The 2013 TCHS Baseball Braves proceed into the second round of the state playoffs this Thursday, when they head to Cleveland.

In first round action last Thursday, the Braves fell to Lafayette County in the first game, but on Friday, the Braves beat the Commodores in the first game at Oxford Friday with senior Dustin Allen pitching. The second game was scoreless and went to extra innings. Junior pitcher Blake McGuff pitched a shutout, and to win the game, J. Roaten got a hit that gave the Braves their 1-0 win, and ended the series.

Now in the "sweet 16" of the playoffs, the Braves will head to Delta to meet the 23-2 Cleveland Wildcats on their home field, where they have not lost a game this season. Friday night will bring the Braves home for a game at Braves Field beginning at 6:30. If a third game is necessary, it's back to the Delta.

## Retired TCEPA Manager Cecil H. Brown Dies

Cecil Harold Brown, 92, of Iuka, left this world to meet Jesus and his wife of sixty-eight years on April 25th, 2013. Mr. Brown was born on February 2nd, 1921, to Clarence "Farmer" and Beatrice Skinner Brown in Iuka, MS. He graduated from Iuka High School, and then joined the U.S. Navy in 1942. He was a veteran of WWII and served in the Pacific. Cecil married his long time friend, Lydia Mae Kirk, on November 11, 1944, and was stationed in Bremerton, WA. Following WWII he attended Mississippi State University on the G.I. Bill and graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Agricultural Engineering. His first child, Donnie, was born in Starkville, MS, in 1946. Later, he moved to Tishomingo and taught veterans. His second son, Ronnie, was born in Tishomingo. Mr. Brown moved to Iuka and joined Tishomingo County Electric Power Association in 1952. He served as manager of TCEPA from 1976 until he retired in 1986.

Mr. Brown was a good Christian man and loved his community. He served as a scoutmaster for Iuka Troop 26, was Wood Badge trained, and was a scout leader for Philmont Scout Ranch and two National Jamborees. He was also awarded the Silver Beaver in scouting, which was the highest volunteer award. He was a member of the Iuka School Board and was a volunteer with 4-H clubs. Mr. Brown was a member of the

Iuka Rotary Club and was selected as a Paul Harris Fellow. He was greatly involved in the Iuka United Methodist Church as a lay leader and was a conference lay delegate for many years. He served as a Sunday School teacher and Sunday School Superintendent, and held many other positions in the church. He was awarded the "Best Friend" award by the Friends of the Iuka Public Library, and loved playing Santa Claus for the children's Christmas party.

Services were held at 11 a.m. on Monday, April 29th, at the Iuka United Methodist Church with Rev. Jon Kaufman officiating. Burial was in Snowdown Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home was in charge of the arrangements.

## Drew Gatlin Kicking Off IDEA's Music in the Park May 18th

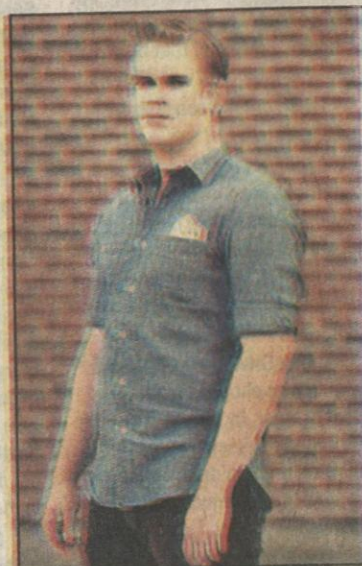

### Lots of Pros to Legalization

I hope the people of this county will pass the referendum allowing alcohol. I have been a social drinker most of my adult life. I am not an alcoholic. I do not drink and drive. These are choices I have made and were not based on laws or the availability of alcohol. (Most of that time, I lived where alcohol was allowed.)

These are the cons I keep hearing about.

**Addiction** - Not everyone who drinks is an alcoholic. If keeping a substance illegal prevented addiction, how is anyone addicted to cocaine? Alcoholism is a disease and laws cannot prevent it.

**Drunk Driving** - As it is now, anyone who chooses to drink alcohol must, by law, do it outside the county. It seems to me that allowing them to drink at home would actually reduce drunk driving.

**Drunk and Disorderly** - It is possible to have a drink without becoming intoxicated. Not every alcoholic beverage leads to drunkenness. This is a personal choice and again the people who over-indulge will do so regardless of the law.

**Children** - I have heard

opponents of the petition say they do not want their children exposed to alcohol. We cannot keep them wrapped in cotton forever. I believe that teaching them to say no or how to drink responsibly is a much better preparation for that first frat party or bachelor party.

Tax revenue seems to be the only positive anyone has pointed out. I would like to point out a few more advantages to legalizing alcohol.

**Fine dining** - Restaurants that serve chef-quality food often also serve wine and cocktails. Sometimes that is more profitable to the establishment than the food sales. We would be more likely to attract a fine restaurant if we allow the sale of alcohol.

**Celebrations** - A wedding reception could include a real champagne toast. Anniversary dinners could include a bottle of wine. Backyard cookouts could include cold beer. A ladies' movie night could include a pitcher of margaritas or martinis. A guy's night/sport night could include beer or cocktails. When you finally get the grass mowed on a hot day, you can have a cold beer in the shade.

**Businesses** - In addition to the restaurants mentioned, regular retail sales would likely increase as people who go into a store to buy alcohol may also buy other items. Responsible drinkers who have too much to drive will need rides, creating a need for a taxi service. Travelers who are accustomed to available

alcoholic beverages will be more likely to stay in our county. All those events listed under celebrations will need venues and other supplies.

At a recent anniversary celebration, we received a bottle of fine (and expensive) wine as a gift. I didn't have the nerve to tell our out-of-state guests that they had broken a local law. Named withheld to protect our unopened bottle of fine wine from confiscation.

### Will You Be Responsible For A Life

Is the sale of alcoholic beverage necessary in a community? Some say it will increase taxes. Others say it will bring in more business and industry. What they do not say is what else it will bring in - more auto accidents, more abuse to families, and more death to our teenagers and more poverty for those who spend their household money on it. Do you really know the effects of drinking alcoholic beverages?

Alcohol is a depressant. It affects your body and your mind. It slows down your thinking and reaction and it will distort judgment. It can ever cause a person the inability to feel pain. It can be toxic to the body causing unconsciousness, coma, or even death. Alcohol is absorbed into bloodstream through the small blood vessels of the stomach and the small intestines. It only takes minutes for it to reach the brain where it starts to affect the way a person thinks. About 20% is absorbed into the stomach which leaves 80% to go to the brain. Alcohol is also carried to the liver, which can only metabolize a certain amount in a certain set time. This leaves the rest circulating throughout the body. When the alcohol in the blood reaches a certain level, the breathing system is slowed so much that a coma or death is possible. At this point, oxygen can no longer reach the brain.

The possibility of a driver under the influence of alcohol

being killed in an auto accident is 11 times that of a driver who has not had a drink. These are just facts to many people, but to the families of those killed it is tragic reality. This is even more so when children are involved. In 2007 the death toll from teenage drinkers driving under the influence was nearly four teenagers every day of the year. Can we even imagine that? This does not take into account the other people that may have been killed in these same accidents.

Since alcohol distorts judgment, it will make a person take chances that they would not take when in their "right" mind. A friend, who had been drinking, took such a risk. He was a college student. After visiting his nearby home town and drinking, he decided to drive back to the college campus for an item he could have done without until the next day - a phone charger. Rather than stay in and be safe, he chose to drive. Driving too fast and impaired thinking does not mix without tragedy. He went off the road and was killed.

Tragedy for his family and loved ones. Driving on the wrong side of the road is another example of drinking and driving. A young mother and her child were both killed when this "impaired driver" drove around a curve on the wrong side of the highway and them head on.

Some statistics are:

The younger you are when you start drinking, the more likely you are to be a problem drinker.

Alcoholics do not know when they are becoming alcoholics until it is too late.

Alcohol poisoning occurs when you drink alcohol too fast, causing a coma or death.

It takes about one hour for each drink to be used by the body.

Do you want to take a change on being a part of these tragedies? Vote no to legalizing alcohol in our community. Do not have it on your conscious that someone was killed because they bought alcohol in our community.

the story about Uncle Sid coming home on leave from World War I. The train stopped and let him off in Paden, drunk. He went straight to his daddy's church that Sunday morning and broke the service. They got out and up to Tishomingo in time to put him back on the train; short visit to say least.

It always puzzles me to hear Paden folks talk about going somewhere and describing as going "down." They went "down" to Corinth, "down" to Memphis, everywhere was "down." But then, you have to remember that we are people, so every trip take is "down." The train stuck with us, even when we became "flatlanders."

A friend's son has been bitten by a copperhead. He had the good sense to kill it and take it with him to the emergency room. There was a problem with the receptionist when he insisted on bringing it in to show the doctor. She said the security officer prevailed, so he threw it at a bush at the main door. Watch for snakes.

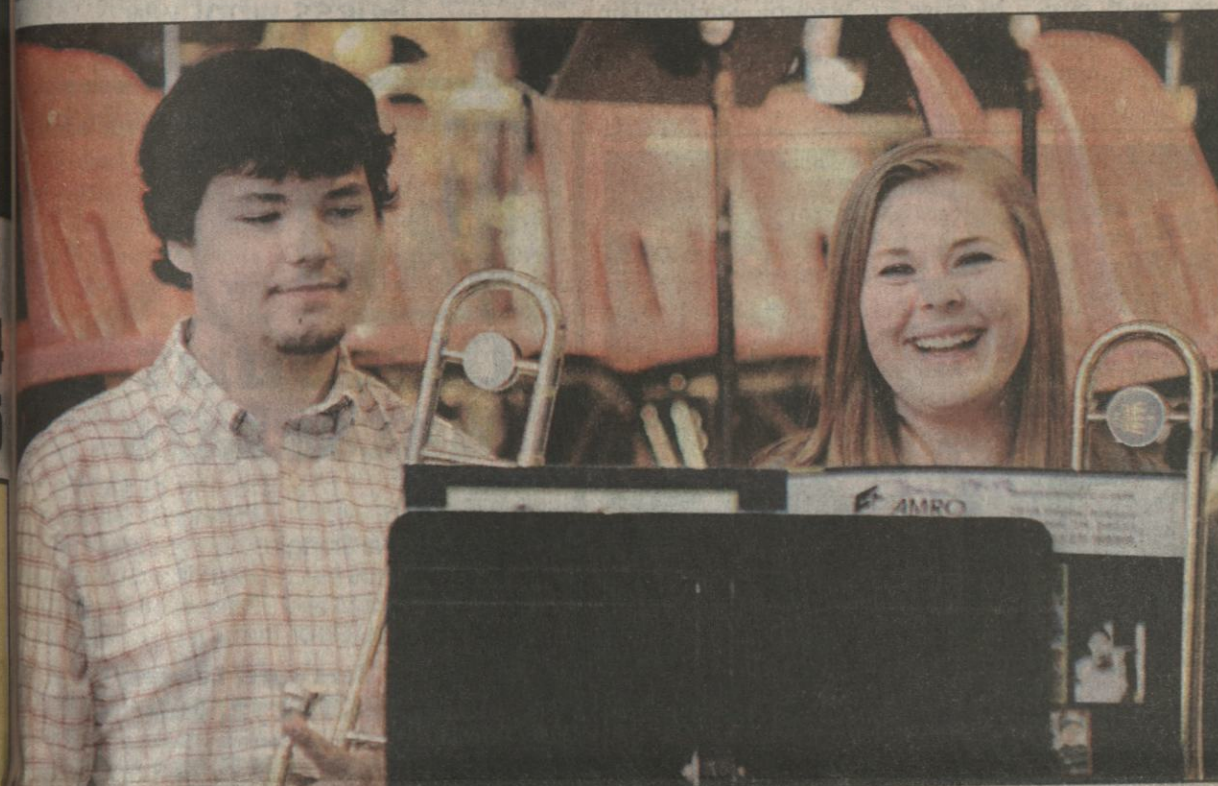

## Southern Cornerstones Peabody Hotel and the Brinkley Connection

Robert Campbell Brinkley, who usually signed his name as "R. C.," went to Memphis, Tennessee, as a lawyer. The son of William Brinkley and Margaret Garrett Campbell Brinkley, R. C. was born on May 26, 1816, in North Carolina. He was about 20 years old when his father bought a farm near Jackson, Tennessee. Brinkley read law in the office of Judge Pleasant M. Miller at Jackson, and then in the office of Foster & Fogg in Nashville, which was probably the legal firm in the state during that time. Brinkley was admitted to the practice of law in 1839.

In October 1841, Brinkley married Anne Coleman Overton, daughter of Judge John Overton and his wife, Mary, in Davidson County, Tennessee. Anne's father was one of Tennessee's prominent early citizens and a close friend of Andrew Jackson. Judge Overton had reportedly once owned all of the land on which the original Memphis city plan was laid. He had been the ultimate authority on land laws of Tennessee, which was the Brinkley specialty.

In 1842, R. C. and Anne Brinkley moved to Memphis. He was soon in a quandary over whether to use his time for his booming career as a lawyer or for managing his wife's extensive real estate, most of it empty and producing large tax bills. R. C. and Anne had two children, Anne Overton Brinkley and Hugh Lawson Brinkley. Hugh was named after a great-uncle, a senator, and one-time presidential candidate, Hugh Lawson White. The children's mother died on May 31, 1845, before she reached her 22nd birthday, and Brinkley took down his professional shingle to manage her real estate holdings.

R. C. Brinkley then married Elizabeth Mhoon of Pride's Crossing, Alabama, in October 1853 in Franklin County, Alabama. This marriage produced five children: James Mhoon, Bettie F., Robert C., Lucille, and William

Junius. The Brinkley family had homes at Iuka, Mississippi; Horseshoe Lake, Arkansas; as well as a large house occupying a city block of Poplar and Manassas in Memphis.

In 1869, Brinkley connected four buildings he owned at the northwest corner of Main and Monroe into a 75-room hotel, which he briefly named the Brinkley Hotel. The \$60,000 hotel boasted gas-lit rooms with private baths, a first class dining room and tearoom, shops and amenities, exceptional entertainment, a ballroom, a saloon, and lobby. It cost \$3 to \$4 a day for a room and meals, and an extra charge was added for a fire or gas light. Just prior to its opening, R. C. Brinkley received news of the death of his good friend, philanthropist George Peabody. As a sign of respect and to honor his friend, the structure became the original Peabody Hotel and led the way toward the Memphis street, park, and school with names honoring Peabody. The original Peabody Hotel was a center for travelers until it closed in 1923, and the building was replaced with Lowenstein's Department Store.

R. C. Brinkley's

daughter, Anne Overton Brinkley, married Robert Bogardus Snowden, a Confederate lieutenant colonel. R. C. Brinkley was generous in his wedding gifts to his daughter and her new husband. He purchased the couple a house located on 200 acres on Pidgeon Roost Road (now Lamar); the Italianate mansion was built in 1855 by Dr. Samuel Mansfield. After it was purchased for the Snowden couple, it was named "Annesdale" in honor of the bride. The mansion, surrounded by trees and shrubbery, is located at 1325 Lamar and adjoined by Snowden Circle. He also gave them the Peabody Hotel, a Mid-South institution considered synonymous with Southern hospitality and Delta style to this day. The 13-story hotel is an excellent example of Italian Renaissance Revival architecture and is Memphis' only historic hotel. For 96 years, the Snowden heirs were connected directly or indirectly with the affairs of the hotel. Lavish balls were held at The Peabody. The original Peabody was host to such notables as Presidents Andrew Johnson and William McKinley

and Confederate Generals Robert E. Lee, Nathan Bedford Forrest, and Jubal Early. Plantation owners, professional gamblers, and movie stars frequented The Peabody. It was the place to see and be seen. The Peabody continued to enjoy success until it closed in 1923. In 1925, a \$5 million Peabody Hotel, designed by architect Walter Ahlshlager, opened at its present downtown Memphis location on Union Avenue. At this point, ownership had passed into the hands of the Memphis Hotel Company, controlled by R. Brinkley Snowden, great-grandson of the original builder.

Writing long after R. C. Brinkley's death, J. M. Keating said in his history of the city of Memphis that Brinkley was "an amiable gentleman of agreeable manners, upright in all his dealings, full of enterprise, and a leader who moved toward the goal he set without faltering for a moment." R. C. Brinkley spent the majority of his time and energy in the Memphis area; nevertheless, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, is proud of its Brinkley heritage.

## Clovis J. Isbell

Clovis J. Isbell, 83, of Cairo, MS, passed away on Tuesday, April 30th, 2013, at his home. He was born on March 29th, 1930. He was a farmer. He was the first Fire Chief of Cairo Volunteer Fire Department and was instrumental in the origin of Cairo Volunteer Fire Department. He was a member of Clausel Hill Independent Methodist Church, a U.S. Marine Veteran of the Korean Conflict. He was a 32nd degree Mason, member of the VFW and Eastern Star. He enjoyed gospel blue grass music, farming and Christmas decorating and the visits from his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.



Services were held at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, May 1st, 2013, at Clausel Hill Independent Methodist Church with Bro. Gary Redd and Bro. Jack Whitney officiating. Burial was in New Lebanon Cemetery in Cairo, MS with Military Honors and Masonic Rites. Magnolia Funeral Home was in charge of the arrangements.

## Shiloh Battlefield to Host Civil War Encampment and Demonstrations

SHILOH, TN - "Shiloh National Military Park will host a Living History Weekend focusing on Civil War Union infantry on Saturday, May 4th, and Sunday, May 5th, 2013," Superintendent John Bunney announced today. The encampment and scheduled living history programs, presented by living historians portraying the 8th Missouri United States Infantry Regiment, will be conducted in the area of the historic Peach Orchard, located at tour stop #16 on the automobile tour route.

The 8th Missouri Infantry Regiment was assigned to General Lew Wallace's Third Division of General U. S. Grant's Army of the Tennessee at the Battle of Shiloh. The regiment was encamped at Crump's Landing and upon hearing sounds of battle on the morning of April 6th, 1862, General Wallace ordered the unit to march to Stony Lonesome, located halfway between Crump's Landing and Adamsville, Tennessee. At 12:00 p.m. the regiment started toward the bloody field of Shiloh. "The 8th

Missouri reported 673 soldiers present for duty, and would be engaged with Confederate forces on Monday, April 7th, 1862, pushing the determined Southerners back from the area of Pittsburg Landing southward to Shiloh Church," said ranger Chris Mekow. By the end of the two day battle the Union army would suffer a total of 13,047 casualties, while inflicting 10,699 casualties upon General Albert Sidney Johnston's Army of the Mississippi.

The 8th Missouri Infantry Regiment would continue to witness combat throughout the Civil War until they were mustered out on August 14th, 1865. They would fight numerous terrible battles including; Corinth, Vicksburg, Missionary Ridge, Kennesaw Mountain, and Atlanta.

A period camp will be set up for the public to visit, and reenactors will be available to answer questions concerning uniforms, equipment, and weapons. The following is a schedule of events for the weekend:
