Student Charged with Possession of Firearm on School Property

A high school student was apprehended last Thursday afternoon allegedly carrying a gun onto school property.

It is the second time this semester that a student has been caught with a firearm on Tishomingo County school property, and the two incidents are not thought to be related.

Though the school district prohibited from releasing any details, reports indicate that the student, who was enrolled at Belmont, got a .22 pistol from a toolbox in his home, and rode the bus from his Paden area home to Tishomingo Middle School, and on to Tishomingo County High School. Normally,

he would have ridden the bus on to Belmont, according to current school procedure.

It is unclear whether or not the student entered the TCHS buildings, but according to authorities, the student walked to Burnsville from TCHS, where he was picked up by a family member near the home of the boy who was his alleged victim.

According to reports from the potential victim's mother, the suspect's mother had been looking for him since finding the gun missing, and called to advise parents of the student with whom he had a quarrel over a girl. A couple months ago there had been some interaction regarding the two boys liking

the same girl, and the allegedly intended victim of Thursday's action had blocked the suspect's phone, said family members. Both the targeted student and the girl were home from school that morning, said family members.

After the suspect was taken home from Burnsville by his family, the Sheriff's Department heard the report of the gun on school property, and the suspect was taken into custody at his home, and transported to the juvenile detention center in Corinth, said authorities. He has

Crime Series Coming to Iuka to Investigate 1999 Byrom Murder-for-Hire Case

A family-focused crime series is coming to Iuka this week, seeking to shed light on the 1999 case of Michelle Byrom, who hired someone to kill her husband, Edward.

"Blood Relatives" from the Investigation Discovery Network series focuses on murders within families. The Byrom episode is due to air in the spring of 2014.

The Tishomingo County News was notified weeks ago by the network, to share information about the investigation, and the surrounding circumstances, and they have plans to speak with other key players in the 1999 case, like investigators.

Byrom's conviction has been in the appeal process since 2001. The 57-year-old Byrom

contends she was abused and deserves a new trial because her original lawyer failed to present what could have been mitigating evidence of sexual abuse by her husband, along with childhood abuse.

Judge Thomas Gardner sentenced her to death, and she is one of two women in Mississippi's 50 death row inmates. Her appeal has been rejected by lower courts, and is currently before the U.S. Supreme Court.

Investigation Discovery or "ID" describes itself as America's leading investigation network and the fastest growing network in television. It says it looks for fact-based investigative content about culture, history and human condition.

Tishomingo County Earns Another Top 10 Rating for Reshored Industry

Tishomingo County has made another TOP TEN listing in Southern Business & Development, a journal that tracks economic development projects and the recognized authority on economic development in the southern United States.

Tishomingo County is identified as one of the "Top Ten Outstanding Small Town Markets in the South for Reshored Industry."

"Reshored" industries are those who previously operated off-shore, like in China, but who have relocated locations here in the states and found them more economical to operate. Recent reshored industries in Tishomingo County include KX Technologies and Comfort Revolution which together employ 272.

The top ten list includes Rocky Mount, North Carolina; Aiken, South Carolina; Rowan County, North Carolina; Martinsville, Virginia; Cullman, Alabama; Danville, Kentucky; Jackson, Tennessee; Elizabethtown, Kentucky; Tri-Cities, Tennessee; and Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Tishomingo County is the

smallest county in population on the top ten list.

This latest recognition follows the 2012 rating of Tishomingo County as one of the "Top Ten Communities in the South for Manufacturing" and the 2009 announcement as "the hottest market in the southeast USA for communities below 22,000 population." The county also won the 2012 National Association of Development Organizations Innovation Award for the Dennen Steel project and the same award in 2013 for the Comfort Revolution project. In 2011, Belmont won runner up position in Bloomberg Business Week as "one of America's best, most affordable places to raise children."

"The national and regional recognition is good for Tishomingo County," said Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors President Nicky McRae. "It highlights our success and is good free advertising. We work hard to meet the needs of busi-

been charged with possession of a firearm on school property, and will be further investigated and dealt with through the Tishomingo County Youth Court system.

"We urge parents to

communicate with their children, and to know what issues they are dealing with, and help them to deal with problems in a healthier way than this," said Youth Court Judge Joey Cobb.

The Tishomingo County School District stated in a release that the issue was thoroughly investigated and it was quickly determined no one was in any immediate danger. The issue will now be handled through appropriate student and legal discipline measures.

The dog that was shot in the back was lucky, the young dog that was with him never was seen again.

Just about a mile east of where all the other were killed or 'disappeared', an elderly lady lives by herself, except her dogs. Her Lab was not home one morning after looking and calling all day. She finally gave up. This Lab dog

was her favorite, also her friend and companion.

Not much has been said about the three dogs. I had two young dogs that disappeared in the Crossroad community.

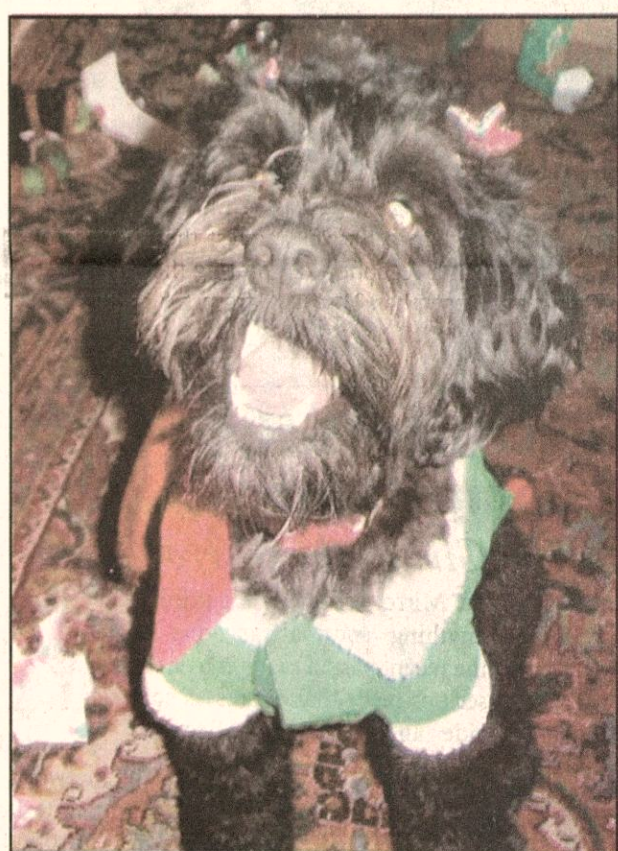
It seems the total now stands two known dead, one wounded, six disappeared. That's a pretty good record for a dog hater, who it seems shoots on sight.

The dog and cat protection law was signed into law by Gov. Haley Barbour, May 1st, 2011.

This includes cruelty to all animals, which carries a penalty of up to \$1,000 fine plus up to six months in jail.

A more serious case up to \$2,500 fine, and jail time up to 6 months for first offense. Even a more serious case of torture or the like, could be up to \$5,000 and up to five years in prison for each. All dog lovers should check out MS Dog and Cat Protection Act. It is for sure: the case described above will be prosecuted to the fullest of the law, if caught and arrested.

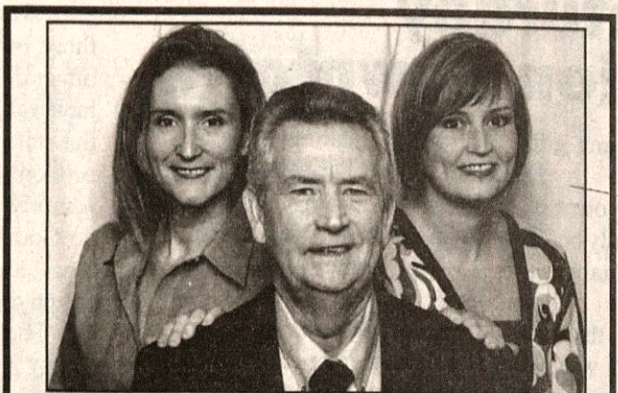

Whitehurst's paintings strongly emphasize the tactile and interactive by incorporating things such as old buttons, clothing patterns, doilies and pages from novels. She uses acrylic paint and plenty of gel medium to create the beautiful works of art.

"I make art to process the past, to more fully live in the present and to create what's next," said Whitehurst, who is also a professional counselor. "I start with something that resonates with me."

Around 20 works of art make up the "Mississippi Mandala" exhibition. Prints and notecards featuring Whitehurst's art are available for purchase in the museum gift shop.

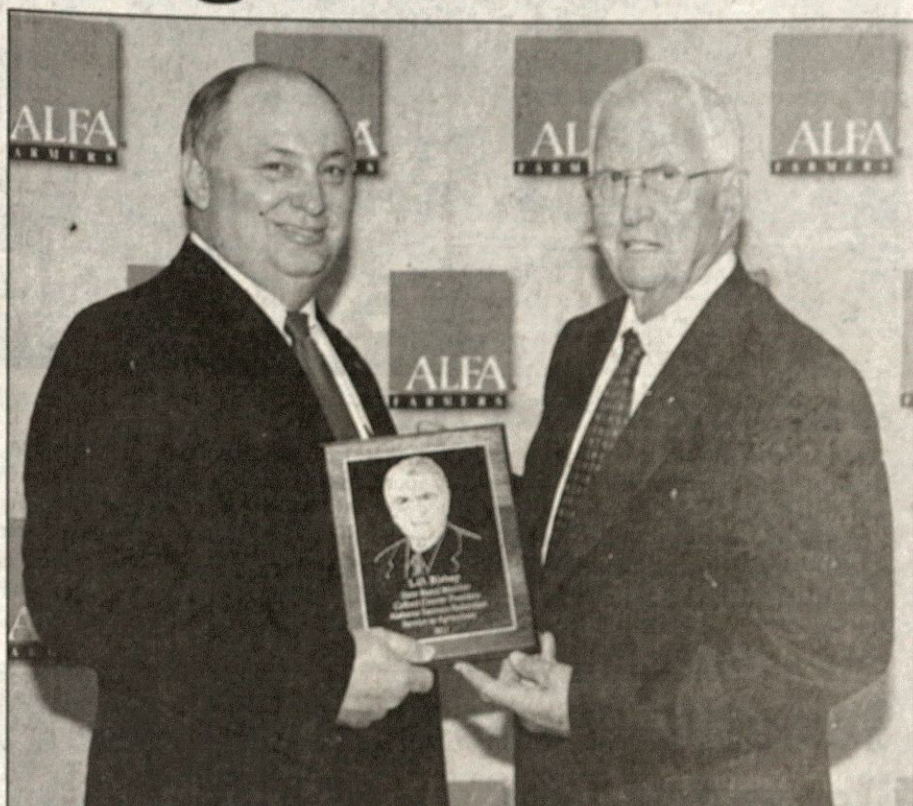
