Four Hospitalized After Tuesday Afternoon Wreck on Hwy. 172

Three adults and a 2-year-old are hospitalized after a two-car collision on Highway 172 east of Iuka around 2:50 p.m. Tuesday afternoon.

According to the Mississippi Highway Patrol, a west-bound Ford Taurus driven by Machelie White Ramsey, 42, of Iuka, collided in the eastbound lane with an eastbound Ford Explorer driven by Amber Thornton, 20, of Cherokee.

Iuka Fire Department responded to the scene, because 911 calls indicated that one person (Ramsey) was trapped in the car, and IFD was the closest responder with "jaws" extrication equipment. By the time firefighters arrived, first responders had removed Ms. Ramsey out of the car, and a fire had become an issue by that time, said witnesses at the scene. Ms. Ramsey was transported to Magnolia Regional Health Center in Corinth with internal injuries and significant injuries to a leg. She underwent surgeries over night, and family members posted online early Wednesday that she was in critical condition from her life-threatening injuries.

The driver of the Explorer, Thornton, was transported to Iuka Hospital, and later transferred to Magnolia Regional Health Center in Corinth. Passenger Lynn Lowrey, 2-year-old Madison Thornton, and 6-month old Annabelle Thornton were all transported to Corinth. The 6-month old was checked and released, say authorities, but 2-year-old Madison was thrown from her car seat and has suffered serious hip-related injuries.

The cause of the collision is under investigation, said Trooper Keith Woodruff, of the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

TCHS Brave Chandler Dexter signed to play football at Northeast Mississippi Community College on National Signing Day last Wednesday.

County Historical & Genealogical Society Releases New Collection of Vintage Images

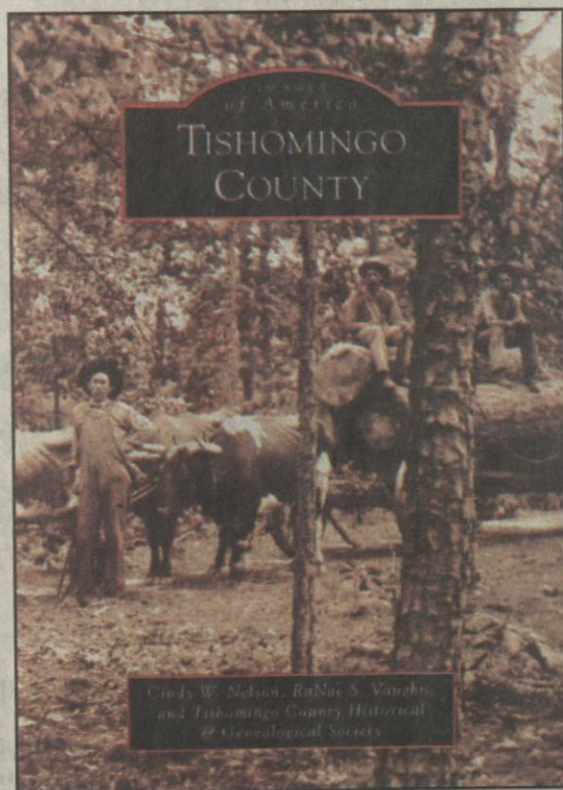

The Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society has published a new collection of vintage images from Tishomingo County's rich history in Arcadia Publishing's Popular Images of America series.

Local authors Cindy Nelson and Raeanne Vaughn, and the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society, have produced the 127-page soft-back book that features more than 100 vintage photographs with the latest information on who is included in the pictures.

Tishomingo County, formed in 1836, was named for the leading chief of the Chickasaw tribe. Located in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains, it is steeped in historical culture and scenic vistas. The new book includes images of the people of the county - from jury groups and women's clubs, to some of the many schools that peppered the county at the turn of the twentieth century.

Readers of TCHGS's previous publications will admittedly recognize many of the images in this new book, but the attractive size, design, and convenient size



make it a worthwhile purchase - especially compared to the huge 3-to-5 pound tomes that were published in the late 1990s.

"It is our hope that others will be encouraged to share their family photographs and heirlooms with the historical society for archiving and possible use in other future publications on Tishomingo County," said co-author Cindy Nelson.

In Iuka, books may be purchased for \$21.99 at the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum (Old Tishomingo County Courthouse), the new Tishomingo County Courthouse, Sunflower Flea Market, and Cappelman's Antiques. The books are also available throughout the county at local banks and city halls.

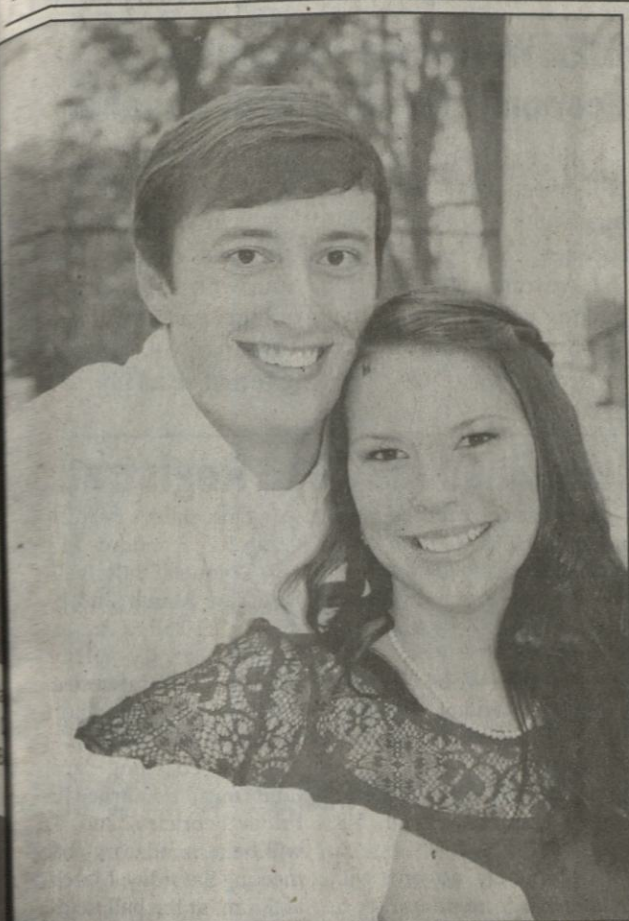

Former Tiger Goes For Season-High For Lion Team

Former Northeast Mississippi Community College Tiger standout Tyler Pritchard finally found the range with the University of North Alabama Lion basketball team on Thursday, February 7.

Pritchard finished the night with 10 points in an 87-73 loss to Christian Brothers University while playing 16 minutes.

During his 10-point outing, Pritchard connected on 4-for-8 shots from the floor and was 2-for-4 from the charity stripe. In addition to his double-digit night, Pritchard came away with two rebounds (one offensive and one defensive), an assist and two steals for the Lions.

With a 10-point night against Christian Brothers University, Pritchard tallied his highest point total of the season after being red-shirted during the 2011-12 year at the University of North Alabama.

Pritchard scored eight points against Fisk on November 12 and then turned in two seven-point contests, two months apart as the Iuka native tallied seven points against Miles College and then turned the trick against Shorter College on January 17.

On the year, the Univer-

sity of North Alabama Lion basketball team is 16-4 and 9-3 in the Gulf South Conference.

During his sophomore season in Booneville, Pritchard either led the Tigers or was near the top in almost every statistical category.

Pritchard was second on the team in free throw percentage hitting nearly 70-percent from the charity stripe -.698 and led the team in free throws made and free throws attempted.

Pritchard's 111 free throws made was just one short of Robert Wade's 112 free throws attempted - who was second on the team behind the Tiger point guard.

During his sophomore season, Pritchard pulled down 81 rebounds for the Tigers while leading the team in both steals (71) and assists (117).

Pritchard finished third on the 2010-11 team with a 15.4 points per game average while scoring 384 points during his second season and helping the Tigers almost average 80 points per game (78.8).

Following his sophomore campaign, the Iuka native was selected to play in the annual Mississippi Association of Community/Junior Colleges (MACJC) All-Star Basketball Game in Decatur.

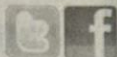

Take Advantage of Higher IRA Contribution Limits

For the first time since 2008, contribution limits have risen for one of the most popular retirement savings vehicles available: the IRA. This means you've got a greater opportunity to put more money away for your "golden years."

Effective Jan. 1, you can now put in up to \$5,500 (up from \$5,000 in 2012) to a traditional or Roth IRA when you make your 2013 contribution. And if you're 50 or older, you can put in an additional \$1,000 above the new contribution limit.

Over time, the extra sums from the higher contribution limits can add up. Consider this example: If you put in \$5,000 per year to an IRA for 30 years, and you earned a hypothetical 7% per year, you'd wind up with slightly over \$505,000. But if you contributed \$5,500 per year for those same 30 years, and earned that same 7% per year, you'd accumulate almost \$556,000 — about \$51,000 more than with the lower contribution limit.

Keep in mind that if you have invested the above amounts in a traditional, tax-deferred IRA, you'll be taxed on your withdrawals at your ordinary income tax rate. With a Roth IRA, your contributions are made with after-tax funds, but your withdrawals have the potential to be tax-free — provided you've had your

account at least five years and don't start taking withdrawals until you're 59½. (Not everyone is eligible to contribute to a Roth IRA, as income limits apply.)

If you have an IRA, you already know its advantages. If you aren't investing in an IRA, you should be aware of these key benefits:

- Tax-deferred growth — A traditional IRA can provide tax-deferred growth while a Roth IRA can potentially grow tax-free, provided you meet the conditions described above. To get a sense of just how valuable these tax advantages are, consider this example: If you put in \$5,500 per year (the new IRA maximum) for 30 years to a hypothetical investment that earned 7% a year, but on which you paid taxes every year (at the 25% tax bracket), you'd end up with slightly more than \$401,000 — about \$155,000 less than what you'd accumulate in an IRA. As mentioned above, you will eventually have to pay

taxes on your traditional IRA withdrawals, but by the time you do, you might be in a lower tax bracket. Furthermore, depending on your income level, some of your contributions to a traditional IRA may be tax-deductible. (Roth IRA contributions are not deductible.)

- Variety of investment options — You can invest your funds within your IRA in many types of investments — stocks, bonds, certificates of deposit (CDs), U.S. Treasury securities and so on. In fact, within your IRA, you can create a mix of investments that are suitable for your risk tolerance, time horizon and long-term goals. Of course, investing always carries some risks, including loss of principal — but the risk of not investing may be greater, in terms of not having enough assets for retirement.
