20 Years **Ago County** Experienced The Ice Storm

Twenty years ago February 10th, Tishomingo County residents woke to what sounded like gunshots in their yards.

Storm of 1994. It was a treeshattering, electric line-snapping ice storm that paralyzed much of north Mississippi and the surrounding region for as much as several weeks. At the height of the impact, as many as 750,000 people were without electricity and drinkable water.

Damage estimates in the region were near \$1 billion, like a hurricane - but it was cold the whole time that power lines were down. Timber forests and landscape trees suffered equally - whole trees fell over with the weight of the ice on their limbs - crushing structures, vehicles and power lines unlucky enough to be under them. And that was after many of their branches snapped off and fell to the ground creating a deadly obstacle course for anyone outside.

News reports from 1994 said that the supervisors reported that Tishomingo County spent \$300,000 on just brush removal.

The February 24, 1994 edition quoted Tishomingo County Electric Power Association Executive Director Robert Grisham estimating that "almost all power within the county should be restored by the weekend" - fifteen days after the initial storm. People at the end of service lines were without power even longer.

Governor Kirk Fordice declared the affected region a disaster area February 10th, and

President Bill Clinton declared a federal disaster ten days later, February 20th, at the urging of Senator Trent Lott.

If you lived through it, you It was the now infamous Ice will always remember those days that forced a lot of us back to pioneer times - heating homes with wood fires and wood stoves, heating water for a sponge bath each morning, cooking on a grill or wood stove, families and neighbors working and living together, and leaning on each other for support.

Chainsaws and generators became hot commodities, and reports from the 1994 papers mention that Attorney General Mike Moore was sending four teams of investigators to the area to check reports of price gouging.

In rural Tishomingo County, citizens were lucky enough to at least know how to deal with the situation. Teams of men in trucks hit the road with chainsaws to clear access for neighbors; especially ones in need of potential medical help.

"We'd saw our way in, and then saw our way back out through all the stuff that fell after we got through the first time," recalled Neil Edmonson.

For months after the storm, the sound of chainsaws filled the air as property owners cleared damage from the storm.

We have had many responses to a request for ice storm stories. We hope you enjoy them, and we hope that by the time this paper comes out, we have not suffered through another

Sonic Had Record Days

At that time we were in the old Sonic location on Constitution Drive. We never lost power, but everyone else did. We watched the big oak tree in front of the power office crumble.

When it started getting dark, people began to come in for food. We had sent everyone home because of the weather and only my wife and I were there. We did the best we could and random people came inside offering to help us. No one seemed to mind waiting up to a half hour for an order. We had people calling from Selmer, Tennessee, calling to see if we were open.

The two weeks following were the busiest we ever were at that location. They were making onion rings in Amory and trucking them to us because we didn't have time.

Every employee we had worked open to close and we rented a hotel room in Corinth where everyone could take turns showering and washing clothes. The people of luka and the surrounding area have always been good to us. Times like that remind us what a blessing it to be part of the community.

Shopping by Flashlight The first day my grandfather and I headed

out with everyone's grocery list and a chainsaw. Destination: Nelson's Supermarket, when we arrived we were given a flashlight and a sharpie for our shopping trip. Flashlight for seeing and sharple for prices! We lived at Mt. Gilead, and had no power or water for 17 days. There was plenty of food; I think my Mom and Grandma cooked everything they had in the big chest-type freezers. The house had to be painted from using the old Tyme coal oil lamps inside. Great memories. but wouldn't want to relive it.

Jennifer Wheeler Harmon Candles in the Tub I called my mom to check on how she was doing. She told me her power was out, and knowing there was not any backup heat there, I loaded up a kerosene heater, went and bought a few gallons of kerosene, and headed to luka.

When I got to Mom's house, the door was locked, and she didn't come when I knocked, so I used my key and got in, and went looking for her. Turned out, she was in the upstairs bathroom, door closed, and about 15 candles in the bath tub, using the toilet for a chair. To my surprise, it was very warm in there. She said she was afraid of fire with so many candles and that is why they were in the tub, and of course, the bathroom is a pretty small place to heat. Pretty smart on her part I

Beth Booker Brown **Back to the Old Days**

After hearing the trees beside the house breaking that morning, and thinking, apparently, not much of it, me and my husband of less than a year drove all the way from Tishomingo to the NASA plant to work for about 3 hours before it became clear we all needed to go home. It took us an hour or more to get near our home, and we finally had to walk the last quarter mile in a field, to avoid all the falling branches. We walked right past our house - our driveway was unrecognizable with all

the downed trees! I was eight months pregnant with Mary, so my husband parked me on the couch and fetched the Ashlev wood heater from the shed -cutting his way there and back to the house with a chainsaw. Using just a dolly, he got it into our house and set up himself (we had just gotten central heat and I was so happy to get that big ole monster out of my living room!) Kent McClung arrived soon after to help clear the driveway, saying, "You might need to have that baby any minute!" Just what a young mom-to-be

needs to hear! For 21 days we had no power, but used that stove to warm water to bathe, to cook and keep warm. His parents came to stay with us when it was apparent it was going to be a while before power was restored. We ate steak every night - since the freezer was full from a recent "meat man" delivery!

My daddy in Oklahoma shipped us a generator, since there were none to be bought. We watched the Olympics a couple nights!

Mary was born March 6th, and chainsaws ran outside her window for months after she came home. She's been the soundest sleeper ever since!

CONSERVATION CORNER Hypothermia

by James L. Cummins

While for the most part we live in a warm state, Mississippi can get very cold, especially when considering our high humidity. For example, a few years ago a friend came to visit from Colorado and wanted to go for a jog early one January morning. I told him it was cold - about 35 degrees Fahrenheit – and he reminded he was from Colorado and could handle it. When he returned, he said if felt much colder than what he was familiar with out

When we are in a cold environment, our bodies can lose heat faster than it can generate it. The body will adjust by constricting blood vessels at the surface of the skin, shutting down perspiration and increasing muscular activity, which we call shivering. This is the beginning of hypothermia. Hypothermia is one of the leading causes of death among outdoorsmen. Wind-chill can also greatly reduce the time it takes for hypothermia to set in.

Some symptoms of hypothermia (defined as body temperature of less than 95 degrees Fahrenheit) may also include slurred speech, incoherence, numbness and impaired gait. Shivering is valuable clue, but hypothermic individuals whose body temperature is lower than 90 degrees Fahrenheit may not shiver or even feel cold. The individual may appear corpse-like due to the pale color of his or her skin, lack of spontaneous motion and a faint pulse.

Odds are, medical attention is needed, but until that can be accomplished, you need to begin gradually re-warming the affected person. First, remove all wet clothing and place the victim in d kets in a warm environment. Offer non-alcoholic fluids. Movement ing the victim must be limited an gently. The goal should be to get tim to a hospital as soon as possi the potential complications are ma some can even be fatal.

To help prevent hypothermi happening to you, wear suitable and protect your exposed areas. I are preferred over gloves. Wear layers of loose clothing. Wearing pairs of socks - cotton next to ski on top will help protect your feet. scarf or head covering.

If you are camping, use the priate sleeping bag for the temp Heating up water, putting it in and placing it in the sleeping help keep one warm also. Remember that certain A


