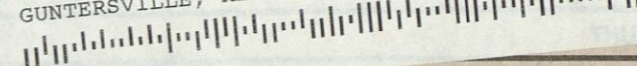

Mississippi Silicon Creating 200 Jobs in Tishomingo County

The long awaited announcement of the "industry coming to Burnsville" was made last week, when Gov. Phil Bryant and officials announced that Mississippi Silicon will locate a new silicon metal production facility in the Waterway Industrial Park in Burnsville. Mississippi Silicon is investing \$200 million in the project, which will create 200 jobs.

According to the release, the new Mississippi-based facility will produce silicon metal for a broad range of industries in the United States including the aluminum, automotive and chemical industries. Mississippi Silicon's high-tech facility is expected to be one of the most efficient and cost-competitive silicon metal production facilities in the world.

Ground breaking is scheduled for next week, and construction time is estimated to be 18-20 months.

Mississippi Silicon is a strategic partnership between Rima Holdings USA, Inc., and domestic investor group Clean Tech I, LLC.

"I congratulate the team at Mississippi Silicon for becoming the state's newest corporate partner and for choosing Tishomingo County," said Gov. Phil Bryant. "Mississippi is strongly positioned for growth in advanced manufacturing, and I am pleased to see another company placing its faith in our world-class workforce."

"Rima is proud to be joining forces with a high-profile group of investors, and we look forward to supporting our global network of silicon metal customers and especially our United States-based customers with this new facility," said Rima Industrial CEO and President Ricardo Vicentin.

"Rima considered many locations around the world for the new facility, and we greatly appreciate the support and enthusiasm shown by the citizens and government leaders in Mississippi."

"The tremendous support at the local and state levels was a key factor in the decision to locate our operations in Tishomingo County," said Mississippi Silicon Chairman of the Board John Correnti. "Mississippi Silicon looks forward to becoming an engine of economic growth in northeast Mississippi."

In support of the project, the Mississippi Development Authority provided assistance through the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving Fund for building construction and workforce training, as well as the state's New Market Tax Credits. Tishomingo County and Tennessee Valley Authority provided assistance for the project, as well.

"This is an exciting way to enter into the New Year as Mississippi Silicon announces it is locating manufacturing operations in northeast Mississippi and creating these jobs," said MDA Executive Director Brent Christensen. "We appreciate our partners in Tishomingo County and at TVA who worked with us to make this project a reality, and we wish Mississippi Silicon many years of success in our state."

Rima Holdings USA, Inc. is owned by the Vicentin family, who also owns Rima Industrial S/A in Brazil, which currently employs more than four thousand associates in diecasting, magnesium, silicon metal, and ferroalloys.

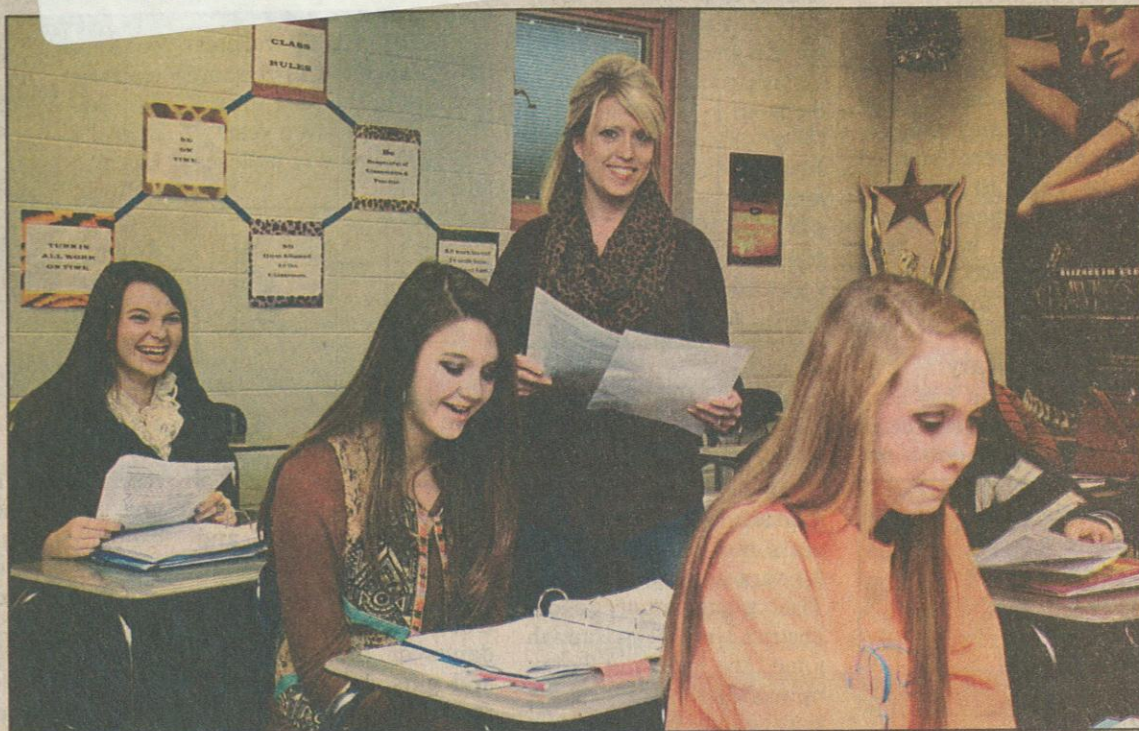

Howie Recognized as District's 2013-14 Teacher of the Year

Cindy Witt Howie was chosen as the Teacher of the Year for Tishomingo County High School and is also the District's Teacher of the Year.

Cindy graduated from Belmont in 1988, and attended Northeast Mississippi Community College where she was a member of Campus Country. She earned her English education degree from Mississippi State University.

Mrs. Howie's student teaching landed her in Ackerman where she taught English, and coached junior high basketball, and high school basketball, and softball. After a year at Ackerman, she got married and moved back home to Tishomingo County. She worked one year at Iuka Elementary and then moved across town to Iuka Middle School where she taught reading, English, career discovery, and coached girls' basketball.

Mrs. Howie is now in her fifth

year at Tishomingo County High School where she teaches English and drama. Along with her co-director Sara Savoy White, she has transformed the drama department with ambitious dramatic productions like *The Outsiders* and *Steel Magnolias*, and musical extravaganzas like *The Lady Pirates of Captain Bree*, *Grease*, and *Little Shop of Horrors*. This year, in the first semester, the drama team has tackled not only the cutting edge drama of *The Girl in the Mirror*, but also produced a hilarious comedy production, *Check, Please!*, which allowed many students of all levels of talent to shine in short sketches.

Additionally, the students took their drama production of *The Girl in the Mirror* to regional state competition where they received outstanding reviews, and have advanced to the next level of competition.

Another important achievement is the number of students

who try out for drama classes, last year 65 tried out for drama, and 43 students are currently enrolled. She demands total commitment to the drama productions, but has still fostered an environment that includes more than students with dreams of being theater majors or having a singing career – whom it's easy to imagine participating in school plays. Many athletes, apparently used to performing under fierce coaching, have been a major contribution to this year's productions – and not just backstage. The lead male roles in the competition piece alone include a soccer player and a starting lineman from the football team.

Mrs. Howie has been married to Brad Howie for almost 20 years, and she is the mother of Colten, 15, and Calli, 13. Mrs. Howie still loves going to work everyday, and her students are a big part of her life.

Record Cold Hits Region Hard

North Mississippi experienced record-setting, single-digit cold temperatures early this week, and the repercussions include frozen pipes, house fires from space heaters, and more that won't even be known until temperatures get above freezing after Wednesday.

Numerous households reported frozen pipes, that burst and caused flooding and other damage. One nursing home in the area had to move residents due to flooding from broken pipes, and International Converter plant in Iuka had part of a fire sprinkler system freeze up, but there was no damage.

There have been at least two house fires that likely resulted from the use of space heaters to fight the cold. Fire officials urge people to use extreme caution when using space heaters of any kind.

Avoiding Emergencies

- Check on neighbors, especially elderly ones.
- Maintain 3 feet of clear space on all sides of any space heater. No extension cords; plug directly into approved wall outlets. Do not run them when away from home.
- Insulate exposed pipes and open cabinets, etc. to allow room temperature air to circulate. Turn on your faucet a little. Keep it dripping through the night or during extended cold weather.
- Unhook your hose in the yard.
- Turn off the main water shutoff valve. In the event of a prolonged power outage, or in unoccupied homes or facilities, turn off the main shutoff valve which controls water coming into the house. Shut that off and then open all of the faucets and let all the water run through. Then there's no water in the pipes for freezing. If a pipe has burst, the first thing to do is to automatically go to the shut off valve. That should stop the water from doing any more damage.
- Drain water heater during extended power outages to avoid damage.
- Pipes already frozen? Seek help. If homeowners have power but suspect their pipes are frozen, authorities recommend not tampering with them and calling a plumber.
- How do you know your pipes are frozen? The water's not going to come on. Lower water pressure could also be a sign.

Page Midway through Stellar Senior Season at Blue Mountain

Booneville, Miss. — All Country basketball players have enjoyed watching Anna Brooke Page display her talents throughout a stellar eight-year period in the area.

The former Northeast Mississippi Community College standout is once again compiling an amazing season in one last tour of the court as a senior at Blue Mountain College.

Page is fifth among members of the Southern Athletic Conference (SAC) in points per game with 15.3. She scored in double digits in nine of 10 outings during the semester and poured in a year-best 24 against Southern Wesleyan (S.C.) University.

She is also among the top statistical players in the league in field goal percentage (.440) and blocks per contest (0.6) while leading the Lady Toppers to a 4-6 start to their campaign.

Page received the opportunity to compete against her one-time rival when Blue Mountain opened the season in an exhibition contest at Northeast on October 22. "I was kind of nervous coming in because it feels like a second home," Page said of her return to Booneville and the Arnold Coliseum. "I always like coming back here and playing."

The Tishomingo native got a strong start to a well-decorated collegiate career in two years as a Lady Tiger under the direction of coaches Ricky Ward and Brian Alexander. She helped carry the team to two straight Mississippi Association Community and Junior Colleges (MACJC) State Tournaments in both years' final season at the helm of the program and the inaugural campaign of Alexander.

As a sophomore in 2011-12, Page was named to both the MACJC All-State and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) All-Region 23 teams with an impressive 18.5 points and 6.4 rebounds per game.

A participant in the 2012 MACJC All-Star Game, she was the top scorer in the North Division and one of the top 30 point producers among NJCAA schools.

Just as important to Alexander was the way Page became a positive influence to her teammates and all she came in contact with.

"Anna Brooke made a huge impact for us during my first year," said the Lady Tigers headman. "She already had the intangibles of leadership and that carried into our season."

Page benefited from the experience of Alexander, a near 20-year coaching veteran, during her final campaign at Northeast to bolster her post presence and increase her averages in both points and boards.

Alexander "really helped push all of our team to be better than we thought we could be," said Page. "He really expected a lot of us and I appreciate that because it made me a better player."

Upon her arrival at Blue Mountain, Page picked up right where she left off and was named the TranSouth Athletic Conference Newcomer of the Year after finishing second in the NAIA with a .632 field-goal percentage.

She was also thirteenth in the nation in points each outing (18.2) and eighteenth in total scoring (528). Page was a two-time TranSouth Player of the Week honoree as well during her junior season.

"She just has a way of scoring and creating situations for us," said Lady Toppers head coach Lavon Driskell. "We just feel blessed that she came to us and she has not disappointed us in any way in the least."

Driskell saw Page develop and hone her skill set while at Northeast and knew she could be a high-caliber star at Blue Mountain.

"Her post moves, she is very deceptive as to what she is going to do when she gets the ball," he said. "She just has a way of getting around people and getting the ball in the basket."

Success has followed Page throughout her days in the gymnasium. At Belmont High School, she was named the Northeast Mississippi Daily Journal's Player of the Year in 2010 after winning the Mississippi High School Activities Association (MHSAA) Class 3A championship.

Page was the Cellular South Scholar Athlete for the title matchup and was named to the Class 3A All-State team. She was a four-time All-North Half and All-Division selection and tallied 20.9 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.1 steals per contest as a senior.

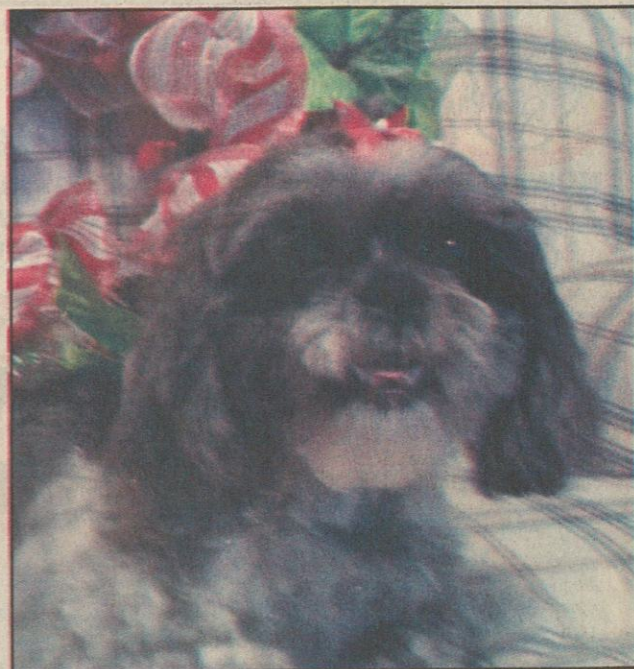
No matter the recognition, Page gives the credit to those that have aided her along her hoops journey.

Alexander sees nothing but good things for Page both on the basketball floor and in all of her future endeavors.

"Anna Brooke is one of the best all-around players I have ever worked with," Alexander said, "and she is an awesome young lady that you would want your son to marry."
