Cherokee Man Charged After Dragging Woman, Threatening Infant

Tishomingo County authorities have charged a 19-year-old Cherokee man with aggravated assault, kidnapping and felony abuse after an incident Monday on Rock Crusher Road at the state border.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitely, deputies were called to the scene near Hoover stone markers around lunchtime Tuesday where it appeared Steven Noyola, 19, of Cherokee, had had an altercation with the mother of a child he allegedly threatened.

According to eyewitnesses to the deputies, Noyola allegedly jerked the car seat

containing the infant away, and tossed it into his car before driving off with the 4-week-old infant in his Camaro, and dragging the mother along as she attempted to reach in the car to stop him. Deputies issued a be-on-the-lookout (BOLO) for the green Camaro, and Noyola was apprehended on County Road 181/Old Hwy. 25 near Midway shortly thereafter. Department of Human Services came to the scene to take care of the child, which was returned to its mother, Kayla Roberts, 22, of Cherokee, after she was treated for a fractured wrist and multiple contusions after being dragged beside the car.

Byrom Denied Appeal in Death Row Case, but Has Asked for a New Trial

Death row inmate Michelle Byrom was denied an appeal by the United States Supreme Court Monday, regarding the slaying of her husband, Edward Byrom, in Tishomingo County and the death sentence received for it.

At late Tuesday, Byrom's attorneys asked the state supreme court to give her another trial based on her claims that Edward Byrom, Jr. actually killed his father at the couple's home, and that she never sought a hit man.

According to reports, Michelle Byrom's attorney, David Byrom, argued that Edward Byrom, Jr. told a forensic psychologist during an evaluation that he had been physically and emotionally abused by his father and that his father for his own protection.

Attorney General Jim Williamson said the statements Byrom, Jr. were not relevant to Michelle Byrom or her attorneys before her trial and the psychologist was not allowed to talk about them at her trial.

The Supreme Court has Attorney General Jim Williamson's office until Monday to respond. Byrom would have until March 5th to rebut the attorney general's arguments.

Hood has asked the Supreme Court to set Byrom's execution date for March 27th. The court has not ruled on that.

Byrom was convicted of capital murder and sentenced to death in 2000 for the killing of Edward Byrom, Sr., and for recruiting her son in the plot. She allegedly offered a payment of \$15,000 for a hit man, to be paid by proceeds from the estate which were estimated at more than \$350,000.

Byrom Jr. testified against his mother during the trial as part of a plea bargain. He later pled guilty to several charges in the murder-for-hire scheme, including conspiracy to commit murder. Judge Thomas Gardner sentenced him to 50 years in prison with 20 years suspended. He is out of prison now and living and working in Tupelo.

Joseph Dale Gillis, described as the hit man in the case, pled guilty to lesser charges of conspiracy to commit capital murder and accessory after the fact. He was sentenced to 15 years in prison, and has been out of prison for some time. According to reports he was out before Byrom Jr.

Cherokee BP Robbery Suspect Apprehended

HEROKEE - Less than 24 hours after the Chiska BP Station U.S. 72 was robbed at point by a woman Friday afternoon, police said they have two suspects in custody.

Cherokee Police Chief James Williamson said the two suspects, who had two children in the backseat of the car at the time of the robbery, were taken into custody around 11:30 a.m. Friday in Horn Lake, Miss. Reports indicate the business, located near the Natchez Trace Parkway, was robbed at 11:37 p.m. Friday morning.

Williamson said Debbie Cochran, 32, Florence, Jimmy Boutwell, of Sheffield, are in custody in Missis-

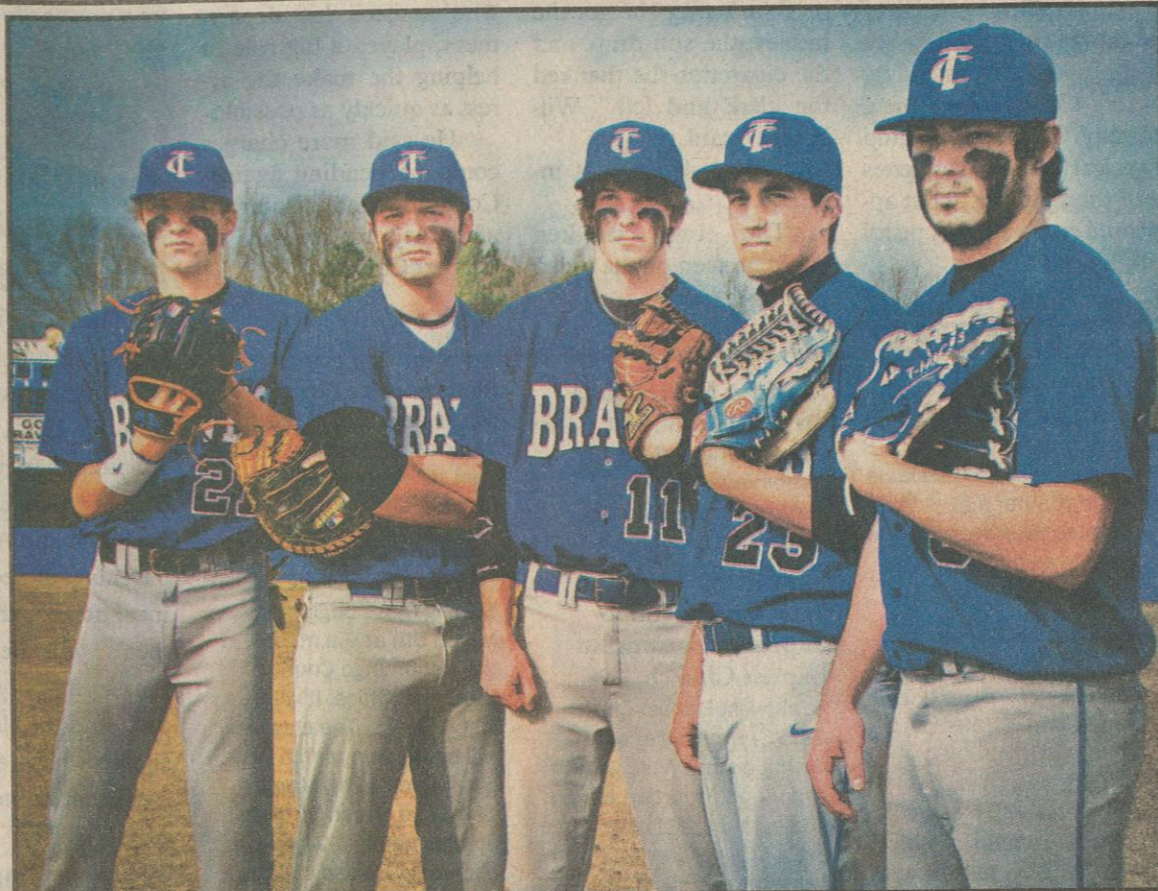
sippi. He said they will both be charged with first-degree robbery.

He said Cochran also has charges for felony possession of marijuana by Horn Lake authorities.

Williamson said thanks to the public's help, calls to Cherokee Police Department the Colbert County Sheriff's Office on Friday night helped identify Cochran.

"We were able to find out that she was headed to Mississippi and notified authorities there," Williamson said. "Then Saturday morning, we were notified by Horn Lake Police that they had them in custody. And during the arrest, they found

Time to File for Homestead Tax Exemption

According to the Tishomingo County Tax Assessor's office, Homestead filing time is upon us.

If you bought a new house or if you have sold or bought land you need to file or re-file Homestead. Also, if you turned 65 or became disabled in 2013, and have been granted veteran disability and regular disability, you need to re-file. Any chang-

es - you need to come and re-file your Homestead.

If you have any questions about filing call the County Tax Assessor's Office at 423-7059 and we will be more than happy to answer your questions. Homestead filing time is from January 2nd through March 31st. Office Hours: Monday through Friday - 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Cochran in possession of marijuana."

Williamson said the two children, who are Cochran's, are in the custody of a relative and have been returned to Alabama.

Cochran is accused of walking into the Cherokee business Friday morning, acting like she was going to buy a soft drink and two cartons of cigarettes and then pulling what appeared to be a 9mm pistol on the clerk.

Video shows Cochran smiling and laughing as she "racked the gun," meaning she chambered a round and ordered the male clerk to give her money.

"And after she got the money, the soft drink and the cigarettes she thanked the clerk and left," Williamson said.

The clerk was not injured.

The two children could be seen on the video

in the back seat of the car with the windows down laughing and playing as the car drove off.

Williamson said the public and the Colbert County Sheriff's office, who assisted his department, played a big role in helping the make the arrest as quickly as possible.

He said more charges could be pending against Cochran and Boutwell after they are returned to Colbert County.

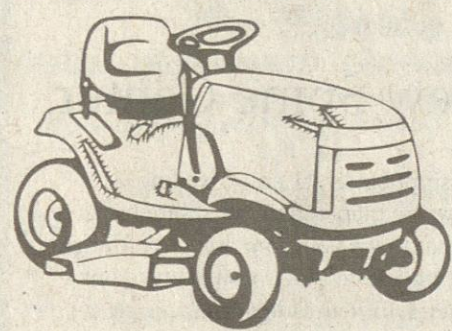

Election As The Purpose Of God

Perhaps it would be good for all of us to say that we do not fully understand the purpose of God, not only in election, but in anything else that He has purposed! Romans 9:10-13 says, "And not only this, but when Rebecca also had conceived by one, even by our father Isaac; (For the children being not yet born, neither having done any good or evil, that the purpose of God according to election might stand, not of works, but of

Him that calleth;) It was said unto her, The elder shall serve the younger. As it is written, Jacob have I loved, but Esau have I hated." It is highly possible that some people read more into these verses than is warranted. The context in Romans 9:6-9 speaks of the choice of Isaac over Ishmael, though Ishmael is not named here. Then we have the choice of Jacob over Esau in verses 12-13. Does this mean that Esau could not have been saved, even if he so desired? I hear

preachers use Hebrews 12:17 to justify their teaching that Esau had no opportunity to be saved. Here is the verse: "For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears." The context shows that Esau had sold his birthright to Jacob (vs. 16), as is shown in Genesis 27:29-34, which shows that Esau "despised his birthright". The truth taught in Hebrews 12:17 is that Esau could not regain the blessings of the birthright, even though he sought to regain it, even with tears (see Genesis 27:37-38).

Hebrews 12:17 certainly is not saying that Esau never had an opportunity to be saved! The direct teaching of Romans 9:12-13 is that God chose Jacob for the greater blessing, not Esau, and Esau could not reverse this.

As to the matter of God hating Esau, we might need to check on the use of the word "hated" in other Old Testament passages. Genesis 29:30 says, "And he (Jacob) went in also unto Rachel, and he loved also Rachel more than Leah, and served with him yet seven other years." Then Genesis 29:31 says, "And when the LORD saw that Leah was hated, He opened her womb: but Rachel was barren." I am say-

ing that Jacob did not literally hate Leah, rather that he loved Rachel more. It seems to be the same with Esau. Deuteronomy 2:5 says, "Meddle not with them; for I will not give you of their land, no, not so much as a foot breadth; because I have given mount Seir unto Esau for a possession." (Read the context of these verses for a better understanding.) God did not literally hate Esau, or else He would not have given Esau land, which He protected from any invasion by Israel! (More on this later)

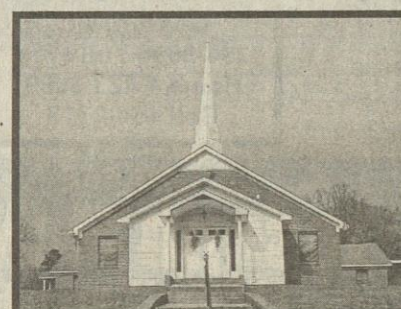

Still No Decision on \$18,000 Power Bill for Tishomingo Businesswoman

For the second time in as many months, the TCEPA Board of Directors has postponed a decision on an \$18,000 electric bill the power company has issued to a Tishomingo businesswoman.

According to reports, long-time Tishomingo County Electric Power Association president of the board Jimmy Marlin asked that the discussion of the issue and any vote be postponed until he can be present. Marlin is said to be recovering from surgery, and could

not attend the February 25th meeting. He was also too ill to attend the January meeting, which Ferguson also attended, expecting some resolution.

Last month Pattie Ferguson, owner of Pattie's One Stop on Highway 25 in Tishomingo attended the meeting where she thought the board would determine what was to be done about an \$18,617 bill that the power company says is to make up for about two years of "under-billing" caused by the company's appar-

ently defective remote meter-reading system.

Back in December, Ferguson was surprised with the huge bill, after months of bills that were \$700-800 that she had been paying. TCEPA Executive Director Robbie Grisham explained that she had been underbilled for about two years, and that she would have to pay for the power she used, but which had not apparently been correctly reported.

At the December meeting, Grisham reported to acting chair-

man Gerald Barnes, and Ms. Ferguson that the system had been corrected. He also affirmed that the \$742 January bill is the correct amount she should expect with her current usage.

The meters are not read by humans on a regular basis anymore, Grisham has explained. In use since 2004, the "turtle" meters send a report to the substations and that is what determines the usage amount that customers are billed.

Southern Cornerstones

Cayce Springs

Cayce Springs was a very popular place for outings, picnics, and a quiet time with nature. Romances were created and lost as couples spent an afternoon strolling under the oak trees. Cayce Springs, a part of the former J. N. Cayce home place, was a very scenic spot about 250 yards south of Mineral Springs Park. The two-story home on this property was built in 1913 by Neil Ganong and his son, John. It was one of several homes that were built by this pair of expert carpenters. Before the home was built, it was the site of the old Cayce

Motel that catered to visitors in Iuka before the turn of the century. The motel was built after the Civil War and was in use until around the early 1900s. In the August 30th, 1870, issue of The Memphis Daily Appeal of Memphis, a Tishomingo County cotton factory was listed for sale.

Touted as the finest water power in the South, the Bay Springs Cotton Mills was available for an exchange of city property or to be sold to the highest bidder. The newspaper noted that the factory's machinery was all new, and the place of business was currently in operation successfully. The location of the property was situated in the southern portion of Tishomingo County, Miss., 25 miles south of Iuka on the stage road leading to Fulton and Aberdeen.

The description of the property was as follows: 800 acres of land, covered with fine timber; one large frame factory house, 52 by 42 feet, 3 1/2 stories, and 576 spindles; one large room storehouse, with good cellars; one large frame carpenter shop; one large blacksmith shop; one large cotton shed and wood carder; five double houses, for operatives, passage between; four single houses, with shed attached; four single houses, without sheds; one large mill house, with corn and wheat mill; one large gin house; one sawmill, with new circular saw; besides dwelling houses, stables, cribs, etc. A large, bold and never-failing stream of water passing through a natural rock canal—the left bank 30 feet and the right bank 25 feet high, of solid rock. The bed or bottom is also solid rock; in fact, it is a solid rock canal, with capacity to drive 4,000 to 10,000 spindles; in a health locality, with good road to Iuka; a splendid orchard of about 300 choice apple trees, and a fine peach orchard.

The newspaper stated that it was a splendid opportunity for capitalists to invest in the finest water power in the South, with all necessary buildings already built on the premises and large enough for spinning or weaving, or both, if desired. Terms for purchase were liberal and negotiable and should be made to the Donoho, Joy & Co., Real Estate and Emigration Agency, 24 Madison Street, Memphis, Tenn.
