County Issues Beer Ordinance; Cities Approve Liquor and Beer Ordinances

The county has approved a beer and light wine ordinance that will allow legal beer and wine sales throughout the county as early as July 1st.

May 21st, Tishomingo voters narrowly approved the legalization of beer and light wine in the

county for the first time since Prohibition.

Until the county and municipalities adopt ordinances governing local sale, distribution, possession receipt and transfer of alcoholic beverages, the state regulations govern those issues, and the county's quickly issued ordinance is aimed at heading

off the possibility of potentially undesirable establishments or practices that are allowed in the state regulations.

The county ordinance controls sale of beer and light wine throughout the county outside of any municipalities, and includes:

- Sale hours: no Sunday sales;

only 7 a.m. to midnight Monday - Saturday

- Cold sales allowed. No drive in sales.

- Establishments that sell by the drink have to have a kitchen that's open the whole time, generate at least 25 percent of revenue from sale of food prepared on premises, and seat at least 40 persons.

- No open containers in public or in vehicles

- No billboards; other advertisements limited to inside and on the outside of the actual structure where beer or light wine is sold.

- No gambling where beer or light wine is sold

- No lewd, immoral or improper entertainment, conduct or

practices where beer or light wine is sold

For the complete county ordinance with all details see page 13.

Information on whether any person or company have applied for beer or liquor sales permits has not been available from the Department of Revenue, but Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors Attorney Philip Whitehead confirmed that no applications have been made for the county privilege license.

All permit applications go through the State Department of Revenue, and then permitted establishments must pay the privilege license fee to the County Tax Collector.

Cities Move Fast on Ordinances

Several municipalities have approved their ordinances for the sale of liquor, and beer, as well. Complete publication of the municipal ordinances will be available in the next week, according to reports.

Sale of liquor is only allowed in municipalities, so cities will have a separate liquor ordinance, as well as a beer ordinance.

Tishomingo approved their liquor sales ordinance Tuesday night, and Burnsville and Belmont approved their beer sales ordinances Tuesday. They mostly follow along with the county's, except Burnsville is allowing Sunday beer sales, according to their ordinance.

Liquor ordinances for Burnsville and Belmont were not available at presstime.

Iuka issued a moratorium May 15th in anticipation of the

potential passage of the county referendum, and their agenda for the June 5th meeting includes extending the moratorium until they prepare their ordinance.

It forbids the construction, licensing, opening or otherwise operating businesses or other establishments for the purpose of selling or distributing adult beverages as defined as liquor, beer or light wine; adult entertainment; and/or adult materials including, but not limited to: adult cabarets, theaters, video stores, book or novelty stores for a period of 60 (sixty) days from this date so that the City of Iuka may investigate and determine proper regulations, ordinances and other such laws concerning said businesses.

Official ordinances will be published as legal advertisements next week.

Hot Rods Stop in Iuka Wednesday

200-600 vintage cars came through Iuka Wednesday as part of the Hot Rod Power Tour. Municipal elections Tuesday were the climax of a very quiet city election season.

Iuka will have a new mayor; Castleberry defeated incumbent Jackie Bryant by just votes.

Belmont, Golden, Paden, Tishomingo and Burnsville will

keep their incumbent mayors.

Aldermen

In Burnsville, incumbents Harold Barnes, Robert Davis, Niesha Carpenter, Billy Don Hamm will be joined by Mike Epperson on the board of aldermen.

In Belmont, incumbent

Brandon Pharr will return, and new board members will be Craig Bell, Mike Harris, Steve Ratliff and Sonya South.

In Golden, incumbent aldermen Sherry Shook and John Giles will be joined by Rebecca Ozbirn, Sandra Collum, and Stan Malone.

In Tishomingo, all the in-

cumbents won re-election, and Doyle Hopkins beat Raines Russell for the fifth seat.

In Paden, only five candidates ran, and Kristy Deaton will join incumbents Keith Deaton, Jean Luttrell, James Murphy and Brian Broughton on the board.

Aldridge Charged with Phone Harrassment

Local petition organizer Charles "Tubby" Aldridge was charged with telephone harassment last week in connection with repeated phone calls he made to a local pastor.

According to the docket at the Tishomingo County Jail, Aldridge was charged May 31st with telephone harassment. He reported to the jail himself, he said, and was released on cash bond shortly afterward.

In statements made Monday, Aldridge said he called Bro. Tony Curtis, pastor at Fifth Street Baptist Church and one of the leaders of the "Coalition for a Dry County," about "10-15 times," leaving voicemails for him each time. Curtis did not return the calls, nor answer, said Aldridge.

Aldridge said he was calling Bro. Curtis to ask about information included in advertisements the Coalition published and aired in the weeks prior to the May 21st election. Aldridge claimed that information in the ads was false, and that "no one in the State offices in Jackson" knew anything about the statements being true. When asked, Aldridge couldn't identify any particular statement or information, claiming he "can't read or write."

"Since I was the leader of the petition drive, and he showed himself to be the leader of the other side, he should have to answer my questions," said Aldridge, who, in the days since the narrowly successful election to bring Tishomingo County out from under the dry laws, has been taking advantage of the public spotlight to announce himself as a candidate for county sheriff — three years from now. According to the Mississippi state elections code, Aldridge's felony DUI conviction, for which he has stated he served time in the state penitentiary, will preclude him from being a viable candidate for public office, unless the governor pardons him between now and then.

Aldridge said he must report to justice court July 2nd for the misdemeanor charge of telephone harassment.

Bro. Curtis declined any specific comment regarding the recent telephone harassment charges, but said he felt he had to take action out of concern for his family.

Honeycutt-Wimberly Announce June Wedding

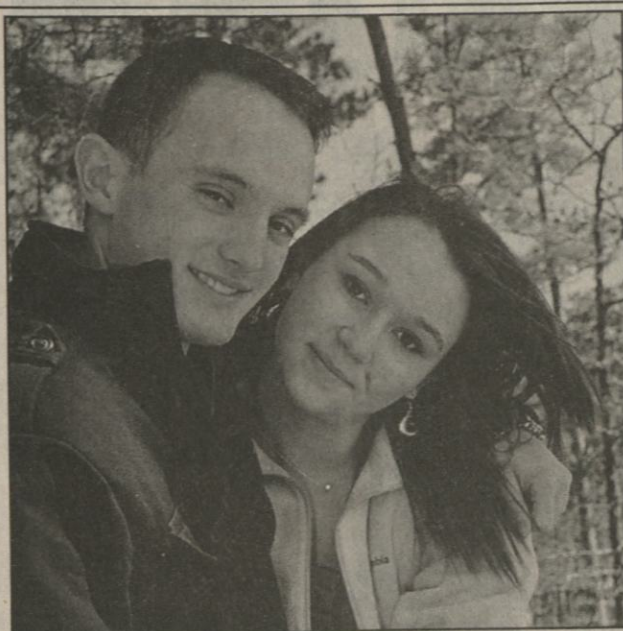

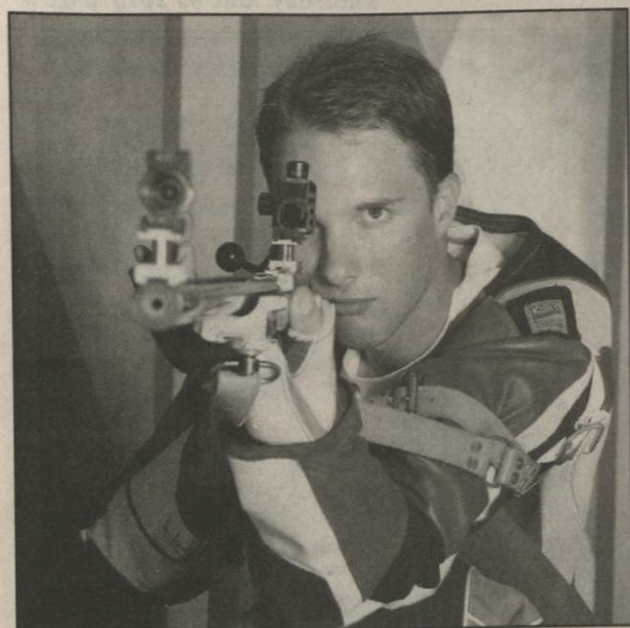

Luke South is on University of Kentucky's Rifle Team

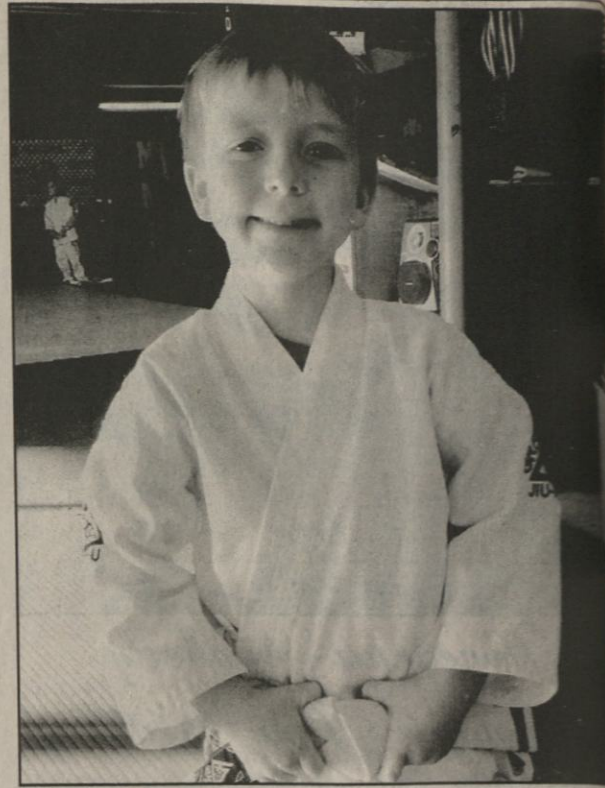

Woodall Mountain Climb June 29th for Cops on Top

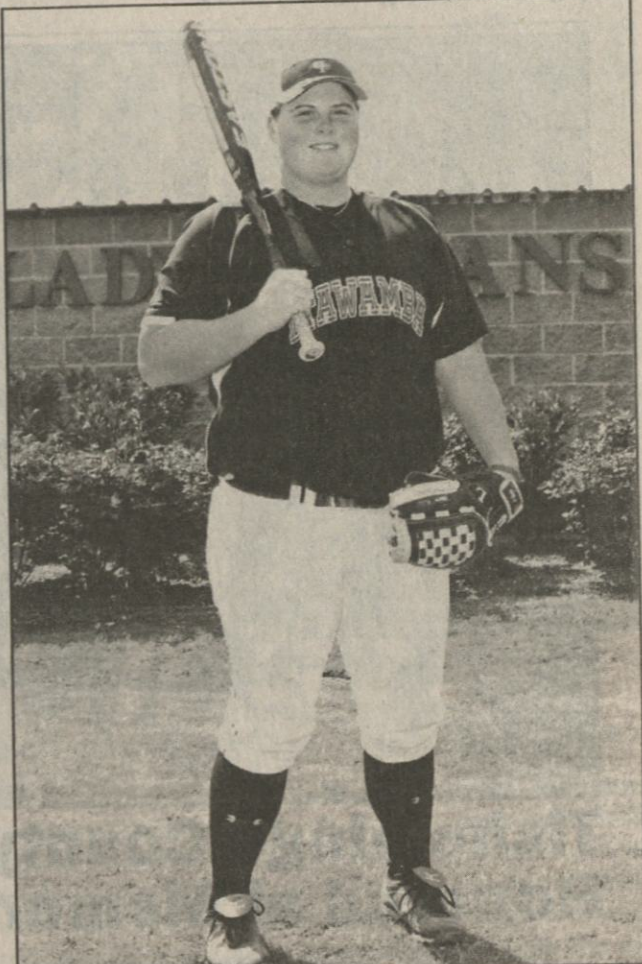
People from all over Mississippi will converge on Woodall Mountain later this month to honor the memory of fallen law

NOTICE OF PROPOSED AD VALOREM TAX EFFORT TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2013-2014 on June 17, 2013, 5:00 p.m., at the Superintendent's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$26,364,477. 22% or \$5,671,460, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$26,873,439. Of that amount 21% or \$5,697,474, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the proposed increase in ad valorem tax effort by Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District may result in an increase in the ad valorem tax millage rate. Ad valorem taxes are paid on homes, automobile tags, business fixtures and equipment, and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax effort, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

You were with General Morgan and his militia in the Carolinas. Things were not going well in the War for Independence. Tarleton and his redcoat regulars had chased you up against the Broad River. They thought they had you trapped but you turned on the British with a vengeance at the Cowpens and whipped them good. We buried you at the Cowpens but not before your actions helped win the War for Independence and free America forever.

You were with Captain Lawrence on the USS Chesapeake. The year was 1813 and the British were once again fighting the colonies. Lawrence cried Dont Give up the Ship as the battle progressed poorly. You and Lawrence died together on the Chesapeake that day. Your deaths and words, however, served as inspiration to the colonies to once again throw off the yoke of British Imperialism.

You were with the Irish Brigade at Antietam. Lee had invaded the North and the Union was in peril. You and 540 of the Brigade fell that day in the Bloody Lane but not before you turned the Rebels back to Richmond. You saved the Union and made slavery disappear from the face of America forever.

I Remember You
You were with Blackjack Pershing in France in 1918. Ten million had already died in those miserable trenches and it had to stop. You made the big push into the Meuse-Argonne and you pushed and pushed until the German Army collapsed. You rest now in grave 1232 in Argonne Cemetery but you made the world safe again for democracy.

I Remember You
You were in the first wave at Tarawa. We needed that tiny island for bombing raids on Japan and we sent you first to start the fight. Your body drifted slowly out to sea as the second and third waves came in to win the battle. As the battle went, so did the war and the evil empires of Japan and Germany were gone forever.

You were at Frozen and surrounded by the Chinese. It was time to advance to the sea and get out of that bloody trap. Your buddies strapped your dying body to a tank and kept the motor running to keep you from freezing in the 30 below cold. CONSERVATION CORNER

Alligator Season Announced

Alligators can be found in abundance across the state of Mississippi. Most prevalent south of Highway 82, alligators will typically avoid any interaction with humans. However, juvenile alligators will often disperse into new territories in the late spring and early summer months. During this time, they occasionally find themselves in unusual locations such as ditches, parking lots, swimming pools, farm ponds and even buildings. Even though they are oftentimes intruding on private property, it is

illegal and very dangerous to try to capture, remove or kill an alligator without a special permit from the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks (MDWFP).

It is because of these intrusions and over populations that the first public water alligator hunting season was initiated in September of 2005. With 50 permits available to a 13-mile stretch of the Pearl River north of Ross Barnett Reservoir, 30 alligators were harvested that year. The first private land alligator hunting season

was initiated in 2007 and was available to three open counties with a set number of permits available in each county. Since that time, alligator hunting opportunities have expanded each year.

Hunting season will begin at 12:00 noon on August 30 and continue until 12:00 noon on September 9, 2013. There are seven geographical public water alligator hunting zones. Each zone will have 150 permits available to applicants, except the Pearl River/Ross Barnett Zone which will have 70

permits and the Northwest Zone which will have 100 available permits. A total of 920 alligator harvest permits will be available for the 2013 hunting season. Each permit will carry a two alligator bag limit. Each alligator must be 4 feet long or longer, and only one may exceed 7 feet in length. Harvest reporting is mandatory.

This year, alligator hunting applications will be accepted from June 3 to 17 for persons interested in hunting during the 2013 alligator season on public waterways. Ap

plicants must be residents of Mississippi and at least 16 years of age and a valid e-mail address is required. The MDWFP also requires that all persons selected for alligator hunting permits attend an alligator hunting training course to participate in the hunt. These training courses will be held at Jones Junior College on August 3, Roosevelt State Park on August 10 and Delta State University on August 17.

Applications must be submitted via the MDWFP website: www.mdwfp.com. All drawn applicants

will be notified via within five working of the June 17. For more information regarding alligator rules and regulations the MDWFP website call 601.432.2199.

Pilot Club of Iuka Underground Railroad Quilt \$2 per chance or 3 chances for \$5 Winner will be drawn at Heritage Day - August 31, 2013

Allow us to give you some background on the quilt. It is called Underground Railroad. The quilt is made in reproduction fabrics to reflect what a quilt would look like if made in the 1860s -- muted greens and browns. It is a teaching quilt that tells the story of the Underground Railroad where quilts were used to guide slaves to freedom. It is based on a nonfiction book based on the oral history of Ozella McDaniel Williams. Her family shared the secrets of how quilts were guides to freedom for slaves unable to read or write but knew quilt patterns and what blocks were named. The quilt has fifteen blocks (one repeated to make a perfect square).

- **Jacobs Ladder** - shows directions using light and dark fabrics. Also known as Underground Railroad, this block pointed the way to a conductor, such as Harriet Tubman, who guided many slaves to freedom.
- **Monkey Wrench** - was the first quilt displayed to signal time for escape and they would need tools to build shelter and to collect food.
- **Wagon Wheel** - the second quilt was primary means of escape. Wagon was built with hidden compartments.
- **Carpenters Wheel** - was to point the way to west-northwest. This was used around the Appalachian Mountains to escape to Ohio and freedom.
- **Bear's Paw** - was used to direct runaways to follow animal footprints like a road map through the mountains and would lead to water and food.
- **Basket** - was used as a symbol of provisions needed for the long journey north. Laundry basket was often used to disguise food and clothing carried to safe houses.
- **Crossroads** - was used for escaping slaves in the Appalachian Mountains to get to a crossroads or terminal. The main crossroads was Cleveland Ohio. Crossroads also referred to midnight. The Monkey wrench turned the wagon wheel towards Canada trail to the crossroads.
- **Log Cabin** - was used to direct a runaway to a safe house. Log cabin quilts always have a red block to symbolize the fireplace. If a quilt had a single black block in the center it was a safe house.
- **Shoo-Fly** - this represented an actual person who helped a slave escape to a place to hide often a graveyard or safe house.
- **Bow-tie** - slaves escaping in tattered clothes were easily identified, this quilt identified that clothing was hidden for them so they could blend in. Turned sideways this quilt show and hourglass symbolizing they were among friends.
- **Drunkard's Path** - this quilt was used to remind slaves to double back retrace steps and never go in a straight line to avoid detection.
- **Sail Boats** - this was the quilt of safe passage. Black sailors or ship owners help many slaves escape.
- **North Star** - this was an important navigation tool that helped slaves escape to Canada.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS CONCERNING THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE LIQUOR, SALE, DISTRIBUTION, RECEIPT AND TRANSFER OF BEER AND LIGHT WINE IN THE TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI OUTSIDE THE MUNICIPALITIES LOCATED THEREIN

Whereas, a Special Election was held in Tishomingo County, Mississippi on the day of May, 2013, wherein the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, by a majority to allow for the transportation, sale, distribution, possession, receipt and transfer of beer and light wine in alcohol content and form, as prescribed by the Mississippi Department of Revenue; and

Whereas, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, is authorized by Section 67-3-65 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, and under its general police powers, to prescribe and enforce rules and regulations and property rules and regulations establishing zones and territories where said beverages may be sold, consumed, the house of opening and operation of establishments that engage in the sale of said beverages and establishments adopting such other measures to protect public health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, as this Board may deem appropriate to the territory of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, outside the municipalities located therein;

Therefore, ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I. TISHOMINGO COUNTY BEER ORDINANCE

1-1. Sale regulated.

To promote the public health, morals and safety to provide reasonable rules and regulations governing the sale of beer and light wine as provided in this ordinance.

1-2. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, as used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Beer and light wines are defined by Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 67-3-65 and by this article as beverages having an alcoholic content as specified by statute and according to the definition of the State of Mississippi, if the definition should be modified hereafter.

Person is a person or entity who has been issued a beer permit from the Mississippi Department of Revenue under Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 67-3-65 as amended.

1-3. Privilege license required.

No beer or light wine shall be sold within the boundaries of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, including incorporated municipalities, unless the seller has first obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue, as required by Mississippi Code Annotated Section, as amended, and has also obtained a business privilege license.

The applicant seeking a business privilege license to engage in the sale or distribution of beer or light wine shall first file a with the Chancery Clerk verifying that applicant, or in the case of partnership or business entity, principals, as identified in the statement, possess the following qualifications:

(a) Each member is over the age of twenty-one (21) years of age and a person of good moral character; and

(b) Each member has no conviction in this or any other state or the United States of a felony, crime of moral turpitude, of disorderly conduct or of keeping or maintaining a house of prostitution or has been convicted of running or participating in illegal gambling activities; and

(c) Each member has no revocation of any license or permit to sell alcoholic liquors, beer or light wine, pursuant to the laws of this state, the State of Mississippi, the United States or U.S. Territory within the previous ten (10) years; and

(d) They are not indebted to Tishomingo County, Mississippi, any municipality therein, the State of Mississippi, or the United States for any past due taxes that have not been resolved by payment to the appropriate authorities; and

(e) If the applicant is a partnership, corporation or limited liability company, all members of the partnership, firm or limited liability company must be qualified and must be the above listed qualifications. If the applicant is a corporation, all officers and directors thereof, and any stockholder owning more than five percent (5%) of the stock of the corporation and the person who shall conduct and manage the licensed premises for the corporation shall possess the qualifications required herein for an individual licensee. Additionally, said business entity shall be in good standing with the State of Mississippi at the time of the application; and

(f) Each applicant shall provide the original license or permit to the Chancery Clerk of Tishomingo County, Mississippi which was granted to the individual, partnership or business entity that was granted by the State of Mississippi Department of Revenue granting them the right to sell, distribute, transfer or convey beer and light wine at the time they file their sworn statement with said clerk.

(g) After filing the sworn application with the Chancery Clerk's Office of Tishomingo County, Mississippi and before engaging in the sale of beer and light wine, each applicant shall file proof of

receipt of a business privilege license issued by Tishomingo County Tax Collector and a valid receipt indicating payment for the fee for said privilege license. The business privilege license imposed by Tishomingo County, Mississippi to engage in the sale and distribution of beer and light wine shall be equal to fifty percent (50%) of the tax imposed by the State of Mississippi pursuant to Section 27-71-303 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, which shall be renewed annually with the Tishomingo County Tax Collector.

Section 1-4. Restrictions on sale of beer and light wine.

(a) Cold beer sales allowed. It shall be lawful for refrigerated beer or light wine to be sold within the boundaries of the county for off-premises and on-premises consumption except as restricted below.

(b) On-premises kitchen facilities required. No beer or light wine shall be sold for on-premises consumption unless the seller has suitable kitchen facilities on the licensed premises to provide for the preparation, cooking and serving of food so that food sales generate twenty-five (25) percent of gross revenue. The service of foods not prepared on the premises shall not be deemed in compliance with the requirements of this section. Restaurants must contain seating for a minimum of forty persons (40) with suitable facilities for the consumption of food for its patrons and the kitchen facilities must remain open for business so long as beer or light wine is being sold. The on-premises facility must pass the State of Mississippi Serv-Safe requirement for food service facilities and shall exhibit in plain sight the certificate evidencing the same. No facility or establishment licensed to sell beer or light wine for on-premises consumption may also sell or distribute light wine or beer by the package for consumption on or off premises.

(c) (Sunday sales). It shall be unlawful to sell beer and light wine on Sunday. The Board of Supervisors shall reserve the right to review this provision anytime after expiration of ninety days (90) after the date of the adoption of this order.

(d) Hours of sale for all days except Sunday. Beer or light wine may be sold for on-premises or off-premises consumption between the hours of 7 a.m. and 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday.

(e) Drive-in sales prohibited. It shall be unlawful to sell beer or light wine through a drive-in window sales facility or a drive-thru "beer barn" within the county boundaries of the city.

(f) Advertising. Advertisements for the sale of light wine and beer are limited to the interior of the building or structure where the beer or light wine is sold and limited to the exterior of the structure where the beer or light wine is sold. There shall be no billboards or other advertisements regarding beer or light wine products outside of the scope defined in this ordinance.

(g) Territory where sale is prohibited. No beer or light wine shall be sold for either on-premises or off-premises consumption within four hundred feet (400) feet of the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home if the area is zoned or used for residential purposes and one hundred feet (100) of the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home if the area is zoned or used for commercial purposes. This distance shall be measured from the nearest point of the building housing the church, school or funeral home to the nearest point of the premises which consists of the floor planned area to be licensed by the Mississippi Department of Revenue Alcohol Beverage Control Division. This distance shall be measured in a straight line, such as airline distance, rather than the usual route of pedestrian travel. Any questions regarding the use or distances shall be resolved by the Mississippi Department of Revenue officer in charge of issuance of the permit in question.

(h) Open containers prohibited on public property. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine on public property, including buildings, parking lots, sidewalks, streets and parks within the County boundaries. Open containers does not include empty containers.

(i) Open container - Vehicles. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine either as an operator or passenger of a motor vehicle. Open containers do not include empty containers.

(j) Open container - Private Property. It shall be lawful for any person of legal age to possess a container of beer or light wine on private property.

(k) Consumption of package beer or light wine. There shall be no on-premises consumption of package beer or light wine on the premises where the same is sold.

(l) On-premises consumption. It shall be unlawful for any premises licensed for on-premises consumption to allow a patron to leave such premises with either a full or partial container of beer or light wine unless otherwise prescribed by the Mississippi Code Annotated as provided for certain package wine sales from on-premises establishments.

(m) Bagging of beer and light wine sold for off-premises consumption. The sales clerk of each premises selling package beer or light wine for off-premises consumption must first place the same in an opaque bag or sack before delivering same to the purchaser unless the same is in case form too large for the normal grocery store or convenience store bag. Draft beer drawn from a tap may be sold for off premises consumption provided the same is sold in sealed containers and bagged as packaged beer. No on premises consumption of draft beer may occur where package beer or light wine is sold.

(n) It shall be unlawful for anyone who works for a person, partnership group or business entity who engages in the sale of beer or light wine to be under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol while working in the establishment holding the permit to offer the same for sale.

(o) It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish in any manner any beer or light wine at any time or place to a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age, or to knowingly sell, furnish or give the same to any person for delivery to such minors unless authorized pursuant to Section 67-3-54 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

(p) It shall be unlawful to sell, distribute or transfer beer or light wine in any establishment where firearms, ammunition, gun powder, explosive devices, dynamite or any other explosive or incendiary devices or compounds are sold.

(q) It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish in any manner any beer or light wine at any time or place to any person who is known to be insane, lack mental capacity, who is mentally incapacitated or who is visibly intoxicated or to knowingly to sell, give or furnish the same for sale to any person for the delivery to such persons.

(r) It shall be unlawful for any person to allow or permit gambling at any location where beer or light wine is sold upon licensed premises.

(s) No holder of a State of Mississippi permit to offer for sale or distribution light wine or beer shall allow any lewd, immoral or improper entertainment, conduct or practices to take place on the premises where said business is conducted or allow said practice to occur in conjunction where said light wine and beer is sold.

Sec. 1-5. Discontinuing operations during emergency.

In the event of any disturbance, uprising or riot or any other emergency of life, property or public safety, the Board of Supervisors may require the Sheriff to promptly order any and all places in the county where beer or light wine is consumed, sold or otherwise dispensed, to discontinue such for the period of such emergency.

Sec. 1-6. Minors giving false information.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years to make a false statement as to his or her age for the purpose of obtaining beer or light wine. The penalty for violating this provision shall be a fine of not less than two hundred (\$200.00) Dollars nor more than five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars and a sentence of not more than

thirty (30) days community service in the event of a first offense and a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and a sentence of not more than six (6) months in jail for a second or subsequent offense.

Sec. 1-7. Compliance with state law requirements.

No Business Privilege License as required by this article shall issue to any person unless satisfactory evidence is furnished to the tax collector that such person has complied with the requirements of state law, and if the permit required by state law is at any time revoked, said revocation shall operate as a cancellation and forfeiture of the rights of the person holding a permit or license from the County.

Section 1-8. Penalty for violation of article; misdemeanor.

Any violation of this article which does not specifically designate the penalty for a violation shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both.

Section 1-9. There shall be no sales of beer or light wine on Christmas Day or other holidays restricted by the regulations of the Mississippi Department of Revenue-Alcohol Beverage Control Division, or as restricted by the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

Section 1-10. No holder of a license to sell beer or light wine shall have any person under the age of eighteen years of age in his employ sell, dispense, handle or stock light wine or beer beverages.

However, in no case shall any person be employed under the age of twenty-one years as a bartender in a facility licensed for on premises consumption in a facility as defined in Section 1-4(b) herein.

Section 1-11. Violations, penalties and revocation of license.

Any holder of a business privilege license to sell, distribute or transfer, for on premises or off premises consumption, who violates the provisions of this article shall be subject to the penalties as follows:

(a) A beer or light wine privilege licensee who violates the provisions of this order may have such license suspended for up to thirty days (30) and a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than thirty days (30) or both.

(b) A beer or light wine privilege licensee who violates the provisions of this order within three hundred sixty five (365) calendar days of the first offense may have its license suspended for up to one hundred eighty (180) days, up to one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) fine and imprisonment up to sixty days in the county jail or both.

(c) A beer or light wine privilege licensee who violates the provisions of this order for a third time within three hundred sixty five (365) days of the first offense shall have its license revoked, a fine of up to \$1,000.00 and imprisonment in the county jail for six months, or both. The licensee convicted of a third offense within three hundred sixty five days (365) of the first violation will not be eligible for issuance of another privilege license to sell beer or light wine for a period of two years from the date of the third violation.

(d) The suspension and revocation of said license shall be for the privilege license issued by the County and the suspension or revocation will be issued by the Board of Supervisors following notice from the Justice Court Clerk of Tishomingo County, Mississippi of the conviction for the violation of the article herein.

(e) Any appeal from the ruling on the suspension or revocation of the Board Order to revoke or suspend the privilege license to sell beer and light wine shall be taken as other appeals within thirty (30) days from the date of the suspension or revocation and shall be filed with the Circuit Court of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

Section 1-12. The Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors intends this article to be construed in concert with those restrictions placed on the possession, transfer, distribution, sale and possession of beer and light wine by the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended and where the regulations herein are in direct contradiction to those prescribed by the statute in a manner that renders any one of the

Sections contained in this article as unconstitutional, then it is the intent of the Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors that said section will be considered severed from this Article with the remaining sections remaining in full force and effect until further order of the Board of Supervisors. Section 1-13. The sale of beer or light wine, distribution and transfer shall be lawful beginning on July 1, 2013.

Section 1-14. Title.

The sections of this article may be referred to collectively as the "Tishomingo County Beer Ordinance".

Ordinance was adopted by unanimous vote of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors. The Board further orders that this Order be published in a paper of general circulation within Tishomingo County, Mississippi for three (3) consecutive weeks.

Hereby ordered by the Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors this the 4th day of June, 2013.
