The Tishomingo County Master Gardeners are having their Annual Plant Sale on Saturday, April 26th at the Fairgrounds in Iuka beginning at 9:00 a.m. The Tishomingo County MHV Cultural Arts Contest will also be held and the crafts will be displayed.

During the day, you can get soil pH tested FREE OF CHARGE and you can get answers to questions concerning soil testing, pH and fertilization. If you would like to have your garden, lawn, flower bed tested, bring out a pint of soil taken from the top 4-6 inches of 10-15 spots from your sample area. In other words, get a good representative sample. Place it

in a ziplock bag and bring it to the fairgrounds on April 26th.

Arts and Crafts vendors and implement dealers are welcome as well as farm and garden suppliers but please call Danny Owen at 423-7016 so that space can be reserved for you. If electricity is needed there will be a \$10 charge per booth but otherwise, all space is free.

The Master Gardeners will have a variety of plants available. The sale will begin at 9 a.m. in the south pavilion. Prices will be cheap! They will have Belle of Georgia peach, Gala apple, Moonglow pear, old fashion snowball, red weigelia, white crepe myrtle, bald cypress, hazelnut, dwarf and regu-

lar nandinas, nuttall oak, sawtooth oak, golden rain-tree, bald cypress, knockout roses, coneflowers, hen & chicks plant, purple butterfly bush, forsythia (yellow bells), leather leaf mahonia, burning bushes, purple datura (angle trumpet), English dogwood, assorted herbs, variegated hostas, oak leaf hydrangea, spider lilies, pepper plants (Camelot) and tomato plants (Bella Rosa, Amelia, Roma, Big Beef, Beef Steak, Cherry). There will be many other plants offered for sale. Refreshments will be sold at reasonable prices.

Funds raised will go toward supporting Master Gardener Projects throughout the county.

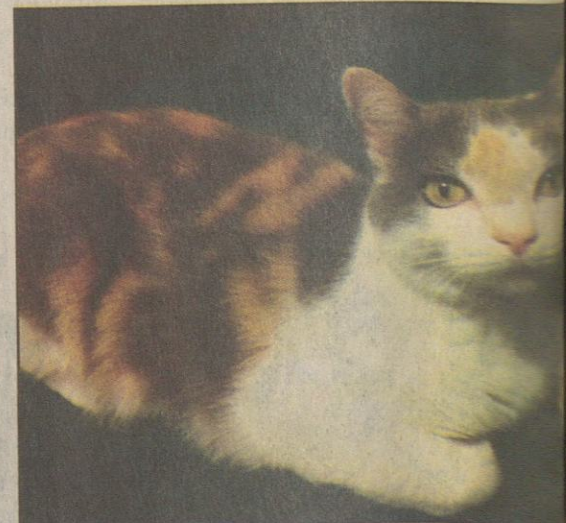

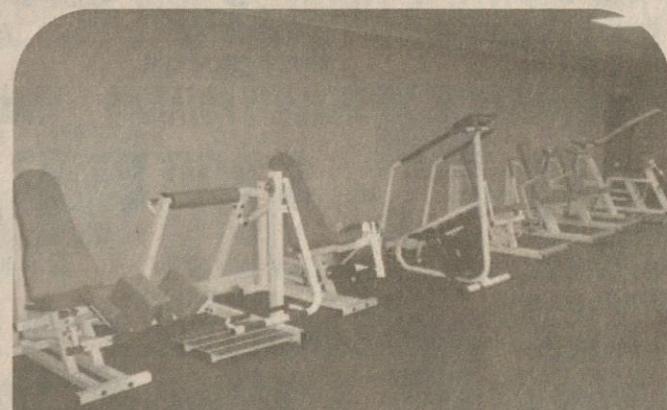

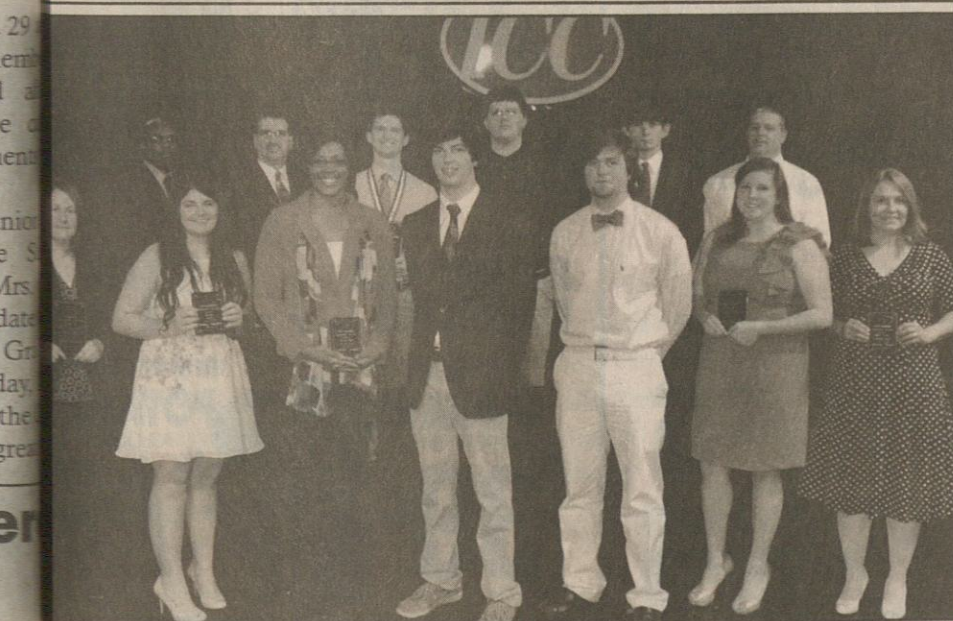

The Bible In Miniature

I have often referred to Romans chapter 12 as: "The Bible in miniature", although I know that not all of the Bible is covered in this one chapter. My thinking, however, is that this chapter covers so many things that are required of believers, it is almost like a small Bible in one chapter. I happen to believe that God has given us everything we need to be saved and to live the Christian life in one book, the Bible. Yes, there are many good books about the Bible, which have been written by men, but they are not on a par with the Bible. Although some people speak of someone being inspired to write a certain song or a particular book, yet no one has been inspired in the same sense that the writers of the Bible were inspired. Some people of all ages since the beginning of the writing of Scripture have recognized that the Bible is different than any other book. Yes, I realize that it came to us by about 40 different writers over a period of about 1600 years, yet the Spirit of God inspired these writers.

With these things said, let's get into Romans chapter 12 to see a chapter that gives many great admonitions concerning how we should live as believers. Romans 12:1 says, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." Paul the apostle is the writer of Romans, so he is beseeching (begging or pleading with) the believers in the church at Rome to present their bodies to God for His service. Notice that Paul pleads with these believers in light of the fact that they have received the mercy of God, in that they have been saved from the sins, which deserved judgment. It is a great day when any of us realize that God did not owe it to us to save us; it was an act of mercy. (Mercy means that God holds back the judgment that we really deserve.) Let's think for a moment about the matter of our bodies. I hear preachers say about the body: "This old fleshly body is no good; it is sinful and can never do anything for God." I beg to disagree with that kind of statement, although many good men have made it. When the Bible talks about the evil of "the flesh", it is speaking about our old nature received from Adam, not about the flesh and bones body. The human body can be used for good or bad, otherwise our verse would never tell us to present our bodies as living sacrifices that God can accept. It is a fact that all believers need to be admonished to give the strength of their bodies to the service of the Lord, because there is a subtle temptation for us to use our physical bodies to advance our own causes! So, we need to understand that God really wants our bodies to be given to Him! I Corinthians 6:13B says, "...Now the body is not for fornication, but for the Lord; and the Lord for the body." This verse makes it clear that God is speaking about our mortal bodies being "for the Lord", and the Lord for our bodies!

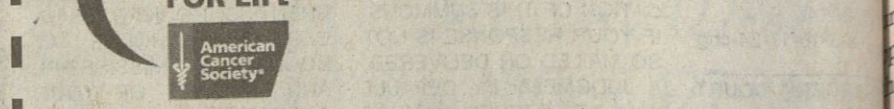

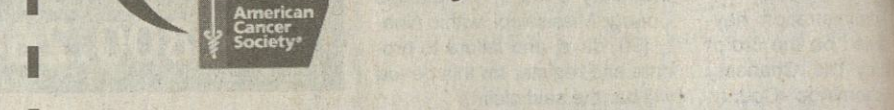

The application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. **No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.** Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. The five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;
2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;
3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or;
4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.
5. All voters who are members of the Armed Services, Their Spouses, Dependents, and Overseas Citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office.

No absentee ballots may be hand delivered. Saturday, May 3, will be the last day a person may register to vote and be eligible to vote in the June 3 Primary Election. Saturday, May 31 will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the June 3, 2014 Primary Elections. All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 2, in order to be eligible to be counted for the June 3, 2014 Primary Elections.

NOTE: Beginning with the June 3, 2014 Primary Elections, all voters who go to the voting precinct on Election Day and all voters who come in person to the circuit clerk's office to vote by absentee will be required to show an acceptable form of Photo ID.

The June 3 Primary Election will be to elect someone to the United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives. There will be a Primary Election on June 3 for both the Democratic Party and the Republican Party. You will declare the Party you wish to vote in when you go to the polls on June 3 or when you come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee. The candidates on the Democratic Ballot are:

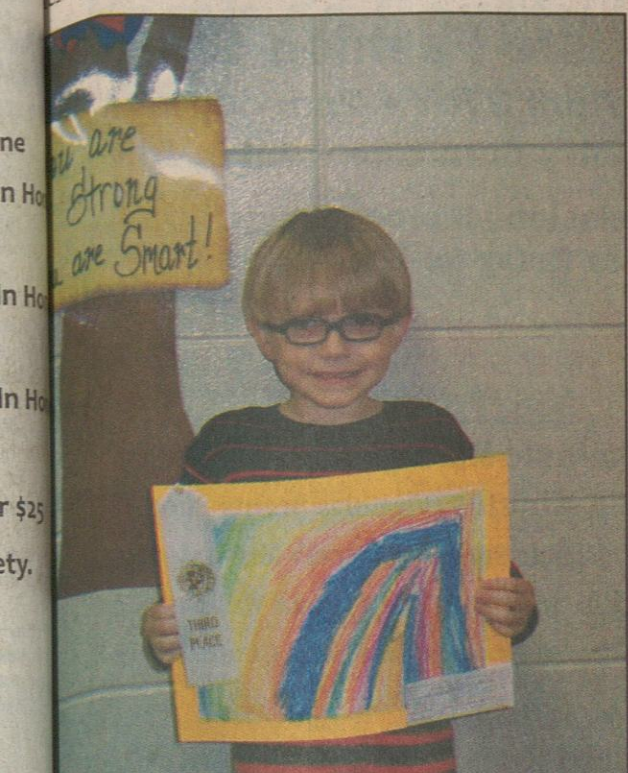
