Two Injured in Motorcycle Wrecks Last Week

Late last week, two separate motorcycle wrecks left two Iuka men seriously injured, and families and friends praying for healing.

Late Thursday night, a one-motorcycle wreck on County Road 243 left Shea Hollon, 39, with major injuries. Family members say that he simply lost control of his motorcycle, and when it left the road he hit a culvert. He is in the MED in Memphis, where he has undergone several surgeries, including one on his face.

"We are hopeful, and he is in good spirits," said his sister-in-law, Shanna Hollon. "We appreciate all the many prayers and support we have had from the community. Please keep praying - he has a lot of healing to do."

Heath Robinson, 37, suffered serious injury when a van collided with his motorcycle in the intersection.

According to a family member, about 5:30 a.m. when he was on his way to work at Northeast Mississippi Community College, the van was behind another car stopped at the stoplight at Quitman and Battleground Drive, headed westbound on Quitman. When the light turned, traffic proceeded through, and the car in front of him went across, but the van turning left/north turned right into Heath, who was on a motorcycle.

Robinson has undergone surgery on his leg, to put a rod in his thigh, and will have major foot surgery in the next week, said a family member.

"We appreciate so much the outpouring of love and support from the community, it means so much to us," said his mother-in-law Debbie Bowling. "He has a long way to go, and we just ask for continued prayers."

Cardinals Take Victory in 2013 County Match

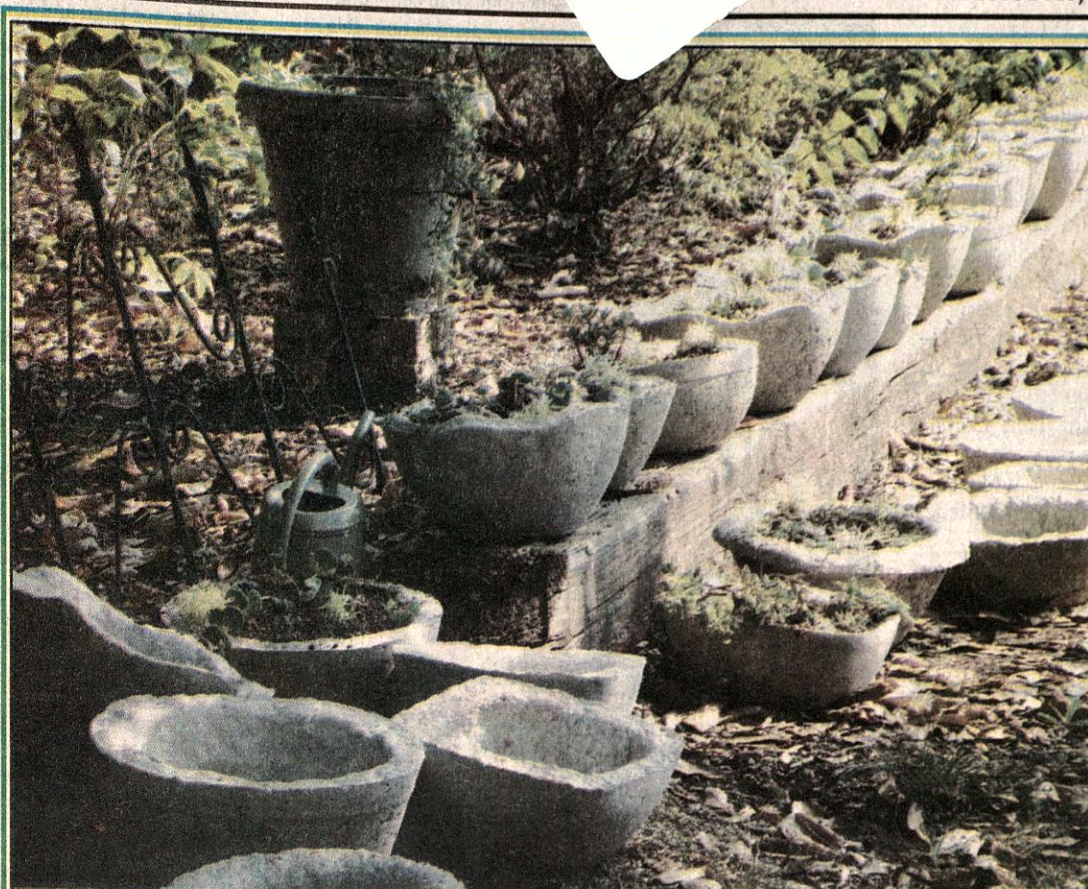
The Braves hopefully learned an important lesson last Friday in Belmont: the game starts with the first kickoff.

Annually, the Iuka United Methodist Women design and sell a commemorative ornament featuring a historic feature about Iuka or the county. A special Battle of Iuka sesquicentennial ornament, and one featuring Twin Magnolias were introduced for the Battle of Iuka anniversary commemorations.

The ornaments are available for \$20 each and can be mail ordered, or picked up from the church office at 101 Eastport Street, Iuka, 38852. Make checks payable to Iuka United Methodist Women. If you want to order by mail, please include \$5 for shipping, and be sure to include your name, address, phone number and the quantity of ornaments ordered with your payment.

Twin Magnolias, referred to as the Coman House in some sources, was the home of Major J. M. Coman, who was an early settler and one of the county's first elected officials. The house was moved from Eastport, as were many in those early days of settlement. In this home also was instituted the first nursing association of the town under the direction of Mrs. Elizabeth Coman, where the women of the town made first aid kits and bandages for the Confederate soldiers.

After the Battle of Iuka, when every home in the town was open to the wounded and dying of both armies, many were brought to this house and all the beds were turned over to the wounded. General Henry Little, of Maryland, used it as his headquarters, and when he was killed at the beginning of the battle, he was buried in the flower



garden until after the war.

The Battle of Iuka ornament honors the 150th anniversary of the historic Civil War battle in September of 1862.

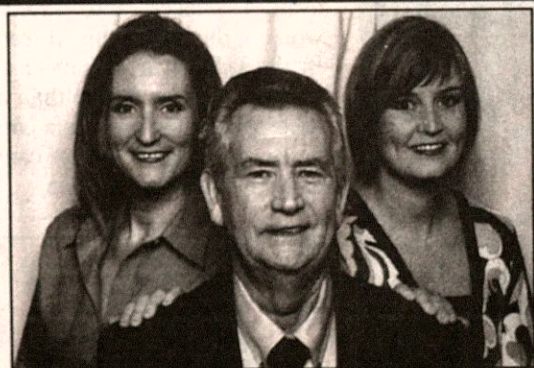

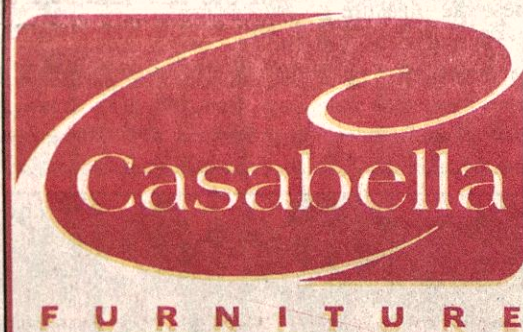

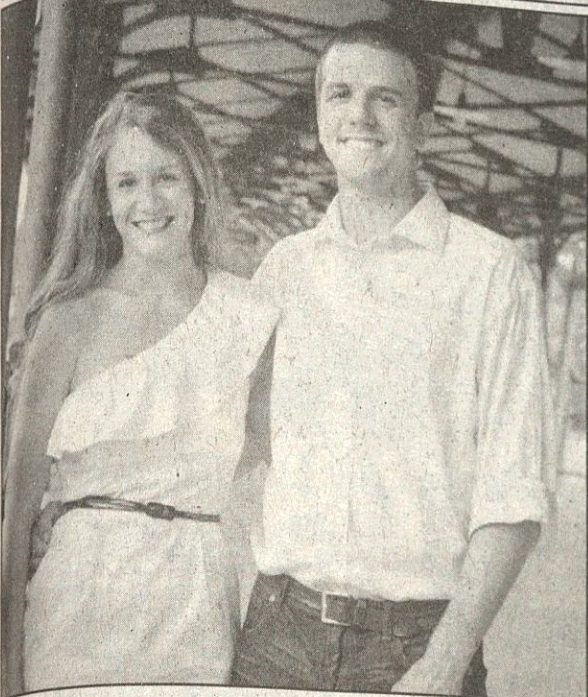

Mr. Becker's certificate was presented during the Educational Seminar following the Presidential Debate on Saturday. The certificate was pre-

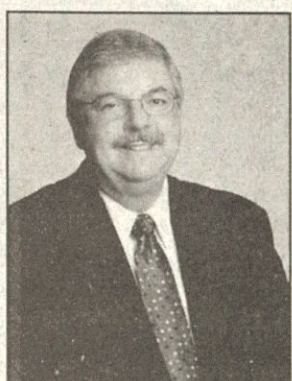


sented by the first Mayor of Iuka, D. L. Davis (portrayed by David Nichols), and President Abe Lin-
