## Cochran Gets a Narrow Win in Runoff to Face Childers in Fall Election

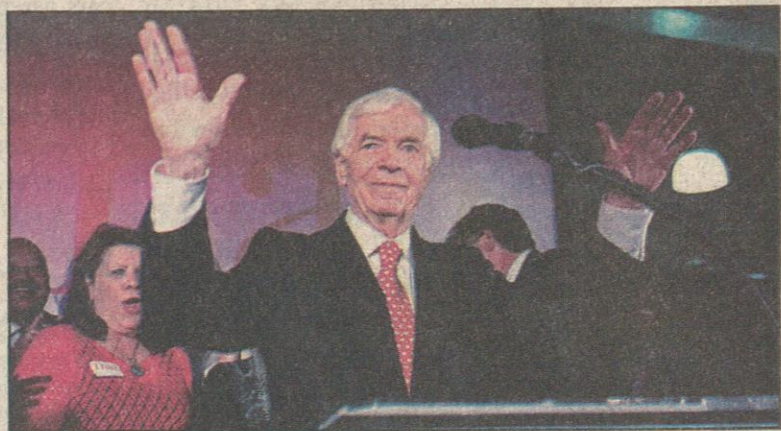
Six-term incumbent Senator Thad Cochran survived the "race of his career" Tuesday, as he defeated Tea Party backed challenger Chris McDaniel by about 6,400 votes in a statewide runoff election. He will face Democrat Travis Childers, a former U.S. Congressman, in the General Election in November.

In Tishomingo County, the race was very close between the two candidates - neither of whom made any reported Tishomingo County campaign appearances in either the first

primary race, or the last three weeks leading up to the runoff election. McDaniel actually came out ahead by 69 votes in Tishomingo County.

Of 12,161 voters in the county, 2,144 voted - a turnout of about 17 percent. According to the official final results for the county, Cochran had 1,042 votes to McDaniel's 1,101.

In neighboring Alcorn County Cochran won by only 13 votes, according to the *Daily Corinthian* reports.

## "The Well Has Run Dry" - Courthouse Museum Faces Uncertain Future Due to Critical Lack of Funding

After years of eeking out an existence from a handful of supporters and a drastically reduced amount of funding from the county, the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum is facing the critical decision to stop operating as it has been in the past several years, and only open on an appointment-only basis.

In recent years, the museum at the corner of Quitman and Fulton has housed more than a century of treasures, archives and documents telling the story of Tishomingo County. The 144-year-old "Old County Courthouse" was renovated to be a publicly usable museum as a division of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS) more than a decade ago, and has had more than 24,000 visitors sign the visitors' book from all over the U.S. and many other countries. This makes it one of the most-visited attractions in the county.

The TCAHM also supports and maintains the Midway School Museum and the Burnsville One-Room School Museum.

The Courthouse Museum impacts the entire county, strengthening civic pride, and providing a valuable education resource through its many efforts, according to Nelson's proposal to the Board of Supervisors for 2015 funding.

But it does so on just about \$500 of allocation of the annual county budget, and donations, and memberships of the TCHGS. They have had grants in the past, and have invested some \$380,000 in restoring the

courthouse and restoring and preserving the Society's archival resources, but grant funding and local sources that have helped the Museum to continue to be operational, even with mostly volunteers keeping it open only 24 hours a week, have dried up.

Plans currently include operating with only one part-time employee for the month of July, and then going to an appointment-only operation. The employees, as well as Nelson and others are on-site much more than that, as volunteers, and the paid help has even volunteered to stay on without pay.

"I don't think that our local people understand how very little support, sponsorship and donations we get from our community," explained Cindy Nelson, president of the TCHGS, who volunteers her time as "director" of the museum. Dedicated volunteers and staff members have contributed their personal monies on a monthly basis in order to make ends meet.

"We've been the most cost-reducing folks you can imagine, but the load is now too heavy to bear, and my well is dry (financially, physically, and emotionally)," said Nelson in an email to supporters.

The greatest need is for some corporate or private supporters to come on board to fund the Society's vision for the facility, but it has been increasingly difficult to attract support due to many factors, including the belief of many that the county provides all the support the museum needs. The Society gets no funding from the small amount of tourism dollars brought in by a hotel tax. Without a paid Ex-

ecutive Director, the museum is prevented from reaching out to major funders, or soliciting more grant opportunities, according to Nelson's presentation to the County Board.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors could possibly restore the \$20,000 annual support it provided prior to 2011, when county support was cut drastically (to \$10,500 annually for four years) to help the

county recover from financial/legal issues stemming from the renovation of the facility.

Nelson met with the Board of Supervisors Monday, and provided documentation pleading for the necessity of the Museum, along with a funding request that would allow the museum to have a stand-alone Executive Director who is invested in maintaining, marketing and operating the museum. The to-

tal request is \$65,000 from the county, with the TCHGS providing an additional \$10,150 to meet the total budget of \$75,150 to adequately run the facility.

Supporters of the Museum are asked to contact their supervisor to ask for full county support of this county resource, and to help the museum as a volunteer, or providing financial support.

## Seventh Graders Must Have New TDAP Vaccine

All students entering the 7th grade must receive the TDAP vaccine and bring proof of vaccination to the school prior to attending in the fall. If your child received the TDAP vaccine after the age of 7, they may not need the vaccine again. You will need to check with your physician or call the Health Dept to verify when your child was vaccinated.

The vaccine will cost \$10 at the Health Dept. You will need to take your insurance card with you. If you have Medicaid, your cost may be covered. If you chose to get the vaccination at your physician's clinic, you will need to check with them on your cost and insurance coverage.

The Tishomingo County Health Department's phone number is 423-6100. You will need to call for an appointment for your child's vaccination.

Also, if you have been a resident of Mississippi for less than a month or two, you will need to carry your child's 121 form with you.

When lack of funds recently forced the library to eliminate an hour of service from 4-6:00 pm, it was a disappointment to both patrons and staff. After the lack was announced, someone felt moved to do something about it, send \$10,000 to restore the closing time.

"Iuka Library patrons are incredibly generous!" says Librarian Ms. Spain. "This gift is completely unexpected after we had asked ourselves to the lack in hours which new would be a blow to many people. And this is in addition to a donation we received earlier this year, also anonymous, to replace all our public computers! There is no way to adequately express our gratitude except by re-

instating the lost hour as soon as possible. The new evening library clerk has been hired, and starting Tuesday, July 1, we will resume our former schedule: 9-6 Monday through Thursday, 9-5 on Friday, and 9-4 on Saturday."

Prior to 2011, the evening position had been funded by the City of Iuka, but funding was eliminated as a result of overall budget tightening. A donor stepped in at that time and funded the position for nearly three years.

"With the ongoing commitment from City Hall, hard work by our Friends of the Library, and personal donations, our library continues to be a strong asset for our community," says Ms. Spain. "We are both humbled by the generosity and proud to be a part of such a wonderful service."

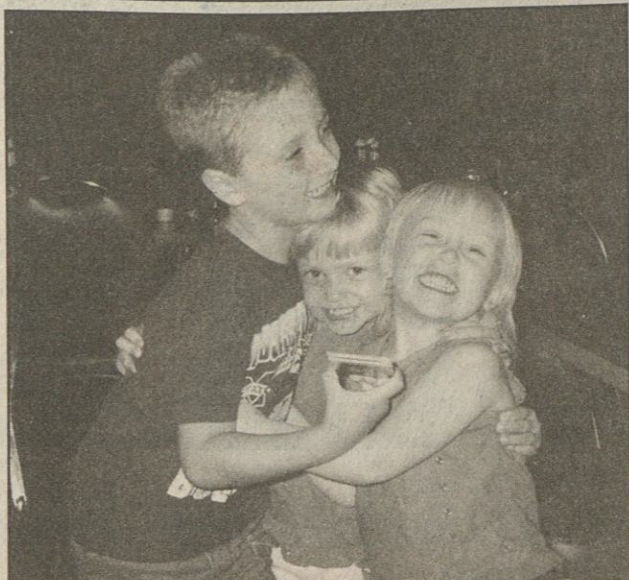
### The Bible In Miniature (part XI)

Perhaps some people have not realized before just how much could be written into one chapter of the Bible concerning our actions as Christians. Romans chapter 12 speaks volumes on the need for Christians to act out the details of our name as followers of Christ. Romans 12:14-21 speaks primarily about the Christian's attitude toward those who are his enemies, with some admonition concerning saved or lost who are rejoicing or weeping. I will give Romans 12:14-16 here: "Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits." It is not necessarily easy to bless those who persecute us, but Jesus has given us the prime example of how it is to be done, when He asked the Father to forgive those who were murdering Him! We are taught to bless; we are taught not to curse. Perhaps many people do not really comprehend the matter of "cursing", as it is used in the Bible. It means that we are not to wish anyone to be doomed to judgment, especially not to hell. We all have heard people tell others where to go; I have never heard anyone get angry and say: "You just go to heaven". We are not to wish anyone to go to hell; we are not to wish that God would "damn" anyone. (That is a Bible word, used in Mark 16:16 and other places.)

We are told in our chapter that we should

rejoice when others are rejoicing. This does not mean, of course, that we are to rejoice in sinful things; it means that we are not to be "cosmic killjoys", when others are rejoicing over some great blessing. On the other hand, we need to learn how to act when others are brokenhearted. It is not the time to tell funny things, when someone around us is sobbing tears over some loss in life. All who know God should have enough compassion for others that we are actually able to shed tears when others are doing so. Christians are not to be lifted up in pride, so that they feel themselves to be above certain other people. We are to bend down our backs and knees to help those who are having a hard time and may be "bent low" in despair. It is our Christian duty to meet people where they are and seek to help them. None of us has any need to be conceited, for we certainly have enough "warts" in our own personalities to know that we are not without flaws! I often say that I do not mind being around "big preachers", if they do not know that they are big! Those who think they are better than the rest of us will come to a time of a big letdown someday, when they see themselves more like God sees them! Psalm 39:5 B says, "...verily every man at his best state is altogether vanity (empty)." Then the word "Selah" is added, meaning: "Think about that".

## Bobby Osborne to Headline Savannah Bluegrass Festival

Wayne Jerrolds, founder and spokesperson for the two day 36th annual Savannah Bluegrass Festival, announced today Bobby Osborne will headline the Saturday night show on July 5, 2014.

Jerrolds said, "I'm pleased and excited to bring Bobby Osborne back to Savannah as part of his 50th anniversary tour. He's a popular entertainer with his mandolin playing and high lead vocals, and with his 60 plus years in bluegrass music and all our local bands we're sure to have a great festival." Osborne's performance in Savannah will be part of his Celebration Tour, a year long tour in honor of his 50th year as a member of the Grand Ole Opry.

Osborne said, "The Opry has been such a big part of my life. It didn't seem right to let the year go by without doing something special for it. I know the rest of the guys in the band are excited to be a part of it as well." The Celebration Tour started in Kentucky on Bobby's birthday, December 7, and continues throughout 2014.

Bobby and his brother Sonny, known as the Osborne Brothers, became members of the Grand Ole Opry on Saturday, August 8, 1964, at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville. The brothers performed *Ruby* that night, one of the most significant and influential songs throughout both the Osborne Brothers and Bobby's career. The duo became the first bluegrass group to perform on a college campus in 1960 and the first bluegrass band to perform at the White House on March 17, 1973, when they performed for President Richard Nixon, his family and members

of Congress. In 1994, they were inducted into the International Bluegrass Music Hall of Fame, bluegrass music's highest honor. The Osborne Brothers' recordings of *Rocky Top* and *Kentucky* were named official state songs of Tennessee and Kentucky, respectively.

Sonny Osborne retired in 2004 but Bobby continues touring with his band, the Rocky Top X-Press. The band consists of his sons, Wynn Osborne on banjo and Bobby Osborne, Jr., on bass; Joe Miller on guitar; and Buddy Griffin on fiddle. In 2009, Bobby was once again inducted into the IBMA Hall of Fame as a part of the Lonesome Pine Fiddlers, an early group he played with, making him the only person inducted into the Hall of Fame twice.

The 36th annual Savannah Bluegrass Festival will be Friday, July 4, 2014, at Wayne Jerrolds River Park beginning at 6 p.m., and Saturday, July 5, at noon on Court Square in downtown Savannah. The festival is sponsored in part by the City of Savannah, Savannah Main Street, Hardin County Convention and Visitors Bureau and Hardin County. In addition to Grand Ole Opry star Bobby Osborne, over twenty local and regional bluegrass bands will perform. The festival is a heritage tourism event dedicated to showcasing and preserving the rich musical heritage of Hardin County, the state of Tennessee, and the nation and a great way to celebrate the Fourth of July.

The 36th annual Savannah Bluegrass Festival is a family event and admission is free both days.

## Proofs of Residency Required for Each Student Prior to Starting 2014-2015 School Year

Once again, it is time for our school district to begin the annual process of collecting Proofs of Residency for our students for the 2014-15 school year. This requirement is mandated by the Office of the State Auditor and these documents must be on file before your child is officially enrolled in our district. The information required is to prove that each student physically resides full time, weekday/nights and weekends, at the place of abode located within the limits of the school district. Please note the requirements below and keep in mind that the proofs must be current. This means that a utility bill must be within 30 days of the date you present and sign the compliance document at your child's school. Other documents must be the latest available. Example: Drivers license and auto registration must be current. All proofs must contain your physical address and date of proof. Listed below are items that will be accepted as proof:

- internet service)
- Driver's License
- Voter Registration
- Current Automobile Registration
- Affidavit of Residency
- Other document — This must be an official document that objectively and unequivocally establishes that the parent/guardian resides in the school district and CANNOT be an envelope showing the address

Every student in Tishomingo County School District must provide 2 new proofs of residency before the 2014-2015 school year begins. These may be presented at pre-registration, or brought to the school office during the summer. This notice is to also remind parents that all students entering 7th grade must present an updated Immunization Compliance Form that includes the new TDAP required by the Mississippi Department of Health. Students will not be given a schedule or assigned a homeroom teacher until his/her enrollment records are complete and current. 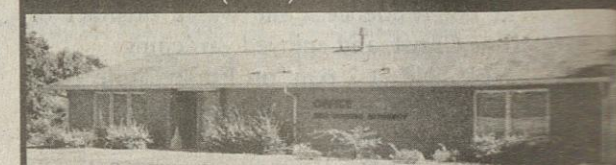

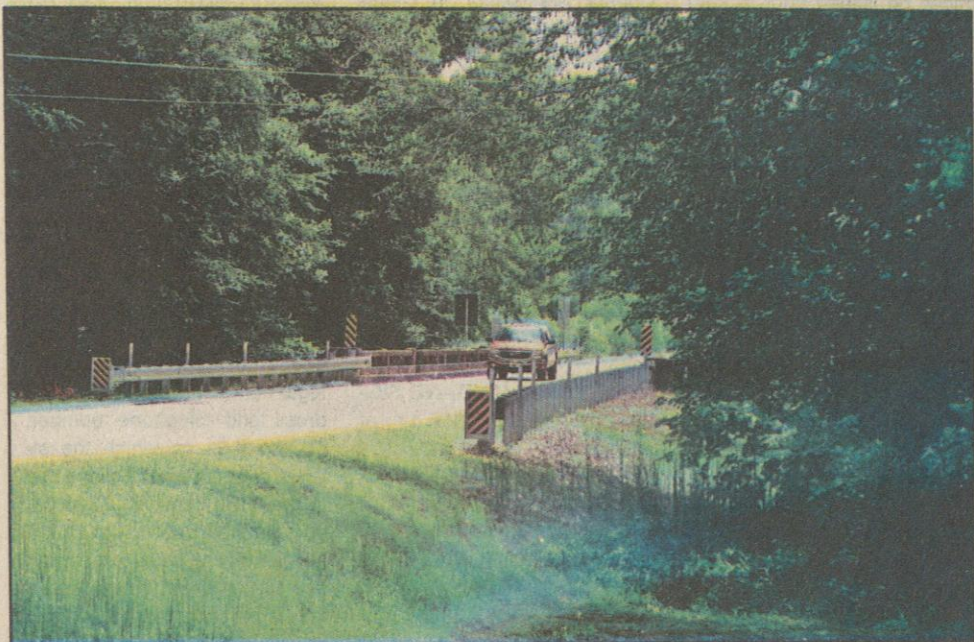
