## WOL Inmate Caught in Burnsville Monday

An inmate at the Alcorn County Regional Correctional Facility is back in custody after failing to return from a three-day honorary leave. Authorities issued the alert for Luke Gregory Calton, 27, who did not show up as scheduled to work at Alcorn County State Work Center Monday.

Calton was caught around 10:30 p.m., Monday night near Burnsville.

Law enforcement in the area searched for Calton, who was serving a ten-year sentence on burglary and larceny charges out of Tishomingo County.

Your child must turn 5 before May 1, 2013, to sign up for Ball.

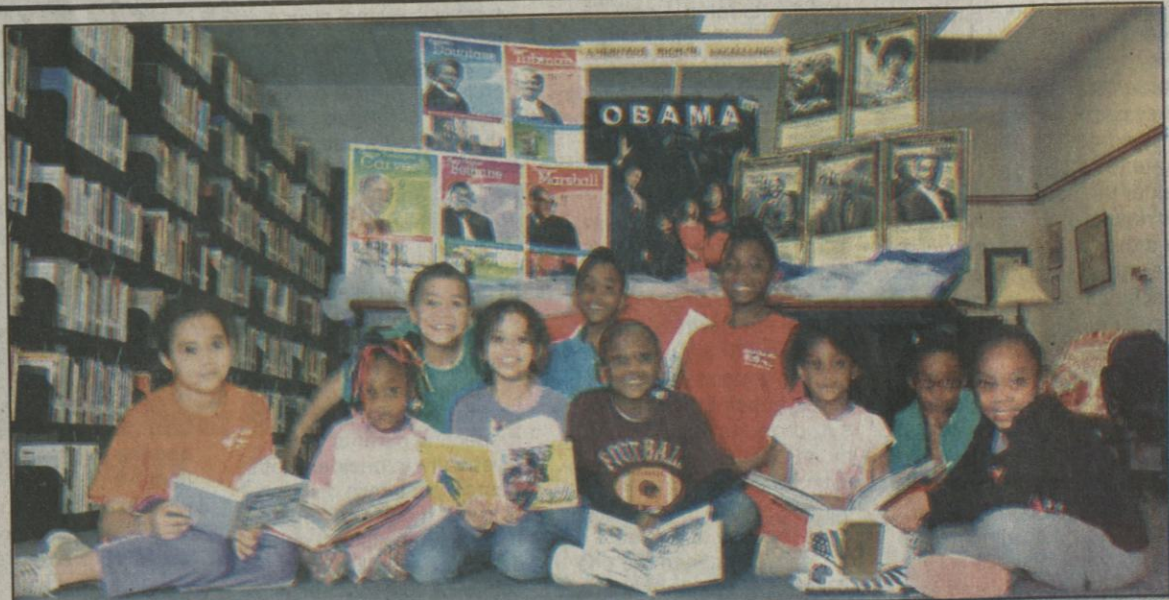

writer and musician Mr. Cassie Bonner will also provide music.

## ICC Baseball Signs Butler as First Tishomingo County Player

IUKA, MS -- Itawamba Community College head baseball coach Rick Collier announced the Tishomingo County High School pitcher and outfielder Gable Butler signed a National Letter of Intent. "It has always been a dream of mine to play college baseball and ICC has a really good program that I'm looking forward to being a part of next year," said Butler. "They have really nice facilities, the coaching staff is a really good one and they are always winning." "Gable has been a four-year starter and has played more than anyone we've had up here in a long time," said Braves' head coach Jerry Long. "He is a good ball player and we are looking for a lot of good things out of him.

He can run, he can hit and he has a good arm on him. I know Coach Collier will build him up with their weight program and I have a feeling you will be seeing some big things out of him before he leaves ICC." Butler is the first-ever player from Tishomingo County High School to sign with the ICC baseball program. Before about 18 months ago, a state junior college agreement meant that if Tishomingo County's junior college, Northeast Mississippi Community College, wanted an option to sign a player, they could "protect" him (or her), and they couldn't play at any other junior college. That is why Butler is the first signee from Tishomingo County for ICC.

As a junior, Butler, batted

.417 with a .552 on base percentage and had sixteen RBI's, four home runs with ten stolen bases. On the mound, he was 5-2 with 49 strike outs and one save in 40 1/3 innings pitched.

"We are very excited about getting Gable," said Collier. "He is one of the best outfielders that we've seen. He ranked very high on every aspect of the game at the state game tryouts. He has great speed, a great arm, great instincts when he's out there and he can swing a pretty good bat also." The Indians will open the 2013 season on the road against Calhoun Community College in Decatur, Alabama on February 9 before hosting Southwest Tennessee Community College in their home opener on February 13.



## Letter to the Editor

### Charter Schools

Recent comments about public charter schools are misinformed at best, and deliberately misleading at worst.

First of all, charter schools are public schools. As public schools, they have to accept all students who apply, unless there's not enough room, in which case they draw names, giving all students an equal chance. They cannot charge tuition, they administer the same state tests and are rated under the same system as regular public schools, and they are subject to the same restrictions on teaching religious doctrine as regular public schools. They cannot discriminate on the basis of race, disability or other categories - including academic or athletic ability. So they won't be "cherry-picking" the best students.

I believe that our good teachers and administrators will not want to leave Tishomingo County and go somewhere else to teach. I

happen to think our schools are good enough that they won't want to leave!

Charter schools will not be allowed to set up in Tishomingo County unless the school board says it's OK to do so. Our district is rated B, and both the House and Senate bills give veto power to districts rated A or B. The House bill also gives that veto power to C districts.

Charter schools will not cause taxes to increase. They do not have the authority to levy taxes and they get no taxpayers' money for facilities. They simply use existing funding more efficiently.

The Charter School Bill will not create a "multi-million dollar agency." It's actually an unpaid board of seven appointees who are authorized to hire only as much staff as needed to evaluate potential charter schools and to monitor them once they are approved.

In reference to the one study to "prove" that charter schools don't work, I would

encourage anyone to read a summary of twelve highly-respected studies on charter schools, available at [www.mspolicy.org](http://www.mspolicy.org). These studies show that charter schools are not perfect, but they have high success rates with low-income and African-American students, which is exactly where Mississippi struggles the most right now.

The biggest difference between a charter public school and a regular public school is that a bad charter school gets shut down. Bad public schools stay in business and get more money.

Charter schools have to produce excellent results (higher than the local public schools) or risk losing their charter.

I believe a vote for charter schools is a vote for respecting parents' God-given right to decide what's best for their own children, whether that's sending them to a traditional public school or a public charter school. A vote for charter schools is a vote to use our

existing education funding more responsibly. All the charter school opponents can suggest as an alternative is that we spend even more money on education! What do you think will actually increase taxes, allowing these public schools to compete for students or voting to give them even more money than they already get?

Even if this option isn't right for Tishomingo County, it's wrong to deprive parents in other communities of the right to try something new. We will have a veto over these schools if we do not want them.

Tishomingo County has nothing to fear.

There are many misconceptions and lies about Charter Schools meant to confuse and scare people. They are not productive and they do nothing to help improve public education for all Mississippians.

# Conservation Corner

## Mississippi Arbor Day by James L. Cummins

While National Arbor Day is held on the last Friday in April, Mississippi, similar to several other states, observes the holiday at a time best suited to its growing season. Our state adopted the second Friday in February as the day on which Mississippi would annually observe Arbor Day.

Arbor Day was first observed in Nebraska in 1872 due to the thoughtful vision of Julius Sterling Morton, who was a concerned resident, journalist and politician. He recognized that the planting of more trees would provide great benefit to the quality of life. He thought that there should be a special day for the planting, care and appreciation of trees.

Currently, Arbor Day is actively celebrated in all 50 states. However, due to the variations in climates across the United States, each state celebrates Arbor Day on its own special date.

And while our nation depends so heavily on trees to produce the thousands of wood products we need every day, we are also depending on these same trees to provide many other services that benefit society, for most of which forest landowners never receive compensation. These free services to society include producing oxygen, sequestering carbon dioxide, filtering air and water, providing fish and wildlife habitat, including that for threatened and endangered species, improving the aesthetic beauty of the

natural landscape and providing opportunities for recreation and solitude. Trees also produce fruits, gums, mulches, nuts, oils and syrups. Trees cut noise pollution by acting as barriers to sound and also beautify our yards as well as the endless miles of highways just to name a few.

We encourage you to plant any of the 150 native species of trees that grow here in Mississippi. Planting the right tree in the right location will ensure a healthy future for generations to come. Some of the trees to choose from are oak, hickory, cypress, ash, holly, plum, dogwood, elm, maple, pine and best of all, the State Tree which produces our State Flower, the Southern magnolia.

To be reasonably sure that the tree

of your choice will grow well in your locality, ask your local nursery, your service forester or your county agent. You can also go to [www.urbanforestrynetwork.org](http://www.urbanforestrynetwork.org), which is Wildlife Mississippi's tree planting site, and find information on tree selection and planting.

This Arbor Day please plant a tree and enhance the natural beauty of Mississippi.

# Tree Planting Tips

There are a few simple tips to remember when planting your tree this spring:

1. Prepare the perfect hole for planting.  
\* Dig the hole two to three times the width of the root ball. Do NOT dig deeper than ball depth. Make the sides of the hole gradually outward.

\* For bareroot trees, neatly cut away broken or damaged roots. Soak the roots a few hours prior to planting to allow them absorb water.

\* Container-grown trees should have plastic or metal containers completely moved. Carefully cut through any circling roots. Remove the top half of pressed peat per containers.

\* Balled and Burlapped ("B&B") should have all of the ropes cut. Pull the burlap at least one third of the way down. Stripping burlap to encourage root growth. A wire basket, cut away the top of the basket.

2. Plant the Tree.  
Gently place the tree in the hole. Partially backfill with the soil from the hole, water, settle the soil, then finish back-filling the hole. Tamp the soil gently, but do not step on root ball.

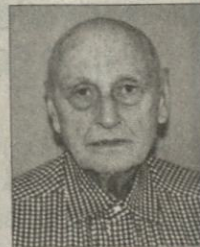

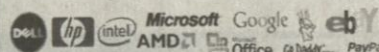
