## Sheriff's Dept. Makes Arrests from Recent Grand Jury Indictments

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has made several arrests in recent days as a result of Grand Jury indictments, including:

Irwin "Buddy" Walker was indicted on three counts of sale of a controlled substance. He lives at Whitfield Park in Iuka, but was indicted while in Tishomingo County Jail on charges, said investigator Palmer.

Sherry Moore, 50, of Foote in Burnsville, was indicted on three counts of sale of a controlled substance, and Jamie Moore, was indicted on two counts of sale of a controlled substance.

Terry Wheeler, of County Road 303, was indicted on three counts of sale of a controlled substance.

Shelia Moore, 58, of County Road 134, was indicted on two counts of sale of a controlled substance.

### Other Recent Arrests

On Friday, January 18th, Iuka police and sheriff's deputies charged Carol Johnson, 52, and daughter Dana Johnson, 32, of Iuka with conspiracy to distribute Dilaudid after searching the residence of the mother. Both subjects already had active cases pending for the same charges, said Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. Dilaudid is a highly addictive pain medication normally only prescribed to patients in moderate to severe chronic pain.

That same day, sheriff's deputies and Golden Police officers arrested Robert Willock, 41, of Golden for sale of hydrocodone, as the result of undercover operations in the Golden area.

## Pleas Heard in Circuit Court Last Week

The January term of Tishomingo County Circuit court met last week, and several pleas were heard, including:

Jeffrey Wayne Booth pled guilty to one count of uttering a forged instrument and was sentenced to 10 years with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC), all suspended, and must complete 5 years supervised probation, and pay restitution, court costs and fines.

Terra Lea Harris pled guilty to one count of uttering a forged instrument and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, all suspended, and 5 years unsupervised probation, and must pay court costs and fees, as well as restitution.

Christopher Goforth pled guilty to burglary of dwelling and was sentenced to 15 years with MDOC, 13 suspended, and 2 years supervised probation, and must complete 5 years supervised probation, and

pay court costs and fines.

Zeaf Jared Clark pled guilty to one count of burglary of a dwelling and one count of arson of a dwelling, in connection with the 2012 destruction of the Locke home in Iuka. His sentencing was deferred pending the disposition of the co-defendants.

Jeff Poole pled guilty to possession of morphine with intent to sell and received a sentence of 15 years with MDOC, all suspended, with five years of post release supervision, and must pay court costs and fines.

Jason Michael Taylor pled guilty to retaliation against witness and received a sentence of 2 years with MDOC, 1 suspended, 1 to serve, and 1 year post-release supervision.

Joshua McKinnon pled guilty to one count of burglary and larceny of a dwelling, one

count of burglary and larceny of a vehicle, and one count of sale of hydrocodone. He was sentenced to 25 years with MDOC, 20 suspended and 5 to serve.

Rodney Grayson pled guilty to possession of cocaine, sale of controlled substance (schedule IV) and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, 5 suspended and 5 to serve; and 5 years post release supervision.

Mary Ramirez pled guilty to two counts of felony child neglect, and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, 5 suspended and 5 to serve, and 5 years post release supervision, as well as court costs and fines.

Willie Carter pled guilty to two counts of felony child neglect, and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, 5 suspended and 5 to serve, and 5 years post release supervision, as well as court costs and fines.

Angela Purnell pled guilty to possession of 2 or more precursor chemicals to manufacture methamphetamine. She was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, all suspended, and 5 years probation, and must pay court costs and fines.

Zachary Puckett pled guilty to two counts of motor vehicle theft and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, 9 suspended and 1 to serve, 5 years post release supervision and pay court costs and fines.

Samantha Wright pled guilty to possession of 2 or more precursors, and 1 count of child endangerment and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, all suspended if she successfully

completes 1 year in the house arrest program, and 5 years probation.

Russell Cormier pled guilty to conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine and was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, 15 suspended and 5 to serve; 5 years probation and must pay court costs and fines.

Bethany Parsons pled guilty to conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, all suspended; 5 years probation and must pay court costs and fines.

## Tupelo Mail Processing Center Closing; Service Transferred to Memphis

Due to the post office making changes in their distribution system, out-of-area subscribers of the Tishomingo County News may experience some delays in receiving their papers.

According to the Postal Service, the Tupelo Customer Service Mail Processing Center will close at the end of January, and all non-direct drop mail will be routed to the Memphis Processing and Distribution Center for sorting.

The News staff drops all in-area (Iuka, Tishomingo, Belmont, Golden, Glen and Cherokee) papers at the appropriate local post office, and they should still get their papers on Thursday. It will be the out-of-area

subscribers who will likely be affected by these changes.

There are sure to be some issues with the new system, and we will work with all of our valued subscribers to make the transition as painless as possible. We have no control over this change, and we are sure that our readers will be patient as we work through it.

We ask that everyone be sure their address label is exactly as assigned by the post office - if the correct address is 700 County Road 400, and the label says 700 Road 400, it could result in sorting delays. We will be glad to help you with any concerns you still have.

## NEMCC Set to Dedicate New Student Services Center

T. Jack Ramsey Hall, Northeast Mississippi Community College's new 37,000 square foot student services center, opened for business January 2, 2013 and will be officially dedicated Tuesday, February 5 with a ribbon cutting ceremony and open house at 11 a.m.

Ramsey Hall was designed as a 'one-stop shop' for the registration process, housing all offices that are required stops during registration such as admissions, records, financial aid and the business office all on the ground floor along with the housing of-

fice and the counseling center. Administrative offices occupy the second floor.

At a cost of approximately \$8 million dollars, the building was officially a Mississippi Bureau of Buildings project due to part of the funding being State Capital Improvement Bond funds.

T. Jack Ramsey of Iuka joined the Northeast Board of Trustees in 1983. He has held each of the three Board officer positions and has served as chairman since 2007.

Dusquesue J. Goodloe pled guilty to sale of marijuana, less than 30 grams, and sale of cocaine and was sentenced to 15 years with MDOC, with credit for time served; the balance suspended; and must complete 5 years of probation, and pay court costs and fines.

Dustin Martin pled guilty to conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, 10 suspended with credit for time served; 5 years probation and must pay court costs and fines.

Zedford F. Cleary pled guilty to 5 counts of failure to register as sex offender and was sentenced to 5 years of probation, court costs and fines.

Rodney Ricks pled guilty to sale of marijuana, less than 30 grams, and was sentenced to 3 years with MDOC, all suspended with credit for time served, and 2 years of probation.

Freddie Dobbs pled guilty to sale of hydrocodone (III), and sale of Diozepam and was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, all suspended if he successfully completes 1 year of house arrest, and 5 years probation. Also must pay court costs and fines.

Zachary Thomas Williams pled guilty to

burglary and large dwelling, and grand larceny. He was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, with 15 suspended to serve, and 5 years probation, and pay court costs and fines.

Alan Skinner pled guilty to attempt to manufacture meth (S II), and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, suspended if he successfully completes 1 year of house arrest, and 5 years probation.

Cody Jones pled guilty to sale of hydrocodone (III) and was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, with credit for time served, and the balance suspended, and 5 years probation.

Christopher pled guilty to possession of stolen property and was sentenced to 10 years with credit for time served, and the balance suspended, and 5 years probation.

John Garner pled guilty to 2 counts - possession of a controlled substance with intent to sell and sale of hydrocodone. He was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, credit for time served, the balance suspended, and 5 years probation.

### Charter School Legislation Needs to be Stopped

Last Thursday morning just before 1:00 a.m. the Mississippi Legislature voted 64-55 in favor of a massive expansion of charter schools. I believe this is the most damaging bill to pass the Mississippi legislature in many years. This bill will take funding, good teachers, and good administrators away

from Tishomingo County Schools even if no charter schools are approved locally. This bill creates a new state agency with a new board to work specifically with charter schools. This board will then approve the creation and funding of new charter schools or the conversion of public schools into charter schools. These charter schools are exempt from many of the requirements

of public schools. Not all teachers have to be certified; questions remain about admissions, hours and months of operation, and whether bussing and other resources will have to be shared with existing public schools. Where and when these new schools can be created has not been clearly settled. The senate and governor are open to allowing charter schools to open regardless of the local school board's approval, but the House version limits this locally unapproved charter school creation to underperforming school districts.

The financial effects of this bill are far reaching. The more schools this multi-million dollar agency creates the larger its budget grows. This budget is in addition to the current State Board of Education budget. Just to support the new board taxes will have to go up, or more money will be diverted from the classroom to bureaucracy. For 2013 K-12 education in Mississippi received \$2.035 billion, a little over \$8,000 a student, ranking 44th in the nation. Every student who leaves a public school takes this \$8,000 with them. In addition to administrative costs, new schools cost money, new teachers cost money, and duplicative school services costs money. All this money will take more slices out of the pie before Tishomingo County gets its share. Since our Legislature is not going to raise state taxes the burden of making

up for lower state funding will fall to local governments. Get ready for your tags and land taxes to go up. All this will happen whether or not a charter school opens up in or near Tishomingo County. Charter schools have a flaky to horrible record. Stanford University, in the most comprehensive study of charter schools to date, "found that 17 percent of charter schools reported academic gains that were significantly better than traditional public schools, while 37 percent of charter schools showed gains that were worse than their traditional public school counterparts, with 46 percent of charter schools demonstrating no significant difference." In other words 83% of charter schools do no better or worse than public schools. (1) Many other studies find similar results. In an open letter encouraging a more cautious approach to charter schools Richard Boyd, Oxford resident and former State Superintendent of Education of both Mississippi and Ohio, showed that, in Ohio, public schools outperformed charter schools in every subject, and stated that in his experience charter schools were more about ideology than about results. (2) Charter schools will have an even greater destructive effect on public schools in the communities where they open. Charter schools will lure many of the best teachers, brightest students, and supportive parents away from public schools. The

studies above show that their education will likely be no better than what they would have received at the public school, and now that public school will no longer have its most valuable assets. Charter schools may sound like more and better choices, and a chance for bright students to escape failing schools, but the evidence doesn't support that conclusion. The evidence supports the conclusion that charter schools perform poorly and take much needed resources away from under-resourced public schools. We all know our schools need improvement, but change that costs more with worse results doesn't make sense.

A vote for charter schools is a vote for weaker public schools. A vote for charter schools is a vote for more government bureaucracy. A vote for charter schools is a vote for higher local taxes. Fortunately it is not too late to nip charter schools in the bud. The House and Senate bills will have to go through conference, and will have to be voted on again. Only 5 legislators have to change their mind, and the three below, whose districts are in or touch Tishomingo County, voted yes. Please contact them and ask them to vote for Tishomingo County Schools and vote NO ON CHARTER SCHOOLS.
