Corinth Votes 2 to 1 for Legalization; What Will it Mean to Tishomingo County?

Tishomingo County stands to lose even more tax money to neighboring counties and cities that have legal liquor and beer, now that voters in Corinth approved on Tuesday a new state law that allows legal liquor and wine sales.

Local legalization proponent Charles Aldridge said Corinth voters approved the measure Tuesday by a margin of more than 2-1 in the first election under a new state law that allows only votes on liquor.

Unofficial totals of 2,641 votes for the measure and 1,150 votes against showed 70 percent of voters favored allowing the sale of liquor and wine, which had been outlawed since a countywide vote in 1989, while 30 percent opposed. Of those totals, 227 absentee ballots and about 50 affidavit ballots did not change the outcome.

Aldridge has predicted that if he could ever get enough people to put their name on the petition, legalization would pass 70 percent to 30 percent here — just like Corinth.

"If you don't already realize you should know that Tishomingo Countians spend a lot of money already shopping in Corinth," said Aldridge. "If liquor is legal, it will help them to have to go all the way to the states or to Tennessee to buy; Tishomingo County still loses potential revenue, in addition to just giving county consumers another reason to shop somewhere other than our county."

For the past two years, Aldridge has been a one-man legalization campaign, doggedly pursuing signatures of any Tishomingo County voters to make up 20 percent. He lacks signatures, but when he gets them (not "if—" he's committed

to completing it no matter how long it takes) the county board of supervisors is obligated to set an election.

He says he's not doing it so that he will benefit, but because the county is missing out on thousands in taxes that go to Alabama, Tennessee and Corinth (where beer sales are already legal).

But under the law that allowed Corinth to vote, Iuka could also vote for legalization within the city limits, and Aldridge, an Iuka resident, is also pursuing that option.

Senate Bill 2497, which took effect in January 2012, permits any city of 5,000 or more population, or any county seat in a county which has voted against coming out from under the dry law, to hold an election to come out from under Mississippi's dry law if 20 percent or more of the city's registered voters sign a petition to do so.

For the Iuka petition, started just a few months ago, Aldridge only needs 390 voters' signatures. He already has 80, and he hasn't really pushed the Iuka effort yet.

"I feel stronger about the chances for the city of Iuka, but the county would lose out on those taxes," says Aldridge. So he's still pushing the county effort.

Iuka city elections will be in June 2013, and the possibility of a legalization vote being on that ballot should make for an interesting campaign for city candidates. If the legalization vote is successful, the city board will make decisions on zoning and other sales requirements. The Iuka city treasury would stand to gain from an increase in tax revenue, as officials have said several times in the past year that the city budget is pretty tight.



Businessman and Veteran Law Officer, Red Taylor, Dies

Another veteran law enforcement officer for Tishomingo County and the City of Iuka has passed away. James R. "Red" Taylor, 72, died Monday, December 10th at the Sanctuary Hospice House in Tupelo following an extended illness.

His law enforcement career started in 1969 and ended in 2004. He served Sheriff Chester Dawson as Chief Deputy and worked as a patrolman with the City of Iuka for the remainder of the time, spending most of his time on the night shift. He also worked as a policeman during the early years.

Most all young people who grew up in the 1970's have a Big Red story. His size and stern warnings sent many teenagers home before curfew. His seriousness was always as bad as it appeared.

He usually had a quick smile that followed his orders and he enjoyed aggravating everyone, even his fellow officers. Everyone who worked with him knew he was not scared to tackle anything - except a snake! Red retired in 2004 due to health problems.

Red was also a businessman in Iuka. In 1983 he opened and operated Red's Pawn Shop. The business was first located next to the Iuka Ford and had a feed store in it. The pawn show later moved to its location across from the Country Squire. Red made many friends in the pawn business and loved dealing with people.

Mr. Taylor spent many years working with Bobby James, who passed away last week, and both men served under Police Chief Joel Holliman, who also died this week. Obituaries for Taylor and Holliman can be found on the obituary page in this issue.
