County Schools Preparing for 2013-2014 Year

County schools are making last minute preparations for the students that will arrive for the first day of class next Thursday.

Registrations still open are:

- TCHS - 9-10th graders pick up schedules and provide proof of residency August 1st, 1 - 6 p.m.
- Tishomingo - Registration & Open house August 1 noon - 7 p.m.
- Belmont - Registration & Open House August 1, noon - 7 p.m.
- Iuka Elementary - August 1st, 3 - 7 p.m.
- Iuka Middle School - August 12th Open House, in the evening
- Burnsville School - Wednesday, August 7th, 2-5 p.m.

Facility Update

There are a few facility updates around the district, explained Tishomingo County Schools Superintendent Benny McClung in a recent interview. At Belmont, they have some new carpeting and flooring in the high school to go along with their new principal, last year's

district principal of the year, Van Roberts. There's also new fencing around the playground and campus.

At Tishomingo, the district is building a long overdue new field house with handicapped-accessible bathrooms that will be available for all those attending football games at Bulldog Field. And Burnsville is also in process of building a new field house, since it's facility was about the same age as Tishomingo's.

New Policies a Challenge

A new attendance policy passed by the Mississippi State legislature will be a challenge for all the schools. It requires students to be present and in class for 63 percent of each day, and the districts are paid by the state according to those numbers.

The recent updates to Mississippi's "concealed carry" law will not affect how such things are handled at Tishomingo County schools, said McClung. There is still a zero-tolerance standard for any weapons on school grounds.

The Town of Burnsville will hold a special election on Tuesday, August 13th to fill a vacancy on the board of aldermen.

Qualified candidates will be Jason Blakney, Sheila Stricklen Crawford, Sherry Emerson, Scott Horton and Larry W. Martin.

According to town officials, alderman-elect Mike Epperson, who received 131 votes in the June 4th municipal election, had a conviction in another state that, upon examination, disqualified him from running for office in Mississippi.

Epperson submitted his resignation at the July 2nd regular town meeting, according to town officials.

The voting poll will be open from 8 a.m. until noon August 10th for absentee voting.

Iuka Plans for Bigger, Better Reenactment & Heritage Festival Labor Day Weekend

Key players in the planning and preparation for the Battle of Iuka/Heritage Day festival got together with area media representatives Tuesday to officially kick off the promotion of what they hope to be an even better event than the one last year.

Building on the success of 2012's 150th Anniversary Commemoration, when more than

20,000 visitors enjoyed Labor Day weekend in Iuka, the town is again hosting hundreds of reenactors and thousands of visitors August 30th, 31st, and September 1st for the commemoration of the 151st Anniversary of the Battle of Iuka.

Heritage Festival organizer Martha Biggs announced Tuesday that they have even more

vendors coming than ever, and also lots of entertainment scheduled in Mineral Springs Park, including Eden 4, and the Cherokee Indians

who will do a presentation in remembrance of Iuka's earliest heritage.

Education Sessions

Friday during the school day, more than 800 Tishomingo County students will be transported to the Battlefield site to see first hand some aspects of life in the 1860s, including a soldier's life, music and dances of the period, and how cannons are fired. Living history presenters will include President Abraham Lincoln, CSA President Jefferson Davis and First Lady Varina Davis, Gen. U.S. Grant and his wife, Julia, members of the 48th Tennessee Infantry, and Freeman's Battery reenactors.

Grand Illumination & Concert Friday Night

Friday night, volunteers will set out 2,000 luminaries honoring the memories of the approximately 2,000 troops killed in the two-hour Battle of Iuka.

Jaybird Park and the road down to Twin Magnolias will be lined with luminaries beginning about 6:30 p.m. Period music by the Lost Cause Confederate String Band will be under the Gazebo, and at 8:30, the dead will be remembered with words by living history actors portraying President Abraham Lincoln, CSA President Jefferson Davis

They sing about love and life on the road, a theme on their latest release, the album "Home," which debuted at #2 in the iTunes Singer/Songwriter chart.

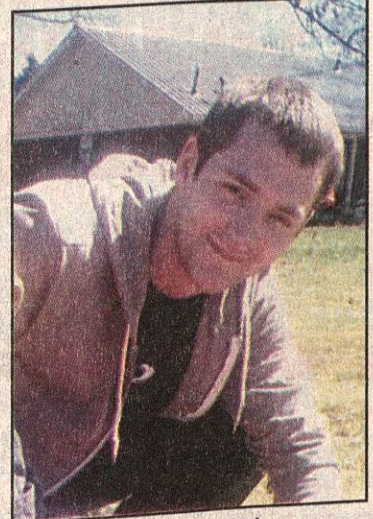

Belmont Man Killed in Wreck Early Sunday Near Golden

A Belmont man was killed in a one-vehicle wreck near Golden sometime Saturday night or Sunday morning, according to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon.

Tyler Goddard, 23, was driving on County Road 82 near the intersection with County Road 69 when the 2008 Nissan pickup he was driving apparently left the road and hit a tree, explained Wilemon. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

His truck was found in the very remote area early Sunday morning by a newspaper carrier when they happened to see a light from his truck that was still

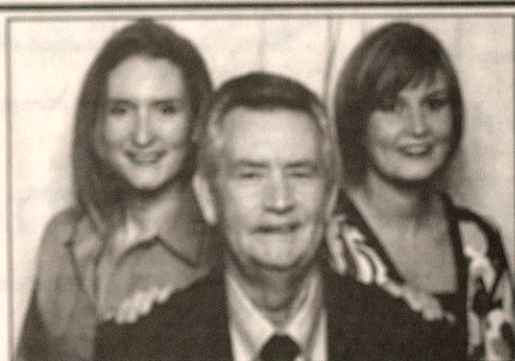

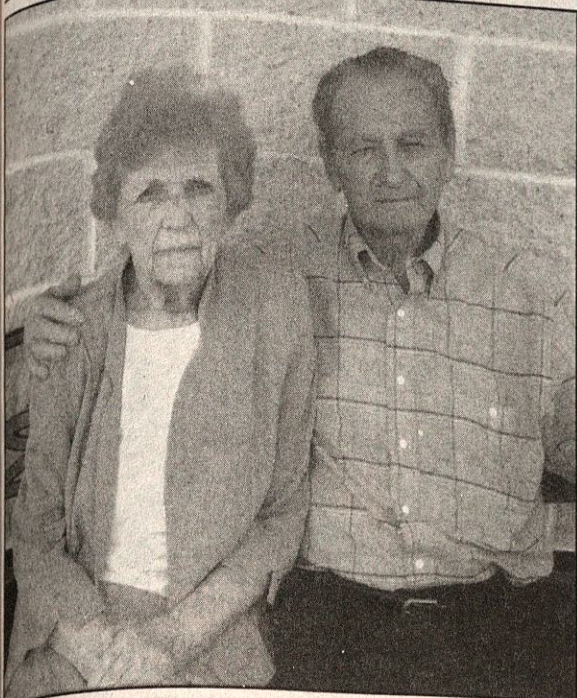

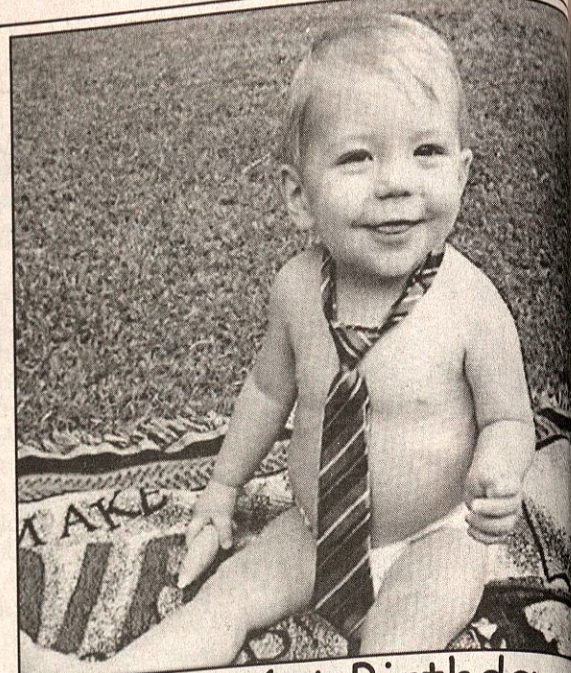
Sign-Ups Open for Iuka Youth Soccer

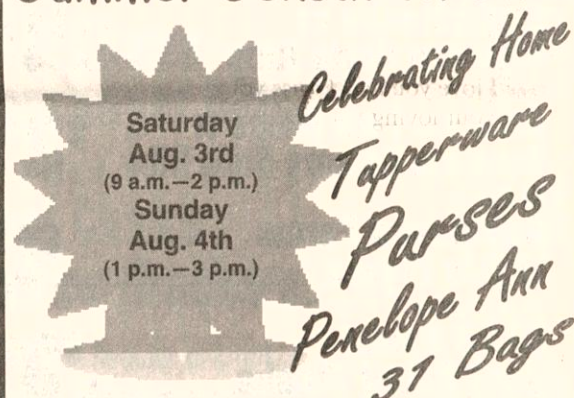


Hannah Humphrey Awarded Undergraduate Leadership Award at Mississippi State

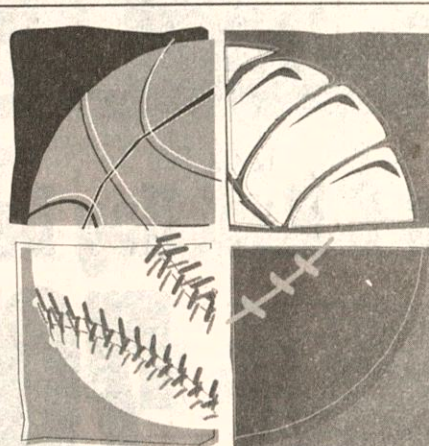

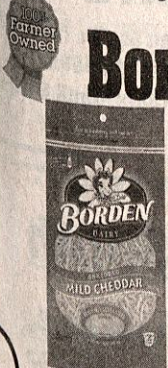

Peace In The Middle Of A Storm

I love facts, even though I recognize that there is also a place for allegories, figures of speech and novels, as long as they are not sensual. I suppose my love for facts is based on the truth of God's Word and the fact that every person who has faith in God will finally be doing fine, even if one may be going through a storm in the present. I am thinking of Acts 27:22-26, which are Paul's words to the crew of a ship that carried

276 people:

"And now I exhort you to be of good cheer; for there shall be no loss of any man's life among you, but of the ship. For there stood by me this night the angel of God, Whose I am, and Whom I serve, Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar; and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee. Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer; for I believe God, that it shall be even as it was told me. Howbeit we must be cast upon a certain island."

Paul was being escorted to Rome by ship to stand before Caesar in court. This would take place, because Paul had appealed his case to Caesar, so the Roman government had to give him a hearing before Caesar. While the ship was on its way to Rome, a storm came up on the sea. There was great reason for fright, because the ship had already been stuck in the sands of the island of Claudia. The interesting thing is that God protected all 276 people on board, including crew and passengers, for the sake of Paul! The angel of the Lord had stood by Paul and told him that he would arrive safely at Rome. It is noteworthy that Paul's peace was also "shared" with every-

one on board the ship. (By the way, our peace can also be shared with those around us, when we have God's peace in our hearts.) Paul brought a message of good cheer to all who were on the ship, because he had heard from God through His angel! Paul's simple response to the message of God was that he believed it! It might be good for us, when we are going through a storm in life, to remember that God has already promised that all who belong to Him will one day be landed safely at home with Him! If some who read this have not yet received the Prince of Peace, the Lord Jesus Christ, it would be a good time for such people to come to put their trust in Him for

salvation. After new life has come through faith in Jesus' death and resurrection, it will be completely normal for God to give peace when the believer is go-

Health Check Brings Equipment, Testing to Pickwick Dam

SAVANNAH, Tenn. Residents and visitors to Pickwick Dam can expect to see large pieces of equipment nearby as the Tennessee Valley Authority conducts a geotechnical evaluation. The study of the earth-and-rock structure is part of a "health check" of all 49 dams in the TVA system. TVA's dams are safe. The health check is part of a continuous improvement campaign to make sure TVA's dams meet today's stringent industry safety standards. During the health check, the integrity of the dam and surrounding area will be tested. To perform the health checks, TVA is drilling holes into the concrete, rock and soil at and near the dams.

The drilling process does not harm the dam or the environment and will help TVA engineers affirm the structural integrity of the dams.

As the work progresses, visitors will notice a large barge as well as a crane near the dam. Temporary lane closures on the road above the dam may also be needed. The work should be complete in September. All scheduled work is subject to change depending on weather, geotechnical conditions encountered and other factors. The Tennessee Valley Authority is a corporate agency of the United States that provides electricity for business customers and local power distributors serving 9 million people in parts of seven southeastern states. TVA receives no taxpayer funding, deriving virtually all of its revenues from sales of electricity. In addition to operating and investing its revenues in its electric system, TVA provides flood control, navigation and land management for the Tennessee River system and assists

local power companies, state and local governments with economic development and job creation.

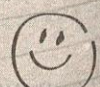

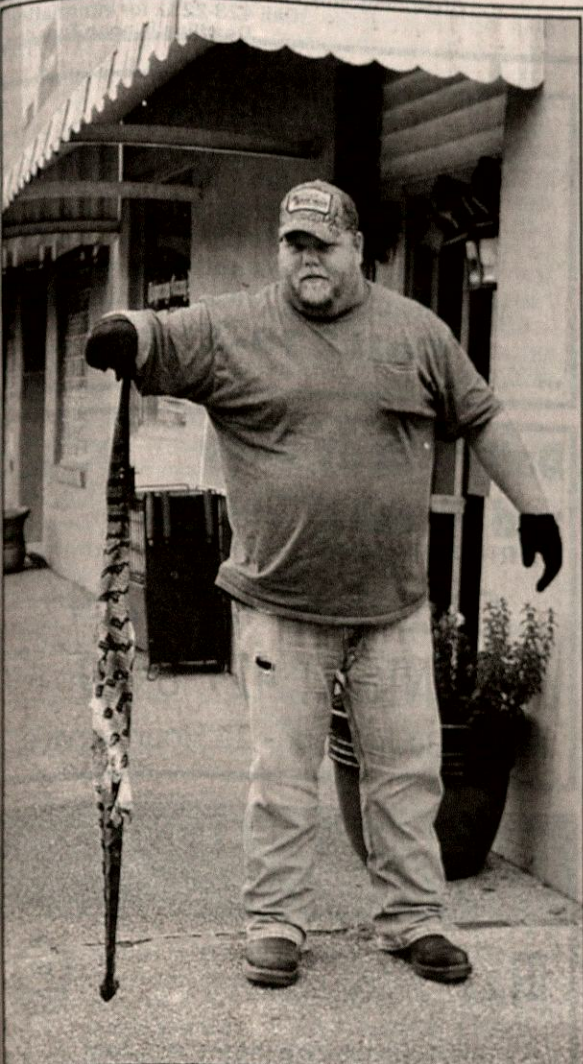

Mission Quilts will meet Tuesday, July 23 at 10:00 a.m.

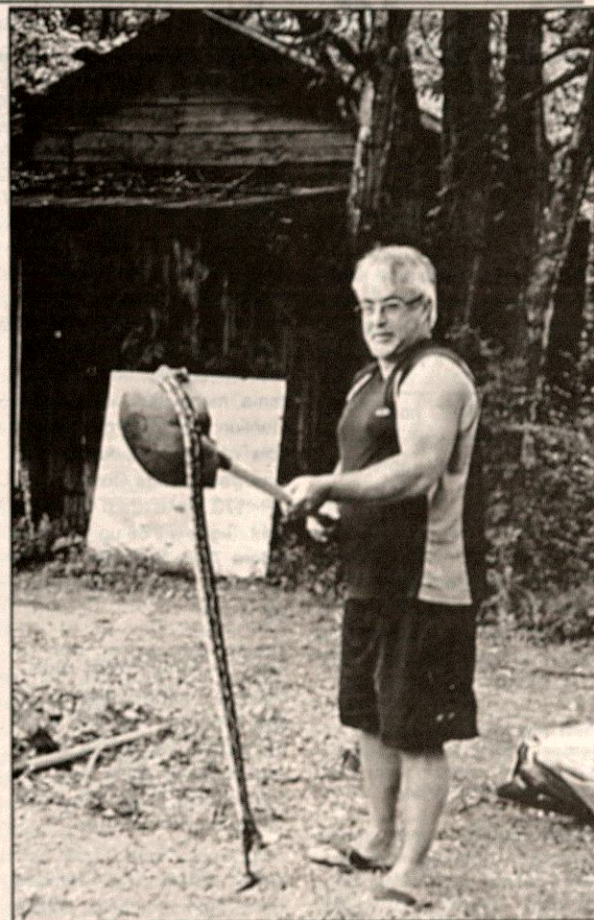


