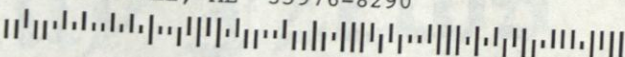

Circuit Clerk Checking List of Petition Signatures Again Before Submittal to Board

In advance of submission to the county board of supervisors planned for next Monday, Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk personnel are reviewing all 4,100 of the signatures that have been submitted on the petition to bring legalized alcohol to a county-wide vote.

Petition organizer Charles "Tubby" Aldridge has submitted signatures on the petition as he received them over the past three years, so that officials could certify them. So far, he has

submitted a total of 4,100 signatures, and 2,601 have been verified as valid signatures of Tishomingo County registered voters. Twenty percent, or 2,592, of Tishomingo County's 12,958 registered voters are required on the petition to bring the issue to a county vote.

According to Circuit Court Clerk Donna Dill, since some of the petition signatures have been submitted as long as two years ago, they need to review them again, because the signers may have moved from the county, or

died.

The Circuit Court Clerk assistants began last Thursday recertifying the signatures, said Dill. They hope to have them done by the Monday, April 1st Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors meeting where Aldridge plans to submit the completed petition to the board.

According to state law, the board will then be obligated to set a county-wide election within 30-60 days of submittal of a valid petition.

Demonstration at County Courthouse Shocks Iuka, County

Iuka citizens and visitors were shocked and dismayed to see a demonstration by Ku Klux Klan members in masks at the Tishomingo County Courthouse last Saturday.

Saying that they were going to speak against child molesters and illegal immigrants, the "North Mississippi White Knights of the KKK" promoted the event in this newspaper and on the internet attracting the attention of even an Australian media outlet.

They met with the county

board of supervisors in February, stating their intent to stage a demonstration at the courthouse. The board said they can be on the public property, but not in the courthouse without additional permission/permitting for insurance purposes. Neither the county, nor city issued any type of demonstration permit, said authorities. Some of the group was in town handing out pamphlets the week before, but were told to leave by Iuka police.

Eyewitnesses reported that the dozen or so men wearing full bedsheet regalia and masks

spoke about child molesters, sex offenders and illegal immigrants, and drug dealers for about five minutes, then began "ranting" on a number of other more offensive subjects. Iuka Police were out in full force, along with sheriff's deputies. Having warned the demonstrators that if they began provocative or offensive speech, their demonstration would be dispersed, Iuka Police and the Sheriff, and other officers, shut down the event af-

Driver Being Sought in March 15th Hit & Run at Fulton St. Home

An Iuka homeowner and county authorities are still looking for the driver of a truck and trailer who caused thousands of dollars of damage in a hit-and-run that happened March 15th.

According to homeowner Tina Gillis, about 3:30 or 4 p.m. Friday March 15th, a truck pulling a utility trailer missed the sharp right-hand turn on Fulton Street and ran over her mailbox. But they didn't stop there - the truck continued across her double driveway and collided with her house, tearing off the siding. They continued through the yard, through some trees, and drove on down Fulton, according to eyewitnesses.

Neighbors who saw

the event say the truck was a green extended-cab pickup, pulling a utility trailer and the driver was a younger man with light-colored hair, possibly in his 20s.

"It was a dark green truck," joked Tina. "You can see the color from the paint on the side of my house!"

Initial estimates of damage are about \$7,000 but that was before Gillis found out that her siding has been discontinued and she won't even be able to patch the repair for the amount.

If anyone has information about this hit-and-run, they are encouraged to call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 423-7000.

"In 1985, our business was originally in Indianola, and we moved in Greenville,"

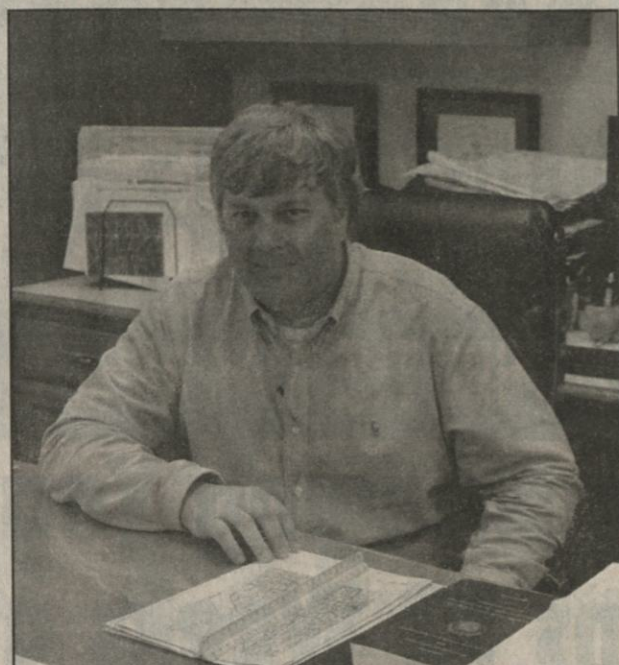
