One Hospitalized, One Charged in Shooting Last Friday

A Tishomingo man has been charged with aggravated assault and grand larceny, and another was hospitalized after a shooting last Friday morning.

About 10 March officers were called to a scene on County Road 958 to check reports of a person who had been shot. They discovered James Bennett, Jr. laying in his yard, suffering from a gunshot wound in the lower leg. An ambulance was dispatched and Bennett was transported by Evac to North Mississippi Medical Center, according to authorities.

Based on evidence at the scene, authorities identified Kevin Ceron Swinney, also of County Road 958, as a person of interest in the investigation of the shooting. He had fled the scene and Bennett's truck, wallet, shotgun and cell phone were missing. The sheriff said Swinney turned himself into Tishomingo County deputy about 5 p.m. that same day, after a day-long search for him that involved the Iuka Police, Mississippi Highway Patrol, Corinth Police, Alcorn County Sheriff's Department and the U.S. Marshals, as well as fire department personnel and off-duty deputies.

Swinney remains in the custody of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department on a \$10,000 bond.

Sponsors & Volunteers Helping Make Little Shop of Horrors Production at TCHS a Reality

Tishomingo County High School Bravada is gearing up for what directors Cindy Howie and Sara White call the most complicated production in the school's history. The complexity is due to the copy and rental costs involved, transportation for the large puppets, puppeteering demands, set requirements, and difficulty of the score. This is a challenging production for not only the students, but for the directors, crew, and parents. Without the help of Tri State Educational Foundation, 20th Century Club and other volunteers, Little Shop of Horrors would just be a play we could do.

Little Shop is so complex, because it requires renting 4 puppets that are large enough that an enclosed trailer is needed to transport them. Joyce Howie, father-in-law to one of the directors, was kind enough to volunteer his truck and his time to pick up these puppets for Bravada; and Joyce Cunningham was generous enough to let the group use her band's trailer to transport them. Ryan Films of Moulton, constructed the puppets after the movie came out in the 1980's. They have been

County Receives Settlement in Misappropriation of Funds Case

State Auditor Stacey Pickering returned \$92,583.71 Monday, March 18th, to the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors following an investigation into former Chancery Clerk Hayden Ables' misappropriation of \$149,445 of public funds, according to a release from the Auditor's office.

The Auditor's office found that Ables used his position as Chancery Clerk (1984-2007) to obtain personal benefit for services he did not perform. Ables submitted false documentation to the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to receive improper payments in violation of the laws of the State of Mississippi, and he did not reimburse the county in a timely manner regarding his employees' payroll and failed to remit the proper amounts. He received extra compensation in excess

amounts approved by the Board of Supervisors, and he falsified board minutes to receive pay.

"This case serves as another example in which the State Auditor's Office has worked to expose the misuse of taxpayers' money, and I hope the check returned today will aid in rebuilding the county's future," said Auditor Pickering.

In August 2012, the Auditor's office released that they served Ables with a demand for \$228,804.46 for losses that occurred between January 2004 and December 2007. That included \$149,445.25 in principal; \$42,558.43 in interest; and \$36,800.78 for investigative costs, according to a release from the auditor.

The auditor's office confirmed that the \$92,583.71 was a settled amount for the civil case, and that the auditor's office also

received payment for investigative costs from the total amount of the settlement. The settlement was paid by Ables' bond, which he was required to carry as the chancery clerk.

The county pays for the

bond of county employees, the current cost is about \$1,000 a year, negotiated and set by the state before each term; it can be increased if there are many payouts, according to county officials.

Petition Drive Successful: Required Number of Signatures Achieved

After a three-year, one-man campaign to bring legalized alcohol to a vote in Tishomingo County, it looks like the county will actually vote on the controversial issue sometime soon.

Charles "Tubby" Aldridge has the required 2,592 signatures on a petition for legalizing beer, wine and liquor sales - that he will present to the county board of supervisors April 1st, he says.

In accordance with state law, the board of supervisors is obligated, upon receipt of a valid petition with verified signatures, to set an election date between 30 and 60 days for the county to vote on the issue.

He started the petition in 2010. In the past two weeks, Al-

dridge has been within 100 of the required signatures, and he is still taking signatures, so that he has some "wiggle room" in case there are any protests, he said. All along the process, the Tishomingo County Circuit Court Clerk's office has been checking and verifying signatures as Aldridge brings them in. They have to be voters registered in Tishomingo County.

Mississippi's new state law

opened up the possibility of liquor legalization elections for cities under a certain population, but Aldridge had already had the petition circulating by then. He also started one for just the city of Iuka, but set it aside, to continue working on the county petitions.

Aldridge maintains that too much tax money is going to surrounding counties and states, where Tishomingo County resi-

dents purchase alcohol and beer regularly.

Nearby Corinth has recently voted to legalize liquor sales with a 60 percent vote, and that is an additional place that county citizens can now go to buy, says Aldridge.

"Beer and liquor ARE here in the county," says Aldridge. "We just don't benefit from it in any way since we don't get the tax money."

Creekside Restaurant Offers Diners a New Point of View

All's well on the Homestead, but sometimes, you need a new Point of View.

After several successful years providing Iuka and the rest of the county with quality home-style dining and tempting buffets, the owners of Homestead restaurant in Iuka are starting a new place - Point of View - that opens this Thursday night.

Unlike anything within 30 miles, Point of View Restaurant and Oyster Bar offers creekside outdoor dining on a deck, a bar area with big-screen televisions, and a 70-seat dining room with gorgeous views of the Goose Pond Slough area of Bear Creek. Less than a mile north of U.S. Highway 72 on Riverton-Rose Trail, diners will be able to enjoy fresh steaks and seafood and live acoustic entertainment every night, along with a beverage of choice.

Terry and Elizabeth Vidal opened Homestead several years ago, and patrons have enjoyed the clean, quality dining, as well as their banquet room, which has become the go-to place for reunions, meetings, sports and business banquets, and other parties. The Vidals have no plans to change a good thing! They will continue to manage Homestead the same they always have. The new restaurant will only be open Thursday and Friday nights, and all day Saturday.

Terry says that Point of View has been a dream of his, ever since he moved from the Jacksonville, Florida area,

where he and a partner operated a successful bar and grill about three times this size on the intercoastal waterway - which was also called Point of View. So he knows his plans and what to expect from the Bear Creek version.

Diners can expect tempting dishes like fresh fish, soft-shell crabs, oysters, grilled, fried and coconut shrimp, and frog legs at Point of View, as well as fresh steaks. The dining room and deck will be ideal for large parties like reunions, or even rehearsal suppers, and since it is in Alabama, patrons can also enjoy beer, wine or other drinks with their meal. Terry Vidal says they will only offer on-premise beverages.

The location, just about 11 miles from Iuka, was the home of the Blue Heron, and had a bait and tackle shop that joined it. Terry has transformed that area into an attractive bar, perfect for get-togethers with friends, with big-screen televisions that will be great for watching sports events.

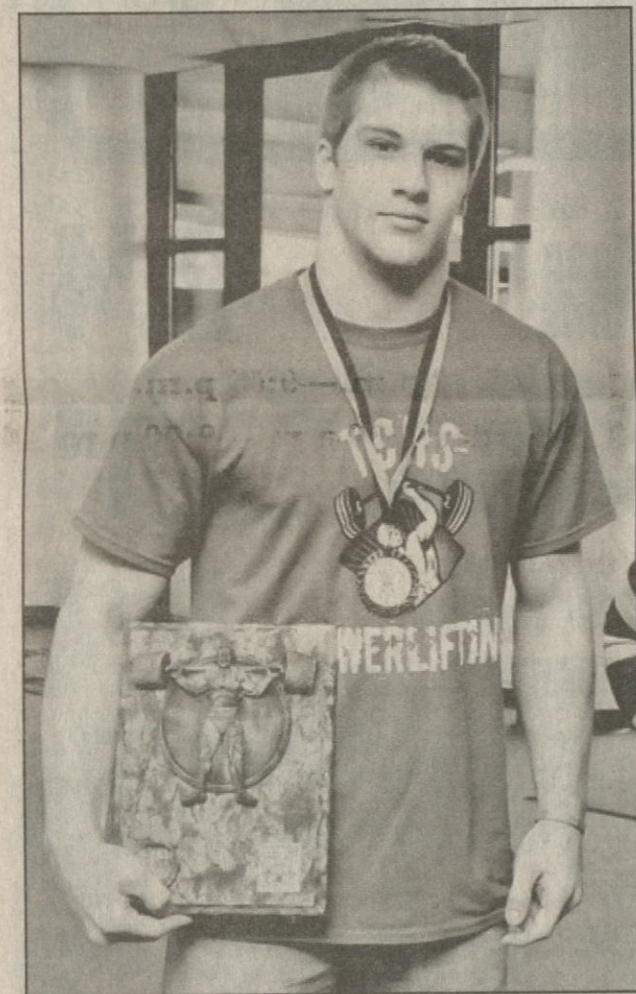

2013 Northeast District Livestock Show and Judging Contest

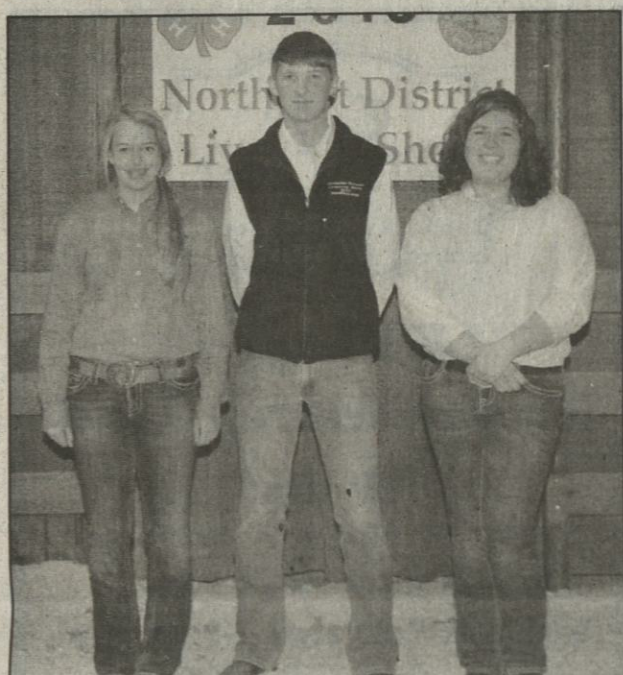

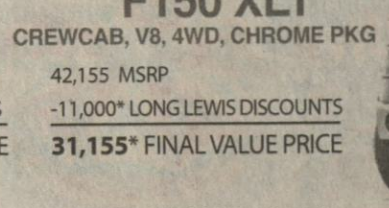

Thomas Eldridge Minga, Sr.

Thomas Eldridge Minga, Sr., died on March 15th, 2013, in Southaven, MS. He was born on October 24th, 1921, in Nettleton, MS. As a teenager, he became an Eagle Scout and graduated from Nettleton High School, May 1941. In 1942, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, and served in World War II in North Africa where he received a Purple Heart before being honorably discharged in 1944. He moved to Memphis, TN in 1945. He married Mary Afton Weaver, from Amory, MS, the same year.

He was a Civil Service employee for the Defense Department for thirty-three years. While employed at the Tishomingo Air Force Depot in Memphis, he was the Assistant Director of Maintenance Engineering and involved with the development of various new weapons equipment. This equipment included such items as a single point nozzle for refueling aircraft while in flight and liquid oxygen/nitric acid tanks used in the firing of missiles. He was present at White Sands, New Mexico when the first air missile was tested and when the sound barrier was broken by a jet sled. He received an Outstanding Performance Rating from the Air Force in recognition of his service in this area. He transferred to DIPEC (Defense Industrial Plant Equipment Center), Memphis, TN, in 1964 from where he later retired in 1975.

He was ordained as a Deacon at Second Baptist Church, Memphis in 1969 and served as a deacon at Iuka Baptist Church. In 1972 he assisted Bro. Harris Counce, then pastor of Iuka Baptist, in establishing a Christian summer mission adjacent to Coleman State Park where he and his wife served as Directors and Sunday School teachers for 39 years.

He assisted in organizing the Tishomingo County District Fire Department and served several years as the first Fire Chief.

He served as president of the Jacinto chapter of ARFE (National Association of Retired Federal Employees). He served as President, and Asst. Tour Director of the All-For-Christ-Senior Adult Club at Iuka Baptist Church, for many years.

In November 1989 he was honored for his outstanding service to the community by President George H.W. Bush as one of the Thousand Points of Light.
