Burnsville Child Killed in Accidental Shooting

A five-year-old Burnsville child died as a result of an accidental shotgun wound last Thursday night.

Burnsville Police and sheriff's department officers were called to the Cotton Gin Trailer Park about 10 p.m. May 23rd.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Izak Russel "Bugga" Lambert was accidentally shot in the chest with a 12-gauge pump shotgun that was in the home for protection. His mother and sister were at the home with him at the time, and he was transported by ambulance to Iuka Hospital. A helicopter was standing by to transport the child to another hospital when medical personnel could stabilize him, but despite the best efforts of the Iuka staff, the child was declared dead at 11:14 p.m., said Wilemon.

After interviewing family members and witnesses at the scene, it has been determined that the death resulted from accidental discharge of the gun and the investigation is closed.

Izak was a recent graduate from Burnsville Headstart, where teachers say he was kind to everyone and had lots of friends. He was always smiling, and was

great at puzzles and loved playing on the playground.

He is survived by his parents, Amber and Petey Lambert of Burnsville; an 8-year-old sister, Julia; grandparents Doris and James Lambert of Burnsville, and Jackie Rozelle of Aberdeen, Mississippi; and uncle Timothy Lambert of Burnsville, as well as several other aunts, uncles and cousins.

Cutshall Funeral Home of Glen was in charge of arrangements, and the service was Sunday, May 26th. Bro. Jason Blakney and Bro. Jonathan Burdine officiated at the service.

He was preceded in death by a grandfather, Robert Dedmon Rozelle.

May 15th-17th several dozen people interested in improving communities all over Mississippi came together for the 4th annual YourTown Mississippi workshop at Lake Tiak O'Khata in Louisville.

Belmont Mayor Buddy Wiltshire attended, and Iuka sent three representatives - Pamela McRae and Jan Anglin from IDEA (Iuka Development & Economic Association), and Luther Britten, of the Sparkplug project that recently completed the renovation of the Johnson-Ford-Mitchell Community Center in Iuka.

The workshop is presented annually by the Stennis Institute for Government at Mississippi State University, the Appalachian Regional Commission, Mis-

issippi Development Authority, and others. Workshop participants studied many aspects of community development including community planning strategies, economic development, asset identification, marketing and branding, historic preservation, and they all participated in a group exercise to make a plan for a fictional town facing many of the same issues that our communities are facing.

"It was so inspiring," said Anglin. "It should really be mandatory for all our public officials to attend. It was so inspiring! We learned so many valuable lessons about making good communities, not just allowing them to develop by

Oliver Paul Nunley Shares Military Experiences

Oliver Paul Nunley visited the Old Courthouse Museum on February 20, 2013, to share his military experiences in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He was one of three sons of Oliver Perry Nunley and Nora Bell Vaughn Nunley who served during the war, and one of the two sons who eventually returned home.

Mr. Nunley was born in Town Creek, Alabama, November 1926. His father was a farmer and operated a minnow business. The family moved to Tishomingo County on January 1, 1927, and the children attended Snowtown Community School. Mr. Nunley was drafted into the U.S. Navy on November 5, 1944, and was trained at gunnery school in Great Lakes, Illinois, and received more advanced gunnery training, including winch training and handling ammunition, at Treasure Island, California, near San Diego.

Mr. Nunley was a member of the Armed Guard, an elite unit of the U.S. Navy. These armed guardsmen were established during World War II to protect ships against German and Japanese submarines and planes. He was stationed on the USS Bernard Victory which carried 6,000 tons of ammunition to The Philippines. He served in the South Pacific near the island of Leyte, Philippines. The ship was attacked by a Japanese submarine, but ably fought off the enemy. When the Japanese submarine attacked the USS Bernard Victory on its voyage to The Philippines, Mr. Nunley remembers seeing two torpedoes bare-missing the ship.

During that same time, his brother, James Preston Nunley, was only about 400 miles from him when he went down with his ship, the USS Indianapolis, on July 30, 1945. The sinking of the USS Indianapolis led to the greatest single loss of life at sea in the history of the U.S. Navy. Shortly after delivering critical parts for

the first atomic bomb to be used in combat to the U.S. air base at Tinian, the ship was torpedoed by a Japanese submarine, sinking in 12 minutes. Of 1,196 crewmen aboard the ship, about 300 went down with it. However, the remaining 900 men faced exposure, dehydration, and shark attacks as they waited for assistance while floating with few lifeboats and almost no food or water. Unfortunately, the ship was not missed due to communication issues, and the Navy only learned that the USS Indianapolis sunk when survivors were spotted four days later by an airplane crew on routine patrol. Only 316 sailors survived.

Mr. Nunley's middle brother, Forrest Lunsford "Bud" Nunley, was in

the U.S. Air Force during World War II. He was a tail gunner on a B-24 Superfortress and served in the Atlantic until the war ended in Europe; he was then transferred to the West coast to serve his time in the Pacific. Mr. Nunley and his middle brother never crossed paths during the war.

One thing that constantly resonates on Mr. Nunley's mind is a plaque that hung on the wall of the old homestead. It contained three blue stars to signify that three sons were in military service from the Nunley home. When Preston Nunley was lost at sea, one of the blue stars turned to red.

Mr. Nunley finishes a recording he made himself by saying, "Preston sleeps, I reckon, in the deepest part of the ocean near Mariana Trench in the South Pacific 7 miles deep. So this little recording was made in memory of my brother ... and I will close by saying:

"Sleep in peace, brother."

"This is Oliver Paul Nunley, Seaman First Class, 9817006, U.S. Navy Armed Guard."
