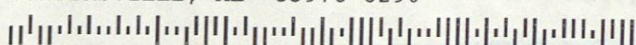

Tishomingo County Sheriff Whitlock released information on several arrests this week, including:

Battle of Iuka and Farmington Plans Sketched Out for Historic Weekend

General Robert E. Lee, General Ulysses S. Grant, Lt. General Nathan Bedford Forrest, General P.G.T. Beauregard, General Albert Sidney Johnston...

At last week's committee meeting for the 2014 Battle of Iuka and Farmington, it sounded like a who's who of famous Civil War commanders, and it turns out nearly all of them will be represented by living history reenactors at this year's commemoration, scheduled for September 19th and 20th.

Combining with the Battle of Farmington this year for the first time, the Battle of Iuka will benefit from more than seven years of contacts and experience Farmington organizers bring to the table. Additionally, Farmington mayor Dale Fortenberry brings along Cleburne's Division Artillery, an organization of hundreds of reenactors from all over the country.

"With this alliance, you get the command and control of Cleburne's Division, who will police all the participating troops, the cannons, the site, and see to safety considerations from infantry rifles to health of cavalry horses," explained Battle of Iuka "General" Harold Lomenick.

Cleburne's Division troops routinely participate in large battles like Shiloh, Gettysburg and Chickamauga, he said. But Fortenberry's involvement with them brought them to Farmington, and they have chosen the Iuka-Farmington engagement this fall instead of the Battle of Atlanta reenactment, which is reportedly the same weekend.

In addition to the expected beefed-up reenactments (one Saturday, one Sunday, and potentially some random cannon fire at night), plans still include

several favorite events and activities Iuka "civilians" have enjoyed the past two years like the Grand Ball and Education Day.

Education day this year will be in town on Friday, September 19th, at Mineral Springs Park, under the shade trees, as opposed to on the Battlefield, where there were a few heat-related issues with students and volunteers in 2013. The guest "generals," many of whom are serious history scholars, will speak to the students from county schools, and there will be cannon demonstrations and other period information sessions for the students.

The Grand Ball will again be held Saturday evening and the 52nd Regimental String Band

Division of Battle & Heritage Festival Allow for Additional History Activities

For the past two years, the Battle of Iuka Committee has partnered with Iuka Heritage to produce the Battle of Iuka 150th and 151st Commemorations the same weekend as the long running Iuka Heritage Festival - which is always on Labor Day weekend.

But after two years of miserable heat, combined with wool reenactor uniforms, Battle organizers opted to separate from Heritage Day and push the Commemoration back a few weeks, to the original anniversary of the September 19th battle, and hope for just a little relief from the heat for everyone involved.

Iuka's Heritage Day observations actually began 27 years ago with the 125th Anniversary of the Battle of Iuka, when there was a reenactment, but over the years, the "history" part of Heritage Day was replaced by fun family activities, music, and a huge arts and craft sale in Min-

eral Springs Park.

It also allows for utilization of Iuka's assets that are otherwise occupied during the busy Heritage Day weekend - the Downtown and Mineral Springs Park are two important ones. They are used by the Wheels of North Mississippi Car Club and hundreds of vendors, respectively during the Heritage Festival.

A new event planned is a Military parade through downtown Iuka Saturday morning. Organizers envision an infantry, wagon and cavalry parade through the historic Downtown, with as many "townfolk" on hand to wish them well before they head to battle, which is much what it would have been like during the Civil War.

Preceding the troops will be as many civilians in period dress as want to participate. They will

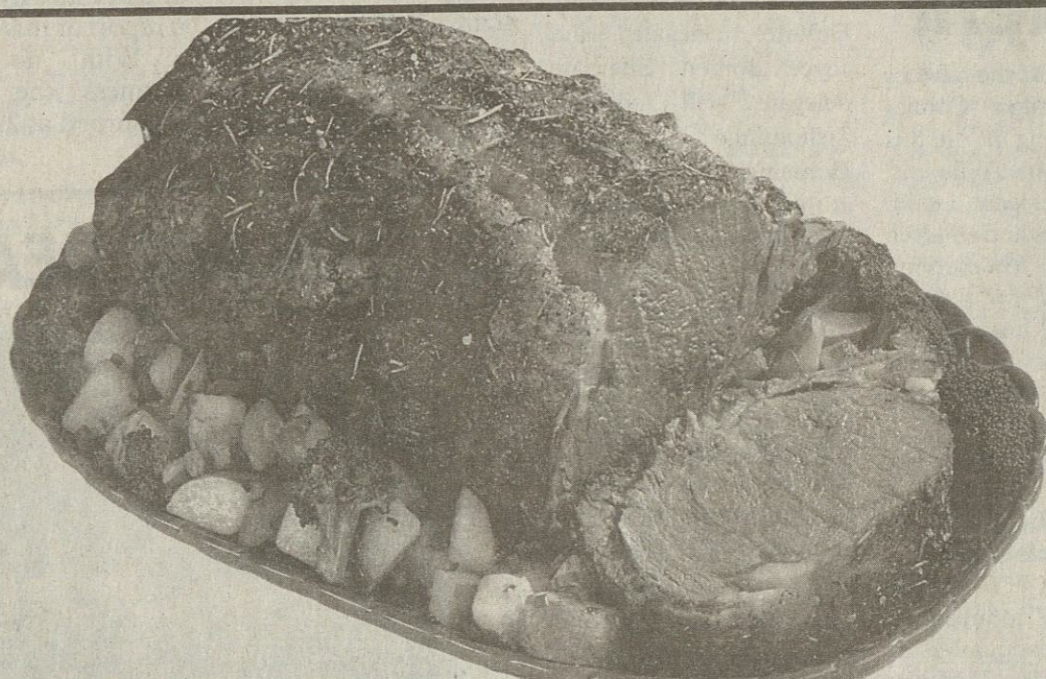

2. To aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight; or
3. To meet other community development needs having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community where other financial resources are not available to meet such needs.

The activities for which these funds may be used are in the areas of housing, public facilities, and economic development. More specific details regarding eligible activities, program requirements, and the rating system will be provided at a public hearing which will be held at the Tishomingo County Boardroom in Iuka, Mississippi on April 25, 2014 at 11:30 A.M. The purpose of this hearing will be to obtain citizen input into the development of the application.

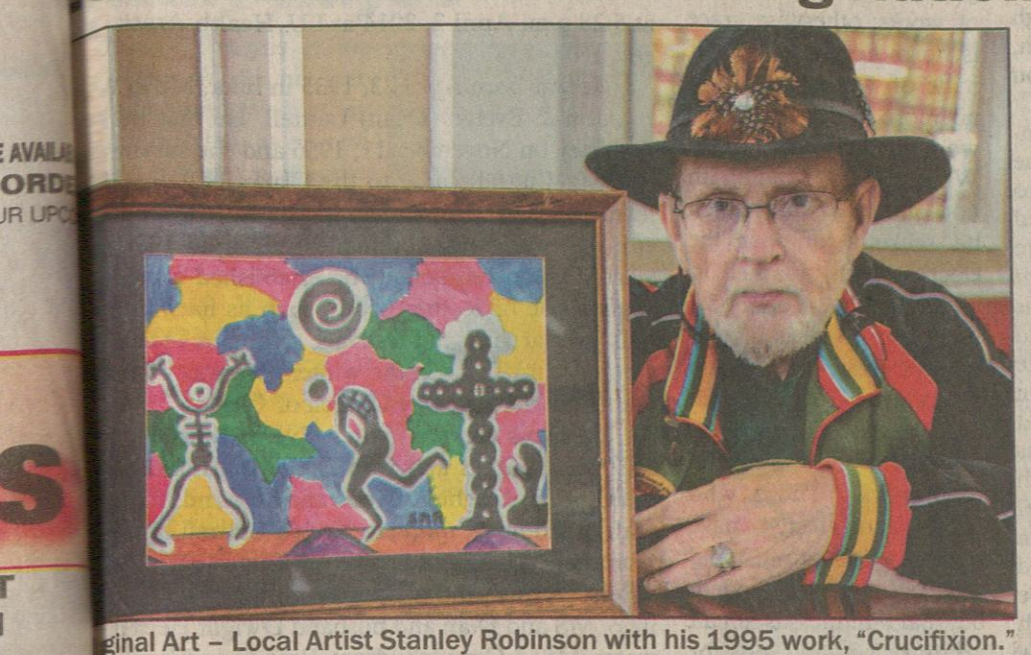

Elect Today?

It amazes me that some people want to completely bypass the Bible doctrine of election. As I stated in an earlier article, I do not have the last word on election, nor to I claim to fully understand it. I have been learning, as one man used to say, that there are some things about God that no man fully understands, and may never fully understand. It is a great day when we come to realize that God has not disclosed to mankind every aspect of His infinite knowledge and wisdom. Deuteronomy 29:29 says, "The secret things belong unto the LORD our God: but those things that are revealed belong unto us and to our children for ever, that we may do all

the words of this law." God has some secrets that He will not reveal to mankind, but whatever He has revealed through His Book, the Bible, belongs to us! We are free to explore them all we wish; we can pray for better understanding of them, and we can be assured that the Bible was not given to hide God's truth, not even the Book of Revelation! Deuteronomy 30:11-14 says, "For the commandment which I command thee this day, it is not hidden from thee, neither is it far off. It is not in heaven, that thou shouldest say, Who shall go up for us to heaven, and bring it unto us, that we may hear it, and do it? Neither is it beyond the sea; that thou shouldest say, Who shall go over the sea for us,

and bring it unto us, that we may hear it, and do it? But the word is very nigh unto thee, in thy mouth, and in thy heart, that thou mayest do it."

Please notice the emphasis on knowing the Word of God, in order to do it. God is interested in making Scripture more clear to those who want to obey it! The point is that God is not trying to hide from us what He has already revealed in the Scriptures. With that in mind, notice Romans 11:1-2A: "I say then, Hath God cast away His people? God forbid. For I also am an Israelite, of the seed of Abraham, of the tribe of Benjamin. God hath not cast away His people which He foreknew." Then Romans 11:2B-4 gives the illustration of Elijah, when he thought he was the only "true Israelite" left. I skipped those because of space, but you can read them. Then Romans 11:5-7 says, "Even so then at this present time also there is a remnant according to the elec-

tion of grace. And if by grace, then is it no more of works: otherwise grace is no more grace. But if it be of works, then is it no more grace: otherwise work is no more work. What then? Israel hath not obtained that which he seeketh for; but the election hath obtained it, and the rest were blinded." Note that there is a remnant of Israelites who are "elect", even in the church age. This election is by the grace of God, and not by their works. Those who have been elected have obtained salvation, and the rest have been blinded, but that blindness is not an arbitrary act of God, for Isaiah 6:8-13, when put with Matthew 13:10-16, shows that the Israelites had closed their eyes, ears and hearts, and God merely confirmed their actions!

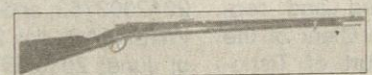
