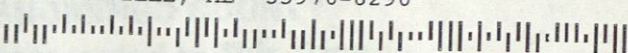

Local Church Vandalized

Authorities are investigating a number of vandalism incidents in the Mt. Gilead area including the New Beginnings Fellowship Church where the words "god is dead" were spray painted on a church building.

The incident probably happened Monday night, though one was there since Sunday evening, when members of the congregation were decorating the church building for Easter Sunday. The church building itself also had spray paint damage. Pastor Jimmy Daniel and his wife Kathy were told of the damage Tuesday, and reported it to the sheriff.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Deputy James

Page, a couple other incidents were reported. A new concrete bridge on County Road 166 also was vandalized, with the words "dead baby here," and "god is dead, get over it..."

Anyone with information about this destruction of private and county properties is asked to contact the Tishomingo County Sheriff Department at 423-7000.

The reports are particularly distressing since it is Easter week, and also in view of the recent success of the movie "God's Not Dead," which has been very popular with people in the area. People are encouraged to tell and text everyone they know the message, "God's Not Dead."

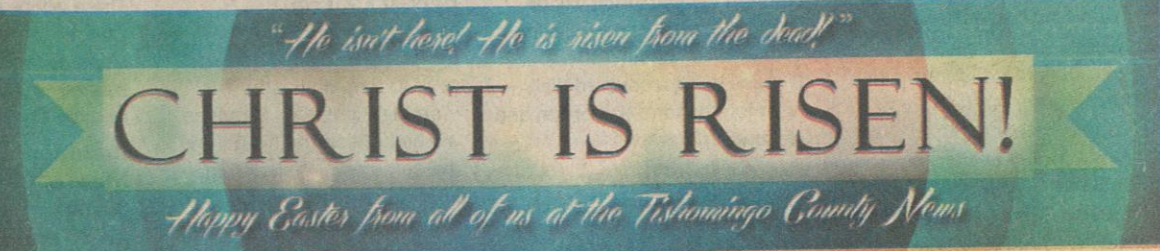

School Board Approves 2014-15 Teachers & Staff and New Policies

New: Board will approve all transfers, instead of superintendent

At Monday evening's school board meeting, several personnel changes were announced including several retirements, resignations and transfers.

Bobby Lowrey, athletic director and science teacher at Tishomingo County High School is among those whose retirement was approved. Coach Lowrey has been at the school since it began and has been a favorite with his students.

Other retirements approved were William Crossett at TCHS, Lisa Sparks at Belmont, and a Daniel at Iuka Elementary. Resignations were approved for Jonathan Moore (TCHS), Cathey Page at Tishomingo Middle.

Coaching changes include

Emily Pearson resigning from the IMS cheer coach position, and Rickey Saint resigning football and softball duties at Tishomingo.

With a new superintendent, Christie Holly, coming into office, some positions at the central office have been shuffled. Katie Crane will replace Christie Holly as Testing Director, and Roy Lawson is moving from IMS principal to Federal Programs and Self Accreditation Director.

Josh McClung will replace Lawson as principal at Iuka Middle School, leaving the position of assistant principal at Tishomingo County High School open. Central office spokesperson Joel Robertson said that the board will expect to hear a recommen-

dation for the position from TC principal Jackie Beals at some future time.

Kathy Ward is coming out of retirement to be counselor at Iuka Elementary.

All the schools submitted lists of staff (both certified and non-certified) to be rehired, and they were approved as part of the consent agenda.

The board also approved the school calendar for 2014-15, with a student start date of August 6th, reflecting that the Mississippi legislature rescinded a bill that would have delayed the start of the school year to no earlier than the third week of August. (Calendar on page 6)

Three policies were voted on at the meeting:

Transfer Approval Given to Board

A significant policy change approved Monday included details for student transfers, including in-district, out-of-district, in-state and out-of-state transfers. The School Board will be responsible for all these decisions, instead of being at the superintendent's discretion as was the previous practice.

The new policy also simplifies the tuition policy for out-of-state transfers. Out-of-state transfers will pay \$300 each year from K-12. If there are more than one student per family, the amount is capped at an annual \$500.

Attendance for Seniors

The new policy will allow students who only need less than

a full day's classes to leave the school after they have completed 63 percent of the day in classes (after 4th period). The students will be able to return for seventh period classes, like band, or sports. Parents must sign for this permission at the school.

Enrollment Requirements

In order for a secondary student to be officially enrolled, he/she must be gainfully involved six periods per day, excluding study hall or student assistant periods (except seniors - see [above]). Cooperative Education students must be enrolled in at least four (4) units of credit. Students may have only one study period or teacher assistant period per day.

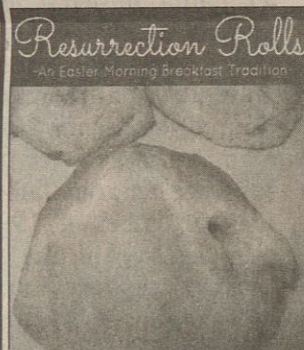
may be lonely but you are never alone because the spirits of your people are always with you in the spirit of the fire."

Thelma and Hank Haynes To Celebrate 70th Anniversary

70 years of togetherness for Thelma Sigler and Clarence Henry Haynes, (known best as Hank), on Friday, April 18, 2014. They met when another girl brought Hank to a friend's birthday party, at which 16 year old Thelma was present. However, once Thelma and Hank met, that girl was history. Hank and Thelma were smitten with one another. He asked her to marry him in November 1943. Before a wedding date could be set, he was drafted by the Army in early 1944. He came home for a 5 day pass before shipping out to the South Pacific, and a wedding was quickly planned. They drove across the state line to Kansas City, KS to be married by a Justice of the Peace on a rainy day, with his Dad and a friend as witnesses.

Hank went to war and Thelma worked as a long distance operator at Southwestern Bell, making \$ 18 a week. This was more than Hank received for fighting in a war; his pay was \$ 50 a month, with a 5 thousand dollar life insurance and no health insurance for Thelma.

He was assigned to the 1st Cavalry, as anti-aircraft artillery personnel. However, when the Lurline Ship arrived in Australia, he was handed a Browning automatic rifle. He survived difficult times in heat, little and at times no food. It was an extremely difficult time; having to take others lives or be killed himself. Today, he would get therapy upon returning home, but in 1945 there was no emotional therapy for soldiers returning from war. In October 1945, Hank returned from the war.

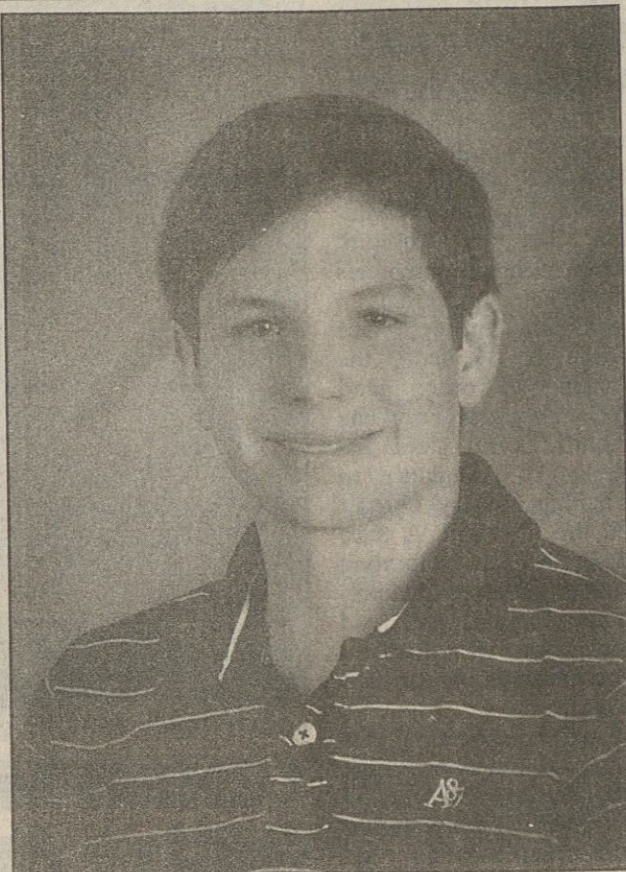
They lived in Kansas City, MO with her parents; with their names on a long waiting list for an apartment. Finally an apartment became available; while living there, their two children were born, Laura and Jim. Hank attended watch repair, engraving and jewelry repair schools. He also worked for MOP Railroad. Hank took a job on the Buick-Olds-Pontiac assembly line, which was owned by General Motors.

In 1952, they moved

to Denver, CO, where Hank had a job with Mountain Bell Telephone Company. Thelma also worked in sales for Mountain Bell Telephone Company. Hank was transferred by Mountain Bell to Pueblo, CO in 1954. However, he quickly landed a job with Strategic Communication Command for the US Government, retiring in 1984. Thelma went to work for the CF & I Steel Mill, retiring after 30 years in 1986.

In 1994, their daughter, Laura, hosted a 50th wedding anniversary party. Exactly one week later, their great grandson was born, Tyler Henry Hoffman. Jennifer named her son after her grandfather. On November 4, 1994, a truck driver hit the car their daughter Laura was driving. Their world was turned upside down. Laura and Jennifer were killed instantly. Tyler survived the accident, as he was in the back seat in his car seat. Thelma, Hank and Tyler became a family unit. In the fall of 2000, they moved to Iuka to be near Thelma's sister, Ellen; niece, Phyllis; and nephew, Phillip. Thelma has lost her sister and nephew since their move to Iuka.

Tyler's grandparents have been devoted to him, showering him with love. They are very happy they moved to Iuka to raise Tyler and have enjoyed their laid back lifestyle here in the hills of MS. Early on, Tyler demonstrated a musical talent which his great-grandparents have encouraged. He graduated from Tishomingo High School in 2012, receiving the Jay Darwin Scholarship. Election Is An Act Of God Through The Grace Of God

I will give Romans 11:5-7 again, because I did not finish with it in the last article: "Even so then at this present time also there is a remnant according to the election of grace. And if by grace, then is it no more of works: otherwise grace is no more grace. But if it be of works, then is it no more of grace: otherwise work is no more work. What then? Israel hath not obtained that which he seeketh for; but the election hath obtained it, and the rest were blinded." Paul is saying that there is a remnant of Israel that is elect, thus saved, in the church age, but the remainder of his argument in Romans chapter 11 is that there is yet a future restoration of Israel as a nation. So, he "picks out" of the nation the remnant that are elect to show that some Israelites are being saved today, thus are a part of the church. (If you happen to believe that the church has replaced Israel, you may want to spend more time studying Romans chapter 11. Moreover, Romans 10:1 shows that Paul has a desire that Israel be saved. If the church is Israel, then Israel is already saved, and there is no need for Paul to pray any such prayer!)

Romans 11:5-6 is so clear on the fact that salvation is totally by the grace of God, apart from any of our works, that there should be no argument about that subject, but there is still a big argument about it. First, I need to say that salvation produces good works; it can never be the reverse, according to Ephesians 2:8-10 and Titus 3:5. I would argue that good works as much as anyone, but I would say that they are the "fruit", not the "root" of salvation. In Romans 11:5-6, we see clear proof that grace and works cannot be mixed to bring about salvation. It is clearly stated, and should be received, that if the election of the remnant of Israel is by the grace of God, then it cannot be also by works, for works and grace cannot be mixed without destroying the meanings of both words. Verse 6 says that if election that brings salvation is by grace, then it cannot be also by works, for then grace would be no longer grace. Then we see the other side of the picture, as it says that if election were by works, then it cannot be also by grace, for then work would not be work. These two verses should clearly show any honest person that election and salvation have to be either by grace, or by works, both cannot be involved in either election or the resulting salvation. I think the reason some people are so set on believing that election and salvation are by works is the fact that they do not want to give anyone an excuse to sin, by saying salvation is a gift, and not attained by any works. When we understand what God is saying here, we will see that works do have a place in the lives of believers, not as a cause of salvation, but as a result of it. Those who say they are saved and live a lifetime for the devil are deceiving themselves, for they are still lost!

April Is Child Abuse Awareness Month We All Have the Responsibility to Report Abuse

April is Child Abuse Awareness Month. Karin Lakin, M.D., director of the Le Bonheur CARES team, wants to remind us of the role we have in protecting the children in our community.

The CARES team at Le Bonheur evaluates children entering our hospital who are possible victims of child abuse and neglect. Patients are referred to CARES by physicians and social workers in the hospital who are concerned that a child's current injuries may be the result of maltreatment. When children are referred, the team performs medical and psychosocial assessments of those children and their families.

Dr. Lakin recently discussed child abuse and ways to recognize signs of abuse:

Have you ever found yourself in a situation where you were concerned that a child was being abused? You must first recognize the signs of abuse in order to help a child.

Child abuse comes in many forms:

- physical abuse
- sexual abuse
- emotional abuse
- neglect

Some types of abuse leave obvious signs, while other signs are more subtle. Often, the various types of abuse overlap. A physically abused child may also be neglected and not have medical needs addressed by the caregiver. A sexually abused child may also be emotionally abused by the predator.

Physical Abuse

Signs of physical child abuse include injuries that are inconsistent with the explanation. A child may suffer from recurring injuries or repeated trips to the emergency room. Injuries blamed on behaviors that are inconsistent for the child's age are suspicious for abuse. A caregiver may give different stories to explain an injury.

Sexual Abuse Signs

Signs of sexual abuse may be more difficult to notice. These include sophisticated sexual knowledge or behavior in a young child. A sudden change in sleep patterns, nightmares, bedwetting or physical complaints like headaches and stomach aches are also warning signs. Physical symptoms may include frequent urinary tract infections or contraction of sexually transmitted diseases. Often, a child may disclose a sexual abuse incident to an adult. Sometimes this may be the only sign, therefore all accounts should be taken very seriously.

Emotional Abuse

Emotionally abused children are often belittled or berated. They may be ignored by the caregiver or treated poorly in comparison to siblings. Neglected children may be unkempt, malnourished or frequently unsupervised. In this particular situation of abuse, a child's medical, educational and physical needs may not be provided by caregivers.

Child abuse is a difficult subject for everyone and many people are confused about reporting it. Fear creates barriers to reporting. We may be reluctant to become involved if we don't know the child. We may fear breaking up a model family, that no one will believe us or get in trouble for reporting abuse if it is unfounded.

What efforts can be made to prevent abuse?

- Individually, connect with the children in your life. As a parent, friend or other family member, be supportive of a child and take time to listen to them. Really engage with them at their level and let them know they are valued and important.

- Be supportive of other parents and caregivers. Lead by example to younger, less experienced parents. Offer to assist a parent in need of childcare in an emergency.

- At a community level, participate in activities with children that promote child well-being. Be vocal regarding your communities response to children exposed to violence. Stay informed and support legislative efforts that address that affect children and families including economic issues, safety, housing and education.

Reporting child abuse may save a child's life and is a person's moral responsibility. In most states, reporting abuse is also a legal responsibility. All persons, including doctors, mental health professionals, child care providers, schools, dentists, family members and friends must report suspected cases of child abuse or neglect.

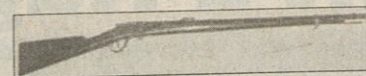
