She will continue to lead us through the numerous changes impacting the educational process in a way that will enhance the learning process in an effort to allow each child to reach his or her greatest potential," stated Board President Michael Puckett.

Holly is the first female superintendent in Tishomingo

After completing her degree in English Education at Mississippi State University, Mrs. Holly began her teaching career in Prentiss County at Hills Chapel School as a teacher for 7th and 8th grade reading and language arts. After three years, she was employed at Iuka Middle School as a 7th and 8th grade Language Arts teacher. While at Iuka Middle School, Holly achieved National Board Certification in the area of Early Adolescence/ Generalist in 2002. She then Master's degree in Educational Leadership. The district then hired Holly as assistant principal at Iuka Middle under the leadership of Jimmy Smith. After Smith's retirement, Holly was promoted to the role of principal at IMS. During her three-year tenure, the school maintained a "B" rating as a High Performing school in the Mississippi Accountability System through the hard work of her staff, parents,

and students. This past year, Holly has been serving as Tishomingo County's Director of Curriculum and Testing. In this capacity, she has led the implementation efforts of Common Core State Standards as mandated by the state, current and new testing initiatives, professional development for teachers, and other areas of curriculum development.

"I am truly humbled by this opportunity to serve the commu-

nities and children of Tishomingo County," said Holly of her latest appointment. "God has truly blessed me with this opportunity and I thank our school board for their support and vote of confidence. As a county resident for the past 16 years, I am fully invested in ensuring our children receive the best possible education to prepare them for success in their futures. With the many changes and challenges we are currently facing in education, I hope to work with our dedicated faculty and staff to maintain Tishomingo County's School District's success and to challenge ourselves to reach higher achievement levels as we transition to new standards and higher expectations from the state. Our students, teachers, administrators, and schools need our support now more than ever. I hope to provide as much support as I can in order to cultivate student

Jeff Kemp, Constable for the South Half of Tishomingo County, died

County Loses South Half Constable After Illness

Three-term constable for the south half of Tishomingo County Jeff Kemp died Saturday at his residence after an extended illness.

Kemp held the Constable seat for a dozen years, and survived a recount contest in the last round of county elections.

Kemp was the paramedic director for Transcare Ambulance Service for more than 17 years, according to reports. Though it is usually a low-key office responsible for serving court papers for the south half justice court, Kemp was prominently visible in his own constable car, and uniform. He was active

in his support of community events, and was brother of current Chief Deputy Mike Kemp, of the Tishomingo County Sheriff Department. The day of his funeral, patrol cars and ambulances of local and area services lined the roadways.

The constable position will be temporarily filled by appointment of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, and a replacement will be officially elected in November to fulfill the term of Kemp, according to the circuit court clerk. Potential candidates have until September 5th to qualify for the ballot.

Does Man Actually Have A Free Will Today?

This has been the subject of at least one huge book called "The Bondage Of The Will", which I have in my library. Can it be said that man does not have the ability to choose God? Many people say that this is exactly the case, since the fall of Adam and the depraved human nature that has been inherited by all of Adam's posterity. I actually doubt that such is the case, since we choose all kinds of other things. If we could choose to go to hell, which we can do, why could we not choose to go to heaven, at least after the Spirit of God has convicted us and is drawing us to salvation? Yes, I know that this is a big point of contention among those who claim the name of Christ. I heard one preacher, who is very strong on Calvinism, say that he tells his people: "Just keep on trying to make sure that you are saved and among the elect." If election is totally an act of God, with nothing of the human will involved, then there is no need for anybody to worry about whether he is saved or lost, if he can do nothing about it anyway! I realize that any doctrine can be pushed to an extreme to which God did not mean for it to be pushed, but if there is absolutely no human choice, and all whom God has elected apart

from any human choice will be saved, then none of us need to concern ourselves with the subject at all!

I believe that we all do make a choice, after having been drawn by the Spirit of God, to either accept His offer of salvation, or to reject it. It is no mystery that God has forever known which choice we will make, therefore, He could elect the believers before the foundation of the world. Yes, I know this is too simplistic for the hyper-Calvinist, but this is the way I understand what God is saying about salvation in the Bible. Notice a question that Jesus asked of a man who had had an infirmity for 38 years. John 5:6 says, "When Jesus saw him lie, and knew that he had been now a long time in that case, He saith unto him, Wilt thou be made whole?" next verse shows that the man said that he had no one to put him into the water of the pool that would bring him healing. Then verse 8 records Jesus' words: "Rise, take up thy bed, and walk." Did you notice that Jesus did not exercise His will against the will of the man? I do not believe that God has ever saved anyone who did not desire to be saved, that is, against the person's own will. This, by the way, might be the solution to the whole question, for if God does not move His will against the will of the person, then both those who go to heaven and those who go to hell have exercised their own wills. Which way have you exercised your will?




