## History Honored in New, Modern Community Center in Tishomingo

There's a shiny new addition to the landscape of Tishomingo as the town a new venue for many community activities.

Made possible by a donation from the estate of former alderman Jimmy Burns, the community center features large and small meeting rooms, and a full kitchen. The Open House last Saturday was the first time it has been open to the public, but saw a lot of traffic Tuesday, when it was the new location for meeting in the new Tishomingo precinct. Tishomingo and West Tishomingo precincts were combined to save money.

The building design is by P. McRae Engineering, of Iuka, and it was built by Master Builders of Booneville.

An impressive, museum-quality timeline display of Tishomingo's history since its founding is located along the north wall. It is still in the rev-

## Runoff Probable in Republican Senate Primary Race

### County narrowly supports McDaniel

With nearly all precincts reporting, the Republican U. S. Senate primary between long-time incumbent Thad Cochran and Tea Party challenger Chris McDaniel is "too close to call" at presstime Wednesday morning.

The Republican primary may require a runoff election to determine who will run against Democrat Travis Childers in the fall. The primary, if necessary, will be June 24th. Former 1st

District Congressman Childers handily defeated lesser-known opponents to clinch the Democratic Senate nomination.

On the House side, incumbent Alan Nunnellee will face in the fall general election Ron Dickey, who earned 66 percent of District 1 Democratic votes.

Statewide, about 78 percent of voters voted in the Republican primary, and only 21 percent in the Democratic primary.

## Recent Tishomingo County Circuit Court Pleas

Recent pleas heard in Tishomingo County Circuit Court:

Mary Beth McKee, 30, of 443 CR 241, pled down to receiving of stolen property in connection with the Locke house fire. She was sentenced to serve ten years with Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC).

James Bray, 39, 309 Adam St., Iuka, pled to grand larceny and was sentenced to ten years with MDOC, with credit for time served, and the balanced suspended, and must successfully complete five years post-release supervision, and pay court costs and fines.

Haley Lambert, 26, of Corinth, pled guilty to possession of methylenedioxypyrovalerone, and grand larceny. She was sentenced to eight years with MDOC, all suspended, and

must successfully complete five years post-release supervision, and pay court costs and fines.

Jay Settlemyres, 30, of Corinth, pled guilty to arson of insured property and he was sentenced to ten years with MDOC, with credit for time served and remainder suspended, and must successfully complete five years post-release supervision, and pay court costs and fines. He and a co-defendant must, joint and severally, repay reparations of \$30,944.69.

Shelia Pruitt Miles, 50, Iuka, pled guilty to sale of hydrocodone, and another count of sale of oxycontin. She was sentenced to ten years with MDOC, all suspended and five years post-release supervision and must pay court costs and fines.

Kelly then goes to another town and gets his loan for the clinic and along the way, he picked up an application for a national bank charter for Iuka.

So in 1964, Iuka suddenly has two banks. First

American Bank, president – Kelly Segars, M.D., now has ten branches in four counties and they are doing well.

My high school diploma, as of this writing, has not been revoked, and I am getting ready to celebrate my 50th class reunion.

Joe Ray Langston stayed on in Booneville and his law practice spread over most of North Mississippi, which was contrary to the prediction of Pappy Jim Cunningham, then the Dean of North Mississippi lawyers, who said, "he won't last six months." Joe Ray died in

1987, but left a half of his family to care for. They, too, are celebrating 50 years, and also well.

The bottom line is the motivation factor is a powerful thing. Be who you kick, they kick back.

Students will learn how to create a show from writing, to acting to behind-the-scenes work, she added.


Skinner, a theatre and film director, also will teach at the camp.

## DAR Ladies Honor Native American Heritage

Chief Tishomingo Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution and guest travel the Natchez Trace Parkway to Lauderdale County, Alabama to honor Native American heritage on Saturday, May 24, 2014.

Te-lah-nay, a Euchee (Yuchi) Indian Woman was forced from her home in North Alabama to Oklahoma along the Trail of Tears in 1839. After five long years, Te-lah-nay managed to leave Muscogee, Okla., and return to her beloved land in Lauderdale County. Upon her return, the strong Indian woman was called Mary Hipp and she earned a living as an herbalist. Nearly 100 years later, when Hendrix was a child in 1936, he would sit by his grandmother, Parmelia Hendrix, and listen to tales of his Indian heritage. It was there that her great-great grandson, Tom Hendrix, learned of Te-lah-nay's incredible journey.

In 1988, Hendrix had the urge to somehow honor the great-great grandmother whose stories inspired him as a child. His creation resulted in a rock wall that required 8.5 million pounds of stone. His

preparations included "three wore out trucks, 22 wheelbarrows, 3,800 pairs of gloves, three dogs, and one 80-year-old man, Hendrix says. "I laid them one at a time for each step she made," said Hendrix.

In 2000, Hendrix wrote a book about his great-great-grandmother's journey and the wall called "If the Legends Fade." He quotes the stories from his 168 page journal of Te-Lah-nay's life and he sits with his visitors near his prayer pit. The winding rock wall on his property off the Natchez Trace Parkway is known as the largest non-mortared rock wall in the United States and the largest memorial to a Native American Woman.

On their return home, the group stopped at Colbert's Stand for a picnic lunch and salute to their State Regent, who was presented with a Tishomingo County afghan. George Colbert operated a ferry across the Tennessee River from 1800 to 1819. His stand or inn offered travelers a warm meal and shelter during their journey on the Old Trace.


## Black Bear Killed in Vehicle Collision

Tyler Norman responded to the scene of the accident and found the 168 pound male bear dead on the shoulder of the highway. The driver of the vehicle, who was uninjured, reported that the bear ran out of the woods and into the highway just after the vehicle had crossed Turkey Creek.

Local residents are advised that while black bears are not common in east central Mississippi, there are a few bears in this area of the state. In the lower

two-thirds of Mississippi the black bear is listed as a Federally Threatened Species and it is classified as Endangered throughout the state under Mississippi statute. As such, it is illegal to intentionally kill or harass a black bear. Motorists driving at night or early morning in areas inhabited by bears should exercise caution. The bear killed Monday night was taken to MDWFP's Museum of Natural Science to be used for research and education.

### The Bible in Miniature (Part VIII)

Perhaps some of my readers are beginning to wonder why I have chosen the title above. There are many important aspects of the Christian life and ministry are covered in this one chapter that I have chosen it: "The Bible in miniature". I gave Romans 12:1-8 the last article, but I did not begin to finish with verses, so here they are again: "Having then mercy, according to the grace that is given to us, by prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith; Or ministry, let us wait on our minister; he that teacheth on teaching; Or he that exhorteth, let him do his exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness."

I am amazed that God would even consider any of us to be a part of His great eternal work, but has chosen to include us, and I am glad. I have heard preachers who bemoaned the fact that they had given the position of being preachers, while others seemed to have no joy whatever in the jobs God given them. I do not mean to imply that I have loved every aspect of the preaching ministry, but I mean to clearly state that I am glad, yeah, even joyed that God should give me some work in His ministry! We need to come to realize that God does not use anything; that He could have chosen to do His work without us; that He has existed eternally, while we are only a "young creation" in time. There are many ministries involved in the reason for God's love and mercy toward us, but I am glad for both His love and His mercy of kindness to His creatures! Paul is telling the Romans as well as us, that we ought to put all we have into the ministry God has placed in our trust. When we speak as a prophet, which can mean foretelling or telling, he should do it according to the proportion of faith that God has given him. The minister in any way to others should do it with zeal and carefulness. Those who are gifted to teach, teach with every particle of knowledge God will give them to have. Those who exhort (encourage), serve well in that position. Those who give show without fanfare! Those who rule should be careful they rule well and fairly. Those who show mercy, also show a cheerful spirit, in that they are able to be merciful, and have had mercy shown to them!

There is much more in these verses than I can perhaps even can, bring out here, but I trust my readers will get the idea that God wants us to serve Him with passion for what we are doing. I have been saying some time that preachers should preach with a passion or else sit down and let somebody else have the pulpit. I am not trying to be unkind; I am only saying that I would not accept from our favorite athletic team the "lazy bones" attitude that some preachers exhibit when speaking to audiences who have come to hear a message from God through His Word the Bible! Since 1 Peter 4:12 says, "For the Word of God is quick and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart," those who dispense the Word should understand what they are handling, so that they be alive, powerful, sharp and convicting!






