## Board Votes Monday to Allow Sunday Sales in County

By Wednesday morning, rumors circulate that board may reconsider decision

Monday morning, the county board voted 3-2 to approve Sunday beer sales at county stores in response to requests from Pickwick Lake marina operators for the expanded sales hours.

But, at presstime Wednesday, courthouse sources report that First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom was trying to pull in other board members to bring the issue back up for consideration. Since the board officially "recessed" from the Monday meeting, as is their usual practice, they can go back into board meeting at their convenience, without any public notice being posted.

No legal notice regarding the amendment to the 2013 ordinance was provided in time for printing, and the notice must be printed for three weeks in the newspaper. Had it been published this week, the first legal sales would have begun Memorial Day weekend.

According to the Monday decision by the board, stores in the county where beer is sold would be able to sell from 10 a.m. until 9 p.m. on Sundays, following the legally-mandated publication process.

The marinas, represented at the meeting by operators from Grand Harbor and Eastport Marina, claim to be the biggest tourism draw in the county, and to pay the biggest chunk of sales tax in the county. At Eastport, it's approximately \$100,000 a month, said Wallace Young, of Eastport Marina, and they would appreciate it if the board could support them.

"These folks purchase a lot of secondary items in addition to beer, including fuel and snacks, coolers and other equipment," explained Young. "If they can't get what they want here, they are going to Tennessee to get it, and that is just throwing away that money and hurting Tishomingo County businesses."

The vote Monday was requested by Young, who attended the board's April 17th meeting, but was told by the board they would consider the matter and let him know. Monday, the board also proposed discussing it outside of the meeting, to decide what to do, but Young, who said he never heard anything from them the last time, asked that they please at least put it to a vote. Third District Supervisor Danny Ryan made the motion to vote, and Greg Collier (5th)

seconded it. The vote was 3-2, with Second District Supervisor Nicky McRae, and Fourth District Supervisor Steve Thorne opposing, and supporting votes by Ryan, Collier and First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom.

Since the county voted last year to legalize alcohol and beer sales, the county board and all the municipalities enacted ordi-

nances dictating rules concerning sales and establishments. It has always been at the discretion of the board to establish sales hours, according to state laws. They are not required to ask for public approval, or a hearing to amend the ordinance.

Despite his supporting vote of the ordinance during the meeting, Supervisor Grissom afterward said, "I just want to say

I think it's a shame that people would be out on the lake wanting to buy beer instead of being in church on Sunday."

Alcohol-selling establishments within the county's municipalities will still be under city ordinances, which prohibit Sunday sales in each town except Burnsville.

## Iuka Board Awards Contract to Renovate Park Youth Center

At the Iuka City Board meeting Monday night, aldermen awarded bids for renovation of the Mineral Springs Park Youth Center.

Calenco, LLC was the successful bidder for the renovation, which has a budget of \$150,000. Calenco, from the Shoals area, bid \$126,990 for the renovation, which will include a new roof, doors and window replacements, upgrades to the restrooms to bring them into ADA (American Disabilities Act) compliance, and improvements to the front to increase the windows and natural lighting. Construction should begin around the end of June, said City Clerk Benny Gray.

There is potentially a second phase to the upgrade, depending on grant funds, to upgrade the kitchen area.

In addition to regular use by community and youth groups, the Youth Center, built in the 1960s,

is currently used by the Boys and Girls Club after school.

The board also signed a non-binding letter of intent to construct a wastewater treatment plant and power generating facility at the lagoon. Gray explained that it would take sewer/wastewater and transform it to purified water. The agreement is with Synergy World Energy, LLC, and Langenburg Technologies and would be at no expense to the city, Gray said. It could potentially keep the city from having to spend money, to build a sewer treatment plant, and it would generate power from the process. Negotiations with TVA to sell the power would be required.

The board also approved an agreement with LGS to have them negotiate the city's cable TV services when they come up for contract renewal, said Gray.

## Lack of Noise Ordinance Keeping Mill Creek Homeowner Awake

The county doesn't have an enforceable noise ordinance, and a citizen asked the county board to consider one at Monday's meeting.

A citizen who lives across from the new bar entertainment establishment called The Hideaway asked the county to give the sheriff's department something enforceable to control late-night

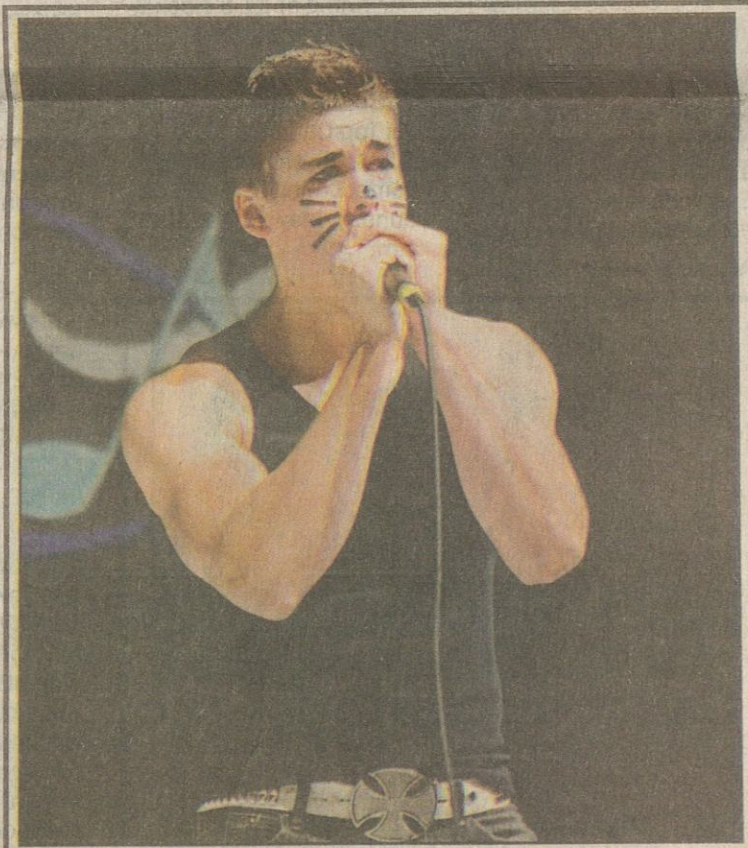
noise at a tavern that recently opened near his home. According to the citizen, noise is only a problem after about 11 p.m. on nights the Hideaway has live music or karaoke. He has called the sheriff's department, but other than coming by and asking the proprietors to keep the noise down, there's not much else to do, since there's no ordinance on the books giving them further authority.

"Since the county has gone 'wet,' this is the only real issue we have had problems with," explained Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, who was at the board meeting. There have been some recent problems from a private home out at Eastport, where noise has been disturbing the peace of nearby long-time landowners, too, but since it is from a private home, it's a different issue, explained the sheriff.

"I came here, and bought my place, because I wanted the peace and quiet of the country," said the citizen who addressed the board. "I'd like to be able to sleep with my windows open this time of year, and it's just a problem."

The Board tasked Board Attorney Phillip Whitehead with researching a potential county noise ordinance that they board could act upon.

Board President Nicky McRae said that he wanted to make sure that any noise ordinance did not impact the ability of industrial businesses like those at the Yellow Creek Port to do their work during the overnight shift.

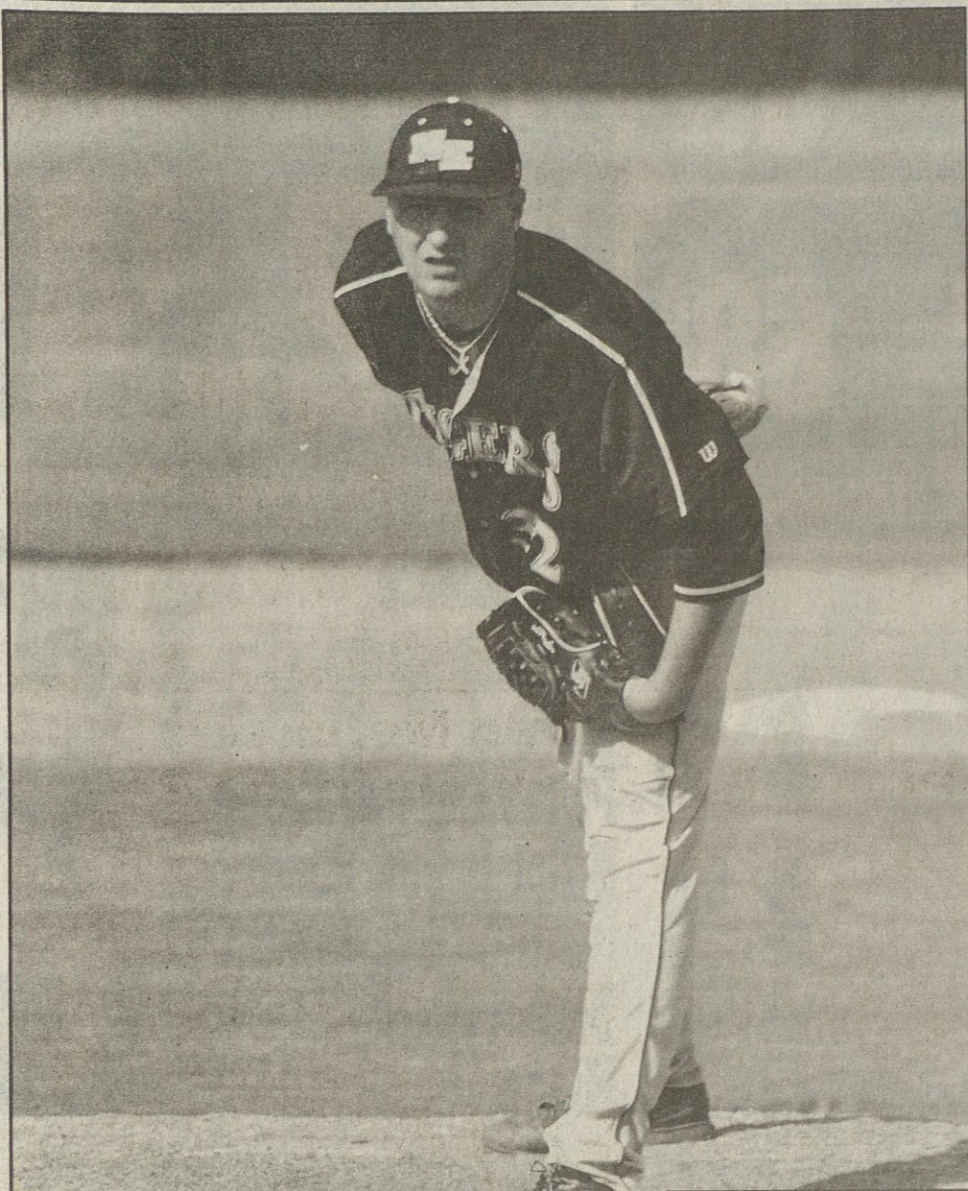

## Two Mississippi Youth Honored for Volunteerism at National Award Ceremony in Washington, D.C.

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Mississippi's top two youth volunteers of 2014, Reagan Norwood, 17, of Biloxi and Jonah Holland, 14, of Belmont, were honored in the nation's capital last night for their outstanding volunteer service during the 19th annual presentation of The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards. Reagan and Jonah – along with 100 other top youth volunteers from across the country – each received \$1,000 awards and personal congratulations from Academy Award-winning actor Forest Whitaker at an award ceremony and gala dinner reception held at the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History.

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards program, sponsored by Prudential Financial in partnership with the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP), named Reagan and Jonah Mississippi's top high school and middle level youth volunteers in February. In addition to their cash awards, they each received an engraved silver medallion and an all-expense-paid trip with a parent to Washington, D.C., for four days of recognition events.

Jonah, a member of the Tishomingo County 4-H and a home-schooled eighth-grader, led his 4-H club in raising money to purchase reusable shopping bags that local merchants can use to cut down on the number of plastic

bags that end up in landfills. Jonah's 4-H club had been looking for ways to implement a community-wide recycling program, but because his town is not near a recycling center, a cost-effective solution proved elusive. "It was very discouraging and would have been easy to simply forget about it," said Jonah. But he wouldn't let the idea drop. Jonah continued to do research online and joined several forums where people exchange ideas. "One day while shopping, it hit me that so many merchants offer reusable shopping bags," Jonah said. He wondered, why couldn't the stores in his community do the same thing?

Jonah presented a plan to the city council that could reduce plastic bag use and promote recycling awareness at no cost to the city. With the town's endorsement, Jonah and fellow 4-Hers put up a "road block" to ask drivers to donate their change to the cause, and in three hours they raised more than \$400. The group then ordered reusable shopping bags in the local school colors and distributed them to local merchants, who sell them to customers for \$2 apiece. Not only is the project expected to save merchants money and reduce plastic bag waste, but the \$1 profit on each bag sold will be donated to benefit wounded servicemen, said Jonah.

"These honorees are shining examples of what is possible when young

people use their passion and initiative to help their communities," said Mr. Strangfeld, chairman, CEO of Prudential Financial, Inc. "We are proud to recognize their accomplishments, and look forward to seeing the things they achieve in the future."

"Through their service, these students not only made a difference in the lives of others – they've provided peers with a powerful example of what it looks like to be an outstanding volunteer," said Jane (BJ) Paris, president of NASSP. "Congratulations to each of the honorees for a job well done."

Youth volunteers in grades 5-12 were eligible to apply for 2014 Prudential Spirit of Community Awards last fall. 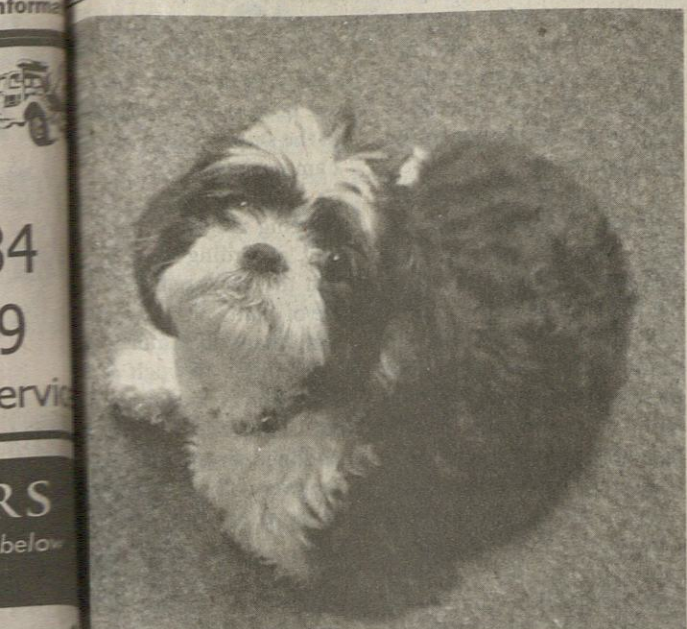

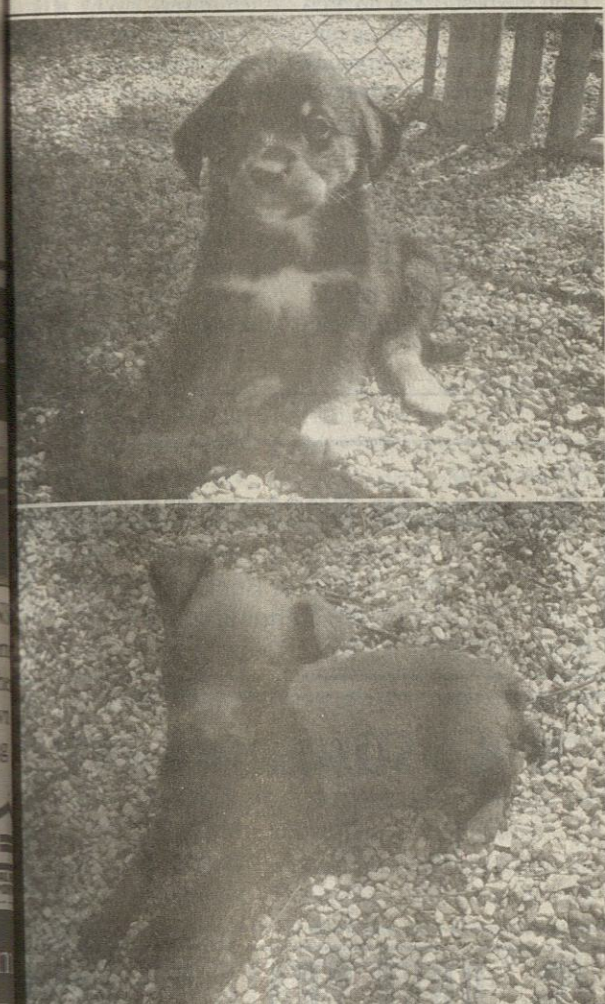

### The Bible In Miniature (part III)

Romans 12:2 says, "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your minds, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." Someone has said that the meaning here is that we should not let the world fit us into its mold. The idea certainly is that we are to be different than the world of unbelievers and the world system of wickedness. No, everybody who is unsaved is not the worst rascal he can be, for I know some people who are not Christians, yet they have more good characteristics than some who say they are Christians. Good actions, however, will never get anybody to heaven, for at best we all have sinned and come short of the glory of God. I John 2:15-17 tells believers

not to love the world, with its lust of the eyes; lust of the flesh and pride of life. It is amazing that the world has a standard that is so different than the standard of the Word of God, yet some people who profess to be Christians see nothing wrong with participation in the world's wickedness and wrong desires. If God said that we are not to be conformed to this world, then that is what He means! If one should look up what the Bible says about the world system of wickedness, the picture would not be very pretty.

If we are not to be conformed to this world, then we must have transformation of the mind, called a renewing in our verse. This means that we have to learn to think differently than the world thinks. It will mean that we cannot see everything that the movie world throws out,

for much of it is indecent and does not fit the pattern that God has given for His children concerning how to think. Philippians 4:6-8 tells us exactly how we should think as believers. To sum it up, Philippians 4:8 tells us to think on things that are true, honest, just, pure, lovely and of good report (reputation). It is so strange that so many who profess to know God do not want to give up the ways of the world, when it comes to how they use their minds! When our minds are renewed and we are transformed, we have no need to think as the world thinks, yet we will still be tempted to do so.

Since the things of God have a much higher and holier purpose than the things of the world, it is surprising that any of us should want to cling to the smut and filth of the world's system of wickedness! God always has a better plan than the world or the devil, but Satan is a trickster, always trying to make us think that God is cheating us out of the good life by commanding us to live for Him. The truth of the matter is that it is the devil who is trying to cheat us out of the good

things that God has in store for us. Through our transformed minds we can prove the will of God to be good, acceptable and perfect!

### The Bible In Miniature (part IV)

Romans 12:3 says, "For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God has dealt to every man the measure of faith." This verse will not likely win for Paul the Nobel Prize for the best literature, yet our writer has given us some information that we all need desperately to hear and heed! For the first thing, the words stated here go directly against most of the teaching being done today concerning self-esteem. Yes, I agree that we need to have a good self-esteem, but I believe the right esteem for ourselves will come from the Word of God. Actually we will have the right esteem for ourselves, when we have the right esteem for God, our Creator! Paul is not necessarily seeking to put mankind down, when he makes the statements made in our

verses, rather he is trying to put God up! Man is pretty good at trying to exalt himself, while trying to put God down, so somebody needs to help us get things put in the right perspective!

Notice that Paul speaks through the grace given to him, meaning that he realizes that he would not have the right words to say, unless God had worked in his life through salvation, grace and the direction of the Spirit of God. The message here is for every man in the church at Rome, but also for every man in Christ. We are told here that we should not think more highly of ourselves than we should. That is one hundred and eighty degrees off from the way the world thinks! We are being taught today with such words as: "I am the best; I can do anything that I can imagine." The fact is that not everybody can be the best in whatever thing it is he is trying to do, for only one person can really be the best, the rest have to be second or below! More than that, we all have often thought we could do things that we really could not do. Some of us have had bodily

injuries by trying to do we could not do. Why we just settle down and do a good job at what we have been given to do, out the stupid pride that "I am the best?"

In Romans 12:3 are being taught to the berly, according as God dealt to every man the sure of faith. Sobriety more than abstaining drunkenness through drink, but it does me too! God has never condoned drunkenness. He never will, so please this down in your little book. Many people ever, who never touch drink still are intoxicated their own importance has happened to the women and young who think soberly themselves? Why is we have to imagine are so important to the that we cannot possibly replaced by someone than we? It is God who dealt to every man a measure of faith, so we not boast about our own accomplishments, when deserves the credit for thing good that we do

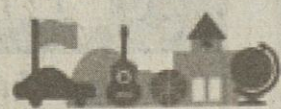

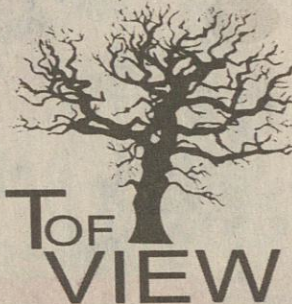
