Local Youth Carry Cross Across County in "Mississippi Glowing" Statewide Tour

Without the cross, Mission Mississippi would be just another nonprofit with nice ideas.

But the cross changes everything.

That's what Mission Mississippi staff and board members are praying will happen over the next few months as they partner with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) on a 2,489-mile walk across the state with a six-foot-tall, battery-illuminated cross.

They're calling it "Mississippi Glowing."

To mark Mission Mississippi's 20th year of promoting racial and denominational reconciliation within the body of Christ, the walk will kick off at the State Capitol Building August 7 and stop in all 82 counties in 82 days before returning to Jackson for a statewide celebration October 27.

"The Ku Klux Klan

burned the cross. This is a lighted cross. If you burn something, it's short-lived. If you light it, light travels for millions of years. That'll preach," said Mission Mississippi board member Lee Paris.

Local Carriers

Saturday, youth from throughout Tishomingo County carried the cross north on Highway 25 from Belmont to Tishomingo, and to Iuka from there. Sunday morning, others carried it on to the county line, were representatives from Alcorn Central's FCA took over.

Nissan North America built the 11-pound cross with the help of Yates Construction. FCA athletes will take turns carrying it on the walk, which will include a celebration service in each county seat.

MISSION MISSISSIPPI began in October 1993 with the raising of a 20-foot cross at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium in Jackson.

Originally, it was intended to be a one-time event, not a movement.

"We thought we'd solve all the problems of race from the past 400 years at one event. But it became apparent in the planning process that we wouldn't," Paris said.

"So a group of us formed the organization. And we've been systematically working on it for 20 years."

That systematic approach includes prayer breakfasts and luncheons, after-church picnics, and discussion forums for Christians of different races to get to know each other. Twenty-two local chapters exist throughout the state.

And on the 20th of each month this year, to honor the organization's 20th anniversary, several restaurants are offering 20-percent discounts to racially diverse parties.

"Mississippi Glowing" is the biggest part of Mission Mississippi's anniversary celebration and is probably one of the most ambitious projects the group has ever undertaken.

On August 7 at 1 p.m., Mission Mississippi illuminated the cross and sent it off with board members and friends, who walked it from the south steps of the State Capitol Building to the Highway 80 bridge in Brandon.

They met representatives from FCA. In each county, multiple high-school and college athletes will take turns walking and/or running the cross to its next stop. Each county's sheriff's department will provide escorts along the way.

"MISSISSIPPI GLOWING" will culminate in the statewide celebration and worship on October 27 at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Anyone and everyone from around the state and beyond is invited, especially those who participated in "Mississippi Glowing" in each county.

Fast Work by Investigators Recovers Stolen Items

Our home was burglarized the late evening of September 4th, 2013, while we were out of town. We had hired two painters and one of those apparently participated, knowing when we would be away.

It is difficult to describe the pain something like this inflicts. It is not just the momentary loss, it is the feeling that some very precious things are no longer a part of you and the beloved memories that they convey to you and your continuing family; your mother's inexpensive engagement ring, the tiny watch she wore, my father's wedding ring he wore for over fifty years; all these in the dirty hands of uncaring strangers, and that future generations will never be able to hold and treasure them as we have.

We were very fortunate. The Colbert County Sheriff's Department

had three investigators out the next day, and they took the burglary seriously. They put out flyers to other areas and pawn shops, did interviews with people who knew we were going to be out of town, and because of their time and work, the items showed up in Franklin County, and suspects have been identified, and appropriate action taken. We recovered nearly 100% of what was taken, thanks to their fast and thorough work. Some of the jewelry had been broken into pieces, to make it easier to pawn, but the majority was intact, as my wife lived through her memories again, by identifying it.

Our sincere thanks for the fast and professional work of the investigators from the Colbert County Sheriff's Department.

(CABOSAN LUCAS, MEXICO) This place is all desert, and cactus and beach and people from Minnesota and some from Arkansas. The small Mexican town is gone, the dusty roads, the roadside taco stand with dollar tacos and dollar beer, the grocery store with the dirt floor, all gone. This place has changed. I'm staying at a Hilton and bought all my supplies at a Walmart.

A tropical storm blew through here the day before yesterday. A tropical storm is like a hurricane except you don't die and your house is still in one piece. It's scary. No snakes so far, but the iguanas will give you a start if you are not careful, especially the long skinny ones.

Tomorrow I hit the "dark desert highway" up to Hotel California. It's about an hour away. It will look the same as 20 years

ago, except the streets are now paved, sort of, and the rates at the hotel will be up, way up. They will play the song for you in the bar if you ask. It's an eight track; some things don't change.

The fellow sitting next to me is from Minnesota. He's a Methodist. We talked about how our church had been a blessing to us, about love and grace and forgiveness; not much about hate. In the restaurant, the customers are constantly looking at their cell phones.

The local grocery store, the one that had a dirt floor, is full of local people. Their shopping carts are full of fresh vegetables and fruit and juice, no frozen pizza, or

Twinkies, or cokes, or junk. These people look a lot healthier than us and they weigh less, a lot less.

There was this fellow on the flight down here - big guy, gray hair, red face, close to 400

pounds, with a blood pressure to match. He didn't talk much; would hardly speak to me. He stayed in the hotel bar all week, so far as I could tell. He is sitting here in the airport; from the looks of him now, he will go over 400 and the blood pressure as well. Yep, he had a good vacation.

I'm from Paden, so I speak to everyone. Some are easy, especially the mid-westerners. The ones from the east coast look at you like you are wanting to borrow money. The ones I have the most trouble with are the exceptionally beautiful women, and there are a lot of them down here. My throat gets dry, or my feet start to shuffle, or I get an itch on my back. So far, no snakes.

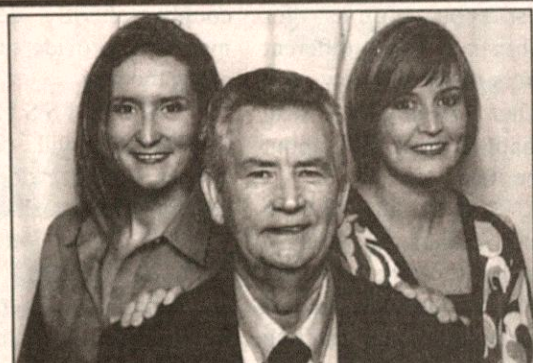

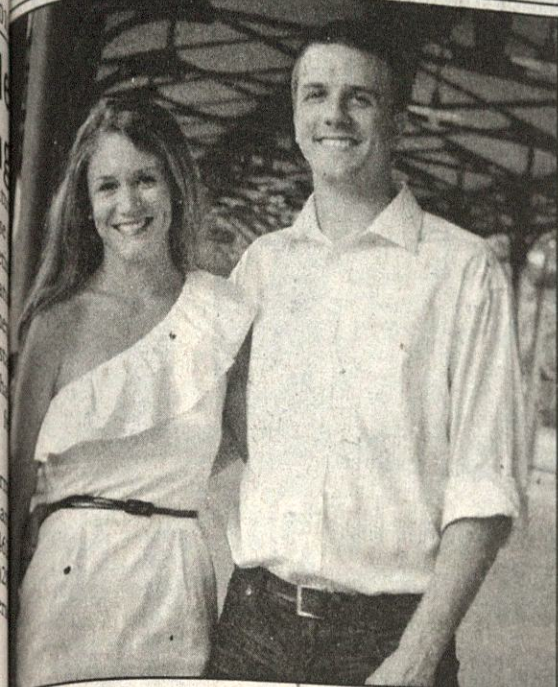

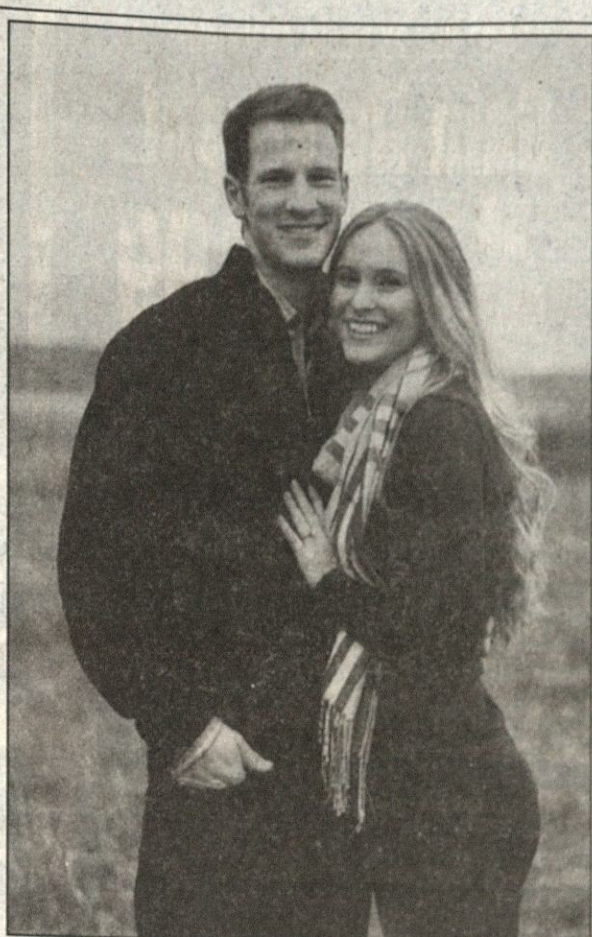

Tacoma, Washington, and is tasked with piloting the C-17 Globemaster III.

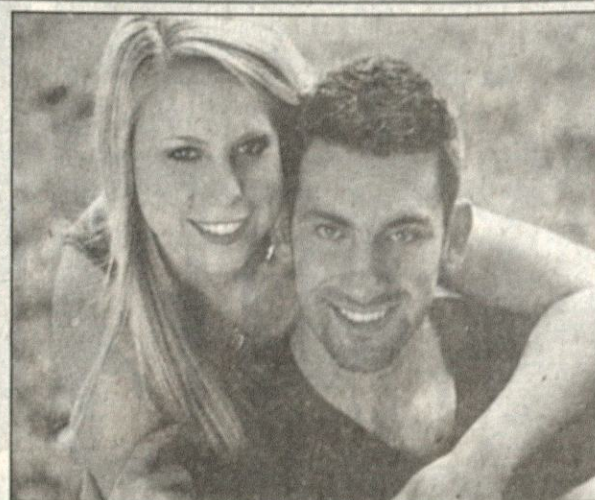

Hillside Using Horses in Therapy Program

Fundraiser BBQ Saturday to Raise Funds for Innovative Equine Therapy

Everyone is invited to come enjoy the Pork-a-Palooza in Pickwick this Saturday night, a music and food celebration to benefit a local equine therapy program.

There will be music by Eden Four, the New Outlaws, Frankie Marlar Band and Nashville's own Anna Kate McElhiney, as well as barbecue catered by The Broken Spoke. All proceeds go to benefit a new equine (horse) therapy program, Hillside New Beginnings, from Michie, Tennessee.

Beginning at 4 p.m., there will be music, games, and food at 3540 Damon Road in Pickwick. There will be equine sessions at 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. showing some of the therapy they do at Hillside.

Hillside New Beginnings is operated by Rachel Bailey and they offer year-round equine-assisted therapy sessions and classes including individual therapy, family reunification, life skill building, and community connections for at-risk youth, groups, treatment centers, families, couples and individuals. Working with the horses assists with emotional growth and teaching of issues related to substance abuse, communication and behavior problems, for people of many different ages.

"Horses are one of the world's best-kept secrets. We come to them tired, discouraged, ill, and confused; they send us home refreshed, renewed, and full of life and hope for tomorrow. By just being themselves, they can bring an emotional and mental healing that other forms of therapy cannot," said Resa Nilson, BS, Animal Science, University of Vermont.

Horses have their very own language—they communicate with the movement of their body, their expression, and the distance they chose, maintain, or increase between them and an object or person of interest. This language is integral to understanding their behavior and how to be with them—the ability to recognize fear, frustration, willingness, and happiness is important to working with them and clients.

Those familiar with horses have long recognized and understood their power and influence on people. Horses are large and powerful, which creates a natural opportunity to overcome fear and develop confidence while working with them, and provides metaphors to use when dealing with other intimidating and challenging situations in life.

Horses are excellent at reading our body language, and will respond to it honestly, which makes them powerful messengers. They are able to read and mirror body language. This creates a situation that requires us as humans to rethink our approach with them and try to communicate in a different manner. Using the healing bond with horses to educate, mentor, and empower behavioral changes, and enhance skills for people of all ages. This therapeutic / learning approach is a powerful tool for people of all ages and all walks of life dealing with problems related to emotional, behavioral, communication and relational issues (i.e. abuse, anger, addiction, divorce, eating disorders, grief & loss, fear, etc.)

"Horses are not concerned with the niceties of human convention -- they don't worry about hurting your feelings, or lie awake at night pondering just the right way to break the hard truth . . . The skills of communication are the

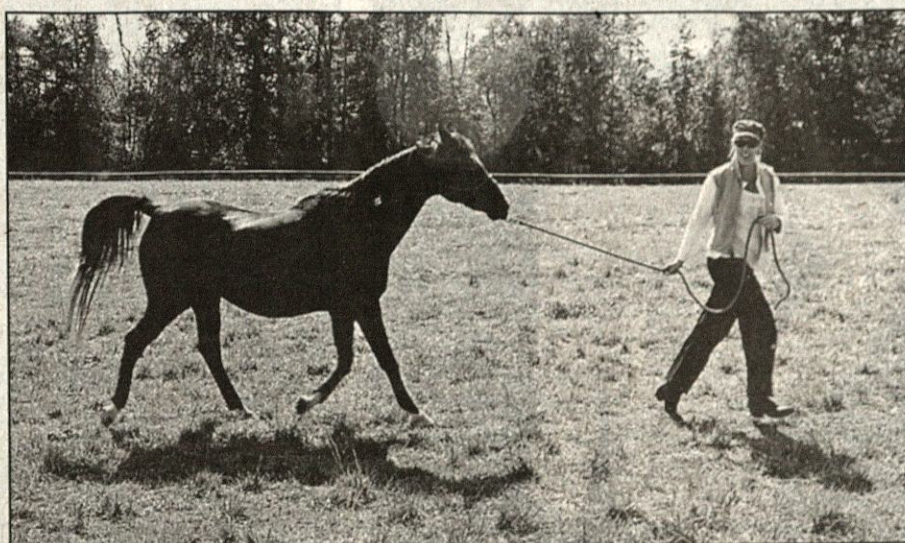
same, whether you are relating to person or equine . . . Horses will not hesitate to challenge us if what we're doing is not clear to them," said April Clay in her article, Discover Your Inner Equine, *Horse Illustrated*, April 2004.

Hillside NEW Beginnings Mission is to provide a foundation of services to youth, families, groups, and individuals, that will transform lives and communities using the strength of horses to teach, guide, and unlock personal awareness, emotional and spiritual growth through equine assisted psychotherapy and alternative learning services.

Hillside NEW Beginnings programs use an experiential model, based on the principles of Equine Assisted Psychotherapy / Equine Assisted Learning which believes participants can learn about themselves and others by participating in activities with horses while processing thoughts, beliefs, behaviors and patterns. Hillside NEW Beginnings team creates "on the ground" activities designed to represent the specific obstacles, situation or problem for the client. As the client participates in the activities, certain metaphors are naturally created between the client(s) and

the horse(s), the activity and the situations in their lives. The team holds the space for the client to work through and make discoveries regarding their particular situations, and reflect back their observations as they process with the client for further application. It is those discoveries and "Aha!" moments that help the client to move forward in the process of change to their specific situation. This form of therapy has been proven to bring faster results than traditional treatment/ counseling alone; as the participants learn very quickly about themselves and are able to relate the exercises they perform with the horses to real-life situations. In all of our work, the horse(s) are the key component of the team, and is what makes our work unique. Every session/class involves a horse(s) and without them we have no program.

"Volunteering at hillside is a huge blessing in my life. Knowing that I can help out the farm in the smallest ways possible makes me feel better as a person each and every way possible. The horses and people there are so much like a family I wish I could just spend every day there," said Volunteer Bria Collins



"Being at Hillside gives me peace. I love horses and love to see how they help others. As a Board Member, I am so excited to help move this organization forward. It has helped so many," said volunteer Coordinator-Jackie Dudley.

WVOM - Wonderful Voice of Music, 1270 on the AM radio dial, was Tishomingo County's first radio station. The station signed on the air at five o'clock in the morning of Saturday, September 17, 1960, for its first day of regular commercial broadcasting. The Federal Communications Commission granted the construction permit on June 8.

A photograph was taken about 4:30 a.m. that Saturday morning before the station went on the air. Original personnel at the station were photographed for this big moment in time. "Curly" Huntley, the station manager, is seated in the picture. Standing behind Curly, from left to right, are Mr. E. C. "Gene" Holtsford, owner of the station; Buddy Bain, assistant manager working as announcer and salesperson; Charles Kay, announcer and salesperson; and Rev. J. T. McCafferty, pastor of the Iuka United Methodist Church, who gave the invocation for the signing on of the new radio station.

The first location of the WVOM broadcast studio was next door in the upstairs area of the old Gallagher building adjacent to the BancorpSouth Bank (formerly the Iuka Guaranty Bank) on Front Street in Iuka, Miss. The transmitter building and broadcast tower were located on a four-acre plot of land about a mile and a half south of Iuka on Pleasant Hill Road.

The first day's broadcast from the new studio marked a milestone in Tishomingo County's progress. Being the first radio broadcast outlet in the county, WVOM was



the most powerful radio station in Northeast Mississippi. Its 1000-watts radiated power expanded its service area to most of North Mississippi, significant portions of Northwest Alabama, and nine counties in West Central Tennessee. The coverage area represented a population density of more than 1 million people.

The station's programs featured refined country music, some rock-n-roll in the afternoons, easy listening on Sundays, news from the wires of United Press International, and public services. WVOM continued to be a constant companion in thousands of homes. As well as entertainment, the station provided listeners with news, weather reports, coverage of special events, reports on local sports, and hundreds of other ser-

vices too numerous to call to mind. Residents of the Tri-State area depended upon WVOM as a reliable source for important local information.

WVOM Radio celebrated its 7th birthday on Sunday afternoon, September 17th, 1967, with a gala program held on the grandstand in Iuka's downtown Jaybird Park. WVOM commemorated seven years of service to the Tri-State area with prestigious performers from both the country and gospel genre. The general public was invited to this spectacular event and urged to pick up free tickets at their favorite participating merchant.

Charlie Louvin, famous country and western singer of Nashville, Tenn., headlined the show. Other performers were the Liberator's Quartet, Chuck

Comer and the Lucky Guys, also of Memphis, the Choate Sisters of Iuka, and other local groups. The Master of Ceremonies was WVOM's Dave Floyd; other speakers were E. C. Holtsford, WVOM owner-manager; Iuka's Mayor George Cutshall; and Circuit Judge N. S. "Soggy" Sweat, Jr.

Behind-the-scenes personnel who were instrumental in planning this spectacular 7th anniversary show included WVOM staff members Joyce Worsham, Jim "Gentleman Jim" Yarbrough, and Harry "Happy Harry" Farrell. The Iuka Rescue Squad assisted in directing traffic and in taking up tickets. The show continued until 4 o'clock with a variety program that pleased youngsters from 8 to 80. Front Street from the Iuka Guaranty Bank

west of McGill's Grocery was blocked off to make room for spectators. People brought their chairs, found a good location, and enjoyed the show.

Mr. Holtsford sold WVOM in January 1970 to Dr. Kelly Segars; he also owned and operated WADI 95.3 (formerly WWTX) in Corinth. At some point in time, Dr. Segars sold the station, and it was called WFOX. WVOM

broadcasted regular daily programs until February 1994 when it was taken off the air.

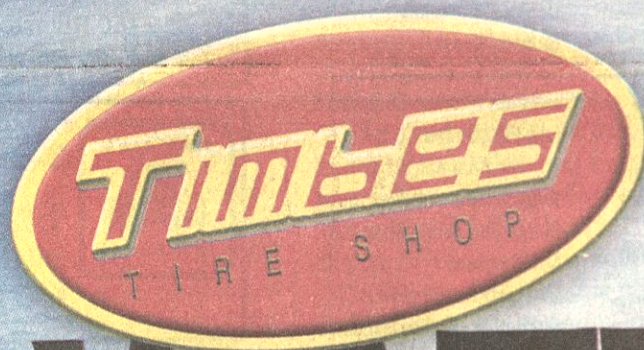

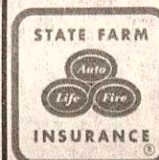

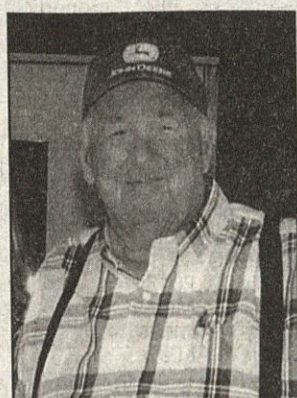

DESIGNATION OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY TO RECEIVE FSA DISASTER LOAN APPLICATIONS

(BOONEVILLE, MS) (September 23, 2013) - "Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Prentiss County Office of the Farm Service Agency," John W. Webber, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

According to Mr. Webber, this authority is pursuant to Secretary Vilsack's declaration on September 18, 2013, of a major disaster in Alabama caused by excessive rain and flooding that began January 1, 2013, and continuing. Tishomingo County is contiguous to the primary natural disaster area. Therefore, it has been designated eligible for Federal Disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through May 19, 2014.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operation to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principal balance of any existing emergency loan owed by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all of its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, and where applicable, sex, marital status, familial status, parental status, religion, sexual orientation, political beliefs, genetic information, reprisal, or because all or part of an individual's income is derived from any public assistance program. Mississippi Deer Archery Seasons Open October 1 & October 15

JACKSON – Hunters are looking forward to the opening day of the 2013-2014 Mississippi deer hunting season. Archery season opens on October 1 in the Hill and Delta zones and opens on October 15 in the Southeast Zone. Hunters need to be aware that the archery season opening date for the Southeast Zone listed in the 2013 – 2014 Mississippi Outdoor Digest is incorrect.

New this year during archery season is the addition of crossbows as legal archery equipment. Longbows, recurves, compound bows, and crossbows are all legal archery equipment and can be used during all deer hunting seasons. There is no minimum draw weight, maximum draw weight, or minimum arrow length requirements; fixed or mechanical broadheads may be used.

The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks (MDWFP) wants to remind all Wildlife Management Area (WMA) hunters that they are required to wear a full-body harness (fall-arrest system) while climbing a tree, installing a tree stand that uses climbing aids, or while hunting from a tree stand on a WMA. While required only on WMAs, and Pearl River Valley water supply district lands, the MDWFP urges

all hunters to wear and know how to properly use a full-body harness while hunting from an elevated position. Hunters should take time before the hunt to ensure that all safety equipment is working properly. Remember, the most important part of the hunt is making it home.

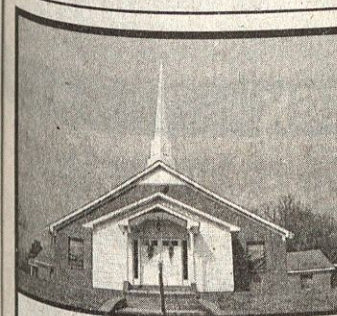
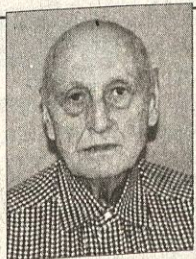
