Those were all made of crossies with tin roofs and pine slab floors. That kind would tell you when the rain got harder or changed to hail, even in the dark. As a kid, my folks were reluctant to go the storm house. We would wait until the rain was falling its hardest

and the wind blowing strong, and then we would go. Arrive soaked, but after the snake had been killed. We would know it was safe to go inside because the snake would be laying dead in the yard next to the storm house door chopped into a dozen intertwined pieces.

There were always people ahead of us, more cautious people, or simply people that bailed out for the storm house

We waited for the announcement, the words that sounded "all clear", when one of the men standing in the door, half in the rain, smoking a cigarette, probably a Camel, would say "It's blown over".

I don't really want a concrete storm house, but when you live in a door to a family that already has one, you can be too picky.

The Renasant Bank team did a awesome job organizing this event. All those who pre-registered for the race, received t-shirts on Saturday. Those who registered on the morning of the race,

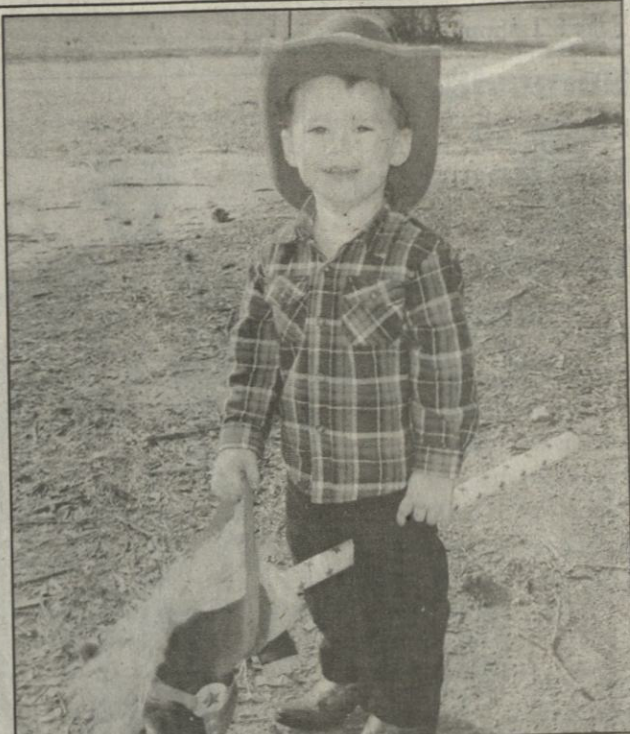

Youth in Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties Participate in Kick Butts Day 2013

Mississippi youth in Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties will join kids in other states, and even countries, all across the world on March 20 to voice their opposition to big tobacco companies during 2013 Kick Butts Day.

Kick Butts Day is a national day for activism when thousands of youth around the world will speak up and stand out against the tobacco industry. As part of this year's Kick Butts Day celebration, the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties is working with students in grades 4-8 in Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties to help empower youth to speak up and take action.

"Kick Butts Day is an opportunity for participating youth to speak out and tell others they are not going to be influenced by pressure to use tobacco products. While Kick Butts Day is officially held on one day each year, our hope is that every day will be Kick Butts Day in the fight against tobacco," said Melissa Nash, Director of Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties.

Tobacco use is the leading preventable cause of death in the United States, killing more than 400,000 people every year. Each year, 3,900 Mississippi kids under the age of 18 become new, daily smokers. Sixty-nine thousand Mississippi kids now under 18 will ultimately die prematurely from smoking, according to the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids.

"Mississippi's kids play a huge role in helping to reduce youth tobacco use in our state," said Roy Hart, Director of the Mis-

issippi State Department of Health (MSDH) Office of Tobacco Control. "The kids participating in Kick Butts Day 2013 are sending two very important messages: they want to raise awareness of the problem of tobacco use in their community and they want to urge elected leaders to do more to protect them from tobacco."

Through MSDH's local tobacco-free coalitions, young advocates take part in a variety of tobacco prevention activities throughout the school year, including working with elected

leaders to develop policies that reduce youth tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke, and educating their peers about the risks of tobacco use.

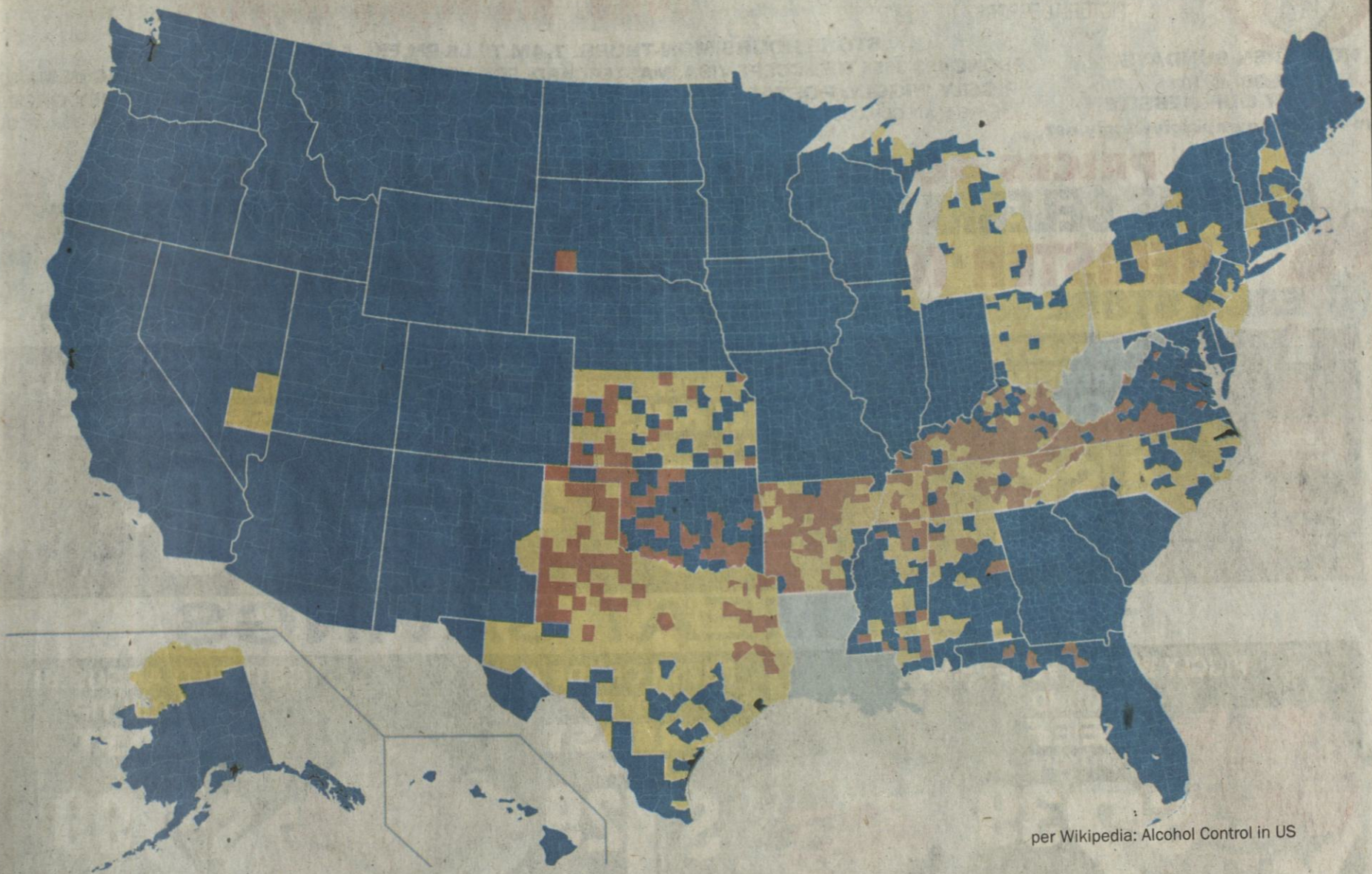

Scientific Facts on DUI's

Over the past five years, completely dry counties in Texas had over three and one-half times the number of alcohol-related traffic fatalities per capita than completely wet counties.

Dry counties averaged 6.8 alcohol-related traffic deaths per 10,000 people whereas wet counties had 1.9 deaths per 10,000 people. This is according to data from the National Center for Statistics and Analysis of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA).

This is consistent with earlier research elsewhere, which I have quoted. For example, a Kentucky study of about 39,000 alcohol-related traffic accidents in wet compared to dry counties, it was found that higher proportions of dry county residents are involved in alcohol-related collisions. I maintain that this is because residents of dry counties have to drive further from their homes to buy or consume alcohol, thus increasing impaired driving exposure. 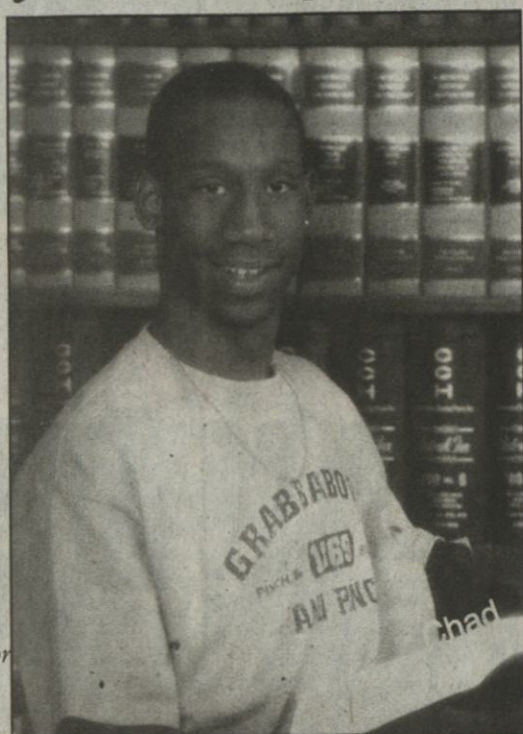
