Tishomingo County School District Receives \$70,000 Grant to Hire Law Officers

The Tishomingo County School District is set to receive a \$70,000 grant to help with the cost of paying for a certified law enforcement officer at public schools.

Fifty school districts throughout the state are getting funding through the Mississippi Community Oriented Policing Servicing Grant (MCOPS) Program proposed by Lt. Gov. Tate Reeves, which provides up to \$10,000 to pay for a certified law enforcement officer at a public school.

Tishomingo County will receive \$70,000, which will pay for \$10,000 in training and security equipment at each campus. Most districts are getting \$10,000, but with seven cam-

puses located throughout the county, the county pays for an officer at each of the seven locations, so they all need the training, explained Superintendent Benny McClung.

Some are police officers, as in Iuka, who work for the school on their off days, said McClung. The district adjusted its budget to pay for a full time law officer presence at the schools last year following the school shooting in Newtown, Connecticut.

Next week, Joel Robertson, from the TCSD administrative offices, will attend a meeting where officials will learn more about the limitations and requirements of the grant, said McClung.

Area Towns Offer Trunk-or-Treat for Halloween

Next Thursday will be the night for celebrating Halloween, and Iuka, Tishomingo and Burnsville will all offer Trunk-or-Treat events for trick-or-treating kids.

In Iuka, the Pilot Club again will present Trunk-or-Treat Downtown beginning at 6 p.m. There will be lots of organizations and individuals offering sweet treats for little ones from their cars along Front Street. There's a costume contest at 7 p.m.

Tishomingo Baptist Church will have it's Fall Festival and Trunk-or-Treat in Tishomingo the evening of October 31st. There will be inflatables, games, and fun for all ages, as well as a Trunk-or-Treat area.

"Last year we had more than 600 people come by our Fall Festival, and we are so glad to offer a place for the community to gather together in a safe environment," said Tishomingo Baptist Church Youth Minister Todd Cecil.

In Burnsville, the Town, Burnsville Fire Department and Burnsville Area Chamber will host Trunk-or-Treat Halloween night from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Waterway Boatramp. Costume contest time will be 7:15, and there's a contest for the best "trunk" or booth!

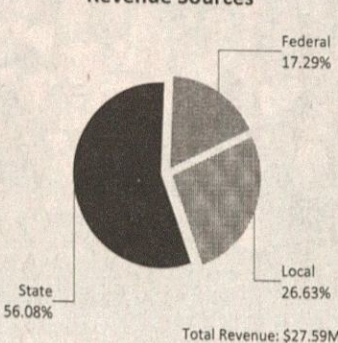

Old Courthouse Museum Receives Donation of Ancient Indian Pottery

The Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum recently received a donation of locally handmade ancient Indian pottery. The exhibit contains 75 pieces of various pieces of art, including bowls, Indian figures, animal figures, marbles, and arrowheads. These items and more are available for viewing in the Old Courthouse Museum.

The donor, Rick Holland, of Fulton, Mississippi, is a carpenter by trade who uses his hands to create bench pottery from the clay and stone dust he collects in his home county of Itawamba. Mr. Holland caught the pottery bug when diving into the history of local Native American tribes. Studying their art and the way they shaped their culture using only their hands inspired him, says Holland.

About eight months ago, Mr. Holland—a Civil

War buff—began to read about ancient Indian pottery. One book explained in detail how clay was used to repair stone bowls, and also how clay became the popular tool for making pottery. Mr. Holland started by replicating the pottery photographed in this history book. After experimenting for some time, he developed a knack for making all kinds of pottery. He goes on to say, "You have to have an idea of what you are going to do before you start working on it, and then you just shape it down. I get the clay ready and let it sit on my workbench until it speaks to me about what to make. Sometimes it lies on my bench a few days before it lets me know what to make out of it," explains Holland.

From the beginning of the history of Mississippi up through the latter part of the 17th century, the northeastern portion of Mississippi was an unknown territory to the white men. The only inhabitants were the Chickasaw Indians. This tribe was known to be the most highly civilized of any tribe of Native Americans in this



territory. They held the esteem and respect of neighboring tribes. Even in time of war, the Chickasaw leaders were often called into conference—known to the Indians as "pow-wows"—by leaders of the other tribes for advice and counsel. This very intelligent tribe lived simply and sanely. Chief Iuka and Chief Tishomingo were the leading members of their tribe. They were very close friends, and Tishomingo visited Iuka when they first discovered the mineral springs in Tishomingo County. The medicinal qualities of the water gave them new strength and vigor. Chief Itawamba was considered a wealthy chief. His daughter owned an inn at nearby Buzzard Roost. At 93 years of age, Chief Itawamba was on his way to Washington when he stopped there for a visit and died.

In the early part of

the 18th century, the white men began to explore and locate in this territory. The Chickasaws soon became great friends with the white settlers and taught them many customs and modes of living, as well as signs and superstitions common to all the Indian tribes. Indians and whites intermarried, and by the 1830s, there were few full-blooded Indians in this area. Nearly all of the counties north of Jackson, Mississippi, have Indian names.

Mr. Holland's spectacular handmade pieces of ancient Indian pottery are on display Tuesday-Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Mr. Holland will accept orders for replicas and will soon make his pottery available for sale in the Museum Gift Shop. His newest piece will be a replica of Chief Tishomingo.

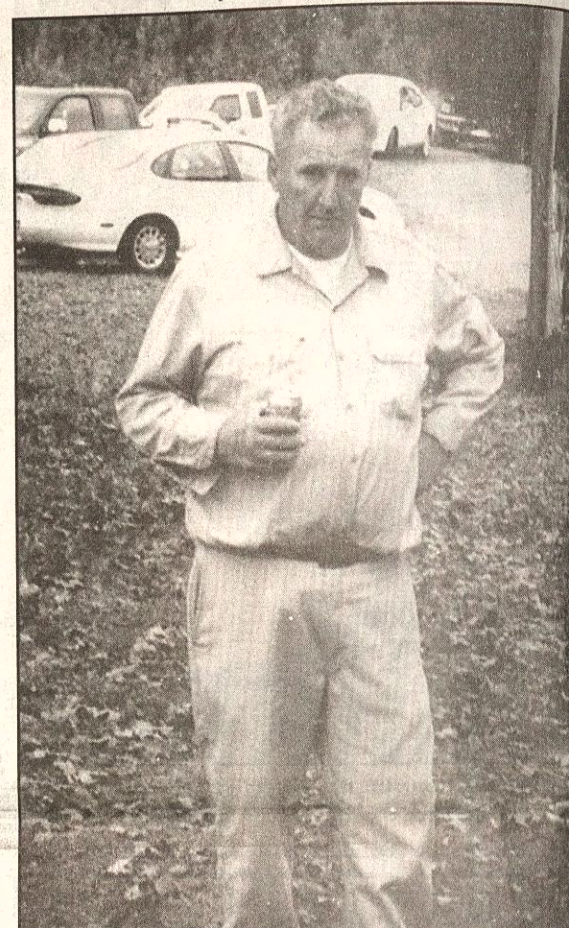

Historical Society Membership/ Donation Drive Is Underway

The Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS) annual membership and donation drive is now underway. The Society is seeking prospective members as well as donations to the general operating fund. The Society operates from the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum.

The Society was established in 1996 with a mission of promoting the collection and preservation of the history of Tishomingo County. Special emphasis is placed on artifacts and archival materials that relate to the life and accomplishments of Tishomingo County with em-

phasis on the period from 1870 to 1971. To assist in this endeavor, the Society established a genealogical research library and historical museum to collect, preserve, index, and provide access to the archival resources of Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

Although the genealogical library is not a lending library, the John Marshall Stone Research Library maintains a phenomenal collection of family histories, genealogical books, and books relating to the Battle of Iuka and Civil War era. Other items include an assortment of county records, school yearbooks, photographs, maps, CDs, and micro-

film. A microfilm reader/printer is also available. The Woodall Mountain Market Gift Shop carries historical booklets, CDs, and other research material, a variety of local souvenirs, and a nice selection of gift ideas.

The historic Tishomingo County courthouse, constructed in 1887, has served the county faithfully for over a hundred years. Standing proudly on the corner of East Quitman and Fulton Streets, in Iuka, it is fondly regarded by local citizens and remains a magnificent reminder of our heritage. The courthouse is a major element of the area's Heritage Tourism pro-

gram. Thousands of visitors have passed through its doors which reinforce everything the Society has accomplished . . . and will accomplish in the years ahead.

This remarkable building and its contents are a noteworthy reflection of the history of Tishomingo County, Mississippi. However, the costs to keep it operational are increasing every year. Your support will contribute to the upkeep of our historic courthouse as we work together to promote and preserve our County's history. Together, we will keep the Old Courthouse Museum stable, vital, and relevant in a changing world.
