ames Meredith: Churches Need to Help Give Children a Better Foundation

irst high school in Mississippi to host Meredith

James Meredith's visit Tishomingo County oh School last Friday as a landmark event for hundreds who came hear the civil rights pioer speak for TC's Unity History program.

In his opening rearks, Meredith, who has oken to audiences worldde, and at Harvard's mmencement, praised shomingo County and Tishomingo County hool system for being of the best in the state. od one of the smartest, nce they were the first gh school in Mississipwho has asked James eredith to come speak to m, he said.

They certainly recoged the importance of guest speaker for the ogram. By 9 a.m. buses re transporting students m Belmont, Tishomgo, and Tuka campuses the TCHS gymnasium the annual program. e gymnasium seating s filled with students dseveral rows of chairs front of the speaker refilled by faculty and ests, and people from

ecommunity.

Meredith is remembered by most as the first black student at Ole Miss in 1962, an institution he always dreamed of attending, and loves to this day, as evidenced by his University of Mississippi shirt and cap. Invited to speak in honor of Black History Month by TC counselor Diane Byars, Meredith said that many people want to talk about past history and indignities suffered by him and others who fought the civil rights battles of the 50s and 60s. But, a much worse indignity is to put children in school who have not been taught how to behave, or received enough education in their homes to get a good start in school.

"The problem is not in the schools and it won't be solved by the schools; no teacher can teach anything to a 9-year-old who hasn't been taught to sit still," said Meredith.

His point is, among other things, that preschool children are not receiving a satisfactory foundation of learning, discipline and respect at home before they start. school, and that it affects

their entire school careers, and the rest of their lives. This is described in his new book, "A Mission from God: A Memoir and Challenge for America," where he outlines a plan for the family of God and the black church, which he says are the most powerful forces in the culture, to take responsibility for providing the necessary foundations for young children

Mr. Meredith, born in Kosciusko, started his education in a school built by his family, he recalled. Since his family was on the board, he got to go to

Erica is the daughter of Shane and Tammy Wigginton.



school earlier than most by age four he knew enough to get a great start in school, having sat in on classes at every level. Today, there is almost no development before age six, said Meredith.

The government and schools can't solve the problem as much as they might want to, he said. When slavery ended, the education of blacks was done largely through the black church. He urged the elder black people of Mississippi, the center of the black/white universe, to take up the challenge of resolving this problem.

"God told Moses to choose the right kind of ily, people who loved me, leaders to lead the people into the promised land," he said. "Black Christians know the Bible, and its teachings, but have trouble executing them."

"Why don't we do our job?" he asked. "Fear. We think: What will happen to me if I help correct this child? When we should be thinking: What will happen to this child if I don't help him?" Three students, and

Dr. Britton asked Mr. Meredith questions afterward, which he skillfully responded to.

In response to the question of how he felt being the first black student

at Ole Miss, he described the pressure as feeling like being in the final minutes of a close basketball game - but for weeks and

One student asked Meredith if it was a difficult decision coming there to speak, knowing that some of the people he was addressing wouldn't want to hear what he had to say. Though many in the audience were a bit shocked at the wording of the question, Meredith showed the poise of fifty years of difficult questions he must have faced when he said, "Well, since I was little, even the people in my famthey often didn't want to hear what I have to say!"

Senior Cody Enlow asked Meredith if he would have done anything different regarding his enrollment and graduation from Ole Miss. Meredith said he was 29 when he enrolled at Ole Miss, and he should have done it eleven years sooner!

"If you weren't such a big Ole Miss fan," asked principal Dr. Eddie Britton (season ticket holder for Alabama), "Would you consider being an Alabama fan, or a Mississippi State fan?"

In 2008, both were enshrined in the Mississippi Association of Community and Junior College (MACJC) Athletic Hall of Fame and had the Davis Event Center named after them when it was opened in January of the same year.

'Bud and Buster were true pioneers, great ambassadors for ICC and great friends to me and my family," Cole commented.




