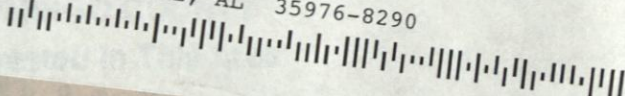

Whitlock's Killer "Insane" - Freed for Treatment, Independent Living

Tuesday morning a circuit judge sentenced the man admitted to the 2008 fatal shooting of 91-year-old Hezzie Whitlock to a lifetime of mental treatment and supervision outside of any institution, and additional stipulations.

On June 20th 2008, Joshua Dale Vandiver walked into the home of Hezzie and Jean Whitlock, in a, and, without a word, put a bullet into Mr. Whitlock's chest. The first shot failed to fire, so he cocked the handgun and fired again, killing Whitlock as he sat in his wife on the couch. He then walked out and drove away, according to investigators and family members. Vandiver is Jean Whitlock's great-nephew.

Mr. Whitlock was the father of two Tishomingo County officials - Sheriff Glenn Whitlock and Tax Collector Paul Whitlock. Members of the Whitlock family were all present for the Tuesday hearing, as well as a few members of Vandiver's family.

After the 2008 shooting, Vandiver was held at the Lee County jail before his November indictment on murder charges by Tishomingo County Grand Jury. In the years since, he was taken to the state mental hospitals (Whitfield and Pearl) for evaluation and assessment.

After treatment, he was sent back to Lee County, and then, at his family's request, was moved to Alcorn County, where he has been incarcerated in recent months.

Gardner judged Vandiver "innocent by reason of insanity," and it was established that he did not know right from wrong at the time of the crime. The state psychologist, Dr. Lott, determined Vandiver was indeed suffering from acute mental illness, and he has undergone treatment that made him mentally stable enough to help in his own trial. It was also referenced in the case file that, according to Dr. Lott, Vandiver still posed a high risk for aggressive behavior if he did not properly adhere to advised intense therapy, continue his medication and have regular assessments, said Judge Thomas J. Gardner at the hour-long hearing.

Before today, details of the investigation and any possible motive for the shooting were not known, but Judge Gardner, in statements intended to establish that Vandiver was competent to proceed, said that Vandiver had admitted to being directed by "a voice" at the time, to which Vandiver responded affirmatively.

Assistant District Attorney

Richard Bowen spoke for the state of Mississippi, and Ronald Michael, of Booneville, represented Vandiver.

Vandiver, now mentally stable enough with treatment and medicine, agreed to waive a jury trial and instead have his fate determined at a bench trial, where Judge Gardner would be "judge and jury." The agreement worked out between the defense and the state, and presented to the judge will prohibit Vandiver from any contact with the victim's family, prohibit him from entering Tishomingo County for three years, and allow Vandiver to live on his own, but report weekly and monthly for drug testing, therapy and evaluation under the supervision of Region IV/Timber Hills. Aside from time served at Lee and Alcorn County jails, Vandiver will face no jail time.

If Vandiver fails to fulfill the stipulations set forth by the court, he faces being sent back to Whitfield. He signed a voluntary commitment order during the hearing, allowing for his immediate transfer to the state mental hospital if necessary.

Vandiver admitted to the murder on the stand Tuesday, when questioned by Judge Gardner, and apologized: "I'm

sorry for what happened and ask for forgiveness of the people it affected."

"It's going to be very difficult for some of our family members to feel safe with this verdict," said Sheriff Glenn Whitlock after the hearing. Some Whitlock family members live in Alcorn County, and Vandiver has family members in Tishomingo County.

"There is no good outcome for this situation," said Bowen. "The state believes the plan we are asking the court to ratify is the best assurance that the family of the victim and the public are protected."

"Even if this didn't involve me personally, I would want people to see the major deficit in the mental health care system in this state that this case brings to light," said Sheriff Whitlock afterwards. "I hope some legislator sees that our state really has no appropriate treatment/incarceration facility for the criminally insane. There's no guidance for how to deal with this kind of case."

Following the hearing, Vandiver was to be discharged from the custody of the Alcorn County sheriff.

Innocent by reason of insanity, unlike in the movies, is nearly never a successful defense. By

waiving his right to a jury trial, Vandiver agreed to the stipulation that the circuit court has jurisdiction over his sentence, stated Gardner.

In other states, the criminally insane are monitored every day either in a facility or through some program - they are seen by trained medical personnel daily, even if they are allowed to work a job, or live independently, said Whitlock.

The sentence at least places Vandiver under the jurisdiction of the court for the rest of his life, and he must be available to the court at all times, who can enforce the verdict, even past the tenure of the judge.

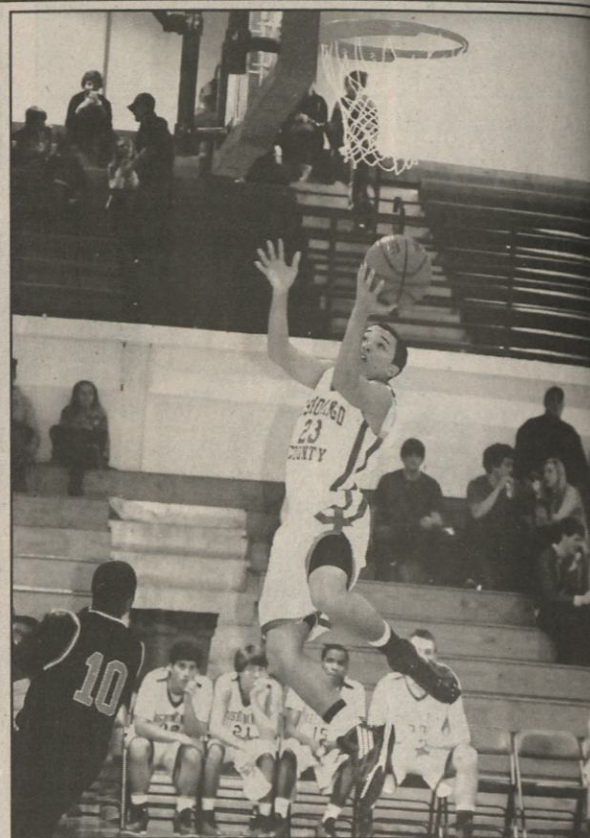

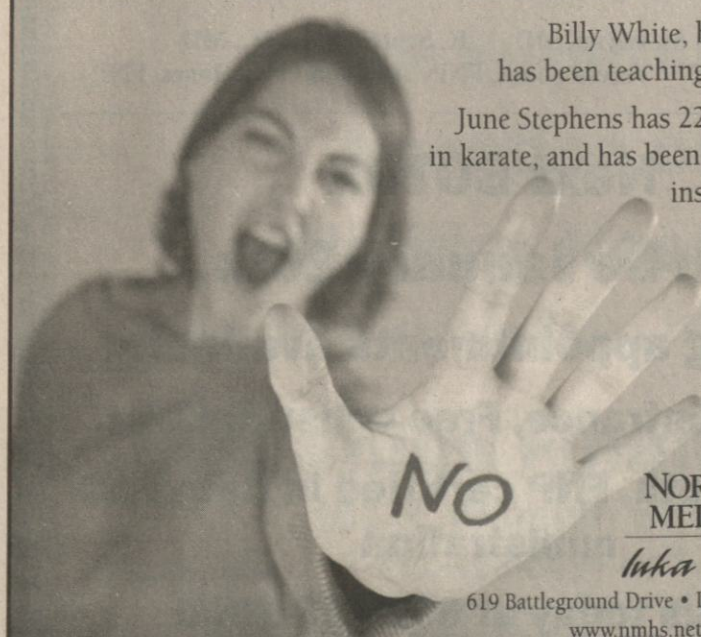

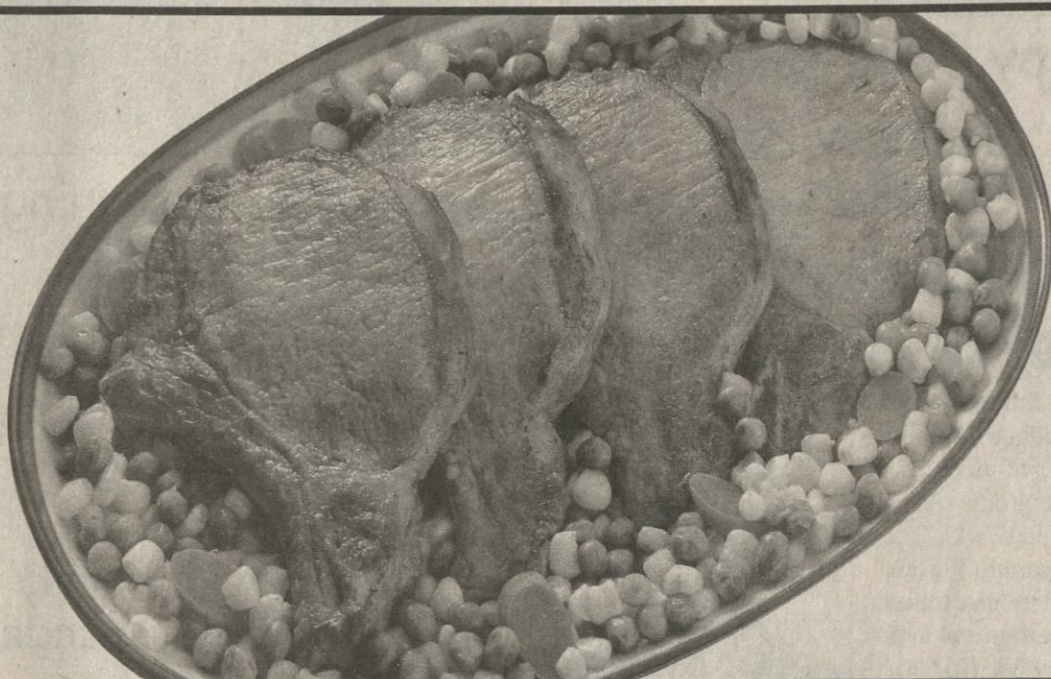

 tion of mobile homes as domiciles
 in order to preserve and promote
 the public health, safety and gen-
 eral welfare of the inhabitants of
 the Village of Paden and the public
 generally, and to encourage and fa-
 cilitate the growth and expansion of
 the Village of Paden.
 WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen
 further find that an ordinance
 should be adopted prohibiting
 the erection and occupation of
 mobile homes for the immediate
 and temporary preservation of the
 public peace, health and safety
 of the inhabitants of the Village of
 Paden and to the general public,
 and that such ordinance should be
 made effective immediately upon
 its passage.
 THAT the Ordinance has been made
 with reasonable consideration, with
 the view to conserving the value
 of buildings and structures in the
 Village of Paden and encouraging
 the most appropriate use of land
 throughout the town.
 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,
 that a mobile home should be
 defined as a vehicular, portable
 structure built on a chassis and

 accessory to a dwelling unit by
 a member or members of the

 residential purposes. Immediate
 family shall be defined as children,
 parents, grandchildren, brother or
 sister of the titled owners. That the
 mobile home shall have the wheels
 removed to be made permanent
 with tie downs and underpinning
 making it a permanent living
 structure.

BE IT, THEREFORE, FURTHER
 RESOLVED that no mobile home
 shall be erected in the town limits
