State Supreme Court Orders New Trial for Byrom in Tishomingo County

The Mississippi State Supreme Court has ordered a new trial for death row inmate Michelle Byrom, in an unprecedented course of action that has many questioning why. In two previous appeals, the state's top court found in favor of the state and let the trial court stand regarding the murder trial of Michelle Byrom, 57, who has been on death row for the past 14 years. Now, prosecutors are scrambling to prepare for a new trial in Tishomingo County reviewing evidence and statements from the 2000 murder trial but the Court's *en banc* order stated only that a new judge assigned to the case, and it didn't identify why they were ordering a new trial.

"Without knowing what this court considers to be reversible error in this case, where each and every issue has been previously found not to be error the execution and the trial court be at a loss with how to proceed on the various issues that surely arise once again" in a final, said Mississippi State Attorney General Jim Hood. Byrom was convicted in 2000 for murder and for participating in a scheme in which she allegedly recruited her son, Edward Byrom, Jr. and Joseph Byrom, Jr. to kill her husband, Edward Byrom, Sr. Byrom has had several unsuccessful appeals, including one as recently as February 24th of this year, when the U.S. Supreme Court denied to hear her case for an appeal.

After the U.S. Supreme Court denied her appeal, Attorney General Jim Hood requested the Mississippi State Supreme Court to execute the date last week, but they did not ever announce a date. Instead, they issued an

order dated Monday, March 31st reversing her conviction for capital murder, and ordering that the case be remanded to the circuit court for a new trial.

The reversal of the conviction and remanding of it to circuit court is "extraordinary and extremely rare," and the state's top court has issued just a few directions: that Byrom's petition for post conviction relief is granted; that the conviction for capital murder is reversed, and the case is to be tried again in Tishomingo County Circuit Court, but under a different judge than Thomas Gardner.

The office of the District Attorney for the First District and the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department have a considerable job ahead of them. Byrom will be transferred from Central Mississippi Correctional Facility in Pearl, to Tishomingo County, to be housed as a county inmate again in the local jail. A new trial will be set after a new judge is assigned, and prosecutors are working now to reconstruct the entire case - 14 years ago there was a different sheriff, district attorney, investigators, etc.

And, Tishomingo County will be footing the bill for a trial that has attracted national attention. The jail will have to house and support an inmate who is reportedly on medication for a variety of ailments. Costs for a trial of this consequence could be a significant impact on a county with a budget the size of Tishomingo County's.

Why Now?

In recent weeks leading up to the proposed execution date,

Byrom and her attorneys have launched a press campaign claiming evidence exists that Byrom, Jr. confessed to committing the murder to a forensic psychologist, and that the testimony of that psychologist was not heard by jury at her trial. Media outlets from the Jackson Free Press to CNN have been carrying stories telling of the trial and pending death sentence.

In the 2000 trial, her attorneys, trying their first capital case, did not call the psychologist to testify, believing that testimony would be more useful during an appeal. They also apparently had Michelle Byrom waive her right to have a jury decide her sentence, leaving the decision to just Tishomingo County Circuit Court Judge Thomas Gardner. Presented with a murder-for-hire scheme described by the prosecution, and with little else to go on, Gardner imposed the death sentence.

In a second appeal to the Mississippi State Supreme Court in 2006 where the court denied her a new trial in a 5-3 decision, the dissenting opinion of Justice Jess H. Dickinson stated, "I have attempted to conjure up in my imagination a more egregious case of ineffective assistance of counsel during the sentencing phase of a capital case, and I cannot."

Also mentioned in the recent media campaign are letters allegedly written by Byrom, Jr. in which he indicated his participation in the crime. Junior testified against his mother during the trial as part of a plea bargain. He later pled guilty to several charges in the murder-for-hire scheme, including conspiracy to commit murder. Gardner sentenced him to 50 years in prison, with 20 years suspended. He's out now, and living in Tupelo. Junior's Facebook page and other social media sites have been taken down in the past week.

TCEPA Board: Business Must Pay Underbilled \$18,000 for Power Used

The Tishomingo County Electric Power Association voted Monday night to rescind its December decision to require the owner of Pattie's One Stop to pay the balance of an underbilled bill of more than \$18,000 that dates back about two years. At the December 17th, 2013 meeting, the board supported the recommendation of General Manager Robert Grisham to allow business owner Pattie Ferguson to pay back about \$18,000 for power used by her gas station/convenience store over the course of two years that the meter company's meter-reading crew had incorrectly recorded, charging her for only about as much power as she was using. By the time the error was caught by the power company, the amount that was underbilled was more than \$18,000. The board set up a payment plan allowing Ferguson to pay back the underbilling over 120 months.

In Monday night's meeting, five TCEPA board members voted to rescind the December decision, but according to the rules, a two-thirds majority is required for such a motion

to pass, so the motion failed. The issue had been tabled in January and February, as the board president, Jimmy Marlin, was not able to attend the meetings due to illness, and requested the board not act on the issue in his absence.

A hearing last Friday with Northern District Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley resulted in Presley finding there had been no discrimination in TCEPA's billing of Ferguson, and he recommended her charges for the underbilling be limited to six months, with TCEPA absorbing the balance. Presumably TCEPA would pass on that expense across the board to other TCEPA customers.

After the board failed to rescind its December 2013 vote to have Ferguson pay the underbilled amount, TCEPA board member Kenneth "Chubby" Clingan said he resigned from the board. However, the board voted not to accept his resignation.

In previous meetings, Grisham has said that the faulty remote meter-reading system that caused the underbilling in this case had been fixed.

TCHS Hires New Football Coach

At press time, the Tishomingo School Board reported that they met in special session Wednesday morning to consider approving (upon the recommendation of Principal Jackie Beals) the hiring of James Preston Leathers as Head Football Coach and Math teacher at Tishomingo County High School and that he was unanimously approved.

According to a release from the District, Coach Leathers is a graduate of Pontotoc High School and earned his Education degree from the University of Mississippi. He is married and has one child not yet in school.

His coaching experience includes:

- Starkville High School 2010/2014-Offensive Coordinator and coached 9th Grade
- Starkville High School 2010/2011-Wide Receivers and coached 9th Grade

- Itawamba High School 2006/2010-Coached offense and quarterback
- Olive Branch High School 2005/2006-Coached running backs

Overall record for teams he has been a part of is 102 wins-37 losses. He was part of the 2012 State Championship Starkville team, and coached in four north half championship games (2-2). He has coached in four division championships, and coached three NCAA Division 1 quarterbacks.

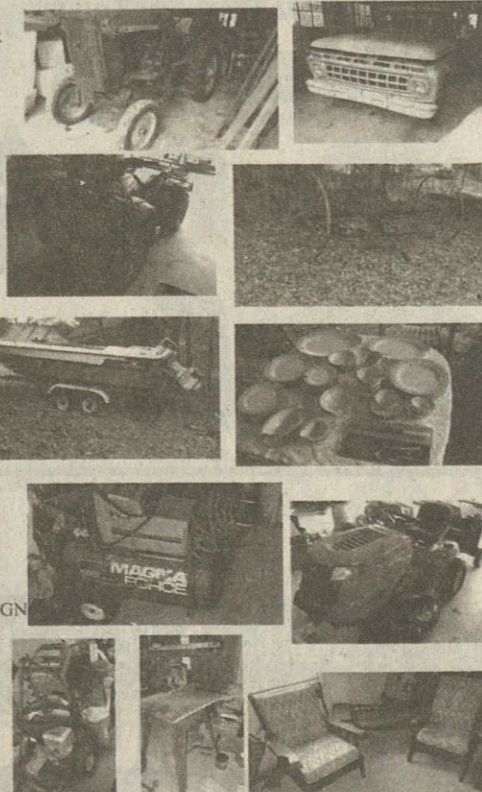

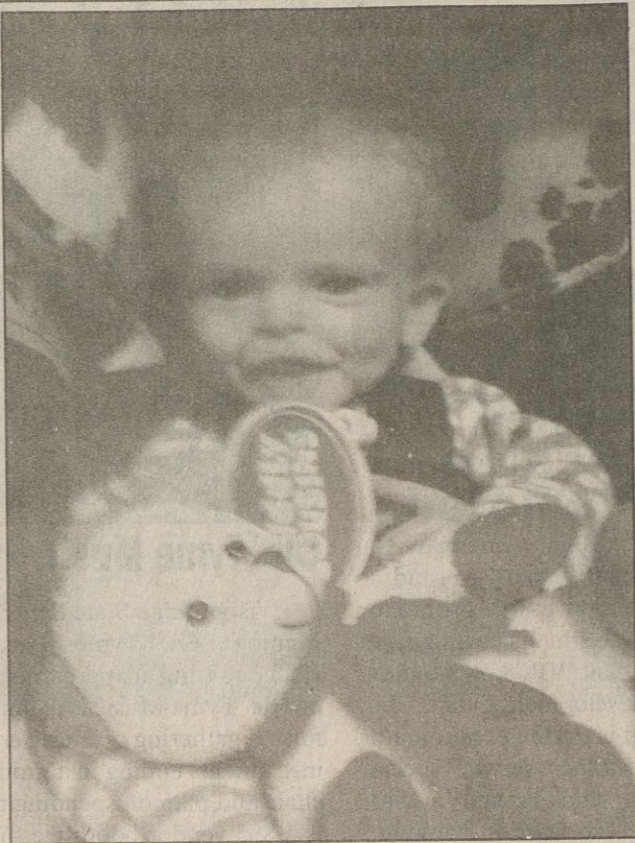

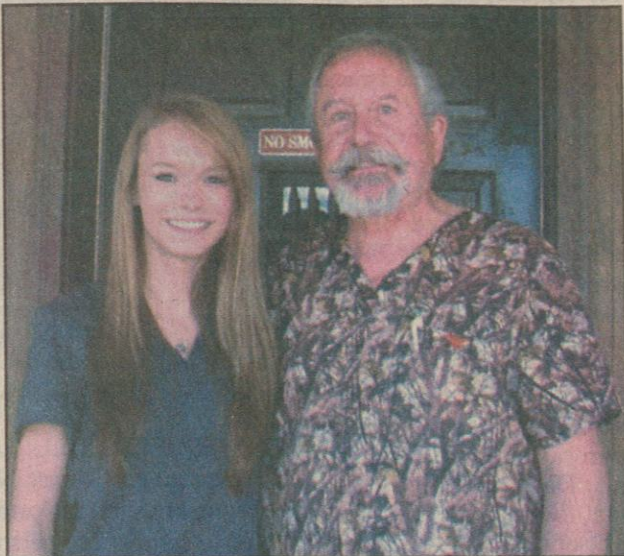

Are All Of God's Offers Legitimate?

John 3:14-19 may help us here: "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved. He that believeth on Him is not condemned, but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the

condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil." John 3:14 is taken from Numbers 21:4-9, which I will not give here because of space. The story shows, however, that Israel was murmuring and God sent poisonous snakes that bit many people and many died. When they cried to Moses, and Moses interceded with God, he was told by the Lord to make a serpent of brass and raise it up on a pole. Anyone who had been bitten by a serpent could look at the serpent of brass and live. Jesus drew a parallel between this and the cross. The only requirement of the bitten person was that he look, in faith of course, to the brass serpent to be

healed. The only requirement for men to be saved from sin is that they look to Christ on the cross by faith!

Was the human will involved in the people who looked at the serpent to be healed? Certainly there was such an act of the will, and so it is with salvation from sin. Nobody had to look to the serpent, and nobody has to look to the cross, yet anybody may do so and be saved by faith! Jesus came to save the world, not to condemn it, but that does not mean that all of the world will be saved, for only those who receive Jesus will be saved. If He came to save the world, then He was willing that all of the people of the world be saved, so where is the problem? It is in the human will that acts to reject Christ's offer, and I do believe that human beings have the power to reject a legitimate offer of God. Here is an interesting piece of Scripture found in I Kings 11:38: "And it shall be, if thou wilt hear-

ken unto all that I command thee, and wilt walk in My ways, and do that is right in My sight, to keep My statutes and My commandments, as David My servant did; that I will be with thee, and build thee a sure house, as I built for David, and will give Israel unto thee." God spoke these words to "Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin". This expression is used of Jeroboam in II Kings 14:24 and in many other places. The point is that Jeroboam sinned and led Israel into sin, yet God had offered him a bona fide offer, when He offered to build him a house (kingdom) like David and to give Israel to him. So, the offer of salvation is legitimate to all, but it is up to the will of man to act in faith to take it! It is man's love of his own sin that keeps him from being saved, not the will of God Who has refused to save him!

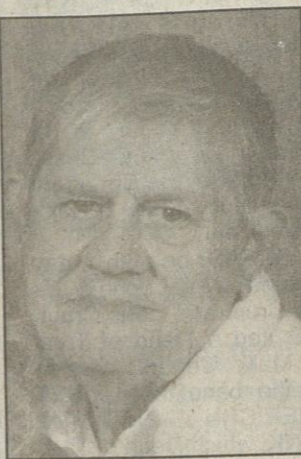

Conservation Corner

Use the Right Hook for the Right Fish

Spring is upon us and thousands of anglers will take to Mississippi's waters to try their luck at fishing. Whether it is a seasoned angler competing in a local bass tournament, or a father and child spending a quiet af-ternoon catching bream on a farm pond, everyone who goes fishing wants to be successful.

A veteran angler will be the first one to tell you that in order to be successful you must have "the right tool for the job." Just as bass anglers rely on certain lures to catch bass under certain conditions, anglers who pursue panfish and catfish rely on certain equipment as well.

One of the most important pieces of fishing equip-ment an angler can have is the hook. Certain hooks work best in a given situation, which is probably why there is such a variety of hooks on the market. There are literally hundreds of hooks for an angler to choose from.

According to Rob Ballinger, a wildlife biologist with Wildlife Mississippi, "The first thing to consider when purchasing a hook is the size of the mouth of the fish you are pursuing. Most panfish have extremely small mouths, so you will need a small hook. Hook sizes in the number 4 to 10 range will work best for panfish. With catfish, hook size is not as critical. The bait you choose for catfish will play more of a role in determining the hook size."

Ballinger states that the next thing to consider is the length of the hook. "When pursuing panfish, a long shank hook such as an aberdeen or carlisle will fit the bill. The long shank will be much easier to remove from the fish's mouth by grasping it with fingers or pliers. A short-shank, wide-gap hook, such as an o'shaughnessy, should do well on tough-mouthed catfish. Circle and kahle style hooks, which have been the favorite of salt-water anglers for many years, are good choices for cat-fish and should increase your catch."

A final consideration should be the wire thickness of the hook. For panfish, a light wire hook has its advan-tages. The light wire will do minimum damage to baits typically used for panfish (minnows, redworms, crickets, waxworms). When fishing around brush tops and other cover where snags are common, light wire hooks will usually straighten out and can be pulled free without breaking the line. A heavy wire hook should be used for catfish as it will penetrate well for solid hook sets and will not straighten out on large fish.

There are other considerations such as hook color and specialized bait-holding hooks. In the end, it will come down to personal preference. Take this initial information and through experience you can come up with your own formula for success.

How to Replace Important Documents

If your wallet has ever been lost or stolen, you know what a pain it is to replace your driv-er's license. That goes double when other vital documents like your, passport, birth certificate or car registration are misplaced or destroyed in a natural disaster. Without the proper ID, you can't start a new job, buy a house, apply for insurance or a host of other common transac-tions.

Here's a guide on how to get copies or re-placements for many common documents:

Birth, death, marriage and divorce cer-tificates. These records come from the states where the events occurred. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has a handy directory that provides links to the appropriate agencies in all U.S. states and territories, in-cluding costs and mailing instructions (www.cdc.gov/nchs/w2w.htm).

Passport. Immediately report lost or stolen passports to the U.S. State Department by call-ing 877-487-2778. If it happens overseas, con-tact the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate. Visit http://travel.state.gov/passport/lost/lost_848.html for further instructions.

Driver's license, car registration. To learn how to replace your driver's license, vehicle registration or car title (which you'll need to transfer ownership), or to access other motor vehicle services, contact the Department of Motor Vehicles. Go to www.usa.gov/Topics/Motor-Vehicles.shtml for links to each state's DMV.

Social Security card. These days, you may not actually need to replace a misplaced Social Security card. If you know your Social Secu-rity number, you generally can still collect So-cial Security benefits, get a job and apply for government benefits and services. However, if you do want to replace the card, you'll need to gather documents proving your identity and citizenship and complete an application (www.ssa.gov/online/ss-5.pdf); then mail or take the paperwork to your local Social Security office.

Military service records. Veterans often need copies of their military service records to apply for government programs, including health care, retirement or education benefits. You can apply to the National Archives (www.archives.gov/veterans) for a copy of your re-cords (or an immediate family member's if de-ceased). The site also has information on re-placing lost military medals and awards.

Green card. If your U.S. Permanent Resi-dent (Green) Card is lost, stolen or damaged, or if your name or other important informa-tion has legally changed since it was issued, you may request a new card from the U.S. Citi-zenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) by filing Form I-90 (available at <http://www.uscis.gov>). If you're outside the U.S. and lose your green card, contact the nearest U.S. con-sulate or USCIS office before applying online for a new card.

Medicare card. To replace a lost, stolen or damaged Medicare card, follow the procedures at <https://secure.ssa.gov/apps6z/IMRC/main.html>. To replace a Medicaid card, con-tact Medicaid (www.medicaid.gov).

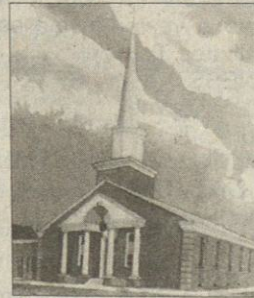
Tax returns. If you need exact copies of previously filed and processed tax returns (in-cluding attachments), you may order them from the IRS by submitting IRS Form 4506 (at www.irs.gov). There is a \$57 fee for each year's return you request. Before ordering an exact copy, however, ask whether a "tax return tran-script" or "tax account transcript" will suffice. These abbreviated printouts of returns are of-ten acceptable substitutes for student loan and mortgage lenders and are free. To order tran-scripts, go to www.irs.gov/Individuals/Order-a-Transcript.

School transcripts. If you need to order high school or college transcripts, it's best to contact the school's registrar or student serv-ices office directly for instructions. (Some web-sites that claim they can expedite the process have proven unreliable.)

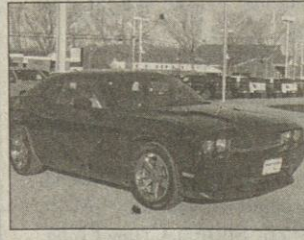

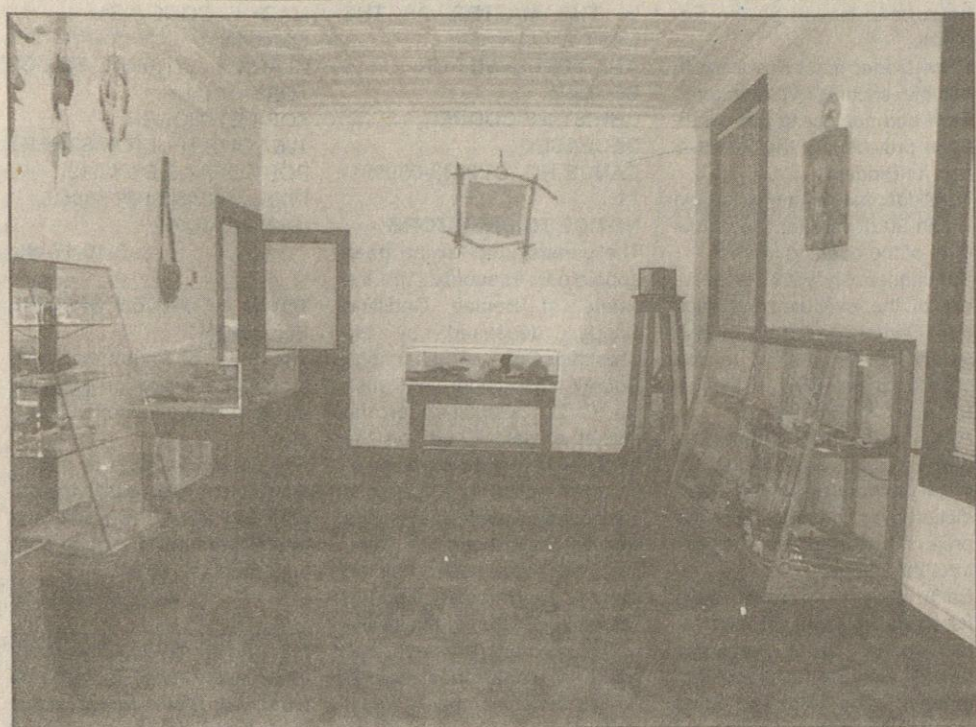

Native American Room at the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse

Another room renovation is now complete at the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum thanks to volunteers Cindy Nelson, Janice Switcher, Helah Switcher, and two community service workers. When TCHGS became stewards of the building in 2004, the room was used as a teaching classroom to explore Native American Culture. Later, the room became a necessary archival room. With the recent renovations of the two adjoining smaller rooms which now serve as archival and storage rooms, this larger room is now the Native American Interpretive Room again.

"We've all heard the saying that your first guess is usually the correct answer, well, this is just our way of going back to some of our original ideas of how we want to represent Tishomingo County as a historical & genealogical society," said Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society President Cindy Nelson.

In 2004, a couple of volunteers wanted to be involved with the museum and asked what subject we would like to teach to our student visitors. Native American history was my first desire, said Nelson, and they established a teaching classroom just for that. Later, as our collections grew and the volunteers moved away to another state, we didn't have new volunteers or staff that could offer this service and the idea just got put on the back burner. We still have the material we used back then and we will be working toward obtaining new information and new knowledge about all our Indian Cultures which are native to our area. Time and money are the only setback for us here at the museum. We are infinitely understaffed and underfunded.
