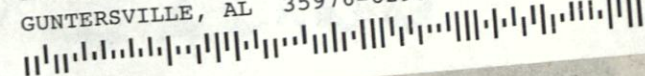

Iuka Man Drowns Trying to Retrieve Cap

The body of an Iuka man drowned Sunday morning while boating on Pickwick Lake. The body was recovered Tuesday morning in Hardin County, Tennessee.

Roger Deaton, 54, died after jumping into the water to retrieve his cap that had blown away, according to reports. He was on a boat with several friends near the Tennessee-Mississippi line near the mouth of Pickwick Lake and was last seen at 11 a.m. Sunday.

The Tennessee Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks

officials, and rescue personnel with the Hardin County Fire Department were joined by several other law enforcement agencies in the search for Deaton's body. However, the body was not discovered until Tuesday morning after it apparently washed up on a Hardin County bank of the lake, according to Ricky Cornelison, of MDWFP.

According to reports, Deaton was not wearing a life jacket when he jumped into the water.

Nearly all those years he's been at the same store - currently Brooks Grocery, and years ago, Nelson's, but he did work about 10 months at Piggly Wiggly, too, said Monday in an interview at the store he has helped build.

Mr. Smith says the grocery business has been good to him, and he's worked with some great people through the years. And he will sure miss him, too.

"What am I going to do now, with Franky gone? We've been here 30 years together!" said Tom Provins, Franky's co-worker in the Brooks meat department. "We've got some good stories to tell..."

"I've been in the grocery

industry a long time, and I don't know anyone who has any grocery knowledge, anyone who is as dependable and hard-working as Franky Smith," said Brooks Davis, the owner. "He will be missed, so we congratulate him on his retirement."

Youngest of a family of five children who were raised in Saltillo, Franky is one of four brothers who all ended up in the grocery business, he said. His daddy worked at the Carnation plant in Tupelo, and the dad then wondered how he ended up with a family of grocymen, he joked. When Franky retires, they will have all left the business.

Franky, who is also a pastor, currently at Rowland Mills Baptist Church, has spent nearly

Franky says his favorite part of the grocery business is the merchandising - the ordering, the display, the advertising and buying of the products that will end up on the shelves for consumers. He has enjoyed the recent re-set of Brooks, when they changed around some of the aisles to make room for more products.

The only part he says he doesn't love is the checkout lines.

"I've just never done it enough to be comfortable at it," he explained.

TCHS Announces Two Alumni as New Baseball, Basketball Coaches

According to school officials, Tishomingo County will have two of its own alumni coaching baseball and boys basketball in the 2013-14 school year.

New principal Jackie Beals confirmed Tuesday that the Tishomingo County School Board had approved the hiring of Blake Holly as head baseball coach and physical science teacher, and Josh McCalmon as head boys basketball coach and physical education teacher.

TC Baseball

Holly, a 1997 graduate, comes home to TCHS from Guntown Middle School. He played baseball at Northeast, and Ole Miss, and coached with fellow TCHS baseball standout Richy Harrelson at Lafayette County when that school won the state championship. He joins several of his 1997 classmates (who elected him "Most Athletic") already on staff at TCHS.

Seth Kennedy will be a paid assistant coach with Holly, and is currently coaching the summer Braves program.

TC Basketball

Josh McCalmon, a 2007 TCHS graduate, comes to the high school after a successful first year of coaching at Burnsville, where he lead the 8th grade boys to the county championship. He played college basketball two years at Itawamba and two at Blue Mountain College.

McCalmon takes the place of Mitch Howell, who was hired earlier in the year to replace interim coach Shannon Edmondson. A few weeks ago, Howell opted to take a position at Alcorn Central, and so summer practices were supervised by assistant coaches. Now, McCalmon has been holding practice several times a week, to accommodate basketball players who are also participating in summer football and baseball programs.

Other personnel changes include:

Chelsey Adams Crum was hired at Iuka Elementary to replace Pam Bullock, who is retiring.

Dax Glover will coach freshmen girls and boys basketball team.

Chris Simmons will be assistant boys' basketball coach at IMS (he's already baseball coach). Ginger Turner will be IMS assistant girls' basketball coach.

Shane Wigginton will replace Tiffany Lowrey as counselor at TCHS. Lowrey will be at the Career & Technical center, where she will teach a new program in engineering and robotics.

Faith Robinson will be the music/chorus teacher at IMS and Tishomingo Elementary and Middle School.

Micah McCay Wilbanks will be boys' basketball coach at Burnsville.

These recent calls apparently come from Jamaica,

according to the caller ID some have reported. And they are persistent; even after one local recipient hung up on the caller, the caller called them back.

"This is a SCAM!" said the sheriff's department in a recent online post. If you receive a call similar to this, do not send them money. If you didn't even enter a contest, you certainly didn't win anything, warn officials.

Unhappy with Doctor

I am not used to writing letters to the newspaper but in this situation, I feel that I have no other choice. Two weeks ago, my mother fell off the porch and hit her head. She cut her head and her right leg open. As she was bleeding so much, I took her to the emergency room at Iuka Hospital.

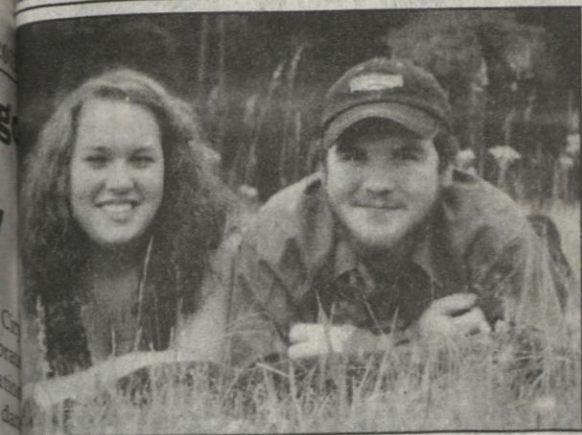
That was my first mistake. The nurses and paramedics did their best and took care of my mother. However the care she received from the doctor there was anything but good. He put staples in her head and even I could tell that they did not look right. He told the nurse to close the cuts on her right leg with steri-strips. Later that night, the staples started falling out and by the next morning, I had to carry her to her own doctor. He spent one hour and 45 minutes undoing what this doctor had done in the Iuka ER. All the staples that had not fallen out had to be taken out and the cut had to be sewn up

with stitches. The two cuts on right leg had to have all the staples cut off and blood clots removed.

My second mistake was to talk to the hospital boss. Before I went to talk to him I had made some inquiries around town and discovered that my mother was not the only person to be mistreated by this doctor. When I talked to the hospital boss he reassured me that he would take out my complaint and get back to me by Friday, June 21st. Needless to say, I am still waiting to hear from him. What really shocked me was what I was told about the doctor's past. How he lost his license in New York in 2001 and then in Mississippi in 2002. I cannot understand how this doctor is allowed to continue to treat the residents of Tishomingo County like this. Surely we deserve better.

Again, I have nothing but praise for the nurses and paramedics who do the best they can to help people every day. I encourage anyone who has had a similar bad experience at the hands of this doctor to contact me or write to the newspaper like I have done.

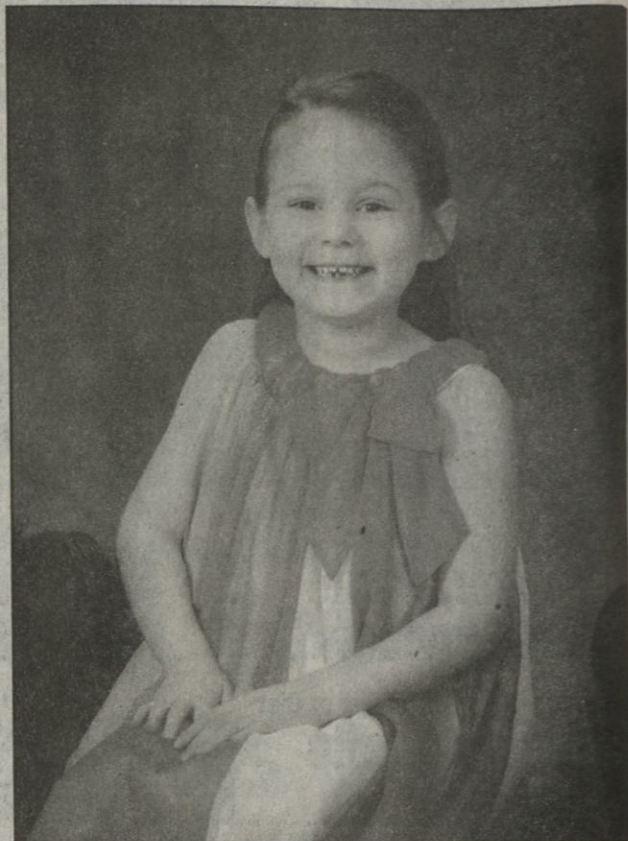


Big Snake Tale from Fearless Local Lifeguards

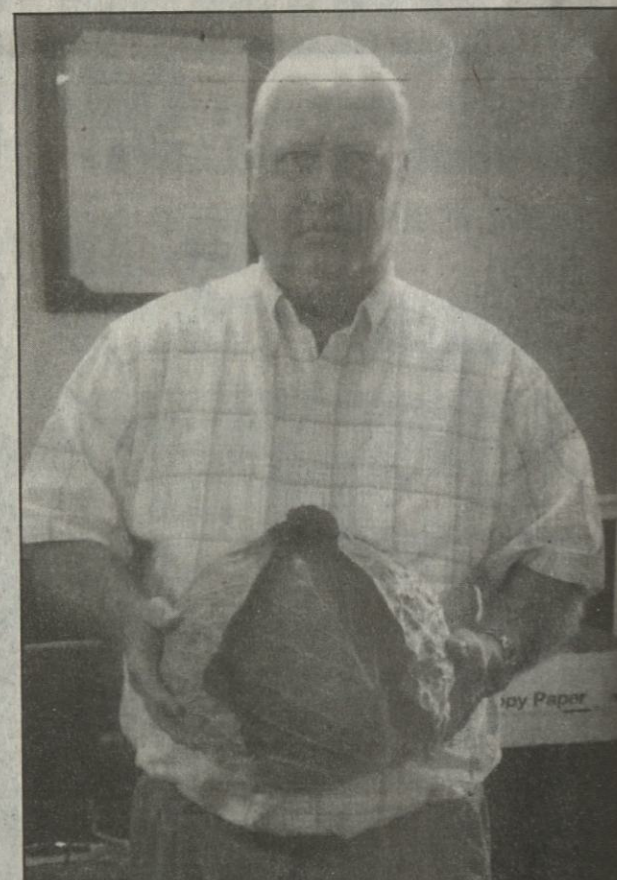

principals and their commitment to creating successful learning communities. Because of them, students thrive academically, teachers grow professionally, and communities are strengthened."

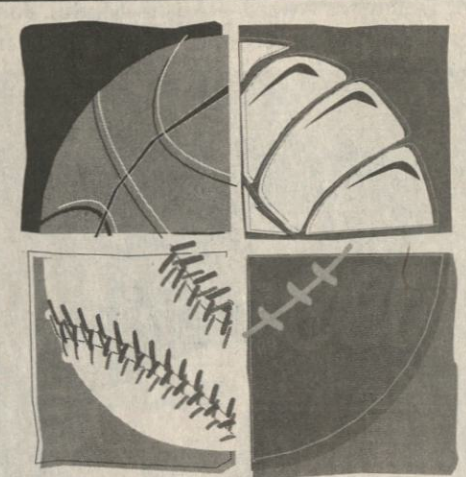

ORDER OF THE TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADOPTING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE TRANSPORTATION, STORAGE, SALE, DISTRIBUTION, POSSESSION, RECEIPT AND TRANSFER OF BEER AND LIGHT WINE IN THE TERRITORY OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI OUTSIDE OF THE MUNICIPALITIES LOCATED THEREIN AS AMENDED

Whereas, a Special Election was held in Tishomingo County, Mississippi on the 21st day of May, 2013, wherein the voters of Tishomingo County, Mississippi voted by majority to allow for the transportation, storage, sale, distribution, possession, receipt and transfer of beer and light wine in alcohol content and form, as prescribed by the Mississippi Department of Revenue; and Whereas, The Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, is authorized by Section 67-3-65 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, and under its general police powers, to prescribe and enforce reasonable and property rules and regulations, for establishing zones and territories where said beverages may be sold, prescribing the house of opening and closing of establishments that engage in the sale of said beverages and establishing and adopting such other measures to promote public health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, as this Board may order to be applicable to the territory of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, outside of the municipalities located therein; The Board of Supervisors having found and resolved that the previous Board order required supplemental definitions.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AS THAT THE PREVIOUS BOARD ORDER IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I. TISHOMINGO COUNTY BEER ORDINANCE

Sec. 1-1. Sale regulated.

It will promote the public health, morals and safety to provide reasonable rules and regulations governing the sale of beer and light wine as provided in this article.

Sec. 1-2. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Beer and light wines are defined by Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 67-3-5 and by this article as beverages having an alcoholic content as specified by said statute and according to the directive of the State of Mississippi, if the same should be modified hereafter. Permittee is a person or entity who has obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi Department of Revenue under Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 67-3-17, as amended.

Package beer and light wine is defined as beer and light wine that may be sold for "off premises" consumption in forms and content as allowed by Mississippi Department of Revenue and the Mississippi State Legislature by existing statute or by subsequent amendment. It is the intent of the Order to allow "off premises" consumption of package beer and light wine as prepackaged by the manufacturer and in forms not prohibited by Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 67-3-51.

On Premises Consumption is defined as a Permittee who complies with Section 1-4(b) of this Order and who elects to serve beer and light wine by the drink and on premises where food sales are conducted as required by Section 1-4(b) of this Order.

Off Premises Consumption is defined as package beer and light wine that is sold by a Permittee, satisfying the requirements of this Order, for consumption off premises from where it is sold.

Sec. 1-3. Privilege license required.

(a) No beer or light wine shall be sold within the boundaries Tishomingo County, Mississippi, excluding incorporated municipalities, unless the seller has first obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue as required by Mississippi Code Annotated Section, as amended, and has also obtained a business privilege license.

(b) The applicant seeking a business privilege license to engage in sell or distribution of beer and light wine shall first file a with the Chancery Clerk verifying that the applicant, or in the case of a partnership or business entity, its principals, as identified in the sworn statement, possess the following qualifications:

I. Each member is over the age of twenty-one (21) years of age and a person of good moral character; and

II. Each member has no convictions in this or any other state or in the United States of a felony, a crime of moral turpitude, of pandering or of keeping or maintaining a house of prostitution or has been convicted of running or participating in illegal gambling activities; and

III. Each member has no revocation of any license or permit to sell alcoholic liquors, beer or light wine, pursuant to the laws of this County, the State of Mississippi, the United States or U.S. Territory within the previous ten (10) years; and

IV. They are not indebted to Tishomingo County, Mississippi, any municipality therein, the State of Mississippi, or the United States for any past due taxes that have not been resolved by payment to the appropriate authorities; and

V. If the applicant is a partnership, firm or limited liability company, all members of the partnership, firm or limited liability company must be named and must be the above listed qualifications. If the applicant is a corporation, all officers and directors thereof, and any stockholder owning more than five percent (5%) of the stock of such corporation and the person who shall conduct and manage the licensed premises for the corporation shall possess the qualifications required herein for an individual licensee. Additionally, said business entity shall be in good standing with the State of Mississippi at the time of the application; and

VI. Each applicant shall provide the original license or permit to the Chancery Clerk of Tishomingo County, Mississippi which was granted to the individual, partnership or business entity that was granted by the State of Mississippi/Department of Revenue granting them the right to sell, distribute, transfer or convey beer and light wine at the time they file their sworn statement with said clerk.

(c) After filing the sworn application with the Chancery Clerk's office of Tishomingo County, Mississippi and before engaging in the sale of beer and light wine, each applicant shall file proof of receipt of a business privilege license issued by Tishomingo County Tax Collector and a valid receipt indicating payment for the fee for said privilege license. The business privilege license imposed by Tishomingo County, Mississippi to engage in the sale and distribution of beer and light wine shall be equal to fifty percent (50%) of the tax imposed by the State of Mississippi pursuant to Section 27-1-303 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, which shall be renewed annually with the Tishomingo County Tax Collector.

Section 1-4. Restrictions on sale of beer and light wine.

(a) Cold beer sales allowed. It shall be lawful for refrigerated beer or light wine to be sold within the boundaries of the county for off-premises and on-premises consumption except as restricted below.

(b) On-premises kitchen facilities required. No beer or light wine shall be sold for on-premises consumption unless the seller has suitable kitchen facilities on the licensed premises to provide for the preparation, cooking and serving of food so that food sales generate twenty-five (25) percent of gross revenue. The service of foods not prepared on the premises shall not be deemed in compliance with the requirements of this section. Restaurants must contain seating for a minimum of forty persons (40) with suitable facilities for the consumption of food for its patrons and the kitchen facilities must remain open for business so long as beer or light wine is being sold. The on-premises facility must pass the State of Mississippi-Serv Safe requirement for food service facilities and shall exhibit in plain site the certificate evidencing the same. No facility or establishment licensed to sell beer or light wine for on-premises consumption may also sell or distribute light wine or beer by the package for consumption on or off premises.

(c) (Sunday sales). It shall be unlawful to sell beer and light wine on Sunday. The Board of Supervisors shall reserve the right to review this provision anytime after expiration of ninety days (90) after the date of the adoption of this order.

(d) Hours of sale for all days except Sunday. Beer or light wine may be sold for on-premises or off-premises consumption between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday.

(e) Drive-in sales prohibited. It shall be unlawful to sell beer or light wine through a drive-in window sales facility or a drive-thru

"beer barn" within the county boundaries of the county.

(f) Advertising. Advertisements for the sale of light wine and beer are limited to the interior of the building or structure where the beer or light wine is sold and limited to the exterior of the structure where the beer or light wine is sold. There shall be no billboards or other advertisements regarding beer or light wine products outside of the scope defined in this ordinance.

(g) Territory where sale is prohibited. No beer or light wine shall be sold for either on-premises or off-premises consumption within four hundred feet (400) feet of the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home if the area is zoned or used for residential purposes and one hundred feet (100) of the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home if the area is zoned or used for commercial purposes. This distance shall be measured from the nearest point of the building housing the church, school or funeral home to the nearest point of the structure where the Permittee intends to offer for sale light wine and beer. This distance shall be measured in a straight line, such as airline distance, rather than the usual route of pedestrian travel. Any questions regarding the use or distances shall be resolved by the Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors. The Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors may appoint a qualified surveyor or the County Engineer to determine the distance and report the same to the Board. The Board may assess the cost of the surveyor or County Engineer to the Permittee or person seeking the business privilege license pursuant to this Order.

(h) Open containers prohibited on public property. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine on public property, including buildings, parking lots, sidewalks, streets and parks within the County boundaries. Open containers does not include empty containers.

(i) Open container - Vehicles. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine either as an operator or passenger of a motor vehicle. Open containers do not include empty containers.

(j) Open container - Private Property. It shall be lawful for any person of legal age to possess a container of beer or light wine on private property.

(k) Consumption of package beer or light wine. There shall be no on-premises consumption of package beer or light wine on the premises where the same is sold.

(l) On-premises consumption. It shall be unlawful for any premises licensed for on-premises consumption to allow a patron to leave such premises with either a full or partial container of beer or light wine unless otherwise prescribed by the Mississippi Code Annotated as provided for certain package wine sales from on-premises establishments.

(m) Bagging of beer and light wine sold for off-premises consumption. The sales clerk of each premises selling package beer or light wine for off-premises consumption must first place the same in an opaque bag or sack before delivering same to the purchaser unless the same is in case form too large for the normal grocery store or convenience store bag. Draft beer drawn from a tap may be sold for off premises consumption provided the same is sold in sealed containers and bagged as packaged beer provided the same does not violate Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 67-3-51. No on premises consumption of draft beer may occur where package beer or light wine is sold.

(n) It shall be unlawful for anyone who works for a person, partnership group or business entity who engages in the sale of beer or light wine to be under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol while working in the establishment holding the permit to offer the same for sale.

(o) It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish in any manner any beer or light wine at any time or place to a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age, or to knowingly sell, furnish or give the same to any person for delivery to such minors unless authorized pursuant to Section 67-3-54 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

(p) It shall be unlawful to sell, distribute or transfer beer or light wine in any establishment where firearms, ammunition, gun powder, explosive devices, dynamite or any other explosive or incendiary devices or compounds are sold.

(q) It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish in any manner any beer or light wine at any time or place to any person who is known to be insane, lack mental capacity, who is mentally incapacitated or who is visibly intoxicated or to knowingly to sell, give or furnish the same for sale to any person for the delivery to such persons.

(r) It shall be unlawful for any person to allow or permit gambling at any location where beer or light wine is sold upon licensed premises.

(s) No holder of a State of Mississippi permit to offer for sale or distribution light wine or beer shall allow any lewd, immoral or improper entertainment, conduct or practices to take place on the premises where said business is conducted or allow said practice to occur in conjunction where said light wine and beer is sold.

Sec. 1-5. Discontinuing operations during emergency.

In the event of any disturbance, uprising or riot or any other emergency of life, property or public safety, the Board of Supervisors may require the Sheriff to promptly order any and all places in the county where beer or light wine is consumed, sold or otherwise dispensed, to discontinue such for the period of such emergency.

Sec. 1-6. Minors giving false information.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years to make a false statement as to his or her age for the purpose of obtaining beer or light wine. The penalty for violating this provision shall be a fine of not less than two hundred (\$200.00) Dollars nor more than five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars and a sentence of not more than thirty (30) days community service in the event of a first offense and a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and a sentence of not more than six (6) months in jail for a second or subsequent offense.

(b) The Judge may, in his or her discretion, accept, in lieu of community service, a certificate indicating the individual has successfully completed an alcohol and/or drug education program or treatment program at the expense of the individual.

Sec. 1-7. Compliance with state law requirements.

No Business Privilege License as required by this article shall issue to any person unless satisfactory evidence is furnished to the tax collector that such person has complied with the requirements of state law, and if the permit required by state law is at any time revoked, said revocation shall operate as a cancellation and forfeiture of the rights of the person holding a permit or license from the County. Section 1-8. Penalty for violation of article; misdemeanor. Any violation of this article which does not specifically designate the penalty for a violation shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both.

Section 1-9. There shall be no sales of beer or light wine on Christmas Day or other holidays restricted by the regulations of the Mississippi Department of Revenue-Alcohol Beverage Control Division, or as restricted by the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended. Section 1-10. No holder of a license to sell beer or light wine shall have any person under the age of eighteen years of age in his employ sell, dispense, handle or stock light wine or beer beverages. However, in no case shall any person be employed under the age of twenty-one years as a bartender in a facility licensed for on premises consumption in a facility as defined in Section 1-4(b) herein. Section 1-11. Violations, penalties and revocation of license. Any holder of a business privilege license to sell, distribute or transfer, for on premises or off premises consumption, who violates the provisions of this article shall be subject to the penalties as follows:

(a) A beer or light wine privilege licensee who violates the provisions of this order may have such license suspended for up to thirty days (30) and a fine of not more than \$500.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than thirty days (30) or both.

(b) A beer or light wine privilege licensee who violates the provisions of this order within three hundred sixty five (365) calendar days of the first offense may have its license suspended for up to one hundred eighty (180) days, up to one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) fine and imprisonment up to sixty days in the county jail or both.

(c) A beer or light wine privilege licensee who violates the provisions of this order for a third time within three hundred sixty five (365) days of the first offense shall have its license revoked, a fine of up to \$1,000.00 and imprisonment in the county jail for six months, or both. The licensee convicted of a third offense within three hundred sixty five days (365) of the first violation will not be eligible for issuance of another privilege license to sell beer or light wine for a period of two years from the date of the third violation.

(d) The suspension and revocation of said license shall be for the privilege license issued by the County and the suspension or revocation will be issued by the Board of Supervisors following notice from the Justice Court Clerk of Tishomingo County, Mississippi of

the conviction for the violation of the article herein.

(e) Any appeal from the ruling on the suspension or revocation of the Board Order to revoke or suspend the privilege license to sell beer and light wine shall be taken as other appeals within thirty (30) days from the date of the suspension or revocation and shall be filed with the Circuit Court of Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Section 1-12. The Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors intends this article to be construed in concert with those restrictions placed on the possession, transfer, distribution, sale or possession of beer and light wine by the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended and where the regulations herein are in direct contradiction to those prescribed by the statute in a manner that renders any one of the Sections contained in this article unconstitutional, then it is the intent of the Tishomingo County, Mississippi Board of Supervisors that said section will be considered severed from this Article with the remaining sections remaining in full force and effect until further order of the Board of Supervisors. Section 1-13. The sale of beer or light wine, distribution and transfer shall be lawful beginning on July 1, 2013.

Section 1-14. Title.

Sections of this article may be referred to collectively as the "Tishomingo County Beer Ordinance".

Ordinance was adopted by unanimous vote of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors. The Board further orders that this Order be published in a paper of general circulation within Tishomingo County, Mississippi for three (3) consecutive weeks.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TOWN OF BELMONT, MISSISSIPPI BEER ORDINANCE TOWN OF BELMONT BEER ORDINANCE

Sec. 1-1. Sale regulated.

It will promote the public health, morals and safety to provide reasonable rules and regulations governing the sale of beer and light wine as provided in this article in forms, content and packaging as allowed by the Mississippi Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature.

Sec. 1-2. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Beer and light wines are defined by Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, Section 67-3-5 and by this article as beverages having an alcoholic content of not more than eight (8%) percent by weight or in such other amounts and content as may be hereinafter prescribed by the Mississippi Department of Revenue or by the State of Mississippi.

Permittee is a person or entity who has obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue under Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, Section 67-3-17, as amended.

Package beer or light wine is beer or light wine, having an alcohol content by weight as prescribed by the State of Mississippi Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature, being sold in the can, bottle, keg or other sealed container, which is sold for "off premises" consumption and not in any form in violation of Mississippi Code Annotated Section 67-3-51.

On premises consumption is defined as a permittee that has obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi Department of Revenue a business privilege license from the Town of Belmont, Mississippi and a business privilege license for the sale of beer by the drink in on premises consumption and who meets the requirements of Sec. 1-4(b) herein.

Sec. 1-3. Privilege license required.

No beer or light wine shall be sold within the municipal boundaries of the Town unless the seller has first obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue under Mississippi Code Annotated Section 67-3-27, as amended, and has also obtained a business privilege license and a sale of beer and light wine privilege license, the fee for which shall be fifty (50) percent of the amount charged by the state, and shall be paid to the Town. The privilege license fees shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance and shall be renewed annually. No person who applies for a privilege license to sell, distribute or transfer beer or light wine in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi may be qualified to receive the same if they have been convicted of any felony crime in the State of Mississippi, any other state, the United States or any U.S. Territory or if they have been convicted of illegal gambling activity in this or any other state, or if they owe any taxes to the Town of Belmont, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, the State of Mississippi or any entity therein or the United States which has not been resolved by payment of the same at the time of the application for said license.

Section 1-4. Restrictions on sale of beer and light wine

(a) Cold beer sales allowed. It shall be lawful for refrigerated beer or light wine to be sold within the municipal boundaries of the town for off-premises and on-premises consumption, except as restricted below, beginning at 7:00 a.m. on July 1, 2013 and continuing thereafter.

(b) On-premises kitchen facilities required. No beer or light wine shall be sold for on-premises consumption unless the seller has suitable kitchen facilities on the licensed premises to provide for the preparation, cooking and serving of food so that food sales generate twenty-five (25) percent of gross revenue. The service of foods not prepared on the premises shall not be deemed in compliance with the requirements of this section. Restaurants must contain seating for a minimum of forty (40) with suitable facilities for the consumption of food for its patrons and the kitchen facilities must remain open for business so long as beer or light wine is being sold. The Town of Belmont, by and through Mayor and Board of Aldermen or by a designated representative of the Board may elect to inspect the facility to insure the requirements of this section are met by the applicant for a business privilege license to sell beer and light wine.

(c) The Town of Belmont may request sales receipts, invoices for goods received and sold and other documentation evidencing the amount of beer, light wine and food purchased and sold by permittee, in order to insure compliance with Section 1-4(b) for sales requirement. If a permittee fails to maintain the requirements of 2-4(b), the Town of Belmont, through the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, may suspend for a designated period of time or, in the case of a second or subsequent violation of said section, revoke the business privilege license to sell beer and light wine.

(d) Sunday Sales. It shall be unlawful to sell beer and light wine on Sunday.

(e) Hours of sale for all days except Sunday. Beer or light wine may be sold for on-premises or off-premises consumption between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday.

(f) Drive-in sales prohibited. It shall be unlawful to sell beer or light wine through a drive-in window sales facility or a drive-thru "beer barn" within the municipal boundaries of the city.

(g) Advertising. Advertising and advertisements for beer and light wine shall be contained to the interior of the building where sold or consumed and advertisements or signs outside of the building where the beer and light wine is sold shall be limited to that that may be attached to the physical structure where the business is located.

(h) Territory where sale is prohibited. No beer or light wine shall be sold for either on-premises or off-premises consumption within four hundred (400) feet of the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home in an area zoned or traditionally used as a residential area or within one hundred (100) feet from the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home in an area zoned or traditionally used as a commercial or industrial area. This distance shall be measured from the nearest point of the building housing the church or school to the nearest point of the premises which consists of the floor plan of the area to be licensed by the commission. This distance shall be measured in a straight line, such as airline distance, rather than the usual route of pedestrian travel.

(i) Any disputes governing the required distance shall be resolved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. If the distance is a disputed fact, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen may elect to appoint a licensed surveyor or their city engineer to measure the distance and render a report of such distance. The cost of the same shall be assessed to the person seeking a business privilege license to sell beer and light wine in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi.

(j) Open containers prohibited on public property. It shall

lawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or wine on public property, including buildings, parking lots, sidewalks, streets and parks within the municipal boundaries of the city. Open containers do not include empty containers. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen may designate areas where open containers are permitted for certain Town sanctioned outdoor festivals, fairs or events and shall designate the specific parameters of when open containers are allowed and shall also designate the hours open containers will be allowed. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall prescribe the same in a resolution and the same shall be posted in three public places or published in a newspaper of general circulation in the Town for at least three consecutive weeks prior to said festival, fair or other event. The Town of Belmont may prescribe permit requirements for festivals, fairs or other events in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi to govern the allowance of open containers within certain dates and within certain geographic parameters as part of the police power retained by the Town to maintain the health, welfare and safety of the general public.

Open container - Vehicles. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine either as an operator or passenger of a motor vehicle. Open containers do not include empty containers.

Open container - Private Property. It shall be lawful for any person of legal age to possess a container of beer or light wine on private property.

Consumption of package beer. There shall be no on-premises consumption of package beer on the premises where the same is sold.

On-premises consumption. It shall be unlawful for any person licensed for on-premises consumption to allow a patron to consume such premises with either a full or partial container of beer or light wine.

On-premises consumption. It shall be lawful for a person, company or business entity holding a valid beer and light wine permit issued from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue to sell beer and light wine for consumption on premises that satisfy requirements of Sec. 1-4(b) herein. It shall be lawful for said person, company or business entity to offer beer and light wine for sale and consumption on premises in bottle form, can form or dispensed from a tap or other container in a cup or glass.

Bagging of beer and light wine sold for off-premises consumption. The sales clerk of each premises selling package beer or light wine for off-premises consumption must first place the same in an opaque bag or sack before delivering same to the purchaser. If the beer or light wine is sold in a cased box or carton, it shall not be necessary for the clerk to package the beer or light wine in an opaque bag or sack before the customer leaves the premises with same. It shall be lawful for a retailer of beer and light wine to sell for sale draft beer provided the same is packaged in a sealed container on the premises and is bagged in the same form as packaged beer prior to leaving the premises of the establishment. There shall be no on premises consumption of draft beer where package beer or light wine is sold.

It shall be unlawful to sell, distribute or transfer beer or light wine in an establishment where firearms, ammunition, gun powder, explosive devices or any other explosive or incendiary devices or compounds are sold or stored.

It shall be unlawful for any person to allow or permit gambling at any location where beer or light wine is sold upon licensed premises.

No holder of a State of Mississippi permit to offer for sale distribution beer or light wine shall allow any lewd, immoral or improper entertainment, conduct or practices to take place on the premises where said business is conducted or in conjunction where light wine and beer is sold.

It shall be unlawful for anyone who works for a person, partnership group or business entity who engages in the sale of beer or light wine to be under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol while working in the establishment holding the permit to offer the same for sale.

It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish in any manner any beer or light wine at any time or place to a person under the age of twenty-one years of age, or to knowingly sell, furnish or give the same to any person for delivery to such minor unless authorized pursuant to Section 67-3-54 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish, in any manner, any beer or light wine at any time or place to any person who is known to be insane, lack mental capacity, who is mentally incapacitated who is visibly intoxicated or to knowingly sell, give or furnish the same for the sale to any person for delivery to such persons.

Sec. 1-5. Discontinuing operations during emergency. In the event of any disturbance, uprising or riot or any other emergency of life, property or public safety, the mayor may require the chief of police to promptly order any and all places in the city where beer or light wine is consumed, sold or otherwise dispensed, to discontinue such for the period of such emergency.

Sec. 1-6. Minors giving false information

It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years to make a false statement as to his or her age for the purpose of obtaining beer or light wine. The penalty for violating this provision shall be a fine of not less than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars nor more than five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars and a sentence of not more than thirty (30) days community service.

The Judge may, in his or her discretion, accept, in lieu of community service, a certificate indicating the individual has successfully completed an alcohol and/or drug education program or treatment program at the expense of the individual.

Sec. 1-7. Compliance with state law requirements

No permit or license required by this article shall issue to any person unless satisfactory evidence is furnished to the tax collector that such person has complied with the requirements of state law and if the permit required by state law is at any time revoked, the revocation shall operate as a cancellation and forfeiture of the rights of the person holding a permit or license from the municipality.

Sec. 1-8. Penalty for violation of article; misdemeanor

Any violation of this article, not specifically containing a prescribed penalty, shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both, unless otherwise specified herein.

Sec. 1-9. No holder of a license to sell beer or light wine shall have any person under the age of eighteen (18) years of age in his employ, sell, dispense, handle or stock light wine or beer. However, in case shall any person be employed under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age as a bartender in a facility license for on premises consumption in a facility as defined as in Section 2-4(b) herein.

Sec. 1-10. There shall be no sales of beer or light wine on Christmas Day or other holidays that are specifically prohibited by the Mississippi State Department of Revenue or as prohibited by the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

Sec. 1-11. Any holder of a beer permit issued from the Mississippi Department of Revenue who violates the provisions of this Ordinance by selling or distributing beer or light wine to minors, allows persons under the age of eighteen (18) years of age to handle, stock, dispense or transport beer or light wine or allows a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years to act as a bartender in facility with an on premises retailer's permit, shall constitute a misdemeanor charge subject to a fine in the sum of not greater than \$500.00 and up to ten days imprisonment in the county jail, or both, for the first offense. Upon a second offense within one year of the first offense, said charge shall be a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of up to \$750.00 and imprisonment in the county jail for up to thirty (30) days, or both. Upon a third or subsequent offense, within one calendar year from the date of the first offense, said person shall be charged with a misdemeanor subject to up to a fine of up to \$1,000.00 and imprisonment in the county jail up to six (6) months, or both and said person's business privilege license may be suspended or revoked by the Board of Aldermen after a hearing on the subject is requested by the City Prosecuting Attorney. A person's business license privilege is revoked, he shall not be eligible to apply and receive another business license privilege for the sale of beer and light wine in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for two years after the revocation of his license. Appeal's from the revocation shall be taken within thirty (30) days of the Board's order revoking the business license privilege and shall be taken to the Circuit Court of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

Sec. 1-12. Title

The sections of this article may be referred to collectively as the "Town of Belmont, Mississippi Beer Ordinance".

Sec. 1-13. The ordinance is to be construed within the context of the law governing the sale, distribution and transfer of beer and light wine as promulgated by the Mississippi State Legislature and the Mississippi State Department of Revenue and where a provision is deemed to be in direct contradiction to state law or viola-

tive of state law, said provision shall be deemed severed and the remaining portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force effect until otherwise altered or amended by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the Town of Belmont, Mississippi.

Secs 1-14 - 1-24. Reserve

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage. The City Clerk shall cause the Ordinance to be published in a local newspaper with general circulation. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING LIQUOR ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF BELMONT, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, pursuant to state law, Tishomingo County, Mississippi held a Special Election on May 21, 2013 to allow the voters within the County to determine whether to legalize the sale, distribution and possession of liquors and wines of more than 8% of alcohol by weight, or as hereinafter may be modified by the Mississippi State Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature, in Tishomingo County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the final certified results of this special election were in favor of legalization of the sale, distribution and possession of liquor and wine as described herein in alcoholic contents and forms as prescribed by the Mississippi State Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature and the same was certified by the Election Commissioners for Tishomingo County, Mississippi and the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk; and

WHEREAS, §67-1-14 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 provides that upon a majority vote for the legal sale of alcoholic liquors the municipal governing authorities shall pass the necessary order permitting the legal sale of such alcoholic beverages in such municipality; and

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Belmont, Mississippi that the Ordinance(s) governing the sale of Liquor and Wine with an alcohol content of greater than 8% by weight, or as may be hereinafter modified in form and content by the Mississippi Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature, shall be as follows:

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Article I Town of Belmont, Mississippi Liquor Ordinance

Sec. 1-1 Definitions

Any term, word or phrase which is specifically defined by Section 65-1-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be so defined in this article:

"Permittee" shall refer to any holder of a state permit to sell alcoholic beverages.

"Commercial establishment" shall include any business or organization, public or private, which charges or accepts revenue for goods, membership or admittance, whether for profit or not for profit.

"Consumption" shall include the ingestion of any alcoholic beverage as well as possession of any alcoholic beverages in an open or opened container.

Sec. 1-2 Purpose

The Town of Belmont, Mississippi finds and determines that it is in the public interest and will promote public health, morals and safety to provide reasonable rules and regulations governing the sale of alcoholic beverages and the same shall be allowed on and after July 1, 2013.

Sec. 1-3 Incorporation of state laws, including sale to minors and possession by minors

All state statutes, rules and regulations, including the Rules and Regulations of the Mississippi Department of Revenue in their present form or as hereinafter amended, modified, repealed or created are incorporated herein by reference as the governing law of the Town of Belmont, Mississippi.

State law reference-See Miss Code 1972, Title 67 generally and §97-31-1 et seq.

Sec. 1-3 Sale, Possession of alcoholic beverages

It is unlawful to sell, offer for sale, or otherwise dispense alcohol beverages or to possess alcoholic beverages in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi in violation of any state law or any rule or regulation of the Mississippi Department of Revenue, including the sale of alcoholic beverages to minors, possession of alcoholic beverages by minors and sale of alcoholic beverages within prohibited distances from churches, schools, kindergartens and funeral homes. Conforming therewith, no alcoholic beverages may be sold in an area designated, zoned or traditionally used as a residential area within four hundred feet (400') from any church, school or funeral home or within one hundred feet (100') in an area designated, zoned or traditionally used as a commercial area. The distances shall be measured from closest point to closest point on the building intended to be used for the sale of alcoholic beverages as designated in the floor plan submitted to the Mississippi Department of Revenue-Alcohol Beverage Control Division which shall have the final determination if said distance requirements are met by the applicant.

State law reference-Sale to Minors Prohibited, Penalties, Miss Code of 1972, §67-1-81; Permits, distance regulations, §67-1-51; and Permitted Premises Where Alcoholic Beverages Are Sold, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.11.2.03

Sec. 1-4 False Statements by Minors

It is unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age to make a false statement to the effect that he or she is twenty-one (21) years of age or older for the purpose of purchasing or otherwise acquiring any alcoholic beverage or for the purpose of gaining admittance to any business, resort, entertainment venue or club in which alcoholic beverages are being sold or furnished and in which persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age are not allowed by the owner, host or manager or pursuant to any state or local law or regulation.

Sec. 1-5 Locations where possession prohibited

It shall be unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any person to have in his or her possession any alcoholic beverage on or in any of the following locations:

- the interior of any business, including a restaurant, in which the owner or manager shall display in several conspicuous location inside the business and at the entrances signs containing the following language: "NO ALCOHOL BEVERAGES ALLOWED";
- any public playground;
- any public park, including the Town of Belmont, Mississippi baseball and softball fields and CC Shook Park and Blue Springs Park;
- any fire station or police station;
- any school buildings or grounds or any sports facilities owned or in use by any school;
- any public library or museum;
- any property in use by the Town of Belmont, Mississippi; or
- any property owned, leased or operated by the Town of Belmont, Mississippi, except as specifically allowed by order of the Town of Belmont, Mississippi Board of Aldermen.

Sec. 1-6 Transportation for compensation prohibited

It is unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any person to transport or deliver any alcoholic beverage to another person for compensation of any kind except for transportation as permitted by state law, rules or regulations.

State law reference- Miss Code of 1972, §67-1-1, et seq. and §27-71-15, et seq.

Sec. 1-7 Possession of alcoholic beverages by operators of public conveyance prohibited

It is unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any person operating any public conveyance to have any alcoholic beverage in their possession in such conveyance. "Public conveyance" shall be defined as a taxi service, a limousine service, a bus service, or any other motorized means of conveyance operating as a means of transporting people for hire. Interstate Common Carriers for hire are excluded from this prohibition.

Sec. 1-8 Employment of persons under the age of twenty-one (21)

It shall be unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi to employ in connection with the sale of alcoholic beverages a person under the age of twenty-one (21) for any employment from which they are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations of the Department of

Revenue, in their present form and as hereinafter amended.

State law reference-Employment of Persons Under 21 Prohibited, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.11.2.08

Sec. 1-9 Requirement For Insurance

Permittees selling alcoholic beverages within the municipal boundaries of the Town of Belmont, Mississippi shall procure and maintain at all times general liability insurance and other necessary insurance which shall include and insure against alcohol related events with minimum limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

Sec. 1-10 Hours and days during which alcoholic beverages may be sold

As set by state laws, rules and/or regulations, alcoholic beverages may be sold as follows:

(a) For holders of a state package retailer's permit, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., except that no sales may be made on Sundays or on Christmas Day; and

(b) For on-premises permittees, including hotels, restaurants, clubs or caterers with a State permit, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and midnight, except that no sales may be made on Sundays. It is further provided that on New Year's Eve night on-premises permittees, including clubs with a state permit, may remain open until 1:00 a.m., January 1st. In the event that New Year's Eve falls on a Sunday, on-premises permittees, including clubs with a state permit, may remain open from 1:00 p.m. until 1:00 a.m.

(c) These prohibited hours and days, all of which conform with present state law, shall be subject to any amendment of state law, rules or regulations, and shall conform with any amendments thereto without amendment to this ordinance. They are further subject to specific amendment by order of the Mississippi Department of Revenue in response to a petition by the Town requested approval of alternate hours and/or Sunday sales, which order shall survive any subsequent amendment to state law, rules or regulations not specifically intended to supersede prior orders by the Mississippi Department of Revenue approving hours and days during which alcoholic beverages may be sold.

(d) While resorts are exempt from state hours and days of sale regulations, the Town may, by petition to the Mississippi Department of Revenue, request designate hours and/or days for resort sales without further amendment to this ordinance. Any subsequent order of the Mississippi Department of Revenue on this subject is hereby adopted by reference.

(e) Any other limits, prohibitions or exceptions granted by state laws, rules and/or regulations, in their present form and as hereinafter amended, are hereby adopted by reference.

State law reference-Hours and Days During Which Alcoholic Beverages May Be Sold by Hotels, Restaurants, Clubs, Package Stores and Caterers, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.11.2.04

Sec. 1-11 Brown-bag ordinance

It shall be unlawful for any person or business entity, nor any agent nor employee thereof, operating a commercial establishment to allow consumption of alcoholic beverages by customers or business invitees on the premises of such establishment without a state on-premises retailer's permit.

Sec. 1-12 Open container

It is unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any person to have in his or her possession an open container, which shall not be construed to include an empty container or an open but reclosed container, in the following locations within the municipal boundaries of the Town:

(a) on public property, including buildings, parking lots, sidewalks, streets and parks; and

(b) within a motor vehicle, regardless of whether the person is possession is an operator or a passenger of the motor vehicle.

Sec. 1-13 Lewd entertainment

It shall be unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any retailer of alcoholic beverages to allow or permit within or on the business premises any conduct or activities prohibited by Title 35, Part II, Subpart 2, Chapter 7 of the Mississippi Alcohol Beverage Control Regulations, including conduct which is lewd, immoral or offensive to public decency, as defined therein.

State law reference-Prohibited Conduct and Activities, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.11.2.08

Sec. 1-14 Disturbance of the peace

It shall be unlawful in the Town of Belmont, Mississippi for any retailer of alcoholic beverages to allow or permit loud and disorderly conduct on the business premises, including loud music, so as to disturb the community.

Sec. 1-16 Enforcement

The Belmont Police Department is hereby authorized, ordered and directed to enforce this article.

Sec. 1-17

It shall be unlawful for anyone who works for a person, partnership group or business entity who engages in the sale of alcoholic beverages, either on premises or package liquor, to be under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol while working in the establishment holding the permit to offer the same for sale.

Sec. 1-18 Criminal penalties

Any person violating any of the terms or provisions of this Article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both. In addition, in lieu of imprisonment the judge may, at his or her discretion, impose not more than thirty (30) days community service. The judge may further, at his or her discretion, accept in lieu of community service a certificate indicating successful completion of an alcohol and/or drug education program or treatment program at the expense of the individual.

Sec. 1-19 Limitation

It is the intent of the Town of Belmont, Mississippi that its ordinances conform to all state statutes, rules and regulations now in force or as hereinafter amended, repealed, modified or later created. Nothing in this article shall be construed as overruling or limiting the applicability of state laws, rules and regulations. Any provision of any ordinance herein which shall be interpreted by a court of competent jurisdiction as being in conflict with any applicable state law, rule or regulation governing alcoholic beverages is superseded by the conflicting state law, rule or regulation, and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Secs. 1-20 through 1-50 Reserved.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage. The City Clerk shall cause the Ordinance to be published in a local newspaper with general circulation. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING BEER ORDINANCE FOR THE VILLAGE OF PADEN, MISSISSIPPI

ARTICLE I. VILLAGE OF PADEN BEER ORDINANCE

Section 1-1. Sale regulated. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Beer and light wines are defined by Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, Section 67-3-5 and by this article as beverages having alcoholic content of not more than eight (8%) percent by weight in such other amounts and content as may be hereinafter prescribed by the Mississippi Department of Revenue or by the State of Mississippi.

*Permittee is a person or entity who has obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue under Mississippi Code Annotated of 1972, Section 67-3-17, as amended.

Section 1-3. Privilege license required. No beer or light wine shall be sold within the municipal boundaries of the City unless the seller has first obtained a beer permit from the Mississippi State Department of Revenue under Mississippi Code Annotated Section 67-3-27, as amended, and has also obtained a business privilege license and a sale of beer and light wine privilege license, the fee for which shall be fifty (50) percent of the amount charged by the state, from the city and pay the privilege license fees to be renewed annually. No person who applies for a privilege license to sell, distribute or transfer beer or light wine in the Village of Paden, Mississippi may be qualified to receive the same if they have been convicted of any felony crime in the State of Mississippi, any other state, the United States or any U.S. Territory or if they have been convicted of illegal gambling activity in this or any other state, or if they owe any taxes to the Village of Paden, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, the State of Mississippi or any other state or the United States which has not been resolved by payment of the same at the time of the application for said license.

Section 1-4. Restrictions on sale of beer and light wine.

a. Cold beer sales allowed. It shall be lawful for refrigerated beer or light wine to be sold within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Paden for off-premises and on-premises consumption, except as provided below, beginning at 7:00 a.m. on July 6, 2013 and continuing thereafter.

b. On-premises kitchen facilities required. No beer or light wine shall be sold for on-premises consumption unless the seller has suitable kitchen facilities on the licensed premises to provide for the preparation, cooking and serving of food so that food sales represent twenty-five (25) percent of gross revenue. The service of food not prepared on the premises shall not be deemed in compliance with the requirements of this section. Restaurants must maintain seating for a minimum of forty (40) with suitable facilities for the consumption of food for its patrons and the kitchen facilities must remain open for business as long as beer or light wine is being sold.

c. Sunday sales. It shall be lawful to sell beer and light wine on Sunday. Beer and light wine may be sold on Sunday only between the hours of 12:00 Noon and 9:00 p.m.

d. Hours of sale for all days except Sunday. Beer or light wine may be sold for on-premises or off-premises consumption between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday.

e. Drive-in sales prohibited. It shall be unlawful to sell beer or light wine through a drive-in window sales facility or a drive-through "bar" within the municipal boundaries of the city.

f. Advertising. Advertising and advertisements for beer and light wine shall be contained to the interior of the building where it is sold or consumed and advertisements or signs outside of the building where the beer and light wine is sold shall be limited to those signs that may be attached to the physical structure where the business is located.

g. Territory where sale is prohibited. No beer or light wine shall be sold for either on-premises or off-premises consumption within four hundred (400') feet of the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home in an area zoned or traditionally used as a residential area or within one hundred (100') feet from the nearest point of the primary building of any church, school or funeral home in an area zoned or traditionally used as commercial or industrial area. This distance shall be measured from the nearest point of the building housing the church or school to the nearest point of the premises which consists of the floor area to be licensed by the commission. This distance shall be measured in a straight line, such as airline distance, rather than the usual route of pedestrian travel.

h. Open containers prohibited on public property. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine on public property, including buildings, parking lots, sidewalks, streets and parks within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Paden. Open containers do not include empty containers. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen may designate areas where open containers are permitted for certain Village sanctioned outdoor festivals, events or other events and shall designate the specific parameters when open containers are allowed and shall also designate the hours when open containers will be allowed. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall prescribe the same in a resolution and the same shall be posted in three public places or published in a newspaper of general circulation in the Village for at least three consecutive weeks prior to said festival, fair or other event. The Village of Paden may prescribe permit requirements for festivals, fairs or other events held in the Village of Paden, Mississippi to govern the allowance of open containers within certain dates and within certain geographic parameters as part of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department's power retained by the Sheriff's Department to maintain the health, welfare and safety of the general public.

i. Open container — Vehicles. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an open container of beer or light wine either as an operator or passenger of a motor vehicle. Open containers do not include empty containers.

j. Open container — Private Property. It shall be lawful for any person of legal age to possess a container of beer or light wine on private property.

k. Consumption of package beer. There shall be no on-premises consumption of package beer on the premises where the beer is sold.

l. On-premises consumption. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess or consume beer on premises licensed for on-premises consumption to allow a patron to leave such premises with either a full or partial container of beer or light wine.

m. Bagging of beer and light wine sold for off-premises consumption. The sales clerk of each premises selling package beer or light wine for off-premises consumption must first place the same in an opaque bag or sack before delivering same to the purchaser. The beer or light wine is sold in a cased box or carton, it shall not be necessary for the clerk to package the beer or light wine in an opaque bag or sack before the customer leaves the premises with the same. It shall be lawful for a retailer of beer and light wine to sell draft beer provided the same is packaged in a sealed container on the premises and is bagged in the same form as packaged beer prior to leaving the premises of the establishment. There shall be no on premises consumption of draft beer where package beer or light wine is sold.

n. It shall be unlawful to sell, distribute or transfer beer or light wine in an establishment where firearms, ammunition, gun powder, explosive devices or any other explosive or incendiary devices or compounds are sold or stored.

o. It shall be unlawful for any person to allow or permit gambling at any location where beer or light wine is sold upon licensed premises. No holder of a State of Mississippi permit to offer for sale distribution beer or light wine shall allow any lewd, immoral or improper entertainment, conduct or practices to take place on the premises where said business is conducted or in conjunction where beer or light wine and beer is sold.

q. It shall be unlawful for anyone who works for a person, partnership group or business entity who engages in the sale of beer or light wine to be under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol while working in the establishment holding the permit to offer the same for sale.

r. It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish in any manner beer or light wine at any time or place to a person under the age of twenty-one years of age, or to knowingly sell, furnish or give the same to any person for delivery to such minor unless authorized pursuant to Section 67-3-54 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

s. It shall be unlawful to sell, give or furnish, in any manner, beer or light wine at any time or place to any person who is known to be insane, lack mental capacity, who is mentally incapacitated or who is visibly intoxicated or to knowingly sell, give or furnish the same for the sale to any person for delivery to such persons.

Section 1-5. Discontinuing operations during emergency. In the event of any disturbance, uprising or riot or any other emergency of life, property or public safety, the mayor may require the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department to promptly order any

and all places in the city where beer or light wine is consumed, sold or otherwise dispensed, to discontinue such for the period of such emergency.

Section 1-6. Compliance with state law requirements.

No permit or license required by this article shall issue to any person unless satisfactory evidence is furnished to the tax collector that such person has complied with the requirements of state law, and if the permit required by state law is at any time revoked, said revocation shall operate as a cancellation and forfeiture of the rights of the person holding a permit or license from the municipality.

Section 1-7. Penalty for violation of article; misdemeanor.

Any violation of this article, not specifically containing a prescribed penalty, shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine or imprisonment as dictated by the Justice Court of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

Section 1-8.

No holder of a license to sell beer or light wine shall have any person under the age of eighteen (18) years of age in his employ sell, dispense, handle or stock light wine or beer. However, in no case shall any person be employed under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age as a bartender in a facility license for on premises consumption in a facility as defined as an in Section 1-4(b) herein.

Section 1-9.

There shall be no sales of beer or light wine on Christmas Day or other holidays that are specifically prohibited by the Mississippi State Department of Revenue or as prohibited by the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended.

Section 1-10.

Any holder of a beer permit issued from the Mississippi Department of Revenue who violates the provisions of this Ordinance by selling or distributing beer or light wine to minors, shall be subject to the existing statutory laws of the State of Mississippi and prosecuted in the Justice Court of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

Section 1-11. Title.

The sections of this article may be referred to collectively as the "Village of Paden, Mississippi Beer Ordinance".

Section 1-12.

The ordinance is to be construed within the context of the law governing the sale, distribution and transfer of beer and light wine as promulgated by the Mississippi State Legislature and the Mississippi State Department of Revenue and where a provision is deemed to be in direct contradiction to state law or violative of state law, said provision shall be deemed severed and the remaining portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force effect until otherwise altered or amended by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the Village of Paden, Mississippi.

Sections 1-13 through 1-24. Reserved.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage. The City Clerk shall cause the Ordinance to be published in a local newspaper with general circulation. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. The foregoing ordinance was proposed in a motion by Alderman DAVID BENSON seconded by Alderman JIM MURPHY, and after discussion, no Aldermen member having called for a reading, was voted upon as follows:

RESOLUTION ADOPTING LIQUOR ORDINANCE FOR THE VILLAGE OF PADEN, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, pursuant to state law, Tishomingo County, Mississippi held a Special Election on May 21, 2013 to allow the voters within the County to determine whether to legalize the sale, distribution and possession of liquors and wines of more than 8% of alcohol by weight, or as hereinafter may be modified by the Mississippi State Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature, in Tishomingo County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the final certified results of this special election were in favor of legalization of the sale, distribution and possession of liquor and wine as described herein

in alcoholic contents and forms as prescribed by the Mississippi State Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature, and the same was certified by the Election Commissioners for Tishomingo County, Mississippi and the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk; and

WHEREAS, §67-1-14 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 provides that upon a majority vote for the legal sale of alcoholic liquors the municipal governing authorities shall pass the necessary order permitting the legal sale of such alcoholic beverages in such municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Paden, Mississippi, at their regularly scheduled Board meeting on the 5th day of June 2013 introduced the proposed ordinance in writing and adopted the same on the 5th day of June 2013;

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Paden, Mississippi that the Ordinances governing the sale of Liquor and Wine with an alcohol content of greater than 8% by weight, or as may be hereinafter modified in form and content by the Mississippi Department of Revenue or the Mississippi State Legislature, shall be as follows:

TITLE 5. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Article I Village of Paden, Mississippi Liquor Ordinance

Section 1-1 Definitions

Any term, word or phrase which is specifically defined by Section 65-1-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be so defined in this article:

"Permittee" shall refer to any holder of a state permit to sell alcoholic beverages.

"Commercial establishment" shall include any business or organization, public or private, which charges or accepts revenue for goods, membership or admittance, whether for profit or not for profit.

"Consumption" shall include the ingestion of any alcoholic beverage as well as possession of any alcoholic beverages in an open or opened container.

Section 1-2 Purpose

The Village of Paden, Mississippi finds and determines that it is in the public interest and will promote public health, morals and safety to provide reasonable rules and regulations governing the sale of alcoholic beverages and the same shall be allowed on and after July 1, 2013.

Section 1-3 Incorporation of state laws, including sale to minors and possession by minors

All state statutes, rules and regulations, including the Rules and Regulations of the Mississippi Department of Revenue in their present form or as hereinafter amended, modified, repealed or created are incorporated herein by reference as the governing law of the Village of Paden, Mississippi.

State law reference-See Miss Code 1972, Title 67 generally and §97-31-1 et seq.

Section 1-3 Sale, Possession of Alcoholic Beverages

It is unlawful to sell, offer for sale, or otherwise dispense alcohol beverages or to possess alcoholic beverages in the Village of Paden, Mississippi in violation of any state law or any rule or regulation of the Mississippi Department of Revenue, including the sale of alcoholic beverages to minors, possession of alcoholic beverages by minors and sale of alcoholic beverages within prohibited distances from churches, schools, kindergartens and funeral homes. Conforming therewith, no alcoholic beverages may be sold in an area designated, zoned or traditionally used as a residential area within four hundred feet (400') from any church, school or funeral home or within one hundred feet (100') in an area designated, zoned or traditionally used as a commercial area. The distances shall be measured from closest point to closest point on the building intended to be used for the sale of alcoholic beverages as designated in the floor plan submitted to the Mississippi Department of Revenue-Alcohol Beverage Control Division which shall have the final determination if said distance requirements are met by the applicant.

State law reference-Sale to Minors Prohibited, Penalties, Miss Code of 1972, §67-1-81; Permits, distance regulations, §67-1-51, and Permitted Premises Where Alcoholic Beverages Are Sold, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.11.2.03

Section 1-4 False Statements by Minors

It is unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age to make a false statement to the effect that he or she is twenty-one (21) years of age or older for the purpose of purchasing or otherwise acquiring any alcoholic beverage or for the purpose of gaining admittance to any business, resort, entertainment venue or club in which alcoholic beverages are being sold or furnished and in which persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age are not allowed by the owner, host or manager or pursuant to any state or local law or

regulation.

Section 1-5 Locations where possession prohibited It shall be unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any person to have in his or her possession any alcoholic beverage on or in any of the following locations:

- The interior of any business, including a restaurant, in which the owner or manager shall display in several conspicuous location inside the business and at the entrances signs containing the following language: "NO ALCOHOL BEVERAGES ALLOWED";
- Any public playground;
- Any public park;
- Any fire station or police station;
- Any properties in use by the Village of Paden, Mississippi; or
- Any property owned, leased or operated by the Village of Paden, Mississippi, except as specifically allowed by order of the Village of Paden, Mississippi Board of Aldermen.

Section 1-6 Transportation for compensation prohibited

It is unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any person to transport or deliver any alcoholic beverage to another person for compensation of any kind except for transportation as permitted by state law, rules or regulations.

State law reference - Miss Code of 1972, §67-1-1, et seq. and §27-71-15, et seq.

Section 1-7 Possession of alcoholic beverages by operators of public conveyance prohibited

It is unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any person operating any public conveyance to have any alcoholic beverage in their possession in such conveyance. "Public conveyance" shall be defined as a taxi service, a limousine service, a bus service, or any other motorized means of conveyance operating as a means of transporting people for hire. Interstate Common Carriers for hire are excluded from this prohibition.

Section 1-8 Employment of persons under the age of twenty-one (21)

It shall be unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi to employ in connection with the sale of alcoholic beverages a person under the age of twenty-one (21) for any employment from which they are prohibited by the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Revenue, in their present form and as hereinafter amended.

State law reference-Employment of Persons Under 21 Prohibited, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.11.2.08

Section 1-9 Requirement For Insurance

Permittees selling alcoholic beverages within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Paden, Mississippi shall procure and maintain at all times general liability insurance.

Section 1-10 Hours and days during which alcoholic beverages may be sold

As set by state laws, rules and/or regulations, alcoholic beverages may be sold as follows:

a. For holders of a state package retailer's permit, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., except that no sales may be made on Sundays or on Christmas Day; and

b. For on-premises permittees, including hotels, restaurants, clubs or caterers with a State permit, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and midnight, except that no sales may be made on Sundays. It is further provided that on New Year's Eve night on-premises permittees, including clubs with a state permit, may remain open until 1:00 a.m., January 1st. In the event that New Year's Eve falls on a Sunday, on-premises permittees, including clubs with a state permit, may remain open from 1:00 p.m. until 1:00 a.m.

c. These prohibited hours and days, all of which conform with present state law, shall be subject to any amendment of state law, rules or regulations, and shall conform with any amendments thereto without amendment to this ordinance. They are further subject to specific amendment by order of the Mississippi Department of Revenue in response to a petition by the Village requested approval of alternate hours and/or Sunday sales, which order shall survive any subsequent amendment to state law, rules or regulations not specifically intended to supersede prior orders by the Mississippi Department of Revenue approving hours and days during which alcoholic beverages may be sold.

d. While resorts are exempt from state hours and days of sale regulations, the City may, by petition to the Mississippi Department of Revenue, request designate hours and/or days for resort sales without further amendment to this ordinance. Any subsequent order of the Mississippi Department of Revenue on this subject is hereby adopted by reference.

e. Any other limits, prohibitions or exceptions granted by state laws, rules and/or regulations, in their present form and as hereinafter amended, are hereby adopted by reference.

State law reference-Hours and Days During Which Alcoholic Beverages May Be Sold by Hotels, Restaurants, Clubs, Package Stores and Caterers, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.112.04

Section 1-11 Brown-bag ordinance

It shall be unlawful for any person or business entity, nor any agent nor employee thereof, operating a commercial establishment to allow consumption of alcoholic beverages by customers or business invitees on the premises of such establishment without a state on-premises retailer's permit.

Section 1-12 Open container

It is unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any person to have in his or her possession an open container, which shall not be construed to include an empty container or an open but reclosed container, in the following locations within the municipal boundaries of the Village:

- On public property, including buildings, parking lots, sidewalks, streets and parks; and
- Within a motor vehicle, regardless of whether the person is possession is an operator or a passenger of the motor vehicle.

Section 1-13 Lewd entertainment

It shall be unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any retailer of alcoholic beverages to allow or permit within or on the business premises any conduct or activities prohibited by Title 35, Part II, Subpart 2, Chapter 7 of the Mississippi Alcohol Beverage Control Regulations, including conduct which is lewd, immoral or offensive to public decency, as defined therein.

State law reference-Prohibited Conduct and Activities, Mississippi Administrative Code, §35.112.

Section 1-14 Disturbance of the peace

It shall be unlawful in the Village of Paden, Mississippi for any retailer of alcoholic beverages to allow or permit loud and disorderly conduct on the business premises, including loud music, so as to disturb the community.

Section 1-16 Enforcement

Enforcement shall be by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

Section 1-16

It shall be unlawful for anyone who works for a person, partnership group or business entity who engages in the sale of alcoholic beverages, either on premises or package liquor, to be under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol while working in the establishment holding the permit to offer the same for sale.

Section 1-17 Criminal penalties

The Village of Paden defers prosecution of violations of this Ordinance to the Justice Court of Tishomingo County, MS.

Section 1-18 Limitation

It is the intent of the Village of Paden, Mississippi that its ordinances conform to all state statutes, rules and regulations now in force or as hereafter amended, repealed, modified or later created. Nothing in this article shall be construed as overruling or limiting the applicability of state laws, rules and regulations. Any provision of any ordinance herein which shall be interpreted by a court of competent jurisdiction as being in conflict with any applicable state law, rule or regulation governing alcoholic beverages is superseded by the conflicting state law, rule or regulation, and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Sections 1-18 through 1-50 Reserved.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after passage. The City Clerk shall cause the Ordinance to be published in a local newspaper with general circulation. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. The foregoing ordinance was proposed in a motion by Alderman DAVID BENSON seconded by Alderman JIM MURPHY, and after discussion, no Aldermen member having called for a reading, was voted upon as follows:

Flag Retirement Ceremony

Community leaders and volunteers celebrated America Flag Day on Friday at Tishomingo County's historic Old Courthouse Museum with a Flag Retirement Ceremony. Winners of DARE Memorial Scholarships Named

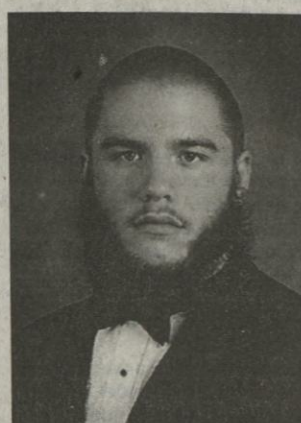

What to Do When a Loved One Dies

Whether it's expected or accidental, the death of a loved one can shake you to the core. The last thing you want is to have to interrupt grieving to deal with mundane tasks, but unfortunately there are many actions that must be done on behalf of the deceased. Some must be taken immediately, while with others you can take your time and reflect on the best path to follow.

Here's a checklist:

If the death occurs under hospital or hospice watch, they will notify the proper authorities and help you make arrangements with the coroner's office for transport of the remains. If it happens at home, call local police or 911 for assistance. If he or she was an organ donor, you'll need to act quickly.

Reach out for help in making arrangements and locating key documents. Split up such tasks as contacting others who will want to know, taking care of pets, collecting mail and safeguarding the deceased's home if it's now vacant.

Look for a will or other document that spells out the deceased's burial or cremation wishes – many people make funeral arrangements in advance, even paying ahead of time. The funeral home can guide you through the paperwork process, such as placing an obituary and ordering death certificates.

Hopefully, the deceased prepared a will that names an executor to oversee the disposition of his or her estate; otherwise, the court will have to appoint one. In sorting through their files, also look for: a trust; insurance policies; bank, credit card, mortgage and loan accounts; safe deposit box key; contact information for lawyer, doctor, accountant or other professional advisors; and passwords to computer and other accounts.

Within the first few days, start notifying organizations with which the deceased had business or financial arrangements. In most cases you'll be required to submit a certified copy of the death certificate, so be sure to order ample copies. You'll need to contact:

Current or former employers for information about possible final wages, accrued vacation, retirement, life in-

surance or other death benefits.

Social Security Administration. If they were receiving Social Security benefits, you'll need to stop payment right away. Funeral homes often do this, but be sure to ask.

Once you've notified Social Security, they will contact Medicare to cancel benefits. However, if they were enrolled in a Medicare Prescription or Advantage Plan or had a Medigap policy, contact each to cancel coverage.

Veteran's Administration. Veterans, their immediate family members and certain others may be entitled to burial at a national cemetery.

Forward their mail to a secure address so you don't miss important correspondence.

Cancel their driver's license to avoid identity fraud.

Banks, credit unions, credit card issuers and other lenders to close accounts – if you are a surviving spouse, to convert accounts to your name only.

If they had a safe deposit box and you don't have the key, ask what documents you need to gain access.

Insurance companies. Cancel auto and homeowners policies; however, continue keeping them activated until assets are sold, in case of theft or damage.

Close email accounts.

Cancel magazine subscriptions and utilities.

Finally, the executor will have to deal with issues as locating beneficiaries, distributing inherited property, filing final tax returns, settling outstanding debts. You'd be wise to work with an attorney who specializes in probate issues.

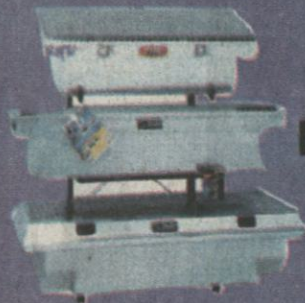

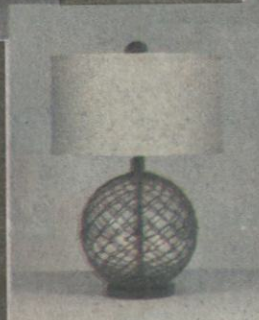
