## Board Sets Election Date of May 21st for County Vote on Legalizing Liquor & Beer

Tuesday, May 21, Tishomingo County residents will get to vote on the controversial issue of legalizing liquor and beer in the county.

At the April 1st Tishomingo County Board meeting, supervisors were presented with a completed petition with enough validated signatures (at least 20 percent of registered voters) to put the state-law-mandated election process into motion. The Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's office worked all last week to ensure that all the signatures collected by sole petition organizer Charles Aldridge were legitimate, and the package presented to the board included a certification letter.

In accordance with state law, the board "shall" set a date for a county-wide election upon receipt of the certified petition, explained Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors Attorney Phillip Whitehead.

The board is to set a date not more than 60 days from the receipt of the petition, and they wanted to keep a traditional Tuesday election day. The date closer to the 60-day mark would have been May 28th, but since that would be the day after Memorial Day weekend, they opted for May 21st.

The election will be county-wide, and the wording on the ballot is specifically defined by state law. As explained by attorney Whitehead in the meeting, the two choices on the ballot will be:

**For** Tishomingo County to come out from under the Dry Law (meaning FOR legalized liquor sales in county)

or

**Against** Tishomingo County coming out from under the Dry Law (meaning AGAINST legalized liquor sales in county)

At the Monday meeting, there were several local pastors

present who spoke, though they were not on the agenda, as was pointed out by supervisors on camera after the pastors left the meeting.

Bro. Tony Curtis, pastor of Fifth Street Baptist Church in Iuka, spoke directly to the board, asking that the board put on the ballot several different stipulations on sales. He said that they were unhappy that the issue was coming to a vote at all, but had a list of requested conditions for the board to add: only sales in grocery stores to be allowed, so there wouldn't be "bars, liquor stores and beer joints" popping up; and no sales of cold beer, and no sales of drinks or wine in restaurants.

Whitehead was quick to remind those present that the ONLY issue the board could decide was when the election would be held.

In fact, from the wording on the ballot, to the issuance of sales permits, Mississippi State Law determines the control, sales, and distribution of alcohol, and the Office of Alcoholic Beverage Control of the Mississippi State Tax Commission is the governing body.

The state determines what goes on the ballot, and according to the online handbook, "While local government bodies or individual groups may object to the issuance of a permit and may request a hearing on the matter, the authority to issue permits to sell alcoholic beverages is solely within the authority of the State Tax Commission."

Included in the 36-page Reference Guide for City and County Governments are interpretations of the pertinent laws.

Though the vote will be county-wide, state law stipulates alcoholic beverages cannot be offered for sale within 400 feet of a school, church, kindergarten, children's day care or a funeral home.

Additionally, permits to sell

alcoholic beverages are only issued within the boundaries of a municipality, even if it is legalized by county voters.

**County Benefits**

If Tishomingo County votes to go wet, it stands to gain the revenue from state-mandated licensing fees. For every annual license fee for a retail outlet paid to the state, the county will get half. For a package retailer, the fee is \$1,825 and for restaurants \$925, according to the Ms. Department of Revenue website. In one jurisdiction that recently came out from under the dry laws, D'Iberville, near the coast, payments back to the city were near \$30,000 since last July, said a representative from the ABC accounting department. Corinth City Hall just got their first license fee payment from the state since going wet, and it was \$5,175 from 10-15 licensed outlets.

In the case of Tishomingo County, these license payments will go to the county, but sales tax earned will go into the state with all the retail sales tax; the municipalities get back 18.5 per-

cent from the state.

**Dissent**

At the meeting, Bro. Bobby Cobb, Director of Missions for the Tishomingo County Baptist Association, commended Mr. Aldridge for his diligence in getting the petition passed, but promised that they were going to work just as hard to defeat it.

The pastors present asked what the procedure would be for people to get their names off the petition, if they were convinced at this time to withdraw their names, but Whitehead said that the petition signatures had been diligently vetted and validated, and would stand as a legal petition.

Bro. Tony Curtis said that legal alcohol destroys lives, and will bring broken homes, health care problems and other problems to the county.

"I like that my kids are not exposed to alcohol," said Curtis, who claimed he only eats at Cracker Barrel when in Tupelo, or other places, because they don't serve alcohol.

"There will be a lot of emotions flying around the next 60

days, but when it's over, whatever the people say, we will do," said Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

### First Vote in County Since 1966

Tishomingo County has been legally dry in modern times for any alcoholic beverages, and the last vote on the issue in the county was December 3rd, 1966, shortly after the state of Mississippi passed a law that allowed counties and localities to vote on coming out from under the statewide prohibition on alcohol.

In what the *Vidette* of December 8, 1966 reported, it was an "unprecedented" heavy turnout of more than 4,000 for the Saturday special election.

In the 1966 election on beer and wine, there was a 71 percent Against vote, and 28 percent For. In the election on alcohol, the county vote was 29 percent For and 70 percent Against.

### Fishing Tournament this Weekend to Honor Jerome West & Raise Funds for Relay

A fishing tournament this weekend will honor the memory of a beloved local sportsman and raise funds for the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

The Jerome West Memorial Fishing Tournament will be held at J. P. Coleman State Park on April 6th. It's open to all entries - Entry fees are \$100; \$10 Lunker (optional). Payout is 75% payback, and 25% goes to Relay for Life.

Jerome West was a dedicated fisherman who fished Pickwick Lake for most of his life. Originally from Lawrenceburg, Tennessee, he lived in Iuka for many years, where he was a fishing guide on Pickwick. He loved fishing and hunting and all things "outdoors."

West passed away last August after a five-year battle with multiple myeloma.

The event is being held by the Iuka Police Department.

### Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley to Hold Community Meeting Next Thursday in Iuka

Brandon Presley, Northern District Public Service Commissioner (D-Nettleton) continues a series of meetings across the Northern District to hear directly from ratepayers. The Community Meeting in Iuka will be held on Thursday night, April 11, 2013, at the Tishomingo County Courthouse from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. This meeting is free, and the public is invited to attend.

## The Crappie

Crappie are the third most popular freshwater fish in Mississippi, behind bass and catfish. In Mississippi crappie are referred to as white perch, but in Louisiana they are known as "sac-a-lait."

Crappie are members of the sunfish family. This family includes such other popular game fish as bluegill, redear, smallmouth bass, spotted bass and largemouth bass. Warmouth (goggleye) and other fish commonly referred to as bream are also members of the sunfish family. There are two species of crappie in Mississippi, the white and the black crappie. The spots on the side of white crappie form several faint vertical bars, while spots on the black crappie are irregular. During spring, it is sometimes hard to discern the vertical bars on the white crappie. Some anglers, who do not know how to tell the two species apart, erroneously think the black crappie is the male, and the white crappie is the female.

Crappie have been found spawning from early March to early June, although late March to mid-April is generally the prime spawning period. Once spawning begins, it will occur over a 30 to 40 day period. Spawning is initiated by water temperature and photoperiod, with spawning beginning when water temperature reaches 57°F with the prime spawning occurring between 60 to 68°F. Larger crappie have more eggs than smaller crappie. Where a 2-year-old crappie may have 24,000 eggs, a 5-year-old crappie will have 195,000 eggs. Larger crappie are believed to spawn earlier.

Crappie, like most other sunfish, are nest builders. The male crappie fans out a depression in moderately firm substrate, usually in an area protected from the wind. Nests are usually built in the vicinity of some type of structure. Although some 2-year-old crappie will be mature, all 3-year-old crappie have reached full maturity.

After the female lays her eggs, male crappie fan them and guard the nest. The eggs sink and are adhesive, so they stick to the bottom. Hatching normally takes about 3 to 4 days, but can take longer if the water is cold or sooner if the water is warm. Hatching of crappie eggs have been estimated to occur as early as mid-March. Crappie stay in the nest for another 4 to 5 days after hatching. The male guards the fry during this period and continues to do so for a short while after they leave the nest.

Crappie can grow relatively fast. Black crappie in Mississippi reach 4 to 5 inches when they are 1 year old, 7 inches at 2 years old and 10 to 11 inches at 3 years old. White crappie can reach 5 to 6 inches at 1 year old, 8 inches at 2 years old and 10 to 11 inches at 3 years old.

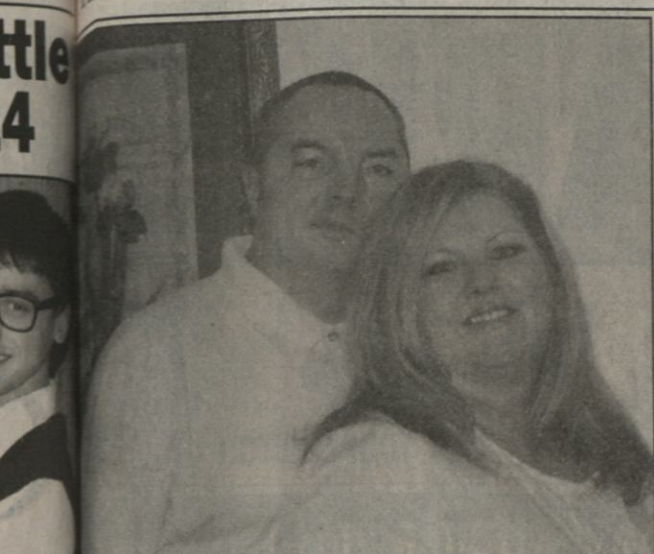

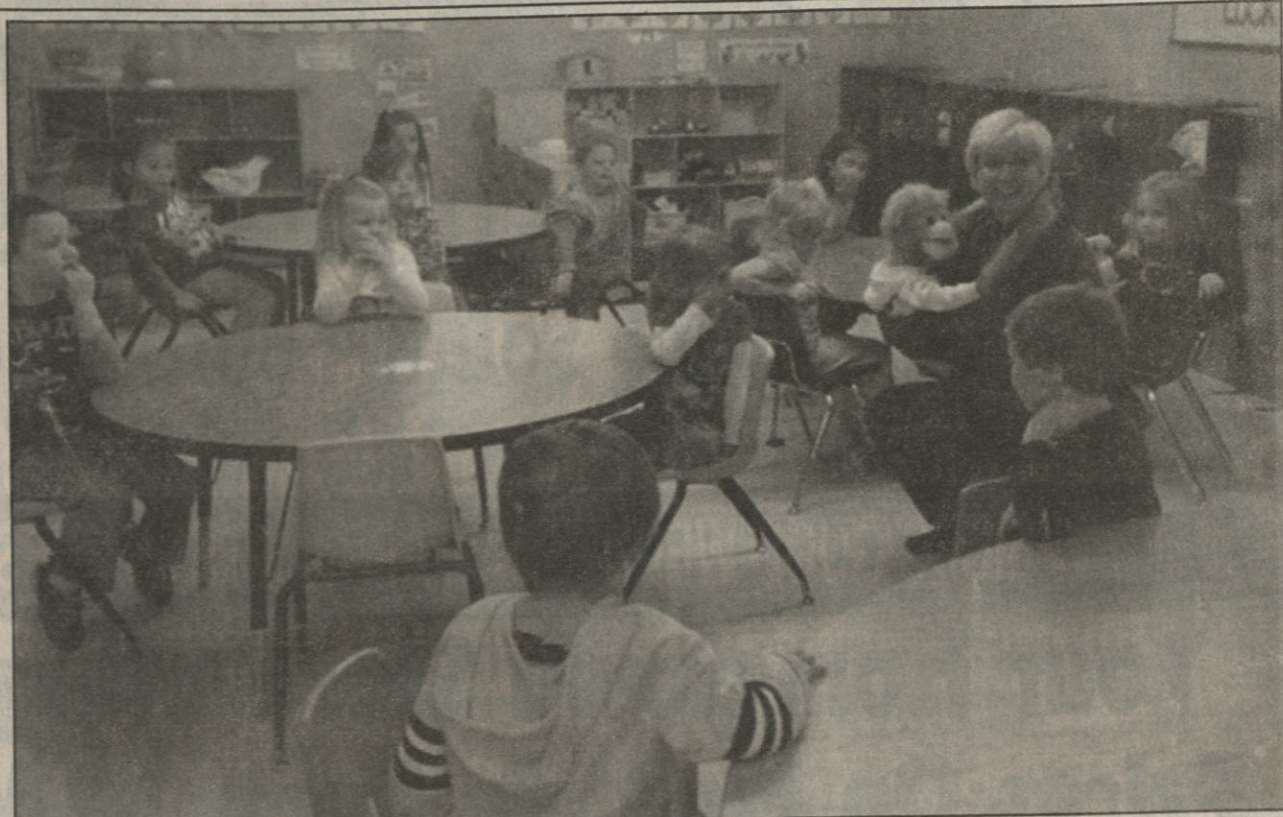
The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone #394 met on Friday, March 19th at 5 p.m. at the Iuka Public Library.

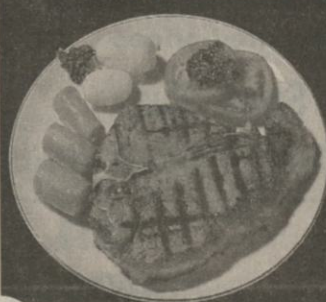

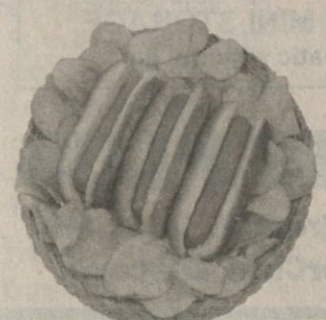

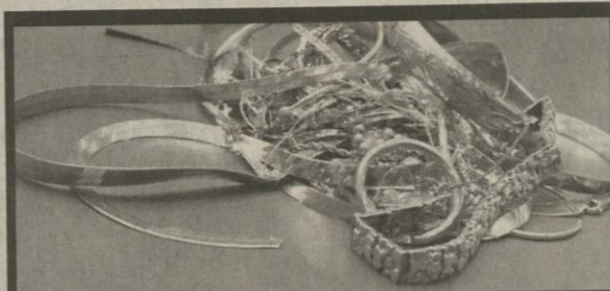
## March was Peanut Month

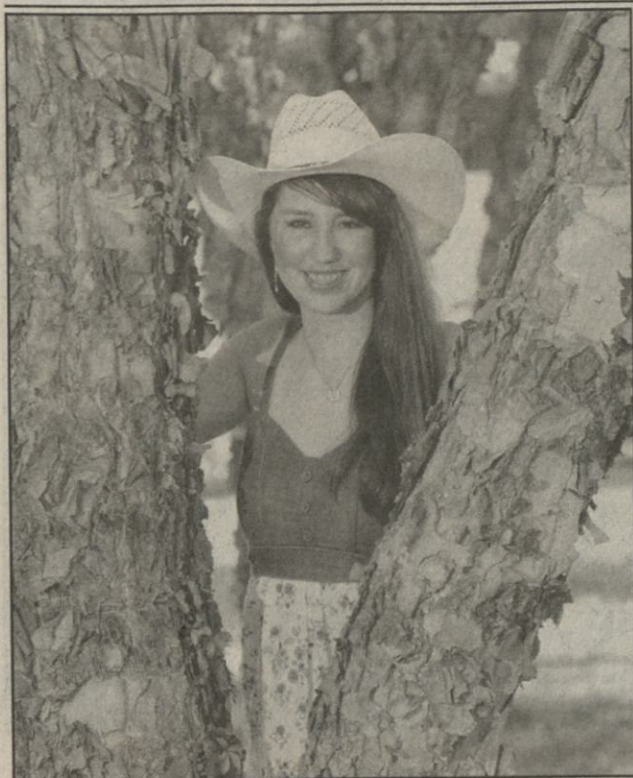

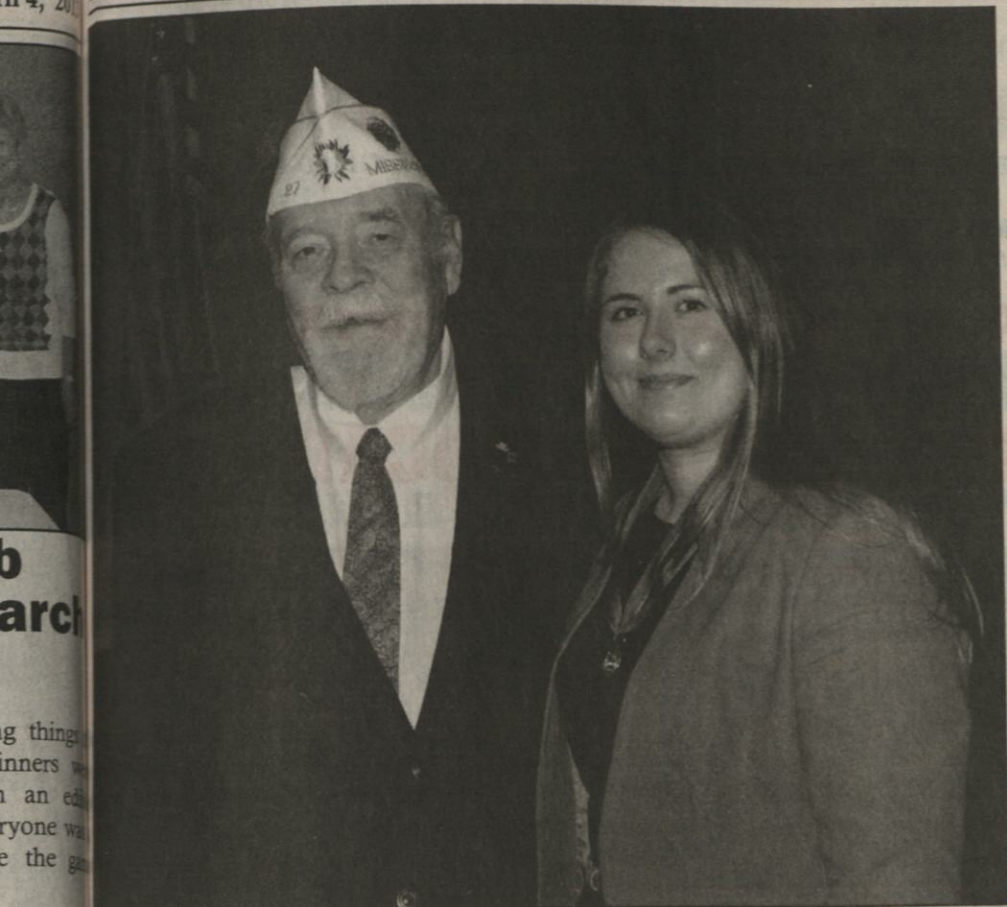

If you can contribute to the endowment fund where only the interest can be used, please send

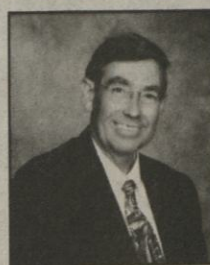

### How Deep Do Your Roots Go?

Incidentally, Christ can do that only by the Holy Spirit, so every truly born again person has the Spirit of God living in him. Our verse says we need to be rooted in Christ, hence my question above. Being rooted is more than being saved; it is being established in the faith. When we see the words "the faith", we are looking at a set of teaching that we often call "doctrine". That word should never scare a believer, for we are to learn good doctrine from those who teach us. Oh, it just occurred to me that many churches

do not make much of matter of teaching new converts, but that is a sad, sad mistake. The reason we are in the mess we are in today, at least in part, lies in the fact that many who have received Christ have never been taught the foundations of the faith. The verse says that we are to abound in good roots, so that we will know how to combat Satan in the world and the old man that lives in all of us. Our school systems are as careless about teaching children the fundamentals of good grammar, mathematics and true science as we would never be to make much progress in anything. We are not even able to communicate. I wonder if Christians think that the basics are less important. By J. Briggs King, Evangelist, Burnsville, MS.

He served our country in the Army 1950-52. From 1951-52 he served in Korea. After his stint in the Army he worked for the US Postal Service in Golden for 27 years.

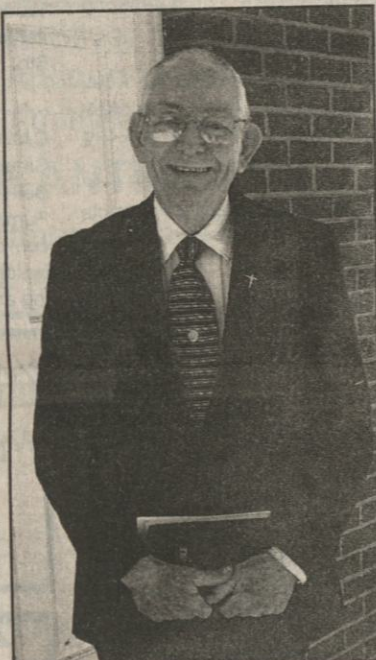

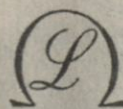

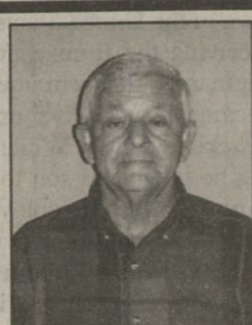
