## Local Music Pioneer Jimmy Pyle Laid to Rest

Local music industry pioneer Jimmy Ray Pyle, 70 of Iuka, died Saturday, February 15, 2014 at North Mississippi Medical Center in Iuka.

Funeral services were held at Magnolia Funeral Home, 1001 N. Main St., Iuka, on Tuesday, February 18, 2014 at 1:00 p.m. with burial in Hebron Cemetery in Iuka. Bro. Jimmy Dan-Gerald Glidewell, and Leona Brown officiated.

Jimmy Ray Pyle, born October 24, 1943, was a true revolutionary, he engaged in all aspects of life with great passion. As he lived out his dreams through his family, friends, and work he believed in.

Most people knew Jimmy Pyle as a performer, musician, writer, a studio owner, a producer, a radio station owner who was involved in countless projects throughout his life. He was a mentor to many artists who were just starting out, including Darryl Worley and Billy Joe Son. Son of Grand Old Opry star Pete Pyle, he began his career at Fox Studios, Pyle Publishing and was actively involved in the Pyle-Roser Music Group. Self-made businessman, he

created an automation system for radio stations and brought the first local TV station to Red Bay, AL. He started three carpet stores and was also a carpenter who built houses. Jimmy was an inventor who had a natural understanding of complex subjects; he enjoyed working with technology and was always innovative in his approach.

He was also a pilot and really loved to fly. Despite the fact that he always stayed busy with his various endeavors, he would never hesitate to help someone who needed him. This is certainly evident by his work in the American Red Cross and by his deep devotion to the ones he loved and his Christian faith.

To sum up the life of Jimmy Pyle is to say that he was immersed in his passions to which he was a visionary; he never gave up seeking out what he loved in life and he always wanted those who he shared his life with to prosper alongside him.

He is survived by his wife of 50 years: Elaine Cummings Pyle of Iuka; a daughter, Regina Pyle Ahmad and husband Asif of Iuka; and three grandchildren: Logan Lambert, Sierra Lambert, and Cypress Lambert; brothers: Johnny Pyle and wife Charlotte of Owassa, OK, Jackie Pyle and wife Beverly of Springfield, TN, Tommy Pyle



and wife Mitzi of Hendersonville, TN, Paul Pyle of Goodlettsville, TN, and Ricky Pyle and wife Judy of Tulsa, OK; and sisters: Haroldine Atchley of Joelton, TN, Linda Pierse and husband Allen of Owasso, OK, Sherry Cook and husband Charles of Murfreesboro, TN, and Dwanna Bergeron and husband Dan of Murfreesboro, TN; and many other relatives and a host of friends.

## McClung Announces Retirement after 2 Years as Superintendent

Superintendent Benny McClung of the Tishomingo County School District announced this week that he is retiring after two years in the post.

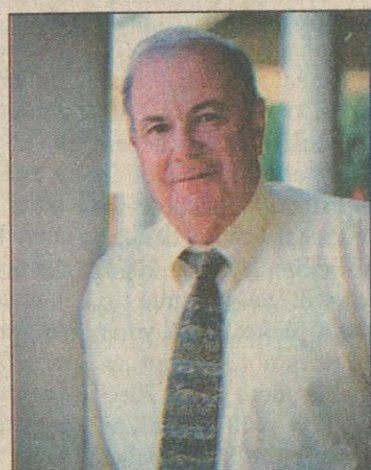
Late Monday, faculty and staff of Tishomingo County schools were notified by email of the decision.

"After much reflection and in-depth consideration, I have decided to retire as Superintendent of Education for Tishomingo County School District," said McClung in a statement released Wednesday morning.

"I would like to thank the school board for giving me the opportunity to serve our school district and for their full support during my tenure as Superintendent. I could not have asked for a more supportive group of individuals to work with, and their care for our school system is highly evident in every decision they make."

The search for a new superintendent will presumably begin in the next few months, as these positions are usually filled during the summer, according to some sources. Two school board positions (First and Fifth Districts) are up for re-election in November.

"I also thank each and every school administrator, teacher, staff member, county supervisor, city official, county law enforcement officer, business owner, local media, and community member for their relentless support of the goals we have set and sought to accomplish during my years as superintendent. It is truly amazing at how great everyone within our county supports our schools countywide and the

drive we all have to see our children succeed," said McClung in his statement.

"This is one of the greatest school systems in the world and I am honored to have been a part of it as a teacher, coach, principal, and superintendent," stated McClung.

"I ensure you that I am not in any way leaving because of health reasons or because of any issues with any person, but just feel it is time for me to step aside and move into the retirement stage of my life. I have dedicated 36 years of my life to educating the children of Mississippi with 24 of those serving the children of Tishomingo County," said McClung, who is a native of Paden and graduated from Tishomingo High School.

"I thank each of you from the bottom of my heart for your continued support and hope you realize how appreciative I am of you for sharing your children with me over the years," said McClung.

He said that he and Dianne will remain in Iuka, where they are active in the community.

## Tishomingo Woman Killed in Highway 25 Collision

A Tishomingo woman was killed in a two-vehicle collision Friday evening in Iuka.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Jullie Deloris Moore, 68, of Tishomingo, was killed instantly when the 1998 Ford Escort she was driving was struck by a northbound pick-up truck as she was attempting to turn south from Paul Edmondson Drive onto Highway 25. The collision happened about 7 p.m. in rainy conditions, explained Wilemon.

Moore, and a passenger, Dorothy Gray, also of Tishomingo, were leaving "pack night" at the Food Depot, said Wilemon. Their vehicle was struck

broadside by the pickup driven by David Dove, of Columbus, Mississippi, who was returning to J.P. Coleman State Park, after eating supper in Iuka with two other passengers who were also in the truck. No one in the truck was hurt, but Gray was transported to Magnolia Regional Health Center in Corinth, and later transferred to the Med in Memphis for treatment, said Wilemon.

Another vehicle, driven by Raymond Miller, was merging into the northbound lane of Highway 25, and some of the wreckage hit him, too, said Wilemon. Miller had also been at the Food Depot.

## Shooting Suspect Held on \$100,000 Bail

Tuesday in Tishomingo County Justice Court, 57-year-old Herbert Lee Bennett was charged with attempted murder for a Friday night shooting incident that hospitalized an Iuka woman.

Bennett was charged and bond was set at \$100,000, according to Justice Court. He is still in custody in the Tishomingo County Jail as of press time.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, Bennett allegedly fired a handgun at Francine Angel, 48,

that grazed her face, and exited around her ear. The shooting took place at a County Road 158 residence about 6:30 Friday night, February 14th, said authorities. The location is near the Iuka Airport.

Two other suspects, Walker Mayhall and Leonard Moss, detained at the same time were charged with disorderly conduct, a misdemeanor.

Angel was treated at North Mississippi Medical Center, according to reports.



## First Voter ID Card Issued in Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's Office

On January 29th, Ms. Altie Calley of Dennis was issued the first Photo Voter ID Card in the county. She wanted to be sure that she was eligible to vote in the June 3, 2014, Party Primary Election.

Ms. Calley needed a Photo Voter ID because she had none of the other types of photo identification that you can use when you vote, under Mississippi's new Voter ID law.

Beginning with the June 3rd, Primary Election, all individuals voting at the polls will be required to show an acceptable form of photo Voter ID, confirmed Circuit Court Clerk Donna Henry Dill. Individuals voting in person by absentee ballot in the Primary Election inside the Circuit Clerk's Office before June 3, 2014, also will be required to show a photo ID. A voter who does not have an acceptable photo ID on Election Day will be asked to vote by affidavit ballot at the polling place. The voter will then have five (5) business days to show an acceptable form of photo ID or apply for a Mississippi Voter ID card, at the Circuit Clerk's Office.

The June 3rd election will be a Primary Election for Candidates seeking the offices of United States

Senator and United States Representative. There will be a Democratic and Republican Elections held on this date. You will choose the party that you wish to vote in.

Any one of the following types of photo IDs may be used on election day for voter identification purposes: (1) a driver's license; (2) a photo ID issued by a branch, department or entity of the State of Mississippi; (3) U. S. Passport; (4) a government employee identification card; (5) a firearms license; (6) a student photo ID issued by an accredited Mississippi university, college or community/junior college; (7) a U. S. Military ID; (8) a tribal photo ID; (9) any other photo ID issued by any branch, department, agency or entity of the United States government or any state government; or (10) A Mississippi Voter Identification Card. If a registered voter does not have any of these acceptable forms of photo ID, a Mississippi Voter Identification Card is available at no cost to the voter at the Circuit Clerk's Office. Only eligible voters who lack one of the acceptable forms of photo ID listed above are eligible for a free Mississippi Voter ID Card. These Mississippi Voter ID



Cards are for voting purposes only.

Any registered voter who needs to apply for a Voter ID Card will need to bring one of the following types of documents with you to the Circuit Clerk's Office: (1) any expired, but valid, document having the voter's name and photograph issued by the U. S. government or any U. S. state; (2) a birth certificate or any other document with the voter's full legal name, date and place of birth; (3) a Social Security card; (4) a Medicare card; (5) a Medicaid card; (6) a Mississippi voter registration card; (7) any of the following, as long as it includes the voter's name and current address: (a) Utility bill issued within the preceding six months; (b) Bank statement issued within the preceding six

months; (c) Paycheck issued within the preceding six months; (d) Government check issued within the preceding six months; or (e) IRS Form W-2, Wages and tax statement issued within the current calendar year. If a registered voter does not have any of these documents, the Circuit Clerk will attempt to verify a voter's birth information free of charge.

If a voter needs transportation to the Circuit Clerk's Office to get the Mississippi Voter Identification card, they should contact the Secretary of State's Voter ID toll-free hotline at 1-855-868-3745 or 1-844-678-6937, or visit [www.MSVoterID.ms.gov](http://www.MSVoterID.ms.gov) or email [MSVoterID@sos.ms.gov](mailto:MSVoterID@sos.ms.gov).

Voters who vote an absentee ballot by mail, military voters and overseas citizens who vote by fax or e-mail, and voters with religious objections to being photographed are the only voters who are exempt from the photo ID requirements.

## Tishomingo County's Old Courthouse Museum and the 1890 U.S. Census Fire

No one really knows for sure what started the fire on January 10, 1921, in Washington, D.C., that destroyed the major portion of the 1890 U.S. Federal Census. Some said it was a cigarette, and others claimed it was deliberate arson. However, everyone agrees that it was a tragedy of immense proportion.

The 1890 census, stored in the basement of the U.S. Commerce Depart-

ment, contained critical historical information on more than 6 million people in the U.S. The other census records were inside a fire- and water-proof vault when the flames started, but the 1890 census was sitting just outside its protective walls.

Firemen rushed to the scene to distinguish the fire, but what wasn't destroyed by the fire and smoke was tragically destroyed by water. It was stated that 25

percent of the census was destroyed by the flames and 50 percent by the smoke and water that followed it. The remaining 25 percent of the 1890 census was shuffled from location to location until it was finally destroyed in the 1930s.

While nothing can replace the invaluable information lost with the destruction of the 1890 census, there is still hope for finding your family. Years ago an "1890 Census

Substitute" was started by Ancestry.com. This substitute contains what was left of the 1890 census plus a few state censuses and other miscellaneous records. It is definitely not a sure bet that you will find your ancestor, but Ancestry.com continues to add more state records and directories from the 1890 time period.

One good thing did come from the disaster. Outrage at the destruction of the census led to the

construction of the National Archives, a permanent place of refuge for our nation's historical documents—a place intended to protect all our important records from ever meeting the same fiery fate.

The Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society and its Old Courthouse Museum attempts to do the same for Tishomingo County's history and archival information. Drop by and

visit the archives, genealogy library, research your ancestors. A subscription to Ancestry.com, Fold.com [a pre-collection of military information] is available in the library for research. The Courthouse Museum is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Tuesday through Friday. You may also e-mail tishomingohistory@yahoo.com or (662) 423-3500.

## Are Some Angels Elect, And Others Not?

This may put a new slant on our subject, for the Bible does speak of "elect angels". 1 Timothy 5:21 says, "I charge thee before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, and the elect angels, that thou observe these things without preferring one before another, doing nothing by partiality." This is the only place in the entire Bible that the term "elect angels" is used. That does not make this reference unimportant or insignificant, it simply shows that God didn't choose to give us a lot of information about the election of angels. This may be because angels are spirit beings and are not at all related to men. Contrary to some opinions, mothers do not become angels when they get to heaven; it is not even that "mama is teaching angels how to sing", for Job 38:7 shows that they sang before the earth or man was ever created! (Sons of God in this verse are angels, as in Job 1:6; 2:1.) We might be well off to spend more of our study time seeking to learn more about God and how He relates to the salvation of mankind, since that directly involves all of us! Yes, I plead my own ignorance concerning any great deal of insight into the "election of angels"! I will say, however, that it seems clear that some angels, like some humans, were elected by the Lord from eternity.

What we do know about angels is that there are two groups of them, good and bad, to say nothing about the two classifications of them, namely cherubim and seraphim. (You can find "seraphim" in Isaiah 6:2, 6 only, as far as the use of that name; you can find "cherubim" and its singular form "cherub" in dozens of places in the Old Testament (Ezekiel 10:1-20 fourteen times, plus in Exodus, I Kings, I & II Chronicles, Psalms etc.), but "cherubim" is used only once in the New Testament in Hebrews 9:5, where it refers to the Old Testament tabernacle and the mercy seat over it.

Ezekiel 28:14-19 seems clearly to refer to Satan, when it uses the term "the anointed cherub that covereth" and "O covering cherub" (see verses 14 & 16). Isaiah 14:12-14 seems also to refer to Satan, with the name "Lucifer" being used only here in the entire Bible. This passage shows in verse fourteen that Lucifer said, "I will be like the most High", with "most High" referring to God alone. So, Satan's fall came through his pride and his desire to take God's place! Revelation 12:4 says that the "dragon", a name for Satan, drew "the third of the stars of heaven", meaning that about a third of the angels (called stars, as in Revelation 9:1 where a star is an angel) followed Satan in his rebellion against God. The elect angels would have been the two thirds of the angels that did not follow Lucifer. We are not told when the angels were elected, but it must have been before the fall of Satan and his angels. (Revelation 12:7-9 shows Michael and his angels fighting against the Devil and his angels. It seems that the angels made an eternal choice to follow Satan, or to stay with God; those who stayed are the elect angels, while the others are not elect!)

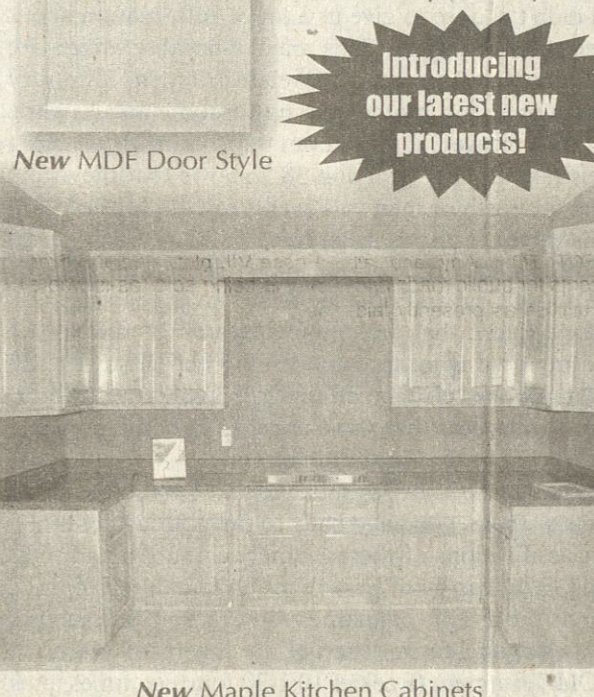

**TOWN OF BURNSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI  
MOBILE HOME ORDINANCE**  
The Town of Burnsville, Mississippi hereby adopts the following ordinance intended to govern the safety and habitability of mobile homes located within the town limits of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi and in doing so does ordain and adopt the following regulations pertaining thereto with said regulations in the ordinance having an effective date of the 4th day of February, 2014 and thereafter.

1.1 The short title of this regulation shall be known as the "Mobile Home Ordinance" for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi.

Hereinafter in this regulation is shall be referred to as the "Ordinance". The Town of Burnsville, Mississippi shall be hereinafter referred to as the "Town".

1.2 Administration. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be administered by the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi's Board of Aldermen and Mayor, collectively or through their designated agent/employee for the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi.

1.3 Definitions:  
A. Ordinance is the complete Mobile Home Ordinance as stated herein including any modifications, deletions or alterations that may be adopted by the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi hereafter.

B. Mobile Home is defined as any type of structure or vehicle which provides facilities for persons to sleep and/or eat, which is mounted on wheels or has provisions for wheels, such as a house trailer, converted bus or truck or other small structure. The definition of mobile home shall include modular homes if the modular home is built off site and transported to a proposed home site by the use of wheels, axles or other means.

C. Applicant is defined as anyone seeking to locate a mobile home for the purpose of being used as a principal dwelling place within the Town.

D. Application fee is the sum of money set by the Town paid at the filing of the application by the Applicant seeking permission to locate a mobile home in the Town for the purpose to be used as a principal dwelling place.

E. Mobile home park is defined as a location where more than one mobile home is located and intended for the purpose of habitation or where mobile homes are rented for habitation.

F. Lot is defined as a proposed site for the location of a mobile home with a minimum amount of space of not less than 1/2 acre.

G. Utilities are defined as the standard utilities of water, gas, electricity and sewer.

H. Mover is any person, entity or business engaged in the business of transporting, moving, locating and setting up mobile homes, manufactured homes or modular homes.

1.4 The Town authorizes the location of mobile homes within the town limits for the purpose to be used as a principal dwelling place provided the following minimum requirements are met prior to occupation of said mobile home.

A. The applicant shall complete an application with the Town certifying under oath that the mobile home is of sound and suitable construction, meeting all State Codes governing mobile homes, including those adopted by the Mississippi State Fire Marshall or other State Agency governing the manufacture, use and location of mobile homes within the State of Mississippi.

B. The applicant shall pay the sum of \$250.00 to the Town as the application fee when the application is filed with the Town Clerk for the Town.

C. The applicant shall provide a plat including a copy of their deed certifying that the proposed site of the mobile home meets the minimum space requirement of 1/2 acre as required by this ordinance and that it is the only dwelling structure located on that site. The applicant shall provide proof that the entity, individual or business that is hired to transport and locate the mobile home in the Town is certified, license, bonded and insured to engage in the business of moving mobile homes. The applicant shall provide a copy of the Movers license, bond and insurance at the time the application is filed with the Town.

D. The applicant shall provide a certificate from the Health Department for Tishomingo County, Mississippi or the State of Mississippi certifying that the septic system meets the statutory requirements for wastewater treatment. If sewer is available through the Town for the site where the applicant seeks to locate the mobile home, payment of the utility deposit with the Town shall satisfy this requirement.

E. The applicant shall provide sufficient proof to the Town that they have applied and received permission from the respective utility providers (water, gas, sewer and electricity) for the proposed site of the mobile home.

F. The applicant shall correct any deficiencies in their application within fifteen (15) days of being notified of the same. Failure to correct the deficiencies in the application will result in a denial of the application and the Town will retain the application fee.

G. Any mobile home that an applicant intends to locate in the Town of Burnsville must be a minimum of fourteen feet wide (14'), contain at least 1,400 square feet of heated/cooled interior living space and no older than five (5) years old at the time the proposed home is to be moved into the Town.

H. Any mobile homes below 1,400 square feet proposed to be moved into the Town must be NEW with a minimum of fourteen feet (14') in width and contain a minimum of 900 square feet of heated/cooled interior living space.

I. Any mobile home that has been abandoned or uninhabited for a period of six (6) months or more is considered abandoned for the purposes of this ordinance and must be removed from the property. If the mobile home is not removed within thirty (30) days from written notice being provided to the owner of said mobile home by the Town, the Town may elect to remove the mobile home and charge the cost of removal to the owner of the mobile home. The Town may elect to offer the same for sale at a public auction to satisfy the expenses incurred in removing the home from the site.

J. Mobile home parks are prohibited in the Town of Burnsville.

1.5 The Town does not authorize the use of mobile homes to be used as a business, storage facility or any other use other than as a principal dwelling place. If a business presently uses a mobile home for office space or otherwise and the business is sold, the mobile home must be removed from the site of its present location and the new owner may not operate a business from the mobile home.

1.6 The Town allows the use of mobile homes as temporary office space within the Industrial Park used for the purposes of office space during a period of construction of a permanent structure or other manufacturing facility.

1.7 Every mobile home shall be inspected prior to being located or attached to a site. The mobile home shall be maintained in a safe and secure manner. The siding of the mobile home shall be maintained and all of similar grade, color and appearance and shall be attached to the structure. All plumbing in the mobile home shall be in a good state of repair. All electrical wiring shall be contained within the floors, walls or underside of the mobile home and shall be secured to the home and not hanging free from the same.

1.8 Once the mobile home is approved for location on the site, it must be completely underpinned where no part of the underside of the mobile home is in view with the tires removed from the axles of the mobile home.

1.9 The Town shall designate an agent who will perform the inspection of all mobile homes prior to their approval and location within the Town. Said agent may be an employee of the Town or an independent contractor as the Town may elect.

1.10 If the Agent for the Town finds deficiencies in the mobile home, he/she shall identify those deficiencies and provide the applicant with a written letter specifying where the mobile home is deficient and if those deficiencies can be corrected so as to satisfy the requirements of this ordinance. The applicant shall have twenty days from the date of the notice letter identifying the deficiencies to correct the same and notify the Town of those corrections. After which, the Agent will inspect the mobile home for compliances purposes with this ordinance.

1.11 Any person or entity that locates a mobile home in the Town which does not comply with the regulations contained herein may be charged with violation of this ordinance and a fine of \$100.00 to \$1,000.00 plus court costs and may be assessed with the actual costs of removal of said home from the Town. Any person, entity or business that moves or attempts to move a mobile home without being licensed, bonded and insured to engage in that activity will be guilty of a violation of this ordinance and will be subject to a fine of \$100.00 to \$1,000.00 plus court costs and subject to restitution cost for any damages caused by their actions.

2.1 Appeal. In the event, the application for location of a mobile home within the Town is denied by the Agent, the Applicant may appeal said decision to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for review provided the Applicant file a written letter requesting the review by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. Said request for review (appeal) must be filed within ten (10) days of the denial of the application. Once the appeal is made, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall act on the request for review and their next regularly scheduled Board meeting.

2.2 The review by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen is final as it relates to the application for the location of a mobile home within the Town.

2.3 The Town may authorize special use exceptions of mobile homes within the Town for limited purposes on a case-by-case basis. In the event someone seeks a "special use exception" to locate a mobile home in the Town for a limited time period, said person shall file an application with the Town Clerk requesting the special use exception, citing the specific purpose for which the mobile home will be used, the site of the proposed location of the mobile home, the time period the mobile home will be located on said site and shall pay the application fee in the same amount as required by anyone else seeking to locate a mobile home in the Town. The Board will review said applications on a case-by-case basis and their decision in whether or not to grant a special use exception will be final. For the purposes of Section 2.3 of this ordinance a limited time period is defined as six months or less. For the purposes of this section, location of a mobile home for the purposes of habitation by persons overnight or as a principal dwelling place shall not fall within the meaning as a "special purpose exception" to this ordinance. f-20-chg

erected or placed within limits any of the following: Neon, light emitting diode, any other sign that uses individual lights or panel of lights to display any message from a public street when door or indoor, except for stating only "Open" less than four square feet in area.

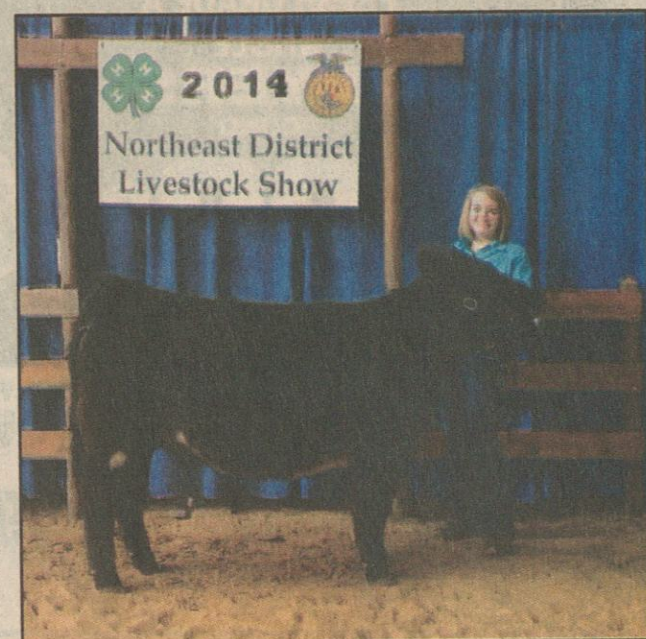
