"If you don't already realize you should know that Tishongo Countians spend a lot money already shopping in rinth," said Aldridge. "If liquor re is legal, it will help them to have to go all the way to the als or to Tennessee to buy; Tishomingo County still loses otential revenue, in addition ust giving county consumers nother reason to shop somere other than our county."

He says he's not doing it so that he will benefit, but because the county is missing out on thousands in taxes that go to Alabama. Tennessee and Corinth (where beer sales are already legal).

But under the law that allowed Corinth to vote, Iuka could also vote for legalization within the city limits, and Aldridge, an Iuka resident, is also pursuing that

Senate Bill 2497, which took effect in January 2012, permits any city of 5,000 or more population, or any county seat in a county which has voted against coming out from under the dry law, to hold an election to come out from under Mississippi's dry law if 20 percent or more of the city's registered voters sign a petition to do so.

For the Iuka petition, started just a few months ago, Aldridge only needs 390 voters' signatures. He already has 80, and he hasn't really pushed the Iuka effort yet.

"I feel stronger about the chances for the city of Iuka, but the county would lose out on those taxes," says Aldridge. So he's still pushing the county effort.

Iuka city elections will be in June 2013, and the possibility of a legalization vote being on that ballot should make for an interesting campaign for city candidates. If the legalization vote is successful, the city board will make decisions on zoning and other sales ration campaign, doggedly requirements. The Iuka city treasuing signatures of any sury would stand to gain from an increase in tax revenue, as officials have said several times in the past year that the city budget is pretty
