Kosciusko, Here We Come!

Braves Beat Cleveland in 2 to Advance to North Half Semifinals

The Tishomingo County Braves handed Cleveland their first home loss for the season last week to progress on to North-Half semifinal play at the Mississippi State Baseball Tournament.

Last Thursday, the Braves hosted Cleveland for the opening game of the third round of play-offs, since Cleveland was experiencing enough rain to cause flooding problems in that part of the state.

Gable Butler on the mound, good defensive work by the Braves, and a single out-of-the-park home run by junior Austin Marlin combined to give the Braves a 1-0 win at their home field Thursday night.

Saturday, the Braves traveled to Cleveland to hand the Wildcats their first loss at home, and their fourth, and season-ending loss for the season. Final score was 2-1.

The 22-10 Braves take the field next at Kosciusko Friday night at 7 p.m. The second game will be at home in Iuka Saturday at 7 p.m. If a third game is necessary, they will play in Kosciusko Monday.

The Kosciusko Whippets beat New Albany last week to progress to the "Elite 8" of the Mississippi State Tournament. They are 24-6 for the season, and TC Coach Jerry Long said the Braves are facing a challenge, but he believes they can win. The winner of the series will meet the winner of the Lewisburg-Houston series in the North-Half finals.

2nd Annual Sammy Darwin Memorial Bike Ride Raises \$1,500 for Backpack Ministry

Bike riders from Iuka and the surrounding communities braved the rainy weather Saturday to ride bicycles in memory of Iuka native, Sammy Darwin, who passed away suddenly last May.

Proceeds from the ride benefit the Backpack Ministry of Tishomingo County, a 501c3 non-profit mission project of Mt. Evergreen UMC in Iuka. More than \$1,500 dollars was

raised in support of this project, which provides meal packs during the school year to be taken home over the weekends, so that 144 children in our community do not go hungry while they are away from school. The Backpack Ministry currently serves students at Iuka Headstart, Tishomingo Headstart, Burnsville Headstart, and Iuka Boys and Girls Club.

Special Election on Liquor Overshadowing Upcoming June 4th Municipal Elections

With a controversial special election on legalizing alcohol sales less than two weeks away, there's been very little said on upcoming June 4th municipal elections.

May 21st, county voters will decide if Tishomingo County will come out from under Prohibition for the first time. There have been many advertisements and letters to the editor on both sides of this hot-button issue, and the Citizens' Coalition for a Dry County has been meeting regularly, and there's a get-out-the-vote rally scheduled by the same. There's even a march and prayer rally scheduled for the night before the election.

But for the municipal elections that are in four weeks, only a few Iuka aldermen and one

Iuka mayoral candidate have advertised at all. There are no political signs posted, and campaigning has been very quiet.

Absentee Voting

For the special election, the county Circuit Court office is open regular hours, and the next two Saturdays they will be open until noon for absentee voting, for those who will be unable to vote in the May 21st election. May 18th will be the last date to vote by absentee ballot in the clerk's office, and all mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5 p.m. on Monday, May 20th, in order to be eligible to be counted for the May 21st, special election.

Dean, Hampton and Brown Recognized by American Chemical Society

The Tishomingo County High School chemistry program is well known for preparing its students for college classes, and last week, its excellence was confirmed again when a student, a graduate, and the teacher were all recognized by the American Chemical Society.

Cecilia Dean received a second place award for the high school chemistry competition exam sponsored by the Wilson Dam section of the American Chemical Society. Cecilia scored the second highest of 1,400 students to take the exam given this past spring to high school students from Southwest Tennessee, Northwest Alabama, and Northeast Mississippi. Cecilia received a certificate, a freshman general chemistry textbook valued around \$250, plus a

\$200 cash prize. Cecilia was also the high scorer from TCHS and will have her name placed on a plaque for being the 2013 high scorer.

Alex Hampton, currently a junior chemistry major and a 2010 TC graduate, won an Analytical Chemistry Award for having the highest average in analytical chemistry this past year at the University of North Alabama.

Tishomingo County High School chemistry teacher, Malcolm Brown received the Thomas Murray Outstanding High School Chemistry Teacher of the Year Award for 2013.

Congratulations to each for their efforts in the field of chemistry.

Postal Carriers Collecting Food for Local Food Banks Saturday

On Saturday, May 11, residents across America will be asked to join the U. S. Postal Service and its delivery carriers to combat one of this nation's growing problems - hunger, by leaving food at their mailboxes. This one-day food drive is the nation's largest single-day food drive across America. Postal carriers in Belmont, Golden and Iuka will participate in Tishomingo County.

In 2012 letter carriers nationally collected 70 million pounds of food donated by customers on their delivery

routes.

Residents are encouraged to leave non-perishable foods, such as canned soup, canned vegetables, pasta, rice or cereal next to their mailbox prior to the time of regular mail delivery on Saturday, May 11.

Carriers will collect these food donations as they deliver the mail and take them to their local food bank or pantry. About 50 million Americans - including 17 million children - now live in families that lack sufficient food.

Northeast Board Approves Tuition Increase

BOONEVILLE, Miss.— At its regularly scheduled monthly meeting in April, Northeast Mississippi Community College's 15-member Board of Trustees approved a \$75 per semester tuition increase to go into effect this fall.

Recommended to the Board by school president Johnny L. Allen, Ed.D., the hike was the first for Northeast since 2010. Allen said while the move was necessary as it was the last time, he didn't take his recommendation lightly.

"It's never a positive thing when colleges have to pass more of the cost of attendance on to the students and their families," Allen explained. "For the past few years the Legislature has asked our (community/junior college) system to continue to provide a quality educational experience to the majority of the college students in the state of Mississippi without increasing its support for those students and their educational endeavors."

Northeast's tuition per semester for a fulltime (12 hours minimum), Mississippi resident student went from \$945 to \$1050

in the fall of 2010. This year's increase moves the same figure to \$1,125.

According to Allen, his recommendation to the Board was based on information compiled by the school's Fee Committee that showed costs to operate the college such as food, fuel and employee fringe benefits had steadily increased over time.

"It's disappointing, but it's where we are," Allen said. "Our Board and the people we serve depend on us to manage our resources responsibly, and I commend our administration and staff for being diligent in their efforts to do that. This is a step we never like to take, but we feel as though at this time, we have no choice."

An increase to other fees including out-of-state/country tuition, part-time student tuition and meal tickets was also recommended and approved by the Board. Out-of-state tuition went from \$2,100 to \$2,250 per full-time semester. Out-of-country tuition rose from \$2,200 to \$2,400. Per semester hour cost for part-time was bumped to \$125 per semester hour for in-state students and \$250

per semester hour for out-of-staters.

Northeast offers two resident and one commuter meal ticket plan. The resident 15-meal plan now costs \$787 per semester as opposed to the \$764 of last year. A 19-meal, which includes the weekend, increased to \$964 per semester from last year's \$936. The Noon Meal Plan (commuter) includes lunch on weekdays and rose to \$284 per semester from \$275.

Northeast will host sessions of Orientation for first-time students Thursday, June 6 and Tuesday, June 18. Fall registration is set for Tuesday and Wednesday, August 6 and 7. Classes for the 2013 fall semester begin Thursday, August 8.

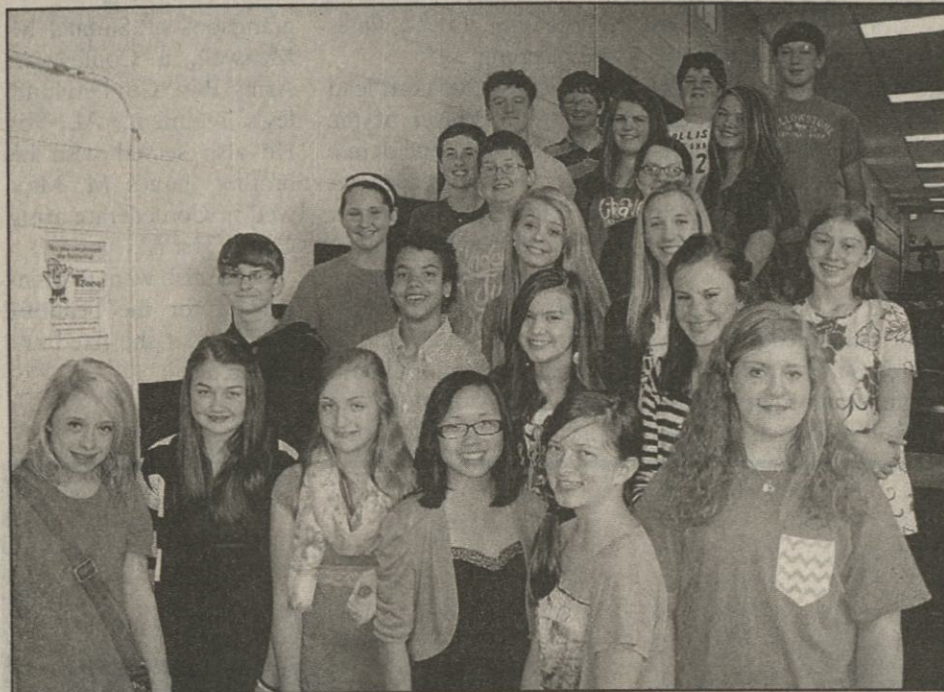

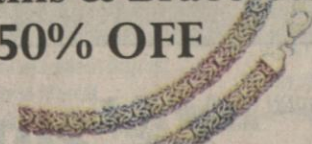
