
Four people are being held arrested for possession of two or more pre-cursors with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine, and conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine. Crosby was also arrested for four counts of child endangerment. The Department of Human Services took custody of four children from the residence.

As a result of the arrest, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department also arrested Brenda Harris, 37, of Iuka, and Chris Wilcox, 38, of Iuka, for conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine. Harris and Wilcox remain in custody since they were already serving probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections at the time of the arrest.

Other recent arrests reported by the department include:

Sam Parker, 20, of Iuka, was arrested for two counts of sale of marijuana and Possession of Marijuana with intent to distribute.

Brently Spaulding, 24, of Iuka, was arrested for two counts of conspiracy to distribute marijuana.

Christmas Cat is Pet of the Week

CONGRATULATIONS to Marley Hamm!! This handsome fellow is our Pet of the Week at luka Animal Clinic. This is what his owner Marjorie Hamm has to say about him "Here's the story of Marley. Marley was my Christmas gift seventeen years ago, Christmas 1996. His birthday is July 25 and he was six months old when he came to live with me. He was given to me by one of my students who thought I would be so lonely without a cat after my 'outside' cat was a casualty of the heavy, fast traffic by my house. The student noticed that although it was December. I had contracted poison oak while burying the casualty feline. Upon her inquiry of how that had happened, she told me her family had six cats! I told her how proud I was that she had that many feline animals. When she told me that I needed a cat to replace the loneliness of the 'outside' cat, I assured her that I was quite okay without one! Every day for several days she would say. 'You need a cat,' to which my reply was always the same-I think I can live without one. However, upon her insistence, I asked her what kind of cats she had. She said one black, with a tip of white on her tail and tips of white on her paws. Then the other one she selected for 'review' was solid white. With every conversation. I thought she just wanted to have one less animal to care for and love. To help her get past her concern for my being 'catless,' I told her to

bring the white one to school when she came for exams on the last Friday before Christmas break. I took a pet carrier with me that day, just in case I changed my mind and took him. I took one look at that gorgeous white, silky fur ball and home with me he came! I later learned that the student and her family didn't give animals away. Thus, I was being judgmental in thinking she only wanted to reduce her inventory. What a difference that has made in my life!

I had stated all my adult life that I would never have an animal in the house! (Point to consider: never say never!) The weather was very cold that December of 1996 and I knew that I needed to keep him inside. Secondly, I thought he needed to stav inside until he learned where home was. Well, I suppose according to my premise he would be a slow learner because here it is seventeen years later and he still follows the same routine! Congealing those two ideas of his need for warmth and safety, from day one Marley was secured at night in the hall bathroom and learned the nighttime routine of going to his room when I started to bed.

The student was right! I did need a cat to fill an empty spot. He has been such a wonderful companion and is so helpful by coming to the door to greet me after I have been gone for several hours. When I travel for extended lengths of time, he becomes upset with my

At three of the four most recent conferences, an industrial technology major has won the challenge competition, a "Jeopardy!"-like quiz bowl, said ATMAE faculty-sponsor Mickey Giordano. In 2011, MSU took second place. For five of the past seven years, MSU's robotics team placed at the tournament, Giordano added. The instructor of instructional systems and workforce development said students' strong commitment to problem-solving and critical thinking is the primary contributor to their continued success at the ATMAE conference. "Our students do all the work on the robot themselves," he said. "They came up with the ideas

and the design, and they built it. Doing it all themselves gives them more of a sense of pride because it's all their own work." Students on the ATMAE robotics team and those in the quiz competition do not receive academic credit; they volunteer outside of class, Giordano said. They worked in MSU's Industrial Education Building metal shop, and one or more faculty members--Giordano, fellow instructor Jerry Mize or associate professor John Wyatt-stayed questions. answer "Our students deserve the pat on the back because they're the ones who come here and do all the work," Giordano said. "They volunteered their time and effort to get it

done and raised around 80 percent of the money to pay for their trip." Office of the Dean in MSU's College of Education also provided funding to cover the students' conference expenses. That support is especially critical because the ATMAE conference offers extensive networking opportunities for students, Giordano said. In addition to learning about graduate-degree grams at other colleges and universities, MSU team members can meet with industry representatives promoting job opportunities. "Attending this conference pays off in the end," Giordano said

> Voter ID will be in effect beginning with the June 3, 2014 Primary Election. Any voter casting a ballot at the polls on June 3rd or by absentee ballot in person at the Circuit Clerk's Office prior to the June 3rd Primary Election will be required to show an acceptable form of photo

"We are committed to ensuring everyone who is qualified to vote has the opportunity to cast a ballot, and we need your help," says Secretary of State Delbert Hosemann. "With the holiday season around us, many of you will be out volunteering in your communities. If you know of anyone who lacks an acceptable form of photo ID, we ask you to contact our Office so we can provide a free photo ID in advance of the June 3rd Primary."

If a voter does not have any documentation proving their identity, Circuit Clerks may verify their birth record FREE of charge. If they need transportation to a Circuit Clerk's office, the Secretary of State's Office will facilitate transportation FREE of charge.

Only voters who do not have an acceptable form of photo ID will receive a FREE Mississippi Voter Identification Card. Circuit Clerks will begin issuing Mississippi Voter ID cards in January 2014.

Individuals who already have an acceptable form of photo ID are not eligible for a Mississippi Voter ID card. The Mississippi Voter ID Card will prominently show the photo, name, address, and county of the voter. The card prominently states it is to be used "For Voting Purposes Only" and will contain several security fea-

Jackson, Miss.- tures. The card will not contain the voter's date of birth.

"We wanted to make the photo and the name of the voter the prominent features, but we did not want the card to resemble a driver's license. The card does contain security features to inhibit unauthorized duplication," says Secretary Hosemann.

"We are dedicated to ensuring anyone who does not have an acceptable ID receives one at no cost," adds Secretary Hosemann. "We will travel across the State implementing a massive voter outreach campaign to inform the public of the requirement. We have met with political parties in the State and many other organizations and interest groups, asking for their assistance with implementation. Over 62% of Mississippians approved a constitutional voter ID requirement. With your help, we look forward to assisting our local election officials with implementation."
