## James Meredith: Churches Need to Help Give Children a Better Foundation

First high school in Mississippi to host Meredith

James Meredith's visit to Tishomingo County High School last Friday was a landmark event for the hundreds who came to hear the civil rights pioneer speak for TC's Unity and History program. In his opening remarks, Meredith, who has spoken to audiences worldwide, and at Harvard's commencement, praised Tishomingo County and the Tishomingo County school system for being one of the best in the state, and one of the smartest, since they were the first high school in Mississippi who has asked James Meredith to come speak to them, he said. They certainly recognized the importance of the guest speaker for the program. By 9 a.m. buses were transporting students from Belmont, Tishomingo, and Iuka campuses to the TCHS gymnasium for the annual program. The gymnasium seating was filled with students and several rows of chairs in front of the speaker were filled by faculty and guests, and people from the community.

Meredith is remembered by most as the first black student at Ole Miss in 1962, an institution he always dreamed of attending, and loves to this day, as evidenced by his University of Mississippi shirt and cap. Invited to speak in honor of Black History Month by TC counselor Diane Byars, Meredith said that many people want to talk about past history and indignities suffered by him and others who fought the civil rights battles of the 50s and 60s. But, a much worse indignity is to put children in school who have not been taught how to behave, or received enough education in their homes to get a good start in school. "The problem is not in the schools and it won't be solved by the schools; no teacher can teach anything to a 9-year-old who hasn't been taught to sit still," said Meredith. His point is, among other things, that pre-school children are not receiving a satisfactory foundation of learning, discipline and respect at home before they start school, and that it affects

their entire school careers, and the rest of their lives. This is described in his new book, "A Mission from God: A Memoir and Challenge for America," where he outlines a plan for the family of God and the black church, which he says are the most powerful forces in the culture, to take responsibility for providing the necessary foundations for young children

to succeed. Mr. Meredith, born in Kosciusko, started his education in a school built by his family, he recalled. Since his family was on the board, he got to go to

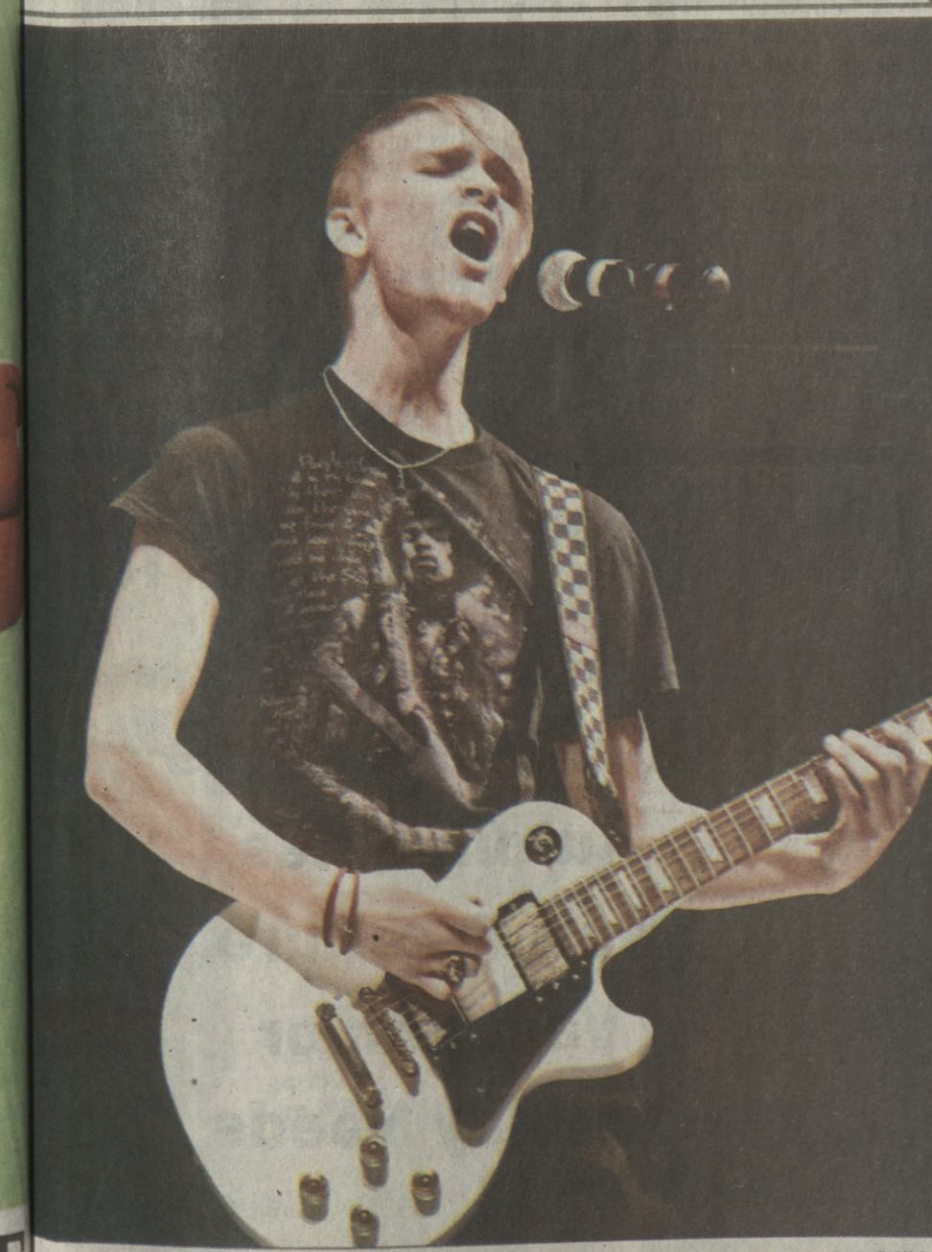

school earlier than most - by age four he knew enough to get a great start in school, having sat in on classes at every level. Today, there is almost no development before age six, said Meredith.

The government and schools can't solve the problem as much as they might want to, he said. When slavery ended, the education of blacks was done largely through the black church. He urged the elder black people of Mississippi, the center of the black/white universe, to take up the challenge of resolving this problem.

"God told Moses to choose the right kind of leaders to lead the people into the promised land," he said. "Black Christians know the Bible, and its teachings, but have trouble executing them."

"Why don't we do our job?" he asked. "Fear. We think: What will happen to me if I help correct this child? When we should be thinking: What will happen to this child if I don't help him?"

Three students, and Dr. Britton asked Mr. Meredith questions afterward, which he skillfully responded to.

In response to the question of how he felt being the first black student

at Ole Miss, he described the pressure as feeling like being in the final minutes of a close basketball game - but for weeks and months.

One student asked Meredith if it was a difficult decision coming there to speak, knowing that some of the people he was addressing wouldn't want to hear what he had to say. Though many in the audience were a bit shocked at the wording of the question, Meredith showed the poise of fifty years of difficult questions he must have faced when he said, "Well, since I was little, even the people in my family, people who loved me, they often didn't want to hear what I have to say!"

Senior Cody Enlow asked Meredith if he would have done anything different regarding his enrollment and graduation from Ole Miss. Meredith said he was 29 when he enrolled at Ole Miss, and he should have done it eleven years sooner!

"If you weren't such a big Ole Miss fan," asked principal Dr. Eddie Britton (season ticket holder for Alabama), "Would you consider being an Alabama fan, or a Mississippi State fan?"

Meredith said he had never heard Alabama and

Mississippi State mentioned together in a sentence, and that in his time at Ole Miss, enduring nasty looks and comments from some of his students, he could not be sure of one thing: if there was anything they hated more than James Meredith was Mississippi State.

As if James Meredith wasn't enough, musician and songwriter Bonner provided wonderful music after the speech. Accompanying him on keyboard, he played Louis Armstrong's "A Wonderful World," Sam Cooke's, "You and Me." The timeless songs and Bonner's voice were a treat for an audience that ranged from elementary students to 80-year-old Meredith.

## Iuka Senior Wins Northern Area American Legion Oratorical Contest

Esther Giles of Iuka, Mississippi, has won the Gold Medal and 1st Place award, a \$700 Savings Bond, in the Northern Area Competition of The American Legion High School Oratorical Scholarship Program—"A Constitutional Speech Contest"—February 16 at Hugh Percy Post 134 in Horn Lake. Her award-winning speech entitled "The Life Within Our Constitution" earned her placement as Finalist in the Mississippi State Final Competition to be held March 1-3 in the War Memorial Auditorium, Jackson. 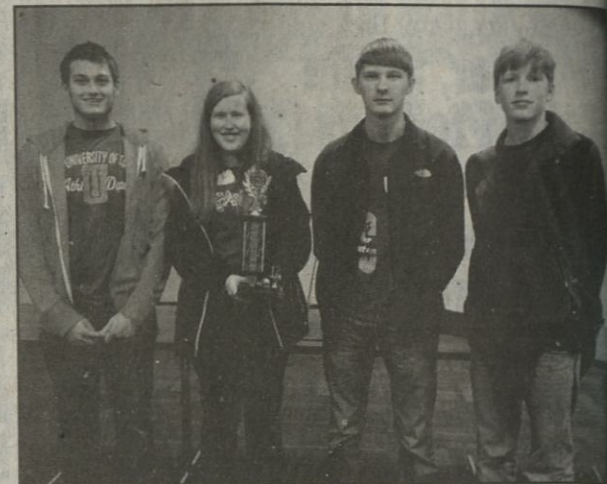

Carpenter notes that Spring Pilgrimage combines the qualities associated with both of Columbus' famous storytellers. "Pilgrimage is resonant in the romance and glamour that was so vital to Tennessee Williams, yet it also offers the family-friendly quality typical of Josh Meador's outstanding work for Walt Disney. Spring Pilgrimage truly has something for everyone."

## Follow "Tax-smart" Investment Moves

Now that tax season is here, and the debate over tax rates has been resolved (at least for now), you can focus on your tax return, which is due on April 15. As you work on your return, you may see some areas in which you'd like to make some changes for 2013 and beyond — and one of these areas may be your investments. Specifically, can you find ways to become a more "tax-smart" investor?

You may be able to benefit from taking the following steps:

- "Max out" on your IRA. Depending on your income level, you may be able to deduct some or all of your contributions to a traditional IRA. And your earnings can grow on a tax-deferred basis.\* (Roth IRA contributions are not deductible, but your earnings and eventual distributions will be tax-free, provided you meet certain conditions.) You can contribute to your IRA for 2012 right up until the tax-filing deadline on April 15. And for 2013, the annual IRA contribution limit has increased, from \$5,000 to \$5,500 (or \$6,500, if you're 50 or older).

- Boost your 401(k) contributions. You generally contribute pre-tax dollars to your 401(k), so the more you put in, the lower your taxable income. (Depending on your employer, you may even be able to make Roth contributions to your 401(k) plan.) So, every time your salary goes up, you may want to consider increasing your 401(k) contributions. For 2013, you can put in up to \$17,500 to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored plan, such as a 457(b) or 403(b). If you're 50 or older, you can add another \$5,500 on top of the contribution limit.

- Consider tax-advantaged investments. If you can afford to put money away even after you've reached the limits on your IRA and your 401(k), you might want to consider other tax-advantaged investments. For example, you may be able to benefit from investing in municipal bonds, which provide interest payments that are free of federal taxes, and, in some cases, free of state and local taxes, too. (Some municipal bonds may be

subject to the alternative minimum tax.) Another investment possibility is a fixed annuity, which offers tax-deferred earnings growth.

financial and tax advice can help you determine which, if any, tax-favored investments may be able for your individual needs.

- Avoid frequent trading and selling. Many people constantly buy and sell investments, hoping to boost their returns. Frequent trading is usually ineffective, however — and it can also be costly. If you sell an investment that you've held one year or less, you have to pay the short-term capital gains rate, which is the same as your ordinary income tax rate when you sell an investment that you've held more than one year, you'll be assessed the more favorable long-term capital gains rate, which is 15% or 20%, depending on your income level. As you can see, you have a real incentive to be a "buy-and-hold" investor.

The Town of Burnsville is considering applying to the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) of an amount up to \$600,000.00. ## Historical Society Held 17th Annual Meeting at Midway School

The historic Midway School building teemed with people and energy as the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society held its 17th Annual Meeting on Thursday, February 15, 2012. President Cindy Nelson commented that "we are celebrating the fact that we have been striving to preserve the fine history of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, for 17 years, and as founding president, I have had the privilege of serving the Society the same number of years." She continued: "During this period, I have witnessed the work of many dedicated individuals like yourself, without whom, the Society would not be what it is today. While we continue to focus our work throughout the county, the responsibilities of managing the old Tishomingo County Courthouse have proven both turbulent and remarkable." Our goal has always been to inspire the people of Tishomingo County to keep our history alive, and we are so proud that you have been a part of that.

Some counties are fortunate to have historical societies and some have genealogical societies. Tishomingo County has both a historical and genealogical society, and on top of that, we have one of very few county archives and history museums. The responsibility doesn't come lightly, the tasks are not easy, and none of it would be possible without the dedication and leadership of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society and its Board of Directors.

Volunteerism is the act of selflessly giving your life to something in which you believe—free of pay. If a person volunteers, although they may not earn money, a feeling of self-worth is fostered, and volunteers earn respect and favors instead of money. During 2012, a total of 129 individuals

donated 19,991 hours of service work to the Society.

Board members and staff were introduced and acknowledged in appreciation by Mrs. Nelson. The Society, which was founded in 1996 to collect, preserve, and protect the history of Tishomingo County, has made great strides in their quest. Located in the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse, the John Marshall Stone Research Library is a state-of-the-art genealogy library. The exhibits in the museum tell the story of the county. Preservation efforts at the Old Courthouse, the Midway School, and the Burnsville One-Room School have brought forth thousands of tax-free dollars to Tishomingo County. A copy of the Society's 2012 annual report was made available for attendees.

Since volunteers are an integral part of this organization, each year the Society recognizes volunteers through awards in five categories. Ranae Vaughn, Marketing & Publications Director, recognized the following awardees for their outstanding contribution to the Society.

The Twentieth Century Club of Iuka received the Award of Merit. The Club has been extremely helpful with donations of historical memorabilia, their time, and monetary donations.

Ms. Opal Lovelace and the Midway Homemakers were presented the Preservation Patron(s) Award in recognition of commitment to historic preservation in Tishomingo County. Opal has graciously donated unique, one-of-a-kind notecards and framed photographs to the museum and gift shop. She also played a large part in the 150th Commemoration of the Battle of Iuka. Midway Homemakers were acknowledged for continued preservation of the Midway School.

The Spirit of TCHGS Award was bestowed upon the First American National Bank and Jerry and Sandra Medlin of Carousel Creations, Inc. The Medlins worked tirelessly for the Battle of Iuka's commemoration in creating the audio files for the mobile audio tour of Tishomingo County. The bank consistently assists TCHGS in book sales, monetary donations, etc.

The Volunteer(s) of the Year Award was presented to Mr. James Cole, Ms. Martha Wallace, and Ms. Eunell Handy. Mr. Cole volunteers 4 hours per week as a museum docent, assisting visitors with tours and the history of our area. Martha Wallace, a resident of California, volunteers as a transcriptionist; she also traveled to Iuka during the Battle of Iuka's 150th Commemoration and portrayed her ancestor, Eliza Loveless, in the Iuka Methodist Church's hospital re-enactment. Eunell has tirelessly volunteered her time assisting in the TCHGS genealogical library.

Mrs. Sheila Thorne's local history and culture class at the Tishomingo County High School was given the Youth Volunteer of the Year Award. The students served as docents throughout the commemoration weekend, and dressing the part, they relayed the history of the area and the Old Courthouse Museum to visitors.

The Iuka Battlefield Commission also made a presentation to Cindy Nelson for her outstanding contributions to the Battle of Iuka Sesquicentennial. Gary Phillips presented the entertainment of the night with his energetic performance of jazz tunes on the guitar. Delicious refreshments were served. Two copies of the newest book, Images of America: Tishomingo County, where given as door prizes.
