Board Members Fail to Support Grissom's "Do-Over"

unday Sales go into effect June 1st

A motion by First District ervisor Brandon Grissom rescind his supporting vote Sunday beer sales died for of a second during a Board eting Monday morning.

There were about 20 people attendance in the courthouse ard room, including marina erators, and several represenwes of the Coalition for a Dry unty.

The board meeting was eduled weeks ago for a -construction conference, after that issue was set-Board President Nicky turned the floor to Brandon Grissom. issom made a motion to cind his vote he made last onday to allow Sunday beer es in response to requests by ckwick Lake marina operas. But fellow board members I not second his motion, effectively allowing last week's vote

May 5th, the board voted 3-2 to allow Sunday sales, while the marina operators were speaking with them in the regularly scheduled meeting. Grissom, Danny Ryan, and Greg Collier voted in support, and McRae and Steve Thorn voted against.

But after voting in support of the Sunday sales, Grissom had second thoughts about his "hasty" decision.

"I've wrestled with this decision all week," he said, saying he had heard from many of his constituents after his supporting vote. "I feel like I made the decision without considering the best interest of the people of Tishomingo County."

Grissom said he believed the issue should not have been voted on last week, but should have been tabled until the next meeting.

However, Eastport Marina operator Wallace Young was pleased to have some closure, as he had already had his request for Sunday sale hours "tabled" after meeting with the board in April.

Monday when the motion died without a second, Grissom asked that they please consider at least changing the time for sales to noon to 6 p.m. "so at least it would be between church time," said Grissom. No one supported that motion, and Danny Ryan moved they table the issue and discuss it at another time (not specified). That motion passed, and Ryan later confirmed that it didn't mean that they would discuss it at the next regularly scheduled meeting (May 19th), or when/if it would be put on

Two Face Meth, **Larceny Charges**

As expected, an issue like this generates a lot of talk on both sides of the issue. Some people think that the county should have had the right to vote on Sunday sales, but Mississippi law allows the people's representatives (supervisors) to determine the ordinances governing sales of beer and alcohol. It is within their right to make whatever decision

They are required by law to publicize the change to the ordinance, but not to ask for public opinions or a hearing.

Another issue is that some think that it should be contained to just the lake marina areas, and the law does allow for a "resort status" to be established, but that required action by the legislature, which is already adjourned for the The county has previ-

The Bible In Miniature (Part V)

I have called Romans chapter 12 the "Bible in miniature" because it covers so many things that we are to do as believers, almost as if God is giving a nutshell version of the entire ethical system of the Bible. The first three verses show us the need to present ourselves to God, as well as the need not to think too highly of ourselves. Since the first three verses show us how to think about ourselves, we will now need some information which shows us how to think of others, and the rest of the chapter does that!

Romans 12:4-5 shows us that believers are all one body in Christ: "For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another." There is no way, nor is there any need, to seek to get around the truth that all people who are truly saved in this age are a part of the body of Christ, which is also called the church. (Ephesians 1:22-23: 5:30-32, and other references. clearly teach this truth.) Yes, there is disagreement within the body of Christ, just as there is disagreement within physical families, but that does not change the fact that all who have been saved since Pentecost are a part of the body of Christ. (I am using Pentecost as the time the church began, others may have different opinions, but the main thing I am saying is that the church and Israel are distinct groups, as clearly taught is Romans chapters 9-11.) By the-way, the church is not supposed to be a "bunch of puppets" who never can have any differences of opinions or thoughts. If we read the Bible with any carefulness, we will learn that good people have often had different opinions. This does not mean, however, that we do not agree on the fundamentals of the faith, for we do agree on these things.

Did you notice that our verses say that the physical body (verse 4) has many members? Most people would say, "Of course we know this." The problem is that many people seem to miss the point that the body of Christ (spiritually) is made up of different members, meaning that we do not all have the same function. Some of us have been called to preach the gospel as pastors, evangelists or missionaries. Others have been called to be musicians, pianists or Sunday school teachers. Still others are termed as "helps" in I Corinthians 12:28 (few people ever vie for this position, but it is mentioned before some of the most coveted "gifts".) The word "helps" means: "relief"; it comes from a word that means to succor, or run to the cry of another. So, God has placed some people in the church to be there when others need them. We should always desire to improve in our administration of the gifts that God has given us, but we should always realize that it is God Who has "set some in the church", as is stated in I Corinthians 12:28. All who are saved belong to one another, because we all belong to Christ as His body, the church! Please do not forget this important truth!
