Iuka Businessman Bobby James Dies After Extended Illness

Retired Iuka businessman, Bobby James died Friday at his home following an extended illness. Well-known throughout the area, Bobby and his wife Ruby, were in the restaurant business in Iuka for 33 years and Bobby also served the public as an Iuka Police Officer, a deputy for the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, and Constable of the First District.

In 1967 Bobby and Ruby bought the Iuka landmark Claude Curtis Café on Main Street and earned the secret to serving up the famous slug burgers and chili dogs.

Over the years Bobby also owned the Gulf Station in Iuka and from 1982 to 1985 the James' owned a furniture store on Front Street where the old Cutshall Furniture was and now Mike Cook's office is located.

In 1985 Bobby and Ruby built a new café and car wash at the intersection of Hwy. 25 and where the Shell station now stands. Business was good, and in September of 1989 when Shell

decided to build at the intersection, Bobby moved his business to its present location on 25 N. and expanded it with more serving area and outdoor seating. Today it is still called B.J.'s Corner Café and still serves the famous Claude Curtis/Bobby James slugburgers.

Thriving Burnsville Business Still on Hold After Thanksgiving Weekend Fire

A November 25th fire in the night has destroyed one, and devastated another business in the Burnsville Shopping Center.

Around 2:30 in the morning the Sunday after Thanksgiving, Andrew Williams got a call that his Bushwhacker's Salon was filled with smoke, due to a fire in the adjoining unit on the west side of his place.

A game room that was part of Pier 72 and Bushwhackers ended up with extensive damage, and the landowner is scheduled to completely "gut" it, according to Williams. Tim Grissom still owned the Pier 72 Pizza and the game room at the time of the fire, though it was reportedly sold and has since changed hands. No one

was hurt in the fire. Bushwhackers and Grissom both rent the space.

Bushwhackers didn't actually have fire, but the smoke filled the area between the dropped ceiling and the roof, and the insulation was damaged, and is falling apart already.

Forced to wait on insurance action from the responsible insurer, Williams and his staff can not use the building where his newly renovated salon is, nor can they clean up, or even take supplies like shampoo out, he said. A local business owner, Tans-and-More, has graciously allowed Andrew and his other stylists to use a salon area in their shop. They are currently seeing all their regular clients, some who come from as far as Cullman and Memphis, at that

location, said Williams.

Williams said many decisions need to be made, and he is considering relocating, or rebuilding - a heartbreaking decision for the businessman who has operated the thriving salon for many years. He had just renovated the salon to include stations for several other stylists.

"I'm the only one being hurt by this, and every day we can't work there it's very frustrating," said Williams while showing the damage on Monday.

Cause of the fire is still under investigation, said Burnsville fire authorities.

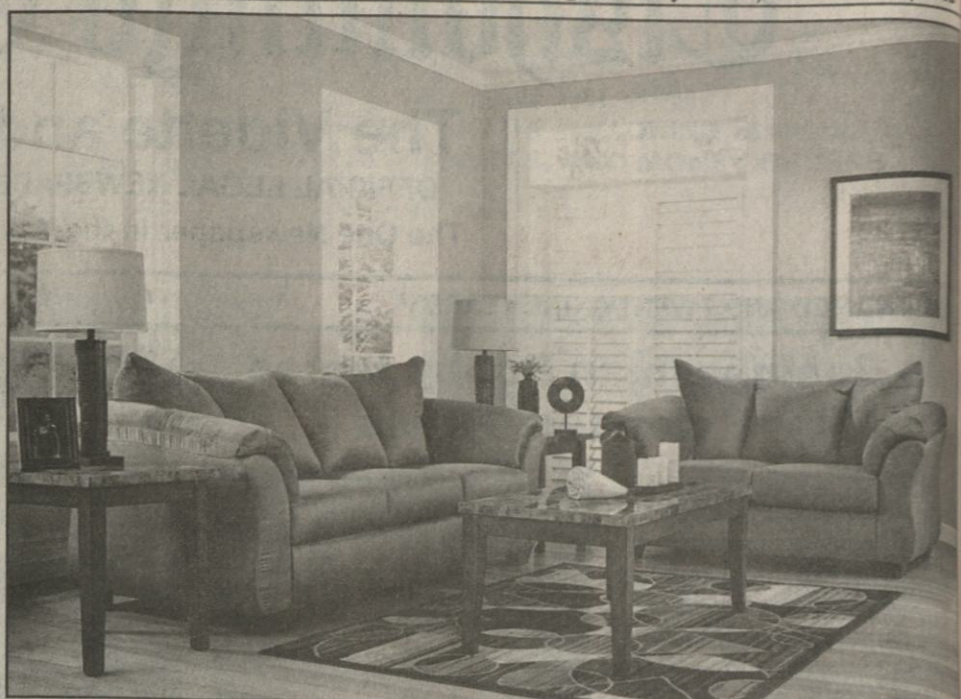

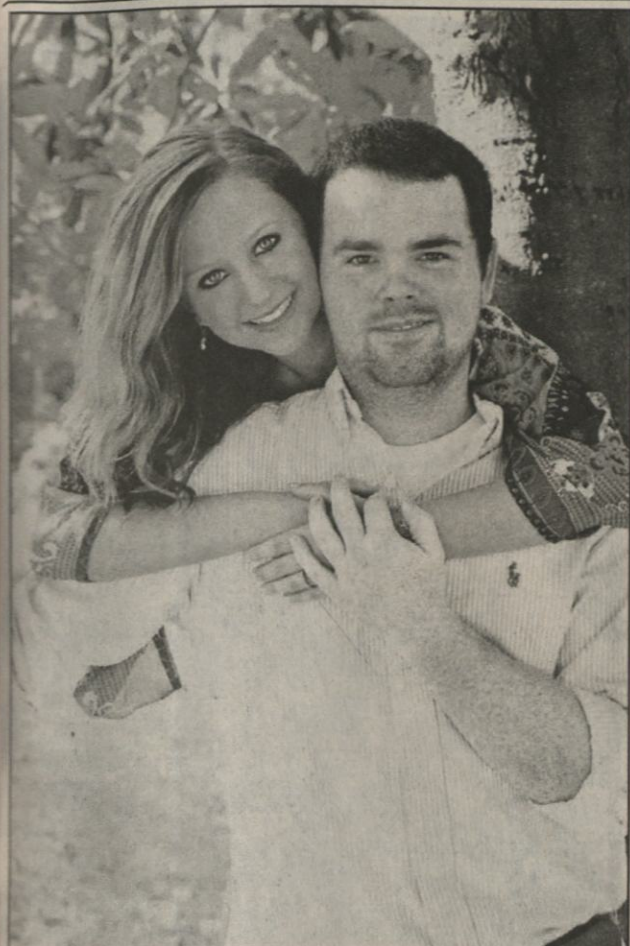

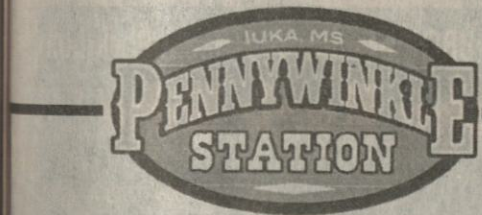

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate, and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability. Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Debbie Walker, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3206 or writing her at the following address: Tishomingo County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Head Starts, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly described the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

The Tishomingo County School District provides services to students who have a physical, mental, cognitive, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.

Twin Magnolias, referred to as the Coman House in some sources, was

the home of Major J. M. Coman, who was an early settler and one of the county's first elected officials. The house was moved from Eastport, as were many in those early days of settlement. It was in this house that the battle flag of Company K Second Mississippi under command of Captain Stone, later governor of the state, was made. In this house also was instituted the first nursing association of the town under the direction of Mrs. Elizabeth Coman, where the women of the town made first aid kits and bandages for the Confederate soldiers.

After the Battle of Iuka, when every home in the town was open to the wounded and dying of both armies, many were brought to this house and all the beds were turned over to the wounded. General Henry Little, of Maryland, used it as his headquarters, and when he was killed at the



beginning of the battle, he was buried in the flower garden until after the war.

The Battle of Iuka ornament honors the 150th anniversary of the historic Civil War battle in September of 1862.
