Comfort Revolution Begins Manufacturing Operations in Belmont

Belmont is the site of Comfort Revolution's newest manufacturing plant, and county and city officials were on hand Monday for the ceremonial ribbon cutting to welcome the new company to Tishomingo County's industrial community.

The company is a developer of high-end sleep products and projects it will create 200 new jobs over the next three years.

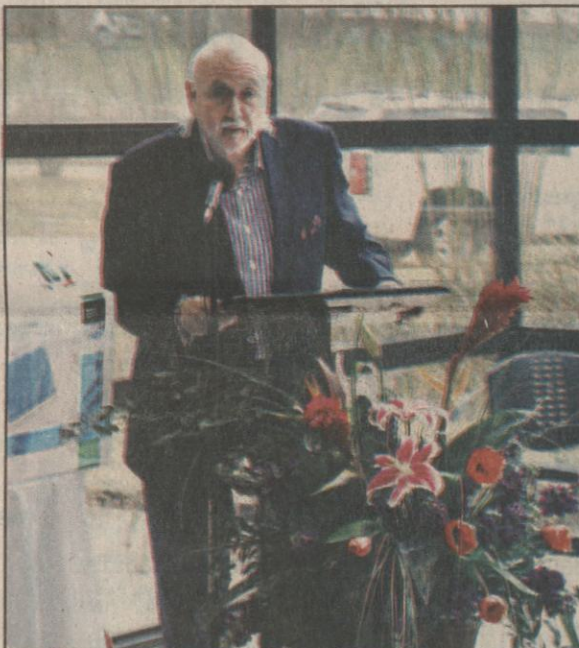
Comfort Revolution announced in September 2012 it would locate operations in the 432,650-square-foot facility formerly occupied by Schnadig Furniture Corporation.

Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) provided assistance for infrastructure improvements in support of the project. Tishomingo County provided assistance for the project, as well, according to an MDA release.

Headquartered in West Long Branch, N.J., Comfort Revolution is a leading developer and marketer of high-end, revolutionary mattresses, mattress toppers and pillows. The company's products are made with premium memory foam and Hydraluxe™ gel technology.

"I've always been impressed with the honesty and integrity of the people who live here. So when I started looking at site plans for a new plant, my thoughts naturally turned to Mississippi," Comfort Revolution Chief Executive Officer Michael Fux said. "We are pleased to unveil this innovative, state-of-the-art facility to produce the finest mattresses, toppers and bed pillows available at retail stores today. And we are proud that one again we can label our products 'made in America!'"

The company is already working with a staff of 20, and they expect to begin manufacturing in late April, or early May after equipment setup and testing, Fux said. When production gets un-

derway, more hiring in areas like shipping, will be necessary, and the company plans to be up to full speed by next January.

Governor Phil Bryant was scheduled to attend the event, but possible icy conditions prevented him from flying in the Belmont Airport, said officials. Bryant did express his support of the new company in a release Monday.

"Today is an exciting day for Belmont and Tishomingo County, as Comfort Revolution opens its doors for business and becomes the newest member of Mississippi's business community," Governor Bryant said. "I am grateful to company officials for choosing to locate in Mississippi and I look forward to a long partnership."

Bank Robbery Suspect Jones Free on \$10,000 Bond

Accused bank robber Brian Perry Jones is free on \$10,000 bond after a Monday hearing before Senior U.S. District Judge Neal B. Biggers, Jr.

Jones, 35, of Toney, Alabama, is set for federal trial to begin March 4th. He is accused of robbing the Iuka's Renasant Bank, as well as two Renasant branches in Tupelo, and one in

Booneville between August 16th and November 19th, 2012. He confessed to Iuka authorities shortly after Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies apprehended him near the Natchez Trace November 19th.

Judge Biggers restricted Jones' travel to north Alabama and north Mississippi.

New School Board Members Sworn In Monday Night

Security, Electronics Policies Discussed

At the first Tishomingo County School Board meeting of 2013, members welcomed new representatives of the third and fourth districts.

Dr. James Perkins was elected to the Third District seat in November's election, taking the place of Tommy Dean, who served one term.

For the Fourth District, Jeff Daniel won election to the seat left open when long-time member Charles South didn't seek reelection.

The Board welcomed the new members by unanimously electing them to the offices of Vice-President (Perkins) and board secretary (Daniel). Board President Michael Puckett was unanimously approved to retain his position.

The board approved a lengthy agenda, which they had opportunity to review prior to the meeting, by consent. It included approval of certified and non-certified personnel, student group fund raisers and student field trips, and competition par-

ticipation, as well as a financial report.

In the superintendent's report, Dr. Benny McClung and Joel Robertson informed the board of discussions with local law enforcement on security at each campus in the district.

Robertson, who is handling security issues for the district, said that Homeland Security authorities are reviewing current procedures and will offer recommendations to help the district develop an action plan.

Right now the district has an officer at every school, but is using off-duty officers, said Robertson. He hopes to have a dedicated officer at each campus, and said there are some options for paying for the service, including a proposal from Governor Bryant to get \$10,000 to districts to help defray hiring expenses for certified officers.

McClung also said the administration is developing a

new acceptable use policy for electronic devices at school.

"In older grades, it is rare that the student doesn't have a smart phone in their pocket on which they could do research, and it already actually happens," explained McClung. "Often times it is more up-to-date than what we have in the computer lab, and it's the way things are headed - toward e-books."

Right now, cell phones are not allowed out, at all. The new policy would allow students to use their own tablets or smart phones, potentially reducing the necessity for the school to provide so many Kindles or Nooks to access resources.

McClung said any new policy would not go into effect until next year.

The district is already making technology im-

provements that include Wi-Fi access throughout each classroom on all campuses.

Common Core testing is on computer, said McClung.

"A lot of districts will really [financially] struggle with being able to provide adequate technology for students to use state-of-the-art resources, but hopefully we will be able to accommodate that," said McClung.

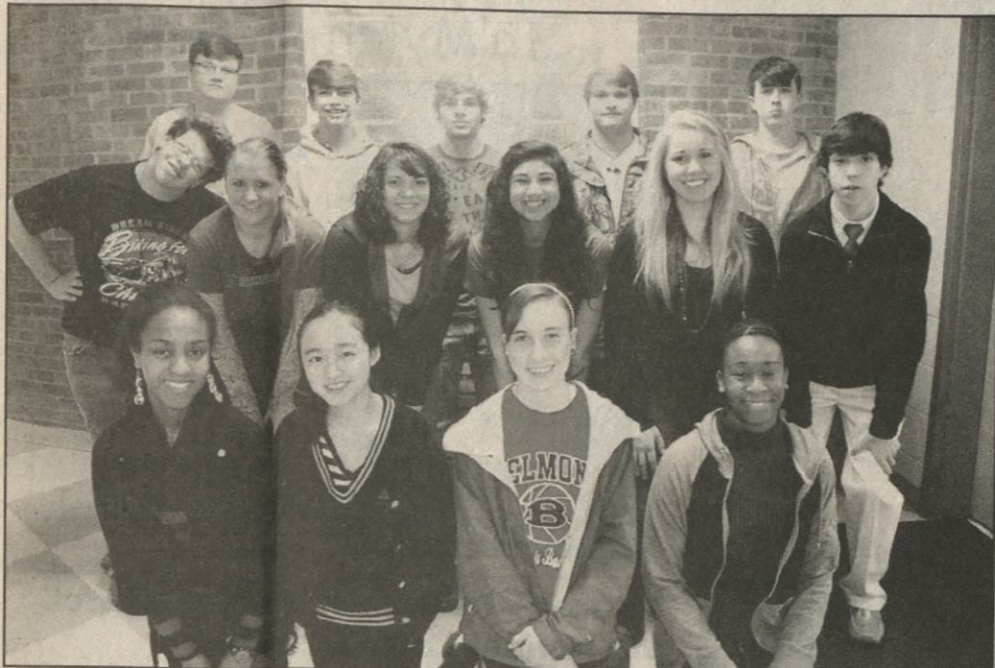

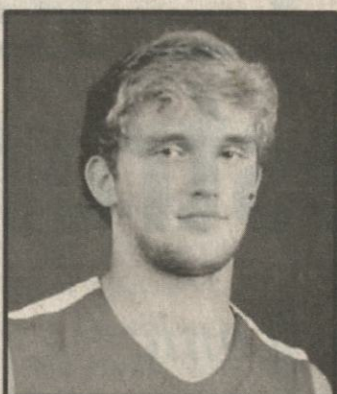

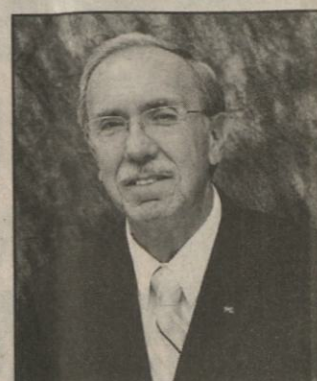
Ramsey Hall is approximately a 37,000

VILLAGE OF PADEN, MISSISSIPPI PROPOSED ORDINANCE CONCERNING MOBILE HOMES

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Paden find that certain regulations should be adopted to prohibit the erection and occupation of mobile homes as domiciles in order to preserve and promote the public health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Paden and the public generally, and to encourage and facilitate the growth and expansion of the Village of Paden.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen further find that an ordinance should be adopted prohibiting the erection and occupation of mobile homes for the immediate and temporary preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the Village of Paden and to the general public, and that such ordinance should be made effective immediately upon its passage.

THAT the Ordinance has been made with reasonable consideration, with the view to conserving the value of buildings and structures in the Village of Paden and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the town.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a mobile home should be defined as a vehicular, portable structure built on a chassis and designed to be used without a permanent foundation as a dwelling when connected to indicated facilities. That occupation of the mobile home shall be by the owner of said mobile home and such occupation carried on in a dwelling unit or other structure accessory to a dwelling unit by a member or members of the bonafide residence of the dwelling or the immediate family of such resident which is clearly incidental of the use of the dwelling unit for residential purposes. Immediate family shall be defined as children, parents, grandchildren, brother or sister of the titled owners. That the mobile home shall have the wheels removed to be made permanent with tie downs and underpinning making it a permanent living structure.

BE IT, THEREFORE, FURTHER RESOLVED that no mobile home shall be erected in the town limits of the Village of Paden. After the effective date of this Ordinance, the exception will be by application for property owners who purchase a mobile home less than ten (10) years old, and that the mobile home shall be the principal residence of the titled owner of the property.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Order shall take effect immediately upon this passage, pursuant to Section 21-13-11 of the Mississippi Code of 1972. Further, this Ordinance shall have no effect on those mobile homes currently located within the town. All mobile homes identified as being "grandfathered" under this Ordinance shall be identified by serial number, make or model specifically.
