Still in Limbo About \$18,617 **Power Bill**

Tuesday night, the board of the nomingo County Electric Power Asation put off any decision on the recase in which a Tishomingo business served an \$18,617 bill to make up for er-billing caused by the Association's ering system.

The recent case of a Tishomingo ness receiving a seemingly outlandpower bill has many wondering if the e thing could happen to them.

In early December, Pattie Ferguson opened her Tishomingo County Electric Power Association bill for Pattie's One Stop and found she owed \$18,617. She thought it was a misprint, and when another bill for the more customary amount of \$837 arrived, she paid it. Shortly after, she got a personal visit from TCEPA Executive Director Robert Grisham saying that the bill was correct, and that the meter the power company installed had not been correctly reporting her usage data

for the past approximately two and a half years - she had, in essence, only been paying for half her actual power usage.

Tuesday night, at the regularly scheduled TCEPA Board of Directors Meeting, Gerald Barnes, acting as chairman in the absence of chairman Jimmy Marlin, who was unable to attend due to illness, said that Marlin and he had discussed it, and decided to table any vote or decision on the Pattie's One Stop bill issue until all members could be present. Board Attorney Steve Jackson was also not in attendance, due to a previous appointment, and they wanted to wait until he was able to attend, as well, Barnes said.

Members of the board still discussed the issue, because it was reported in the Tupelo paper that the power company had suggested a \$450 every two weeks

payment plan to business owner Ferguson, in addition to her regular bill, which is about \$700-800.

Several board members said they recalled discussing a payment plan of \$100 or \$125 a month, and wondered where the information came from.

After the meeting, it was confirmed that Grisham had sent Ferguson a proposal dated January 10th, offering \$150 be added to her monthly bill until the underbilled amount was paid, or the \$450 every two weeks, neither option of which Ferguson has agreed to do without some answers.

Board members asked where the minutes were to the December meeting,

luka, Miss. Closing Exercises of the luka Female Institute

IUKA, June 27, 1875—It was my good fortune to witness the closing exercises of the above far-famed institution. The concert came off Tuesday night, 15th instant. The house was crowded to its utmost capacity with a large and appreciative audience, who was held spellbound for the hours. Mrs. Steger, formerly Mrs. Tepe of your city, was the principal of this department, and more than sustained her high reputation on the occasion. We had solos, duets, trios, and quartettes of the most elevated and soul-thrilling character. The pieces were admirably selected; the time was perfect, and all performed with an ease and grace which showed that they had a teacher of the highest order of musical talent. The mu by Miss Shanda, of Senasic, which poured forth from the piano and organ in unison, was the most

Wednesday, the 16th, was commencement day, and seldom have I looked upon a class of graduates who presented so fine an appearance. Beauty and intellect, culture and refinement, beamed in every countenance. The first exercise was the presentation of certificates to the graduates and others for excellency in mathematics, by Miss Hunt, the teacher in this department, who delivered a short and eloquent address. This superior teacher, I learn, has had charge of this department and others for nine sessions in this school, and no male professor could fill her place with more acceptability to her numerous patrons. After the presentation of the certificates, the young ladies delivered their essays-some by speaking, others by reading. The first was a salutatory in Latin, tobia, which she spoke in a style so eloquent that it would almost have won

himself. Miss Durrett, of Panola, followed with an English salutatory which did honor to the head and heart of the fair young lady. Miss Wadley, of Iuka, read a most beautiful essay in French. Four others, Misses Barbee of Shelby, Ellis and Johnson of Iuka, and Foster of Memphis, read essays which would do honor to the more experienced. The valedictory was delivered by Miss Stelle, of Iuka, formerly of DeSoto, in a manner so pathetic, and the matter was so soul-stirring, that nearly all present were bathed in tears. After the graduates had delivered their essays, T. A. Blair, Esq., of Jackson, Tenn., was introduced by the president of the school (Dr. Douglass) to the audience as the orator of the day. When I saw a young man arise to follow all that I had heard, and learned from his exordium that he had only a week's notice, I feared he would fail; but he soon relieved heavenly I ever heard. the applause of Cicero me from these groundless

apprehensions. Never did peal (Memphis, Tenn.), June 29, 1875.

I see any speaker more perfectly at home. His speech was replete with intellect, wit, humor and good sense; gems sparkled in almost every sentence, and the frequent applause from the large and intelligent audience showed how highly this young orator, who once lived among them, was still appreciated by them. I predict for Mr. Blair a most brilliant future. The presentation of diplomas and gold medals to the graduates, which was done by the president in his usual felicitous style, closed the exercises of the occasion. Long will this school live in the hearts of its friends and patrons. The cartoon character would have you believe that coyotes are found only in the desert and chase only longlegged birds when in fact, the coyote (Canis latrans) is a species of canine found in all parts of the United States, except for Hawaii. Unlike the wolf, the coyote's range has expanded along with human civilization, and coyotes readily reproduce in metropolitan areas.

Coyotes have grayishbrown to yellowish-brown fur on top and whitish, or buff, fur on their under parts. The forelegs, sides of the head, muzzle and paws are reddishbrown. With large, triangular ears and a long, narrow muzzle, the coyote has a black nose, yellow eyes and a long, bushy tail. In fact, the tail can help to distinguish between coyotes, wolves and dogs. When running, the coyote keeps its tail down; dogs keep their tails up; and wolves run with their tails straight out.

From the muzzle to the tip of the tail, full-grown coyotes typically measure just over 4 feet. Coyotes stand a little over 2 feet and weigh anywhere between 15 and 50 pounds. However, some coyotes have been recorded weighing nearly 75 pounds and measuring over 5 feet in total length.

Coyotes are known for their agility. Reaching speeds up to 45 miles per hour and jumping distances of over 13 feet, coyotes have been observed to travel in large groups, though they primarrelated adults, yearlings and young. Coyote groups are often called bands, packs and

The coyote is active at night. Coyotes primarily eat small mammals, such as rabbits, voles, squirrels, prairie dogs and mice though they will also eat birds, snakes, lizards, deer and livestock, as

well as large insects and other large invertebrates. In the fall and winter months, fruits and vegetables are a significant part of the coyote's diet. Part of the coyote's success as a species is its dietary adaptability. With this, coyotes have been known to eat human garbage and domestic

Female coyotes are monestrous (in "heat" once per year), between late January and late March. The gestation period lasts from 60 to 63 days. Litter sizes range anywhere from 1 to 19 pups. Sexual maturity is reached by 12 months.

The coyote is a very vocal animal. The calls a coyote makes are high-pitched and variously described as howls, yips, yelps, barks, whines and growls. The federal government routinely shoots, poisons, traps and kills around 90,000 coyotes each year to protect livestock. Coyotes are often attracted to dog food and small animals. Items like garbage, pet food and even feeding stations for birds and squirrels will attract coyotes into backyards.


