordinance.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this ordinance in the Tishomingo County News for the period of time as prescribed by law.

This ordinance was adopted on the 6 day of October, 2012 by a vote of 5 to 0 vote of the Board of Aldermen to take effect on the 1st day of January 2013.
