# **Burnsville Child Killed** in Accidental Shooting

#### by Pamela McRae

A five-year-old Burnsville child died as a result of an accidental shotgun wound last Thursday night.

Burnsville Police and sheriff's department officers were called to the Cotton Gin Trailer Park about 10 p.m. May 23rd.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Izak Russel "Bugga" Lambert was accidentally shot in the chest with a 12-gauge pump shotgun that was in the home for protection. His mother and sister were at the home with him at the time, and he was transported by ambulance to Iuka Hospital. A helicopter was standing by to transport the child to another hospital when medical personnel could stabilize him, but despite the best efforts of the Iuka staff, the child was declared dead at 11:14 p.m., said Wilemon.

After interviewing family members and witnesses at the scene, it has been determined that the death resulted from accidental discharge of the gun and the investigation is closed.

Izak was a recent graduate from Burnsville Headstart, where teachers say he was kind to everyone and had lots of friends. He was always smiling, and was

great at puzzles and loved playing on the playground.

He is survived by his parents, Amber and Petey Lambert of Burnsville; an 8-year-old sister, Julya; grandparents Doris and James Lambert of Burnsville, and Jackie Rozelle of Aberdeen, Mississippi; and uncle Timothy Lambert of Burnsville, as well as several other aunts, uncles and cousins.

Cutshall Funeral Home of Glen was in charge of arrangements, and the service was Sunday, May 26th. Bro. Jason Blakney and Bro. Jonathan Burdine officiated at the service.

He was preceded in death by a grandfather, Robert Dedmon Rozelle.
