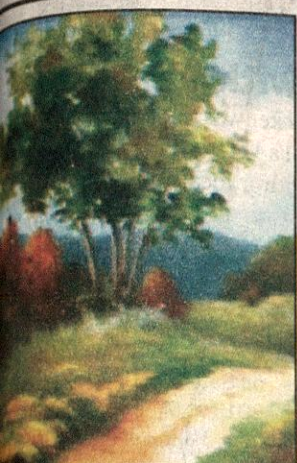

Malcolm White to Development Foundation: "Tourism is Big Business"

The turnout was noticeably greater than in recent years for Tuesday night's Tishomingo County Development Foundation's annual banquet, and one of the reasons was guest speaker Malcolm White, Tourism Director for the Mississippi Development Authority.

After awards were made for outstanding businesses and industries in the county, White spoke of Mississippi's many assets, and particularly of Tishomingo County and this part of the state, and what it has to offer the many tourists that come visit each year.

"Tourism is great," said White. "We can talk about ourselves, tell our story, and invite people to come see us, and make money doing it!"

He said that for every \$1 spent on promoting tourism, Mississippi gets back a \$4.46 return on that investment.

"One of our greatest assets is our Story - who we are, where we are from, and where we are going. Too many times in my life I've seen other people trying to tell Mississippi's story, and they inevitably get it wrong," explained White, who was raised in Booneville, one of three sons of former Northeast Mississippi Junior College president Harold T. White.

After Booneville, Malcolm White went on to co-found Jackson landmark restaurant Hal & Mal's with his recently-passed brother, Hal. Mal was

also founder of the Jackson St. Patrick's Day Parade and was director of the Mississippi Arts Commission prior to becoming Director of Tourism for MDA.

Earlier Tuesday, White sat down with county tourism officials to hear about recent successes like the Battle of Iuka commemorations, Heritage Day, and the Trash-to-Treasures yard sale.

He praised the recent events, saying that all tourism is not casinos, or big and flashy - millions are attracted to historical events and other "Americana," style attractions.

"People are looking for authentic experiences," said White. Tishomingo County can be a successful tourism destination with its geographically unique location and features.

"The successful community is one who tells its Story well," he said.

The banquet was hosted by the Christian Fellowship Retreat, who recently took over management of Crow's Neck Environment Education Center. The meal and the service was one of the finest ever for the TCDF annual event.

Industry of the year was awarded to International Converter.

Business of the year was awarded to Ace Hardware in Belmont.

Martha Biggs was recognized as Volunteer of the Year.

Jackie Bryant won the Bob Yarber Award for Leadership.

- 1984, and was chief of police for the city of Iuka from 1990 until his retirement in 2000. He then served a four year term on the Board of Aldermen for the City of Iuka. He was a member of Fifth Street Baptist Church, and enjoyed spending time with his family.

Services were held at 11 a.m. on Saturday, November 9th, 2013, at Fifth Street Baptist Church with Bro. Tony Curtis, Bro. William Burcham, and Bro. Haskel Sparks officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home of Iuka was in charge of the arrangements.

Sheriff's Department Makes Arrests in Drug, Arson Cases

Mary Elizabeth McKee, age 40, formerly of Iuka, was located and arrested in Chester County, Tennessee on November 7th. Mary McKee was wanted for charges of burglary of a dwelling and arson. For several months the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has been trying to locate McKee due to a grand jury indictment concerning the case. Investigators with the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department worked with the Corinth Police Department, McNairy County, Tennessee Sheriff's Department, Ches-

ter County, Tennessee Sheriff's Department and the United States Marshal's Fugitive Apprehension Unit in attempts to locate McKee. Several locations were checked in three counties along with locations in McNairy County and Chester County. McKee was located in a residence in Chester County and was extradited back to the Tishomingo County Jail. McKee remains in the Tishomingo County Jail.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department assisted the McNairy County TN Sher-

iff's Department in the arrest of Justin Justice, age 24, formerly of Tishomingo County, and Anthony Fuqua, age 34 of Iuka, for aggravated burglary and theft of property. Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Chief Investigator Logan Vaughn and Fire Investigator Jessie Jones initiated a traffic stop of a vehicle driven by Fuqua and recovered stolen items from the vehicle. Both subjects are currently in custody in the McNairy County Jail. The MDOC has placed a hold on both subjects.

Sonya Flanagan, age 27 of

Burnsville, was arrested for on a grand jury indictment for sale of a controlled substance.

Hudson Traveled Country in Music City Drum & Bugle Corps Last Summer

IUKA - If the band director and fellow band members at Tishomingo County High School have noticed a difference in Jon Hudson this year, Jon said it's because his summer experiences have helped him mature and grow.

From June 22 through Aug. 11, the 18-year-old senior toured with the Music City Drum and Bugle Corps, based in Franklin, Tenn. near Nashville.

"I started thinking about it year before last," Jon said. "I'd never done drum corps before, but I taught myself at home looking up videos on YouTube."

He wasn't successful being selected after his first audition in December 2011, but December 2012 told a different story.

The weekend of auditions with the Music City Drum and Bugle Corps required weapons training and practice, as well as practice with flag, sabre, rifle and dance routines.

"You either get a call-back for further audition or a contract, and I got a contract asking me to tour with them during the summer," Jon said. "I went back in March for another camp, then back again in May, when all the people who were going to be in the corps were there."

When his actual summer program began, the group spent the first two weeks at the base in Franklin.

"The routine included a 7 a.m. wake-up call, running and PT (physical training) first thing in the morning, then breakfast," he said.

Days were divided into different types of practice: a three-hour block before lunch, another four-hour block after lunch until dark, then the entire band would go back after dinner

to work on routines.

Their housing was a gym floor wherever they went to play, showering in the locker rooms, eating meals from the portable food truck, that went everywhere with them. And each corps member had specific duties to perform as part of the team beyond their performance duties.

"Every time we left a housing site we had to clean and do various house chores," Jon said. "Some had clean-up chores and others were the loading crew to put everything on the buses."

From La Crosse, Wisconsin to Minneapolis, Minnesota, Bentonville, Arkansas, Johnsonburg, Pennsylvania, and half a dozen cities across the United States, the routine was repeated in city after city - perform a show or competition, then free time.

"It was great learning I could be independent," Jon said. "When you go

you're pretty much on your own with nobody to do things for you. You have your responsibilities with others. I could push myself as far as I needed to, and I feel like I can do anything."

Jon is eagerly embracing his next challenge: performing with a college level Independent Indoor Color Guard, while also continuing his participation with the TCHS marching band, where he plays baritone and performs a small rifle feature, and the show choir.

His performances with the Independent Indoor Color Guard will include eight to 10 shows on Saturdays January to March.

"Music has been a big part of my life and I've been in marching band since sixth grade, plus theater," he said. "I'm musically inclined and I like teaching, so in the future I think I want to teach music."

Jon is the son of Larry and Gail Hudson, and he started singing with his mom when he was a little boy. He expects to attend Northeast Mississippi Community College, but hasn't decided where he wants to go from there to complete his bachelor's degree.

The summer, he said, really brought him a long way in maturity, something that will benefit his entire future.

"Most of it was a lot of work, but at the same time it was really fun because doing something I really, really love," he said. "It really went by so fast. Being with the whole corps for almost two months you really get to know them. It's like having a second family. I got so close to people in such a little time, I didn't know I could grow to care for people so quickly. It's really different from anything I've ever experienced."

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "MDA") for the purpose of purchasing land and infrastructure upgrade and thereby promoting commerce and economic growth. Thereupon Supervisor GREG COLLIER offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE A LOAN ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FROM THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,500,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING LAND AND INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADE TO PROMOTE COMMERCE, LOCAL JOB CREATION AND ECONOMIC GROWTH.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the

"Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find, determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan Program, pursuant to Section 57-93-1, et seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, (the "Act"), the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to existing industries, county or municipal authorities for the purpose of economic development.

2. The County will agree to purchase this land and infrastructure upgrade and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the purchase (the "Project").

3. Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for the development of the Project in the amount of three million five hundred thousand dollars (\$3,500,000) (the "Loan").

4. The County will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County agrees to borrow the proceeds of the Loan subject to and upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

5. In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act.

6. The Loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed three million five hundred thousand dollars (\$3,500,000) for the purpose of purchasing land and infrastructure upgrade thereby promoting commerce, local job creation and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi, at 10:00 a.m. on the 2nd day of December, 2013, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the

question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such election shall be called and held as provided by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for at least four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to December 2, 2013, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date, said Resolution to be published on November 7, 14, 21, and 27, 2013.

Section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of said publication of this Resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 3 hereof.

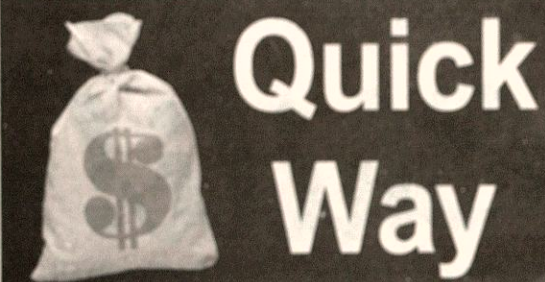

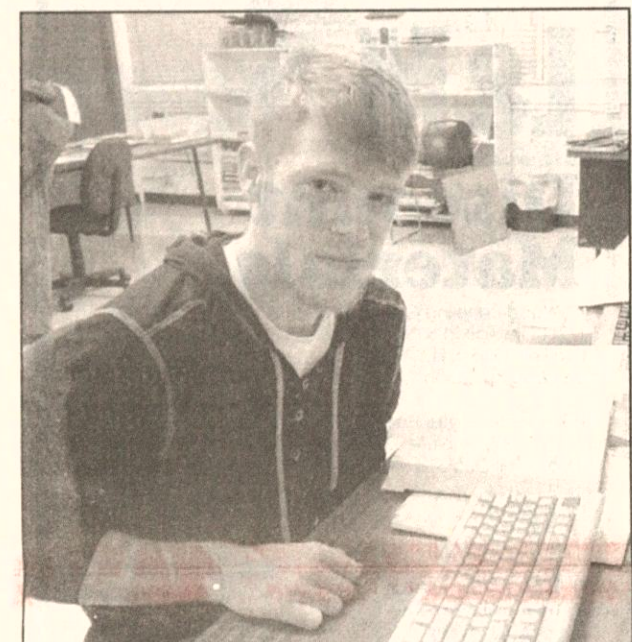

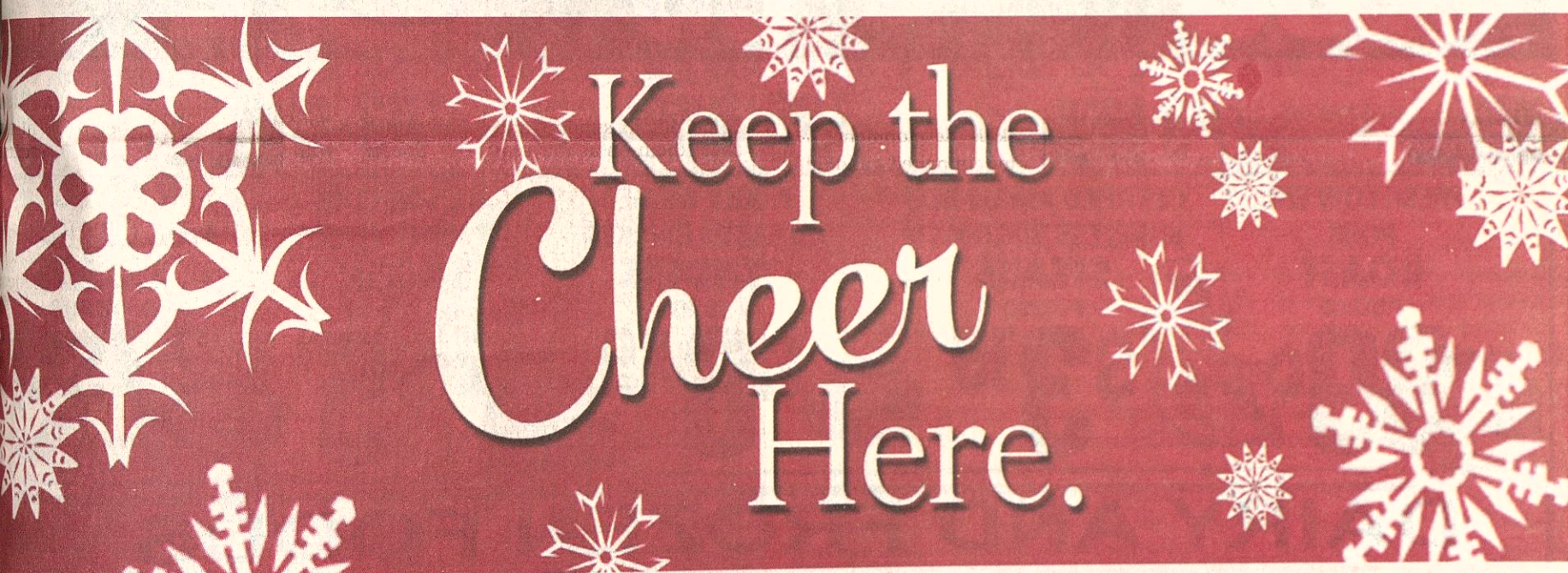
